LINEAGE LIST NOTATION

This document is written in “*Register* format,” a format popular with scholarly genealogists named for the New England Historic Genealogical Society (NEHGS) and its learned journal the *NEGHS Register*. To facilitate stepping “backward” through the genealogy, I utilize one small addition to standard (actually “modified”) *Register* format. A leading subscript to a person in a lineage list is the person number for that individual in this work. For example, Caleb Smith⁶ Riggs (₇₀Joseph⁵, Joseph⁴, Edward³, Edward², Edward¹) was son of person 70, Joseph⁵ Riggs (₃₇Joseph⁴, Edward³, Edward², Edward¹), who in turn was son of person 37, Joseph⁴ Riggs, and so forth. This technique may be applied to any person in a lineage list. However, to reduce visual clutter, I will use it here for at most one person per lineage list, usually the first.

A superscript asterisk (*) indicates the first person in a lineage list who is not genetically related to the next older person in the list. For example, Skylor Nathan^{13*} Knoll (Martha Jane¹², Edward Clark¹¹, Theodore Dalzel A.¹⁰, Edward⁹, Elias⁸, Elias⁷, Preserve⁶, Zebulon⁵, ?Joseph⁴, Edward³, Edward², Edward¹) was an adopted son of Martha Jane¹² Riggs. Note also the question mark (?) in this lineage list, indicating that the father-son relationship of Joseph⁴ and Zebulon⁵ has not been proved.

It is traditional in American genealogy to label the immigrant’s generation as no. 1. The generation preceding his is A, preceding A is B, and so forth.

METHODOLOGY AND STYLE NOTES

Un sourced material. Some claims without accompanying sources are important to preserve, as hints to future researchers or simply to indicate that I am aware of commonly claimed dates, names, or places, but am not certain of them. I enter these in footnotes and not in the main text. I do not always explicitly flag these claims as unsourced, but they should be understood as such by their presence in the footnotes only. This type of information often comes from compiled, but unfortunately unsourced, genealogies that have the appearance, to me at least, of being well researched and based on solid evidence. The footnote hint might inspire a future researcher to find the elusive evidence, whereas I had not done so by the time this book went to press.

Census litany. Rather than trying to be creative on each of dozens of census readings, I have chosen to state them with a common “litany.” To make census litanies easy to spot, I usually introduce each one with the year. For example, a reading from the U.S. census for 1900 will begin “In 1900”

Online sources. I have made much use of online sources, usually secondary, such as the listing of gravestones in a particular cemetery. The problem with this practice is the supposed ephemeral nature of the web. Many online sources may simply disappear from the web over time, or change addresses at least. I have therefore made a copy of every webpage used in this work and archived it for future reference. Very notable exceptions are the many databases available from major servers, such as <Ancestry.com>, which I assume, with some trepidation, will be permanently available by some means. The URL for a website is identified by enclosing < > brackets. When a URL needs to wrap at the end of a line for good visual appearance, I have inserted a hyphen in an appropriate location. This line-breaking hyphen should be omitted, of course, when the URL is used as an internet address.

Abbreviations. I use abbreviations. With one exception, I always abbreviate state names and month names. The exception: I do not abbrevi-

ate state names in the main text that stand alone. However, state names in footnotes are always abbreviated, even in the titles of books.

I do not abbreviate anything in a quotation. An abbreviation in a quotation is present in the original.

I use succinct forms for the sources in footnotes. The bibliography should be consulted for full expansion of a source reference. See the abbreviations section of the front matter for the full list of abbreviations used in the census references. In all cases, the census was read from <Ancestry.com>, and the roll numbers correspond to the microfilm series used by that organization.

Verb tenses. Past tense is normally used, but a record is described in the present—e.g., Joe Gopnik was born in 1836, but a death certificate for Joe Gopnik states that he was born in 1836.

PREFACE

This is part of my ongoing project of formalizing my online family tree, accumulated over decades at <alvyray.com>.

N.B. The spelling of the surname is important. Its usual spelling in the world is **Gilliland**—the “early double ell” version—but our family uses the “late double ell” version, **Gililand**, and has throughout the history covered by this book, except for the earliest years for which there was no accepted standard spelling.

N.B. There has been substantial *Middle Name Creep* in this family. For example, Jesse R. Gililand (my direct ancestor) is nearly always presented as Jesse **Richardson** Gililand. But I have not found a single piece of evidence to support that middle name. It makes sense, considering the shared beginnings with the Richardson family, but I will not propagate an unsubstantiated name. I similarly make note when I have found no evidence for several other popularly reported middle names.

I descend from Jesse R.³ Gililand (*John*², *John*¹) as documented herein, where John¹ Gililand is featured in the title of this book. John¹ Gililand married, it is believed, Charity² Richardson (*Mathias*¹). John² Gililand married Agnes² Lowe (*William*¹). And William¹ Lowe married, it is believed, Margaret² Fair (*Barnabas*¹). That explains the personal motivation behind the full cluster of names in the title of this book.

Furthermore, Jesse R.³ Gililand married Ann³ Shaw, daughter of James² Shaw (*James*¹) and his wife, Mary² Riggs, daughter of Bethuel¹ Riggs. See my print-published book on Bethuel for further details: *Elder Bethuel Riggs (1757–1835) of Morris County, New Jersey*.

William¹ Lowe, Barnabas¹ Fair, and Bethuel¹ Riggs were all Revolutionary War soldiers. In particular, they were all three in or near the Battle of Kings Mountain, and all three received pensions for their service. (James¹ Shaw was also a Revolutionary War soldier but not in North Carolina.)

THE DNA EVIDENCE

This section is not yet developed. I use it at this point only as a placeholder for the first pieces of DNA evidence that I have found.

The “Gilliland” DNA project at FamilyTreeDNA.com has a public spreadsheet with dozens of Gilliland YDNA contributors. I searched the spreadsheet for the spelling “Gililland” often used by our family, the family in this book. I found only two contributors with that spelling. Here are their YDNA signatures on 37, resp. 67, markers, where the code **a** = 1, **b** = 2, . . . , **z** = 26, **A** = 27, **B** = 28, . . . , **Z** = 52, is used to shorten the lists of numbers to alphabetic strings. The one location (marker) where the two genetic signatures differ is shown in blue—and differ by only 1 there:

from the same part of New Mexico as my family. He is—and Frances by marriage—my second cousin once removed. A paternal great-grandmother of mine was a Gililand. Here is my lineage:

Alvy Ray⁸ Smith (*Alvy Ray⁷ Smith, Alvy Ray⁶ Smith, ²⁶⁷Lucretia Ann⁵, William F.⁴, Jesse R.³, John², John¹*)

With help from these two correspondents, I began the research on their genealogies of the two DNA contributors, Jerry and Daymon, knowing only the following bare facts:

Jerry Gililand had as his earliest known ancestor—as provided by him—to be John “Gilliland,” born about 1765, and died 1849 in Kentucky. FamilyTreeDNA.com (FTDNA) testing company found his haplogroup verified to be R-M222.

I knew only that Daymon Dale Gililand was recently deceased, and that he had provided as his earliest known ancestor, William “Gilliland,” born 1801 in Kentucky, and died about 1875 in Texas. FTDNA predicted his haplogroup to be R-M269. Appendix H is devoted to tracing his ancestry.

I recognized Jerry Gililand’s ancestor, John “Gilliland,” as the John¹ Gililand in the title of this book. That is, the contributor of this YDNA claimed to descend from John¹ Gililand, and in fact this book proves that he does. And since the two genetic signatures match, the other contributor probably does too, or from kin of John¹. So this might be the first glimpse of John¹ Gililand’s genetic signature, the one which all male Gilillands in this book must match.

By the way, there are other contributions in the FamilyTreeDNA.com group who match this signature but spell the surname differently. The different spelling is not a requirement for descent, so many of them are probably also descendants of John¹ too or his male kin.

The Gilliland DNA site divides its contributors into Group 1 and Group 2. The two “Gililand” signatures above fall in Group 2. See appendix C for a DNA-based argument that a certain Alexander Gililand could not be John¹ Gililand’s father.

I have not yet placed Daymon's ancestor, William Gilliland, in this book. I provide a genealogy for him in appendix H. We know there must be a connection but do not yet understand when or where it could have occurred.

Haplogroup R-M269 includes R-M222, so those two results are not incompatible.

THE JOHN GILILLAND FAMILY

First Generation

1. **JOHN¹ GILILLAND** was born about 1764, South Carolina, and died July 1849, age 85, Simpson Co., Ky., in the home of his daughter, Martha Ann Reeder (from the 1850 Kentucky Mortality Census, q.v.). He married say 1791 or 1792 **CHARITY² RICHARDSON**, who was born 30 Aug. 1772, daughter of Mathias¹ and Frances (–) Richardson (see appendix A).

Marriage date: The marriage date of 1792 is repeated in many places but without evidence. It must be an estimate based on John² Gililland's birth on 17 Jan. 1793, a date derived from his gravestone data. See the sketch for him in this book for an argument, based on tax records, that he might have been born in 1792. Also notice the 1790 census below which indicates that John¹ might have already been married and had a son, and perhaps a daughter, by 1790, but doesn't prove it. (But see later discussion of this census item.)

Surname note—Gililland vs Gilliland: We can call these the “late double-ell” vs the “early double-ell” forms. Although I consistently use the spelling Gililland (the late double-ell form) for this family's surname in this book, note that almost every record in this sketch for John¹ uses the alternative spelling Gilliland. However, the “modern” spelling Gililland was beginning to be used already as can be seen in the sketch for Mathias¹ Richardson in appendix A. The parts of the family I personally know are proud of the late double-ell form and use it as an exclusive marker.

In 1790 **John “Gilliland,”** over 16, resided in Greenville Dist., S.C., with one male under 16 [born after 1774], and two females.^[2]

But also in 1790 **John “Gillilin,”** over 16, resided in Pendleton Dist., S.C., with one male under 16 [born after 1774], and three females. Listed nearby were Benjamin Clardy and John Clardy. They were listed under Capt. Micaiah Clark, one page away from the next item.^[3]

N.B. In 1790 **Mathias Richardson,** over 16, resided in Pendleton Dist., S.C., with two males under 16, and five females. Listed nearby was **William Lowe.** They were listed under Capt. Benjamin Clark.^[4]

See the Pendleton Dist., S.C., land conveyances for **Mathias¹ Richardson** dated 29 Sept. 1795 and 15 Oct. 1795 in appendix A. In both cases **John Gililland** (spelled that way) witnessed the transactions, implying that they were neighbors.

N.B. Greenville District, S.C., was separated from the Pendleton District by the Saluda River. So these neighbors might have lived across the river from one another. More likely is that the two John Gillilands were distinct and the one in the Pendleton Dist. was the neighbor of Mathias Richardson.

The Other Gilillands in the Area

Placeholder: On 21 May 1784 **Robert “Gileland”** was warranted 300 acres north of the Saluda River in South Carolina. 120 acres of it were surveyed for him on 26 May 1784 by Thomas Lewis: “I have admeasured & laid out unto **Robert Gilliland** a tract of land Containing One hundred & twenty acres situated in the district aforsaid [96 District] lying & being on the Golden Grove Creek . . .” Recorded 10 June 1784. “Deliv. Robt Gileland’s son.”^[5]

GILLILLAND GENEALOGY

Placeholder: On 15 Apr. 1785 “**Rob^t Gililand**” was warranted 300 acres north of the Saluda River in South Carolina. 271 acres of it were surveyed for him on 17 Apr. 1785 by Thomas Lofton: “I have admeasured and laid out unto **Robert Gililand** a tract of two hundred and seventy one acres of land, above the ancient boundary line, situate in Ninety Six District, on south branches of grove Creek waters of saluda River . . .” Recorded 16 July 1785.^[6]

Placeholder (this item directly precedes the item above): On 1 July 1785 “**Alex^r Gilleland**” was warranted 300 acres north of the Saluda River in South Carolina. 251 acres of it were surveyed for him on 14 July 1785 by John Hunter: “I have admeasured and laid out unto **Alexander Gilleland** a tract of two hundred and fifty one acres of land, on the north side of Saluda River, situate in ninety six district” The land description mentions that it is bounded by, among others, “land laid out to **Rob^t gilleland.**” Recorded 16 July 1785.^[7] **This strongly suggests a connection between this Robert and Alexander.** See appendix C. This and the next several paragraphs are about this other (I believe) Gililland family. I track them both since I am not certain they are distinct families.

Placeholder: On 9 May 1785 **Robert “Gileland”** was warranted 200 acres north of the Saluda River in South Carolina. 200 acres of it were surveyed for him on 20 May 1785 by Jonathan Downs: “I have admeasured and laid out unto **Robert Gileland** a tract of land containing Two hundred acres of land, situate in 96 district above the ancient boundary line, on the Reedy fork, waters of Reedy River . . .” Recorded 13 Sept. 1785.^[8]

Placeholder: On 16 June 1786 **John “Gilleland”** was warranted 400 acres north of the Saluda River in South Carolina. 165 acres of it were

surveyed for him on 24 June 1786 by Jonathan Downs: “I have admeasured and laid out unto **John Gilleland** a tract of land Containing One hundred & Sixty five acres, Situate in 96 District above the Old Boundary on a branch of Reedy River Called Maypole Swamp Creek . . .” On the plat drawing itself the creek is labeled “Maple Swamp Creek.” Recorded 25 Nov. 1786.^[9] This plat and the immediately preceding one do not mention one another, but are quite similar, suggesting a relationship between the John and Robert Gilleland involved.

Placeholder: On 20 Aug. 1787 it was recorded that **Robert “Gilliland”** leased then released 271 acres of land in Greenville Co., S.C., from William Poke. The lease occurred on 3 Feb. 1787 between the two men, both “Planters” of Greenville Co., S.C., Gilliland receiving £10 sterling from Poke for the acreage lying on “south Branches of the Golden Grove Creek water of Saluda River,” being the whole tract granted to **Robert Gilliland** by the Governor on 5 Dec. 1785 (Grant Book G:280). On 9 Feb. 1787, for £80 sterling the release occurred.^[10]

The following important deed establishes that the John Gililand of Pendleton Co., S.C., was formerly of Lincoln Co., N.C., and appeared there as an heir in the will of Alexander Gililand, presumably his father (see appendix C):

On 29 Dec. 1797 **John “Gilliland” of Pendleton Co., S.C.**, sold to Andrew Falls of Lincoln Co., N.C., for \$170 a parcel “in the County of Lincoln & on the waters of Crowders Creek Joining and between John Dunwoody & **Rebecca Gillilands** Lands” containing 172 acres. The parcel is “Part of two Tracts of Land of Diverse Dates the One Granted to Sam^l Coburn Nov^r 16th 1764 & by him conveyed to William Wray by him to William Moore by him to **Alex^r Gilliland** & at his Decease Willed to sd **John Gilliland** the other Tract Granted to said **Alex^r Gilli-**

land the date at present not ascertained and willed also to said **John Gilliland.**” Proved in Lincoln County (N.C.) Court April Sessions 1801.^[11]

There are various spellings of the name that I have settled on as John Dinwoodie. Some of the variations we have already encountered here are: John Dinwoeds, John Dinwozey, and John Dunwooddy.

In 1800 **John “Gilliland,”** over 45 [born before 1755], resided in Pendleton Dist., S.C., with a woman 26–45 [born 1755–1774], and one male 16–26 [born 1774–1784].^[12] We believe our John¹ was born about 1764.

Placeholder: On 31 Mar. 1804 a survey was made, pursuant to a warrant of 31 Mar. 1804, in Greenville Dist., S.C. for a tract of land for **James “Gilleland,”** of 102 acres on “both sides of Wattaco branch of Wattaco’s creek the Middle fork of Saluda River.”^[13]

But in 1810 **John “Gilliland,”** 26–45 [born 1765–1784], resided in Greenville Co., S.C., with a woman 26–45 [born 1765–1784], one boy and five girls under 10, and one male and one female 10–16.^[14]

Placeholder: On 15 May 1813 a survey was made, pursuant to a warrant of 14 May 1813, in Greenville Dist., S.C. for a tract of land for **John “Gilleland,”** of 100 acres on “both sides of Oil Camp creek, Waters of the Middle fork of Saluda River,” bordering **David “Gilleland”** land. Chainbearers were **John Gilleland** and **Elijah Gilleland.**^[15]

Placeholder: In 1830 **Thomas Gilliland** and **Elijah Gilliland** appear in the census for Greenville Co., S.C. And they are listed together in the

1840 census for Pickens Dist., Pickens Co., S.C. In 1850 Elijah Gilliland and family are listed in Eastern Division, Pickens Co., S.C. **My current opinion is that these are not our Gilillands.**

Back to the Gilillands We Know

It appears that there must have been another John Gilliland in southern Kentucky (Logan Co.) at the same time as the one just above because of the following records, which we believe describe our John¹:

On 21 Aug. 1799 **John “Gillian”** [or “Gileian”] paid tax in Logan Co., Ky., for 200 acres on Drakes Creek, on land entered by Susannah Smith, with 1 white male over 21.^[16] [He does not appear in the 1796 or 1797 tax lists, and the 1798 list does not appear in the LDS records.] Drake’s Creek and Susannah Smith appear often in the following data.

Incidentally, the 1800 census reading above for John Gilliland in Pendleton Dist., S.C., brings the 1790 census item discussed earlier into question. Recall that it suggested John Gililand was married and had a small family by 1790, before his supposed 1791 or 1792 marriage to Charity Richardson.

Placeholder. I have not found a Susannah Smith survey of any sort. I found a William Smith survey for 100 acres on 19 Oct. 1796 but not on Drakes Creek (rather “on Buck Creek waters of Pawn Creek”). There were 200 acres in Logan Co., Ky., surveyed for David Smith on 9 Oct. 1796, “lying on Drakes Pond.” This doesn’t match in several ways but is as close as I’ve found.^[17]

On 2 and 6 July 1796 William Smith paid tax in Logan Co., Ky, the second for a large tract (7,400 acres).^[18]

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On 24 Apr. 1799 **William Lowe** paid tax in Logan Co., Ky., for two 200-acre tracts on Drakes Creek in Logan Co. and for one 200-acre tract on Drakes Creek in Warren Co., for land entered by respectively William Lowe, James Butler, and a Mr. Lawrence, with 1 white chargeable male over 21 and 5 horses.^[19]

On 21 Aug. 1799 **John “Gillian”** paid tax in Logan Co., Ky., for 200 acres on Drakes Creek, for land entered by and surveyed for Susannah Smith, with 1 white male over 21.^[20]

In 1800 **John “Gilliland”** paid tax in Logan Co., Ky., for 200 acres on Drakes Creek, entry by Gilliland, with 1 white male over 21 and 1 horse.^[21]

In 1801 **John “Gillelan”** paid tax in Logan Co., Ky., for 200 acres on Drakes Creek, entry by Gillelan, with 1 white titheable.^[22]

On 27 Mar. 1802 **John “Gilleland”** paid tax in Logan Co., Ky., for 200 acres on Drakes Creek, on land entered by William Smith, with 1 white male over 21 and 1 horse.^[23]

DGS 7834476, “2 July Smith W^m,” also in second set of 1796 records, p. 14, image 107 of 1012, “July 6th Smith William [1st rate] [B^l?] [2nd rate] [empty] [3rd rate] 7400 gren River Logan.”

GILLILLAND GENEALOGY

On 31 Aug. 1808 **John “Gilliand”** paid tax in Logan Co., Ky., for 200 acres on Drakes Creek, with 1 white over 21, 1 white 16–21 and 4 horses.^[28] [He is either missing or illegible in the 1809 tax list.]

In 1810 **John “Gilleland”** paid tax in Logan Co., Ky., for 200 acres on Elk Fork, on land entered by Susannah Smith, with 1 white over 21 and 5 horses.^[29] Confusingly, next to John is listed **Alexander “Gilleland”** who paid tax in Logan Co., Ky., on 100 acres on Elk Fork, on land entered by M. Neely, with 1 white over 21, 1 black, and 7 horses.^[30]

In 1810 **John “Gillerland,”** 26–45 [born 1765–1784], resided in Logan Co., Ky., with a woman 26–45 [born 1765–1784], another woman over 45 [born before 1765], three boys under 10 and one female 10–16.^[31]

On 20 June 1811 **John “Gilliland”** paid tax in Logan Co., Ky., for 202 acres on Drakes Creek, on land entered by Susannah Smith, surveyed for “Gilleland,” and patented to M. G., with 1 white over 21 and 4

N.B. John Gilliland (our John² Gililand) married 15 June 1812, Logan Co., Ky., “Agness” Lowe.^[34]

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On 25 July 1812 **John “Gilleland”** paid tax in Logan Co., Ky., for 202 acres on Drakes Creek, on land entered by Susannah Smith, surveyed for “Gilleland,” and patented to M G [Mathias Gililland?], with 1 white over 21 and 4 horses.^[40] Next to John is listed **Sam¹ “Gilliland”** who paid tax in Logan Co., Ky., on 1 white over 21 and 2 horses.^[41]

On 28 June 1813 **John “Gilliland Sen”** paid tax in Logan Co., Ky., for 200 [not 202] acres on Drakes Creek, on land entered by Susannah Smith, surveyed for “Gilleland,” and patented to M G [Mathias Gililland?], with 1 white over 21 and 5 horses.^[42] Next to John is listed **John “Gilliland Jun”** who paid tax in Logan Co., Ky., only on 2 horses [so probably just exactly 21 (implies born 1792, before 28 June)].^[43] Three items further on is listed **Sam¹ “Gilliland”** who paid tax in Logan Co., Ky., on 1 white over 21 and 4 horses.^[44]

In 1814 (and before 12 Oct. 1814) **John “Gilliland Sen”** paid tax in Logan Co., Ky., for 202 acres on Drakes Creek, on land patented to J. Gilliland, with no white over 21 counted and 5 horses and \$1,195 total value.^[45] Near John Sr. is listed **John “Gilliland Jun”** who paid tax in Logan Co., Ky., for one white male over 21 and 1 horse and \$59 total value.^[46] Several pages earlier is listed **Samuel “Gilliland”** who paid tax

in Logan Co., Ky., on 1 white over 21 and 3 horses and \$80 total value.^[47]

According to a published biographical sketch of Jesse R. Gililand (q.v.), “He [Jesse] was a son of **John and Agnes (Johnson [sic]) Gililand, who settled in Lincoln county, from Kentucky, as early as 1815.**” So we would expect the younger John Gililand to fall off the tax lists (if there are any) after 1815 in Logan Co., Ky.

On 13 Jan. 1815 **William Lowe** of Warren Co., Ky., sold to **John “Gilleland”** of Logan Co., Ky., for \$10, a parcel of 2–3 acres in Logan Co., “on the East side of the barren fork of Drakes creek.” The description mentions “till it intersects William Lowes last line, but of a two hundred acre survey then” and “**including the houses where John Gilleland now lives.**” Witnesses: **Barney Lowe** and John C. Pope. The deed was acknowledged 10 June 1815.^[48]

On 7 Feb. 1815 **William Lowe** of Warren Co., Ky., sold to **Barney Lowe** of the same place, “in consideration of a gift well and truly made unto him the said Barney Lowe by the William Lowe **his father** whereof him the said William Lowe do acknowledge himself content and satisfied,” a parcel of 26 acres in Logan Co., Ky. The land description starts with “Beginning on walnut near **John Gillilands** fence” and further mentions “to a black oak on the west side of said **John Gillilands** mill path thence to the beginning.” Witnesses: **John “Gilliland”** and John C. Pope. The deed was acknowledged 10 June 1815.^[49]

In 1815 **John “Gilleland”** paid tax in Logan Co., Ky., for 202 acres on Drakes Creek, with 1 white over 21 and 4 horses and \$908 total val-

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ue.^[50] Nearby is listed **John “Gilleland”** who paid tax in Logan Co., Ky., on 1 white male over 21 and 2 horses and \$60 total value.^[51] One page further on is listed **Sam¹ “Gilleland”** who paid tax in Logan Co., Ky., on 1 white over 21 and 4 horses and \$125 total value.^[52]

According to a biographical sketch of Jesse R. Gililland (q.v.), the younger John Gililland left Kentucky in about 1815 for Missouri, so we would expect no further records of him in Kentucky.

The following deed seems to imply that Mathias Gililland had land next to that of John Gililland (or it refers to the same 200 acres for which John had been paying taxes for years):

On 5 Feb. 1819 **Mathias “Gilleand”** and his wife, **Katherine**, of Logan Co., Ky., sold to **John “Gilleand,”** a planter of Logan Co., Ky., for \$300, a parcel of 200 acres in Logan Co., “on the Es^t Side of the barren fork of Drakes Creek.” The description mentions “line between Susannah Smith and **William Lowe.**” The tract was 200 acres originally surveyed 28 Aug. 1799. The spelling of the surname changes to “**Gilliland**” and then to “**Gilleland.**” The deed was signed by **Mathias Gilleland** and **Catherine** [her X mark] **Gilleland**. Witnesses: Peter Hendricks, Oliver Hays, and **William Gilleland**. The deed was acknowledged 7 Feb. 1819.^[53]

N.B. Simpson Co., Ky., was created in 1819 from (mostly) Logan Co., Ky.

In 1819 **John “Gilliland”** and **Samuel Gililland** were taxed in Simpson Co., Ky. **William Lowe** and **John F. Lowe** were in same list (q.v.).^[54]

In 1820 **John “Gillilan,”** over 45 [born before 1775], resided in Petersburg Twp., Simpson Co., Ky., with a woman 26-45 [born 1775-1794], two boys and three girls under 10, one male and one female 10-16, and one male and one female 16-26.^[55]

In 1820 **William Low,** over 45, resided in Petersburg Twp., Simpson Co., Ky., with a woman over 45, a male 10-16.^[56]

In 1830 **John “Gillen,”** 60-70 [born 1760-1770], resided in Simpson Co., Ky., with a woman 50-60, one male 10-15, one male and one female 15-20.^[57] This seems to be the only candidate in Simpson Co.

Placeholder: In 1840 **Elizabeth “Gilliland,”** 60-70, resided in Simpson Co., Ky., with one girl 5-10, one female 10-15, one male and one female 15-20.^[58]

In 1840 **James R. “Gilliland,”** 70-80 [born 1760-1770], resided in Simpson Co., Ky., with a woman 60-70, one male 10-15, and one male 20-30.^[59] LuAnn Elsinger suggests that James R. in this census is not the 70-80-year-old, but rather the 20-30-year-old residing with his parents. Thus this item would be for John¹ Gililland, 70-80, which is consistent with John “Gillen” of the 1830 census. And the woman 60-70 is consistent with the woman 50-60 of the 1830 item. I believe LuAnn is correct with this analysis. She further deduces that the 10-15-year-old boy might have been the elusive John Gililland, who married Rebecca Stonebreaker, which argument is revisited in its proper place.^[60]

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On 13 Mar. 1843 John N. Smart sold to **James R. Gililland** of Sumner Co., Tenn., for \$200, a parcel of 69 acres in Sumner Co., Tenn., “on both sides of the tract branch of the west folk [sic] of Drakes Creek in Barren River.” The land description mentions Kenson [perhaps Kenion] T. Skeen and Eli Ale[x]ander, and the parcel being “part of several tracts of land granted by the State of Tennessee and Kentucky [to] W^m M^cCord and Buckner S. Durham and others.”^[61] On 8 Aug. 1846 **James R. Gililland** sold this very same property to John Vance, both of Sumner Co., Tenn., for \$200.^[62]

Notice the similarity of the land description above in Sumner Co., Tenn., with that in the deed of 13 Jan. 1815 between **William Lowe** and **John “Gilleland”** in Logan Co., Ky. And also to that in the 5 Feb. 1819 deed between **Mathias “Gilleand”** and his wife, **Katherine**, of Logan Co., Ky., to **John “Gilleand.”**

N.B. The boundary between Tennessee and Kentucky was ambiguous until 1820. It was formally defined until then as 36°30' North, but a line north of there, called the “Walker line” was the de facto boundary until officially recognized as such in 1820. Logan Co., Ky., straddled the Walker line, (as did Simpson Co., Ky., derived from Logan Co., in 1819), as did Sumner Co., Tenn. Apparently this family cluster lived near the Walker line.

N.B. The Barren River feeds the Green River which feeds the Ohio River which feeds the Mississippi River. Drakes Creek feeds the Barren River at about Bowling Green, Warren Co., Ky. The West Fork of Drakes Creek passes near Franklin, Simpson Co., Ky., and then into Tennessee near Portland, Sumner Co. (also Robinson Co.).

The name I have transcribed as “Reeders” might be “Needers” or “Readers” or “Neaders”. Compare it to the name on the following line, which appears to read “Lewis Reeder in his family.” The first letter of this surname matches the lower part of the first letter of the second surname in the line above (i.e., the upper part of the “R” there, if that is what it is, is missing or is too faint).

Placeholder: On 1 Jan. 1862, John “Gilliland” signed his will in Pickens Co., S.C., and it was proved 2 Mar. 1863. It mentions “my beloved

Banks and wife for the love and affection I have for them,” “in case of the death of my wife Elizabeth Banks,” “my two nephews above named as John Roper & Robert Banks,” and appoints Warren T. Banks as executor. Witnesses were George Hendricks, Riley Simmons, and F. E. Hendricks.^[66] This has to be a different John Gilliland.

She would have been only 15 at marriage, but a more difficult problem is a birthplace of Tennessee, in the 1850 census, which doesn't seem quite right, but Sumner Co. is a possibility.

In 1820 Moses Chaney, 26–45 [born 1775–1794], resided in Franklin Twp., Simpson Co., Ky., with a woman 16–26 [born 1794–1804], three boys and three girls under 10, and another woman 16–26.^[68]

On 7 Oct. 1834 Moses Chaney of Morgan Co., Ill., was granted 80 acres in Greene Co., Ill., by the US government.^[69]

In 1850 Elizabeth Chaney, 55, born in Tennessee, resided in Greene Co., Ill., in the household of William Chaney, 31, a farmer born in Kentucky, with \$1,000 real estate, and with Mary Ann, 27, born in Illinois, Emily Jane, 9, Elizabeth E., 7, and Frances Ann, 4, all born in Illinois, and with Lewis Garret, 17, a farmer born in Illinois.^[74]

- + 4 iii **MATHIAS R.² GILILLAND**, born 12 Jan. 1798, married **CATHARINE HENDRICKS**, and had at least five children.
- + 5 iv **MARY “POLLY”² GILILLAND**, born about 1801, North Carolina, married **JOHN D. JAMISON**, and had at least three children. This marriage is listed just before John²'s second marriage in Lincoln Co., Mo., which argues that Mary² is a sister of John².
- 6 v **?NANCY “FANNY”² GILILLAND**, born about 1806, died before 1849, married **STEPHEN HEFFINGTON**. **Why do I have her here?**

In 1840 Stephen Heffington, 30-40, resided in Morgan Co., Ill., with a woman 30-40, and one girl under 5, one boy 5-10, one male and one female 10-15, next to John Heffington, 30-40.^[76]

N.B. Calhoun Co., Ill., is directly across the Mississippi River from Lincoln Co., Mo., and Morgan Co., Ill. is two counties (40-50 miles) northeastward from Calhoun Co.

Placeholder: Stephen "Hevington" of Calhoun Co., Ill., married 27 May 1850, Lincoln Co., Mo.,^[77] Rachel Ann Guin [transcribed as Green in one place], of Lincoln Co., Mo.

Placeholder: In 1850 Stephen Heffington, 32, a farmer born in Tennessee, with \$300 real estate, resided in Illinois Twp., Calhoun Co., Ill., with Rachel, 17, born in Kentucky, and with Malissa, 5, born in Illinois.^[78] So Malissa was a child of a previous marriage.

- + 7 vi **ROBERT² GILILLAND**, born about 1807, Kentucky, married **ANNE MOORE**, and had at least eight children. I deduce that Robert² was a brother of John² by their mutual appearance in Lincoln Co., Mo., from Kentucky.

2. **JOHN² GILILLAND** (*John¹*) was born 17 Jan. 1793 (calculated), South Carolina, died 28 Jan. 1852 (gravestone), aged 59 years 11 days, and was buried in Sulphur Lick Cem., Millwood, Lincoln Co., Mo.^[79] He married (1) 15 June 1812, Logan Co., Ky.,^[80] **AGNES² LOWE** (*William¹*), who was born say 1792 if 18 at marriage. He married (2) 25 Dec. 1825, Lincoln Co., Mo.,^[81] **ELIZABETH PRESLEY**, who was born 5 July 1807 (calculated), North Carolina, daughter of David Presley, and died 15 Aug. 1872, aged 65 years 1 month 10 days, and was buried near her husband.^[82]

His birthdate: The Logan Co., Ky., 1813 tax list implies John had just turned 21 on 28 June 1813, so was born in 1792 before 28 June. The 1814 tax list has him over 21 on 12 Oct. 1814, so turning 22 before 12 Oct. 1814, implying birth in 1792 before 12 Oct. His gravestone birthdate of 17 Jan. 1793 doesn't fit either of these. This suggests that he was born in 1792, not 1793. Perhaps he was born 17 Jan. 1792, in which case John¹'s marriage to Charity probably occurred in 1791, not 1792.

Middle Name Creep gives Agnes Lowe's middle name as **Johnson**. In this case there is one bit of evidence, but of questionable quality. An 1884 *History of Audrain County, Missouri*, gives Jesse R. Gililland's parents as John Gililland and Agnes Johnson although Johnson was not her sur-

name. The full excerpt appears in Jesse's sketch (q.v.) in this relevant sentence:

He was a son of John and Agnes (Johnson [sic]) Gililand, who settled in Lincoln county, from Kentucky, as early as 1815, when Missouri was still a Territory.^[83]

[Middle Name Creep](#) gives Elizabeth Presley's middle name as [Francis](#). I have no evidence that it was, however. Similarly, Jesse R. Gililand is often given the middle name [Richardson](#), but I have found no evidence for it.

N.B. Lincoln County formed from St. Charles Co., Mo., in 1819.

In 1821 **John and Mathias Gililand** were listed as taxpayers in Union Twp., Lincoln Co., Mo.^[84]

On 2 July 1821 **Mathias "Gilliland"** was fined \$3 for nonattendance as a grand juror for Lincoln Co., Mo.^[85]

On 5 Nov. 1821 **"Matthias Gilliland"** was selected as a grand juror for Lincoln Co., Mo.^[86]

On 5 Apr. 1824 **John "Gillerland"** was selected as a grand juror for Lincoln Co., Mo.^[87]

On 6 Dec. 1824 **Mathias R. "Gillerland"** was selected as a grand juror for Lincoln Co., Mo.^[88]

On 8 Feb. 1830 **“Matthias” R. “Gillerland”** was selected as a grand juror for Lincoln Co., Mo.^[91]

In 1830 John “Gilliland,” 30-40 [born 1790-1800], resided in Lincoln Co., Mo., with a woman 20-30 [Elizabeth, born 1800-1810], one boy and one girl under 5 [born 1825-1830], two boys 5-10 [Allen, Isaac, born 1820-1825], two males and one female 10-15 [Leven, Jesse, Polly, born 1815-1820], and one female 15-20 [Charity, born 1810-1815].^[92]

Mathias and **Robert “Gilliland”** are also both in this census in Lincoln Co., Mo. (q.v.).

On 19 Dec. 1834 John Gililland and his wife, Elizabeth, of Lincoln Co., Mo., sold to Benjamin Kinion, of the same place, for \$48.35, 80 acres in Lincoln Co.^[93]

Also on 19 Dec. 1834 John Gililland and his wife, Elizabeth, of Lincoln Co., Mo., sold to William Moore, of the same place, for \$50, 38.69 acres in Lincoln Co.^[94] William was probably their son-in-law, via daughter Margaret, as of 1833.

On 15 and 16 Apr. 1835, land for John “Gilliland” in Lincoln Co. was surveyed by James Finley, the county surveyor. Listed among the chain carriers for the survey was John’s son, Jesse R. “Gilliland.”^[95]

On 6 Apr. 1839 John “Gilliland” and Elizabeth, his wife, and Mathias “Gilliland” and Catharine, his wife, and Benjamin Kinion and Polly, his wife, gave as a gift to the Sulphur Lick Baptist Church of Lincoln Co., Mo., lands belonging to each to be used as a graveyard. The three women relinquished their dower rights.^[96]

[I stopped here in deeds index: 57/281. There are more items.]

In 1850 John “Gilleland,” 47 [sic, born 1803! Note that 57 would have been about right], a farmer born in South Carolina with \$1,500 real estate, resided in Dist. 49, Lincoln Co., Mo., with Elizabeth, 44, born in North Carolina, illiterate, and with Elizabeth, 17, Sarah, 14, James, 11, Cynthia, 9, Louis, 7, Alexander, 5, Levi, 4, Isaac W., 26, Mary, 25, John, 4, Elizabeth, 2, and Isaac W. Jr., 8/12, all born in Missouri.^[97] I believe that the persons in blue have surname Gilmore, not Gililand. This explains the mention of “Mary Gilmore my daughter” in John’s will (next paragraph).

On 24 Apr. 1846 John Gililand signed his will in Lincoln Co., Mo., and it was proved 11 May 1852. It mentions “Charity Ligon my daughter,” “Margaret Moore my daughter,” “I have heard my son William L. Gililand is dead,” “Jesse R. Gililand,” “my son Allen J. Gililand,” “my son John B. Gililand,” “Mary Gilmore my daughter,” “my wife Elizabeth,” “her [Elizabeth’s] children by me . . . except David P & Nancy Gililand.” Witnesses: Frances B. Clare and William F. Clare. Proved by Francis B. Clare and David P. Gililand.^[98]

On 11 May 1853 Elizabeth Gililland was bonded as executrix of the estate of John Gililland deceased with security guaranteed by John B. Gililland and George Presley.^[99]

On 16 Feb. 1854 the estate of **David Presley** deceased was settled in Lincoln Co., Mo. The settlement mentions Peter Presley's heirs, George Presley, David Presley, Jacob Presley's heirs, Anthony Presley's heirs, William Presley's heirs, Polly Cantrel, **Betsey "Gilliland,"** Nancy Cox, Lewis Presley, and Peter Presley.^[100]

In 1860 Elizabeth "Gilliland," 62, a farmer born in North Carolina with \$2,000 real and \$60 personal estates, resided in Millwood, Millwood Twp., Lincoln Co., Mo., with James, 21, Louis P., 18, "Alex" L., 16, Levi "T.," 12, and Statia Webb, 21, a laborer, all born in Missouri.^[101] N.B. Statia Webb (Jr.) was son of Statia Webb and Sarah Bell Riggs, daughter of Bethuel Riggs (see my book on Bethuel Riggs).

In 1870 "Eliz^h Gilliland," 65 [sic], retired, born in North Carolina with \$5,600 real and \$2,500 personal estates, resided in Millwood, Millwood Twp., Lincoln Co., Mo., with Alexander L., 26, a farmer, and Levi S., 23, a farmer, both born in Missouri, and with four Gilmore children: Margaret, 17, Mattie, 12, Johnson, 10, and Rebecca, 7, all born in Missouri. N.B. next door was the John T. Gilmore family with many children.^[102]

- + 25 xvi **LEVI SANFORD³ GILILLAND**, born 23 May 1846, near Mackville, Lincoln Co., Mo., and had no children.

4. MATHIAS R.² GILILLAND (*John¹*) was born 12 Jan. 1798. He married (bonded) 17 Jan. 1818, Sumner Co., Tenn.,^[106] **CATHARINE HENDRICKS**, who was born 1790–1800.

His middle name: It was almost certainly Richardson—named for his maternal grandfather Mathias Richardson—but I have no evidence to support it.

Repeated from the sketch of John¹: On 5 Feb. 1819 **Mathias “Gilleand”** and his wife, **Katherine**, of Logan Co., Ky., sold to **John “Gilleand,”** a planter of Logan Co., Ky., for \$300, a parcel of 200 acres in Logan Co., “on the Es^t Side of the barren fork of Drakes Creek.” The description mentions “line between Susannah Smith and **William Lowe.**” The tract was 200 acres originally surveyed 28 Aug. 1799. The spelling of the surname changes to “**Gilliland**” and then to “**Gilleland.**” The deed was signed by **Mathias Gilleland** and **Catherine** [her mark] **Gilleland**. On 6 Oct. 1828 **John “Gillerland”** was selected as a grand juror for Lincoln Co., Mo.^[114]

On 8 Feb. 1830 **“Matthias” R. “Gillerland”** was selected as a grand juror for Lincoln Co., Mo.^[115]

In 1830 **Mathias “Gilliland,”** 30-40 [born 1790-1800], resided in Lincoln Co., Mo., with a woman 30-40, and three boys and one girl under 5 [Charity, William, and James], one boy and one girl 5-10 [John and Mary], one male 10-15 [Peter], and one male 20-30 [?] for a total of 10 persons.^[116]

On 2 Apr. 1832 **Mathias R. Gililland** of Lincoln Co., Mo., was granted 77.38 acres of land in Missouri.^[117]

On 4 July 1836 **Mathias R. Gililland** sold to **John Gililland**, both of Lincoln Co., Mo., for \$15, 1.77 acres in Lincoln Co.^[118]

On 30 Dec. 1837 **Mathias R. Gililland** mortgaged to **John Gililland**, both of Lincoln Co., Mo., for \$100, 77.38 acres in Lincoln Co., the parcel granted to Mathias by the United States on 2 Apr. 1832.^[119]

two males and one female 10-15 [Charity, William, and James], one male 15-20 [John, Mary had married], and one male 20-30 [Peter].^[120]

On 24 May 1841 **Mathias R. Gililand** mortgaged to Walton Perkins, both of Lincoln Co., Mo., for \$125, 77.38 acres in Lincoln Co. He paid off the mortgage on 4 Dec. 1843.^[121]

On 10 Jan. 1842 **Mathias R. Gililand** mortgaged to **Jonathan Reeder**, both of Lincoln Co., Mo., for \$300, 80 acres in Lincoln Co.^[122]

On 2 Feb. 1842 **Mathias R. Gililand** mortgaged to **Peter H. Gililand**, both of Lincoln Co., Mo., for \$1,575, 77.38 acres in Lincoln Co. He paid off the mortgage on 29 Oct. 1852.^[123]

On 4 Feb. 1842 **Mathias R. Gililand and Catharine, his wife**, sold to **Richard Ives**, both parties of Lincoln Co., Mo., for \$400, 120 acres in Lincoln Co. in three parts. Catharine relinquished her dower rights in the property.^[124]

On 23 July 1842 **Peter H. Gililand** and **Mathias R. Gililand** mortgage to Charles Wheeler, trustee of Emanuel Block and Eleazer Block (merchants styled as E. Block and Brother), both parties of Lincoln Co., Mo., for \$177.30, payable in 12 months at 10% interest, 237.38 acres in Lincoln Co. in three parts.^[125]

Gililland because of the 2 Feb. and 23 July 1842 joint financial transactions they shared.

JAMISON**, who was born about 1799, Virginia. This marriage is listed just before John² Gililland’s second marriage on 25 Dec. 1825, Lincoln Co., Mo., which argues that Mary² is a sister of John².

N.B. This is where my correspondent and genealogist LuAnn Elsinger entered my research. She determined that John “Jimerson” in the mar-

riage record was actually John D. Jamison. LuAnn's branch of the Gilliland family descends from this marriage.^{[128][129]}

N.B. Pike Co. abuts Lincoln Co., Mo.

On 21 Mar. 1826 Matthew McDowel and Ann, his wife, of Pike Co., Mo., sold to John D. Jamison of Calumet Twp., Pike Co., Mo., for \$112, a parcel of 80 acres in Calumet Twp., Pike Co. "whereon the said John D. Jamison now resides," being the tract W½NE S34 T52N R1E. The agreement was acknowledged and Ann relinquished her dower on 29 Mar. 1826.^[130]

On 4 June 1827 **John D. Jamison and Polly, his wife**, of Pike Co., Mo., sold to James Jamison of the same place, for \$112, a parcel of 80 acres in Pike Co. "which lies north of Gwins creek," being the tract W½NE S34 T52N R1E. The agreement was acknowledged and Polly relinquished her dower on 4 June 1827.^[131] I would expect James to be a brother or other close kin (but not son) of John. The very next deed in the deed book has James Jamison and his wife, Elizabeth, selling this very property to Samuel Jamison on 9 Apr. 1838.^[132]

In 1830 John D Jamison, 30-40 [born 1790-1800], resided in Pike Co., Mo., with a woman 20-30 [born 1800-1810], and one boy under 5 [James, about 3]. Several other Jamisons were listed next to him.^[133]

On 14 Oct. 1836 James L. Jamison and Easter, his wife, sold to John D. Jamison, for \$150, a parcel of 40 acres in Pike Co. "on the waters of

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Gwyns creek,” being the tract [NESW?] S35 T52N R1E. The agreement was acknowledged and Easter relinquished her dower on 1 Mar. 1838.^[134] I suspect I might be misinterpreting “north Half of the South west half qu” here. NESW might be the intention, and satisfies the 40-acres specification.

On 19 Jan. 1839 Thomas Dolan and Catharine, his wife, of Pike Co., Mo., sold (mortgaged) to John D. Jamison of the same place, for \$150, a parcel of land in Pike Co. which “said land is the same that I now live on and the same that I purchased of John Jamison for a full description, see the original title of said John Jamison.” The agreement was acknowledged and Catharine released her dower on 23 Jan. 1839. The condition of the mortgage was agreed to by both parties on 19 Jan. 1839.^[135]

In 1840 John D. “Jamieson,” 40–50 [born 1790–1800], resided in Pike Co., Mo., with a woman 40–50, and one girl under 5 [Catherine, age 2], one girl 5–10, and one male 10–15 [James].^[136]

On 20 Mar. 1841 James R. Patton and Elizabeth, his wife, of Pike Co., Mo., sold to John D. Jamison of the same place, for \$360, a parcel of 80 acres in Pike Co., being the tract E½NE S34 T52N R1E. The agreement was acknowledged and Elizabeth relinquished her dower on 20 Mar. 1841.^[137]

On 29 Mar. 1842 Thomas Dolan and Catharine, his wife, of Pike Co., Mo., sold to John D. Jamison of the same place, for \$400, a parcel of 80 acres in Pike Co. “on the waters of Gwyns creek,” being the tract E½SW S35 T52N R1E. The agreement was acknowledged and Catharine released her dower on 29 Mar. 1842.^[138]

On 27 Feb. 1844 **John D. Jamison and Mary, his wife**, of Pike Co., Mo., sold to Samuel Jamison of the same place, for \$300, a parcel of 40 acres in Pike Co. “on Gwyns creek,” being the tract SWNE S34 T52N R1E. The agreement was acknowledged and Mary relinquished her dower on 28 Feb. 1844.^[139]

On 27 Feb. 1844 **John D. Jamison and Mary, his wife**, sold to Abraham M. Thomas, for \$350, a parcel of 200 acres in Pike Co. “on the waters of Gwyns creek,” being the tracts E½NE S34 T52N R1E, [NESW?] S35 T52N R1E, and E½SW S35 T52N R1E. The agreement was acknowledged and Mary relinquished her dower on 28 Feb. 1844.^[140]

These last deeds suggest John and Mary were selling out of Pike Co., Mo., in 1844 in preparation for the move to Grant Co., Wis.

In 1850 John D. Jamison, 51, a miner born in Virginia, resided in Grant Co., Wis., with Mary, 49, born in North Carolina, and with Catherine E., 12, and Nancy E., 7, both born in Missouri. Next door resided James W. Jamison, 23, born in Missouri and his wife, Phebe A., and family.^[141]

In 1855 John D. Jamison resided in Beetown, Grant Co., Wis., one male and three females.^[142]

On 1 June 1858, a parcel of 40 acres in Grant Co., Wis., was granted to John D. Jamison of Grant Co., Wis., by the US government.^[143]

In 1860 John D. “Jameson,” 60, a miner born in Virginia, with \$400 real and \$100 personal estates, resided in Beetown, Grant Co., Wis., with Mary, 59, born in North Carolina. Next door was Henry Mayne,

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45, and his wife, Matilda. A few doors away resided James W. “Jamison,” 30, born in Missouri and his family.^[144]

In 1875 John D. Jamison resided in Beetown, Grant Co., Wis., one male and no females. Four other Jamisons were listed next to him.^[145]

7. ROBERT² GILILLAND (John¹) was born about 1807, Kentucky, and died after he signed his will 21 Mar. 1873 in Lincoln Co., Mo., and before it was proved 4 Nov. 1874. He married ANNE MOORE,^[146] who was born about 1807, Kentucky, and apparently died just prior to 13 Mar. 1889 (when Robert’s estate was finally settled with the heirs). In fact, she died 15 Feb. 1889 according to the *Montgomery City Standard* newspaper, Montgomery Co., Mo.^[147]

I have not yet established when Robert² came to Missouri. I don’t have any evidence yet that he came when John² and Mathias² did in, say 1820. Thus it is possible that Mourning³ Gililland, born about 1824 in

Kentucky was his child before his move. The only reason for this guess is that in 1870 she resided near Benjamin A.³ Gililand, Robert's son. But we don't yet know who her name mourns. Note that there is no slot for her in the 1830 census item, next.

In 1840 "Robt." Gililand, 30-40, resided in Union Twp., Lincoln Co., Mo., with a woman 30-40, and two girls under 5 [Mary and Martha], and two boys and two girls 5-10 [Benjamin and John and ?].^[149]

In 1850 Robert "Gilleland," 43, a farmer born in Kentucky with \$2,000 real estate, resided in Dist. 49, Lincoln Co., Mo., with "Ann," 43, born in Kentucky, and with Benjamin, 22, a mechanic born in in Kentucky, and with John R., 20, Mary A., 14, Martha, 12, Elizabeth, 10, William H., 8, Robert [D?], 6, Matilda, 3, George W., 5/12, all born in Missouri.^[150]

In 1860 Robert "Gilliland," 52, a farmer and blacksmith born in Kentucky, with \$3,750 real and \$1,300 personal estates, resided in Last Branch, Millwood Twp., Lincoln Co., Mo., with "Annie," 54, born in Kentucky, and with Benjamin, 22, a mechanic born in in Kentucky, and with Martha, 24, "Eliza^b" McGlosson, 22, Robert, 15, Matilda, 12, "Geo." W., 8, Geo. C. McGlosson, 1, all born in Missouri, and with Wesley Watson, 27, schoolteacher, "Eliza^b," 21, and Louisa F., 6/12, all three born in Missouri. On the same page is James R. "Gilliland," 30, and (cont. from preceding page) "Benj." A. "Gilliland," 32, and on the preceding page, "Jno." R. "Gilliland," 30.^[151]

In 1870 Robert "Gilliland," 65, a retired farmer born in Kentucky, with \$3,750 real and \$2,500 personal estates, resided in Millwood, Millwood Twp., Lincoln Co., Mo., with "Anna," 67, born in Kentucky, and

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with Benjamin, 22, a mechanic born in in Kentucky, and with “Elizab” F. “McGlosser,” 34, Robert S., 25, George “H.,” 19, Stephen D. Hudson, 12, farm worker, Matilda H. “Veerkamp,” 23, and the Veerkamp children: William, 5, Anna, 3, and Mary, 1, with all members of the household but Robert and Anne born in Missouri.^[152]

On 21 Mar. 1873 Robert Gililland signed his will in Lincoln Co., Mo., and it was proved on 4 Nov. 1874. It mentions “my beloved wife Anne Gililland,” “my two widowed daughters Matilda M. VeerKamp and Elizabeth F. McGlosson,” the SWNW S20 T50 R2W parcel he owned, “my several children, sheare and sheare alike (except my daughter Martha Ross) names as follows: Benjamin A. Gililland, John R. Gililland, Charity E. Holly [sic], Elizabeth F. McGlosson, Matilda M. VeerKam [sic], Robert S. Gililland, George W. Gililland,” “my grandchild Stephen D. Hudson [under 21].”^[153]

In 1880 “Ann” Gililland, 73, a widow born in Kentucky of Kentucky natives, resided in Millwood Twp., Lincoln Co., Mo., in the household of her son, George Gililland, 28, a farmer born in Missouri of Kentucky natives, his wife, Martha, 21, born in Missouri of Missouri natives, and his [George’s] nephew, John Ross, 13, born in Missouri of Missouri natives.^[154]

On 13 Mar. 1889 an administration bond was made in Lincoln Co., Mo., for Robert S. Gililland for the estate of Robert Gililland, with securities by Benj. A. Gililland and Parvin Holland. The document lists the heirs of Robert Gililland in this order: Benj. A. Gililland, John R. Gililland, Charity E. Holley, Elizabeth F. Soloman, Matilda M. Holland, Robert S. Gililland, Geo. W. Gililland, and Martha Ross.^[155] Presuma-

bly, since Robert had died prior to Nov. 1874 when his will was proved, this further settlement of the estate must have followed the death of Robert's wife, Anne.

37 i ?**MOURNING MERIAM**³ **GILILLAND**, born about 1824, Kentucky, married (1) 23 Mar. 1843, Lincoln Co., Mo.,^[157] **WILLIAM PRESLEY**, who died intestate before 4 Nov. 1850,^[158] when Mourning was bonded as administratrix of his estate in Lincoln Co., Mo., and had three children. She married (2) 22 June 1854, Lincoln Co., Mo., **MARION VAUGHN**. She married (3) 27 Jan. 1859, Lincoln Co., Mo.,^[159] **LEWIS GRAHAM [GRIMES]**, who died before 23 Oct. 1882, when John T. Gilmore, administrator of the Lewis Graham estate declared three sons, including Joseph A. Graham, to be his legal heirs (the other two from a first marriage).^[160]

Mourning is almost certainly not a child of Robert². Her birth in Kentucky (and the censuses are consistent in that) doesn't fit John's

In 1850 Mourning Presley, 26, a widow born in Kentucky, with \$120 real estate, resided in Dist. 49, Lincoln Co., Mo., with David, 5, Jacob, 3, Mary E., 1, all born in Missouri, and Charity J. "Gilliland," 22, born in Kentucky. David Presley, 76, resided nearby.^[161] Note that Charity J., born about 1828, Ky., clashes with Charity E., born about 1833, Mo., in the list below.

In 1860 Lewis "Grimes," 41, a farmer born in Kentucky, with \$1,000 real and \$300 personal estates, resided in Millwood, Millwood Twp., Lincoln Co., Mo., with Mourning, 35, born in Kentucky, and with four children, 4-11, who must have been children of his previous marriage.^[162]

In 1870 Lewis Graham, 50, a farmer born in Kentucky of Kentucky natives, resided in Cuivre, Millwood Twp., Lincoln Co., Mo., with Mourning, 40, born in Kentucky, and with Joseph A., 10, born in Missouri, young enough to be Mourning's child. Nearby resided Benj. A. "Gilliland," 42, with Martha Presley, 15, in the household.^[163]

In 1880 Lewis "Grimes," 60, a farmer born in Kentucky, with \$900 real and \$350 personal estates, resided in Millwood Twp., Lincoln Co., Mo., with Mourning, 65, born in Kentucky of Kentucky natives, and with Joseph A., 20, born in Missouri.^[164]

8. **JAMES R.**² **GILILLAND** (*John*¹) was born about 1811, Kentucky. He lived for decades with **MARGARET A. (GIBSON) BAYLESS**, who was born about 1814, Kentucky, and her family from Mr. Bayless. There are clues that they lived as a common law couple, but nothing definite, and they had no children. I deduce that James R. was a son of John¹ because surely Martha A. (Gililland) Reeder (next sketch) was a daughter, and James apparently resided with her at one time.

The following two items are repeated from John¹'s sketch for convenience to show the probable connection to the John¹ Gililland family:

GILLILAND GENEALOGY

Using the analysis of LuAnn Elsinger mentioned in John¹'s sketch, in 1840 James R. "Gilliland," 20-30 [born 1810-1820], resided in Simpson Co., Ky., with a male 70-80 [born 1760-1770], with a woman 60-70, one male 10-15.^[165] LuAnn deduced that the older couple were James R.²'s parents and that the 10-15-year-old boy might have been the elusive John Gililland who married Rebecca Stonebreaker (see below). I shall tentatively place him as a child of James R.²

On 13 Mar. 1843 John N. Smart sold to James R. Gililland of Sumner Co., Tenn., for \$200, a parcel of 69 acres in Sumner Co., Tenn., "on both sides of the tract branch of the west folk [sic] of Drakes Creek in Barren River." The land description mentions Kenson [perhaps Kenion] T. Skeen and Eli Ale[x]ander, and the parcel being "part of several tracts of land granted by the State of Tennessee and Kentucky [to] W^m M^cCord and Buckner S. Durham and others."^[166] **William Lowe** is buried in the Skeen Cem., Simpson Co., Ky. His son **John F. Lowe** died in the residence of K. T. Skeen in 1854, John Lowe's widow Mary resided in that residence in 1860.

In 1850 there is a J. R. "Gilliland," 43, born in Kentucky residing with Jonathan M. Reeder, 39, in Simpson Co., Ky., with M. A., 37.^[167] See the sketch for putative sister Martha A.² Gililland. He was perhaps this James R.² Gililand, but the 1807 birth doesn't quite fit. Their father John¹ is thought to have died in the Reeder home in 1849 (q.v.). So I suspect that this has to be our James R.²

In 1850 Margaret "Balys," 36, illiterate, born in Kentucky, resided in Allen Co., Ky., with C., 16, female, L. C., 13, male, E. J., 10, female, P. F., 6, female, and A. A., 8/12, female, all born in Kentucky.^[168] This Bayless family resided with James R. Gililland in the next three censuses.

Clara Smith nee Bayless, born 16 Aug. 1834, Simpson Co., Ky., died 24 Aug. 1924, Glasgow, Barren Co., Ky. Her father was – Bayless, born in Kentucky, and her mother was “Peggy” A. Gibson, born in Simpson Co., Ky.^[169] This establishes Margaret Bayless as Peggy A. Gibson, and the C. “Balys” in the 1850 census as Clara (Bayless) Smith.

In the 1853 tax list for Allen Co., Ky., is “Balus Margaret” with four children between 6 and 18, but no Gililand.^[170]

In the 1854 tax list for Allen Co., Ky., is “Balus Margaret” with three children between 6 and 18, but no Gililand.^[171]

In the 1855 tax list for Allen Co., Ky., are “Balis Margaret” with two children between 6 and 18, and “Gilliland James R.”^[172]

On 19 Sept. 1856 James R. “Gilliland,” bought from Henry C. Hancock, both of Allen Co., Ky. [adjacent to Simpson Co., Ky.], for \$875 a parcel of 180 acres in Allen Co. “on the waters of the middle fork of drakes Creek.” It was acknowledged on 10 Nov. 1856.^[173]

In the 1856 tax list for Allen Co., Ky., are “Balis Margaret” with four children between 6 and 18, and “Gilleland James R” on Middlefork.^[174]

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In the 1857 tax list for Allen Co., Ky., are “Bailes Margaret” with three [but crossed out] children between 6 and 18, and “Gilleland James R” on two parcels.^[175]

In the 1858 tax list for Allen Co., Ky., are “Bayless Margaret” with three children between 6 and 18, and “Gilleland James R” on one parcel.^[176]

In the 1859 tax list for Allen Co., Ky., are “Balis Peggy” (next to “Balis Levi”) with three children between 6 and 18, and “Gillilan James R” with two parcels on “Sulpher” Fork.^[177]

In the 1860 tax list for Allen Co., Ky., are “Balis Peggy” (next to “Balus Levi C” with a parcel on Sulphur Fork) with three children between 6 and 18, and “Gilliland James R” with one parcel on Sulphur Fork.^[178] I ceased looking at the tax lists here, having inspected the lists for years 1853–1860.

In 1860 J. R. Gililland, 49, a farmer born in Kentucky, with \$2,500 real and \$600 personal estates, resided in Mt. Aerial, Buttersville Dist., Allen Co., Ky., with Margaret “Balus,” 50, A. A. Balus, 7, female, Elizabeth Balus, 19, Permecee Balus, 15, L. F. Balus, 6, female, Levi Balus, 21, a farmer, all born in Kentucky, and one farmhand.^[179] The new Bayless addition here since the 1850 census, in which there was no Mr. Bayless, was Louisa F., born about 1854. Note that James R. Gililland first shows up in Allen Co., Ky., on the 1855 tax list.

Elizabeth Bayless married (licensed) 23 Nov. 1860, Sumner Co., Tenn.,^[180] Jason Meador. They had a child, Mathias W. Meador. His death certificate lists his father as Jason Meador and his mother as **Elizabeth “Gillian.”**^[181] Although most records give her name as Bayless, it might have been commonly stated as Gililand, given the living arrangements of the mother.

But a death certificate for Ollie M. (Meador) Downs, born 1 Dec. 1867, Scottsville, Allen Co., Ky., died 29 July 1937, Ft. Worth, Tarrant Co., Texas, gives her parents as Jason Meador and America (not Elizabeth) Bayless.^[182] This is an error because America Bayless was unmarried in 1870 (see next item). Furthermore, she married Lafayette Creekmure, and had at least one child, Charles Pinckney Creekmure, born 6 Sept. 1871, Kentucky.^[183]

In 1870 James R. “Gilliland,” 59, a farmer born in Kentucky, with \$1,000 real and \$450 personal estates, resided in Buttersville, Allen Co., Ky., with “Margret Bailess,” 55, America Bailess, 18, “Louwisa” F. Bailess, 16, all born in Kentucky, and one boy.^[184]

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In 1880 James R. “Gilliland,” 69, widower, a farmer born in Kentucky of South Carolina natives, resided in Scottsville Dist., Allen Co., Ky., with his “daughter,” **Louisa F. Gilliland**, 27, born in Kentucky of Kentucky natives. Lafayette “Creekmore” and his wife America resided next door.^[185] So apparently Louisa used James’s surname after the death of her mother, who apparently never did marry James. It’s possible that he adopted Louisa, and it’s barely possible that he was indeed her father, but the tax lists argue against it. I’ve not found any further evidence about her.

It was in the J. Reeder household in Simpson Co., Ky., that John¹ Gililand died (see the 1850 Kentucky Mortality Schedule). The entry next to his was for Lewis Reeder, age 70 (see Figure 1). Placeholder: An un sourced family tree on <Ancestry.com> (Reynolds-Dalton Families) has James Lewis Reeder married to Isabel Duncan as parents of Jonathan Reeder, born 17 Feb. 1811, Simpson Co., Ky., died 6 Nov. 1857. Isabel Duncan does not fit the “M. Reeder” in the death record we have for Jonathan M. Reeder. But it references “James L. Reeder Bible, Joshua Reeder Bible and Lewis Reeder Bible,” pp. 127–132, at the Simpson Co. Historical Society, Franklin, Simpson Co., Ky.^[189]

In 1840 Jonathan M. Reeder, 20–30, resided in Simpson Co., Ky., with a woman 20–30, one boy [James] and two girls [M. M. and Arabella] under 5, and one girl 5–10 [Charity].^[190]

In 1850 Jonathan M. Reeder, 39, a farmer born in Kentucky with \$1,000 real estate, resided in Simpson Co., Ky., with M. A., 37, female, born in Kentucky, and with C. F., 17, female, J.A.P., 15, male, M. M., 13, female, A., 11, female, J.L.R., 8, male, W. M., 6, male, M. E., 9/12, female, all born in Kentucky, and with J. R. Gilliland, 43, male, a laborer born in Kentucky, and Joseph Douglass, 26, a laborer born in Kentucky. This census was enumerated on 28 Aug. 1850.^[191]

Note that J. R. Gilliland would have been born about 1807, Kentucky, so doesn’t match John R. Gililand, Mathias’s brother, born 1793. 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died 5 Aug. 1910, Laddonia, and was buried 7 Aug. 1910 next to Jesse in the Laddonia Cem., Audrain Co.^[216]

The family story has it that Ann, as she prepared to die, requested her good friend, Eliza Ferrell, to marry Jesse and care for the children.^[217]

An *History of Audrain County, Missouri*, published 1884, places Jesse R. Gililland and James Gililland, probably Jesse's son, in the eastern part of Prairie Twp. "at the beginning of the war," or about 1861. The history describes Jesse as the first blacksmith in Laddonia, known as "the Laddonia joker."^[218] Here is a transcription—purple prose and all (except the

Jesse R. Gililand, justice of the peace of Prairie township and retired merchant, Laddonia. ‘Squire Gililand, an old and respected citizen of Audrain county, and one of the first residents of Laddonia, is a **native Missourian**, and comes of one of the pioneer families of the north-eastern part of this State. He was a **son of John and Agnes (Johnson [sic]) Gililand, who settled in Lincoln county, from Kentucky, as early as 1815**, when Missouri was still a Territory. His father was a typical pioneer settler, a man of iron constitution, indomitable resolution and great courage, a worthy representative of that stalwart, fearless race of men whose enterprise and brawn and brain have opened the way for civilization across an unknown continent, and planted in the heart of vast wilds the foundations of great and prosperous States. When the smoke of the camp-fire of this sturdy old pioneer curled for the first time above the green wilderness of Lincoln county, the red man of the forest still made his home within its borders, and the slow-paced bear and sad-voiced wolf still drank at its brooks as they murmured on down to the bosom of the mighty Missouri.

But here on the banks of the Missouri a great Commonwealth was to be founded, forests were to be cleared away, homes established and civilized society organized. This was the work laid out for the brave-hearted pioneer fathers of the State to do—a work grander in its conception and nobler in its results than the virgil-sung achievements of the storm-tossed heroes of Troy, but a work, nevertheless, which they nobly performed.

In bringing about this mighty transformation, a transformation only less sudden than it was gigantic and splendid, **John Gililand** bore a brave and worthy part. For nearly half a century he wielded his ax with willing hand and turned up the soil of the new-cleared lands to nourish and yield

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abundant harvests. With the growth and development of the country he, too, advanced in prosperity and became, many years before his death, one of the substantial farmers and influential citizens of the county. He **left a large family of children, a number of whom still reside in Lincoln county**, and are classed among its best citizens. **'Squire Gililland, his second son, was born on the old Gililland homestead in that county on the 17th of November, 1819.** His early youth was spent on the farm, and his school advantages were limited to the elementary instruction given in the stick-chimney, log school-houses of the period. Among all the better races of men there is a wide diversity of natural aptitudes, one individual possessing a marked talent or inclination in a given direction, a second varying from the first, a third from the second, and so on through all the long gamut of human versatility and skill. From an early age 'Squire Gililland showed a distinguishing taste for mechanical pursuits and a wonderful skill in handling the tools of the mechanic arts. His talents as well as his manual deftness in this direction were of a high order, and with the advantages of an advanced education and competent instructions in the mechanic arts he would doubtless have risen to distinction in this department of life. But in that early day the carpenter's bench, the anvil, and a few other trades of a primitive kind, were the only fields open for young men of mechanical genius and skill. Colleges of the mechanic arts were not then even heard of. But yielding, notwithstanding, to the natural bent of his inclinations, **at the age of sixteen he apprenticed himself to the auger-maker's trade**, then one of the most advanced of the mechanical occupations. This he learned thoroughly, but soon the manufacture of augers by machiner was begun, and he was thus driven from his trade. Nearest **allied to his was the blacksmith's trade**, which the ken of the inventor has never been able to supplant; **and to this he naturally turned his attention on quitting the occupation of auger making.** 'Squire Gililland worked at the blacksmith's trade a number of years, and in this accumulated a comfortable start in life. **On the 1st day of May, 1838 [sic], he was married to Miss Annie Shaw, a daughter of James Shaw,** one of the early settlers and respected citizens of Lincoln county. **Continuing to reside in Lincoln coun-**

ty for nearly twenty years after his marriage, Gililland then removed to Audrain county (1857),^[219] where he made his permanent home. At that time this county was still very sparsely settled, and he was among the first settlers in this part of the county. But the War coming on in 1861, in a short time affairs became so critical that it was not safe for even a non-combatant to remain at home, to say nothing of carrying on any useful industry with success. Accordingly, **during the second year of the war ‘Squire Gililland went to Illinois, and from there in 1864, determined not to become mixed up with the strife in any way, he went to California,** where he remained until after the restoration of peace. His position as to the war was one of great embarrassment. Sympathizing with the South, but patriotically attached to the Union, on the platform of the Constitution and the Union, he would have stood up sword in hand by his Southern kindred and friends; but outside of the Union he could not go. Still holding the ties of natural affection more sacred than all other earthly interests, he could not strike down his own sons and kindred who fought under the three-barred banner of the Confederacy, and he therefore determined to take no part in the struggle. **After the war ‘Squire Gililland returned to Missouri, locating at first in Pike county, but soon afterwards coming back to Audrain, where he has since resided. He has been a resident of Laddonia for over ten years [c1874-1884], and came here when there were but seven families in the place.** ‘Squire Gililland has had a long and successful experience in both farming and merchandising, and was engaged in the latter up to within a short time ago. A man of decided strength of mind, and of extensive general information, he has always wielded a marked influence in the communities where he has lived. Upright in thought and deed, and of sound, sober judgment, in business and public affairs he is looked up to as a counselor and friend by not a few of his neighbors and acquaintances. In the good old days of the Whig party ‘Squire Gililland was an ardent and active Henry Clay Whig, but since the demise of that party he has been prominently identified with its ancient antagonists—the Democracy. ‘Squire Gililland has held various offices of local importance. **For two years he was coroner of the county, and**

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he has held the office of justice of the peace at Laddonia for eight years [c1876–1884]. As a magistrate has administered us characterized by efficiency and even-handed justice, and by a worthy zeal for the public peace and for the majesty of the law. He commands the confidence and respect of the public both as an officer and citizen. **In 1867 ‘Squire Gililland had the misfortune to lose the wife of his earlier manhood days,** and to him this was a loss of exceptional severity, for she was a woman of exceptional worth and sweetness of disposition. The writer knew her well; and although he has mixed in the world a great deal, and known many motherly-hearted, noble women, he can truthfully say that there is none in his memory, save his own loved ones, who ever held a higher place in his esteem. Similar sentiments, he feels safe to say, are held by all who ever knew her, for as near as there was ever woman without fault she was that one; and such were the qualities of her mind and heart that she drew all to her in respect and esteem who came under the influence of her gentle, motherly presence. Of her the sweet line of Halleck are doubly true:—

She was the mother of thirteen children: James A. and Mary Agnes (twins), William F., Edward N., Elizabeth, Margaret, Benjamin, Nancy A., Jesse R., Catherine N., Emily J., Sarah O. and Mildred F. Most of these lived to reach maturity, and a number of them are now themselves the heads of worthy families. ‘Squire Gililland gave his children good school advantages, and his daughters especially became ladies of rare culture and refinement. **To his present wife ‘Squire Gililland was married on the 10th of May, 1868. She was formerly a Miss Eliza A. Ferrell, of Pike county, a daughter of Ezekiel and Annie Ferrell, of that county.** She is a lady of great personal worth, and is much esteemed by her neighbors and acquaintances. The ‘Squire and his wife are earnest and active members of the Baptist Church. **They have two children: Annie B. and Ada J.**^[220]

Death of Squire Gililland.

Oldest Mason in the County and an Early Settler Passes Away at His Home in Laddonia.

Death claimed one of Audrain's oldest settlers, Sunday afternoon, when Squire Jesse R. Gililland, of Laddonia, passed across the great divide. Squire Gilliland [sic] was born in Lincoln county Nov. 17, 1819, while Missouri was still a territory. In 1838 he was married to Miss Annie Shaw, who died in 1867. His second union was with Miss Eliza A. Ferrell, of Pike county, who survives him.

In 1858 he moved to Audrain and has resided in this county almost continuously [sic] since and has lived in Laddonia for over twenty years. Squire Gililland has held various offices of local importance. He was for two years coroner of this county and held the office of justice of the peace at Laddonia for years. As a magistrate [sic] his administration was characterized by even handed justice and a worthy zeal for the public peace and the majesty of the law. He commanded the confidence and respects of all who knew him both as an officer of the law and a citizen. He was probably the oldest Mason in the county.

His funeral was conducted Monday by Rev. John S. Jesse, of this city, at the Baptist church at Laddonia, of which deceased was a member, by the Masonic Lodge of Laddonia and was buried in the Laddonia cemetery.^[221]

On 15 and 16 Apr. 1835, land for John "Gilliland" in Lincoln Co. was surveyed by James Finley, the county surveyor. Listed among the chain carriers for the survey was John's son, Jesse R. "Gilliland."^[222]

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Jesse R. “Gilleland” appears on an 1843 delinquent tax list for Lincoln Co., Mo.^[224]

On 10 Sept. 1844 Jesse R. Gililland of Lincoln Co., Mo., was granted 40 acres, being parcel SWSE S5 T49N R2W, Lincoln Co., Mo.^[225]

Jesse R. Gililland and Ann, his wife, sold 125 acres of Lincoln Co. land to Samuel Hall and Benjamin Heaton on 23 Mar. 1846 for \$400, perhaps in preparation for their move to Pike Co., Ill.^[226]

In 1850 Jesse R. “Gilleland,” 30, a blacksmith born in Missouri with \$650 real estate, resided in Pike Co., Ill., with Ann, 33, born in Missouri, and James, 10, Mary, 10, William, 9, Edward, 8, “Elisabeth,” 7, Margaret, 6, Benjamin, 4, all born in Missouri, Jesse, 2, and Nancy, 10/12, born in Illinois.^[227]

In 1860 Jesse “B. Gillilland,” 40, a blacksmith born in Missouri with \$300 personal estate, resided in Lick Creek, Salt River Twp., Ralls Co., Mo., with Ann, 43, born in Missouri, and James A., 20, William F., 19, Edward N., 18, Elizabeth A., 17, Margaret A., 16, Benjamin L., 14, all born in Missouri, [next census page:] Jesse R. [B with the bottom bit scribbled over] Gililland, 12, Nancy C., 10, and Mildred F., 4, all born in Missouri. John H. Moore, 32, born in Kentucky, resided next door.^[228]

Using the *History of Audrain County* as evidence, Jesse must have moved from Ralls Co., Mo., to Audrain Co., Mo., shortly after the 1860 census. Then Jesse moved to Illinois about 1862, then to California in 1864 for the remainder of the Civil War, then back to Pike Co., Mo., after the war, say 1865, finally returning to Audrain Co., Mo., say 1866.

In 1870 “Jessee Gilliland,” 50, a blacksmith born in Missouri with \$120 real estate, resided in Hickory Creek, Cuivre Twp., Audrain Co., Mo., with Eliza, 39, born in Missouri, and Anna, 1, and Nancy, 19, both born in Missouri.^[229]

On 2 Sept. 1872 Eliza Ann Gililand of Audrain Co. bought, for \$170, 10 acres of the northeast corner of SWSW S9 T51N R6[W?], from William H. Burch and his wife, Mary. This was the first of several transactions that all appear in Eliza’s name.^[230]

On 3 July 1873 Eliza Ann Gililand of Audrain Co. bought, for \$100, lots no. 5 and 6 in block no. 9 in Laddonia, Audrain Co., from Amos Ladd and his wife, Rebecca, and J. J. Haden and his wife, Anna M.^[231]

J. R. Gililand was coroner in Audrain Co. in 1876.^[234]

Mineola, Wood Co., Tex., 82 years old. The pension was not granted for lack of sufficient evidence of John B. Gililand's service. The widow claimed that he served for about two years in a Missouri infantry company, but not roster listing him was discovered. A daughter, Mrs. Rebecca Tindle, and a brother, D.D.L. Susan, Walden, Fountain S., and Horatio. . . . Walden married Nancy Gilleland, and settled in Montgomery county.^[272]

On 24 Apr. 1846 John² Gililand signed his will in Lincoln Co., Mo. Witnesses were Frances B. Clare and William F. Clare. These are believed to be Francis Beattie “Frank” Clare and William Fox Clare, brothers of Walden born in Kentucky, but I have not verified that this is so.

However, that Frances and William were brothers of one another is established by this obituary:

Death of Mr. F. Clark.—Owing to some oversight we failed to learn of the untimely and unfortunate death of Mr. Wm. F. Clare, of this county, until after the paper of last week had been published. He died on Sunday, the 18th inst., from the effects of an accidental blow from the handle of a pitchfork, received while unloading some hay in his barn. A boy on the upper floor accidentally let the fork fall with the handle down, which struck Mr. Clare in the face, and knocked him over on the floor. He struck on the back of his head and received a hurt which resulted in his death. Mr. Clare was an old and highly respected citizen of this county, and his loss leaves a vacancy in the community that will long be felt by his neighbors and numerous friends. He was a brother of our efficient Circuit Clerk, Dr. Clare.—*Montgomery Standard*.

Mr. Clare was well known in this county. He was a brother to Francis B., and H. C. Clare [presumably Horatio Cox Clare]. He was an excellent man and citizen.^[273]

GILLLAND GENEALOGY

Among the largest landholders of Montgomery county, though never a resident of the county, was Daniel Clare, originally of Virginia, the father of the subject of this sketch. He was of German descent, but his ancestors had long been settled in the Old Dominion. He came to Missouri by way of Kentucky, in 1829, and bought land in Lincoln county, an old Spanish grant from the Choueaus [Choctaws?]. He had been a soldier in the War of 1812 and received a government land grant in recognition of his services, which he “load” on a tract of land in Montgomery county. He also entered and bought large tracts in this county, and at one time owned nearly 2,000 acres. He died on his homestead in Lincoln county, in 1843. He was twice married. His first wife was a Miss Jane Hansford, a daughter of the Rev. Thomas Hansford, a pioneer Baptist minister of Kentucky, and a friend and companion of Daniel Boone, uniting also the qualities of an Indian fighter with those of a minister. She died in 1834, and Mrs. Fannie Cox, a widow lady, whose maiden name was McClure, became Mr. Clare’s second wife. She survived until 1880. He had a family both his first and second wives, and Walden G. was born of the first union, in Lincoln county, January 23, 1828. He was reared on the farm in Lincoln county, and in 1849 was married to Miss Nancy Gililand, a daughter of the old pioneer settler of that county, John Gililand, a sketch of whose life is given on pp. 602–606 of the “History of Audrain County” recently issued by the publishers of this work. After his marriage Mr. Clare removed to Montgomery county, and settled on the land which he now owns—a farm of 250 acres, well improved, and here he is engaged in raising stock. He also feeds cattle and hogs for the wholesale markets. He and his good wife have seven children, namely: Francis, who died in 1865, at the age of 16 year; William, Alice, the wife of Alexander Jefferson; Sallie, the wife of Dr. Muns; Frank D., Maggie, the wife of Frank Hensley; Cynthia, and an infant, deceased. Mr. and Mrs. C. are members of the Christian Church.^[274]

Clare, 72, a landlord born Jan. 1828 in Missouri of a father born in Virginia and a mother in Kentucky, resided in Montgomery Twp., Montgomery Co., Mo., with his wife of 51 years, Nancy, 69, born Nov. 1830 in Missouri of a father born in Kentucky and a mother in North Carolina, and with one servant. An 1895 history of Lincoln Co., Mo., contains this biographical sketch of Judge Gilmore. I include it in its entirety because many genealogical facts, generally supported by the evidence (and remarked if not), are mixed in with the typically purple prose. This evidence was collected from living persons:

Hon. J. T. Gilmore. Throughout this portion of Missouri few of the residents of Lincoln County are better known than Judge Gilmore, a resident of Millwood Township, and the present incumbent of the office of Associate Judge. Born in Millwood, he dates his birth from the 1st of August, 1830, some years before Missouri was linked together by bands of steel and a network of telegraph wires. He has been an eyewitness of the wonderful transformation which has taken place in the county and state, and has not been an idle factor in their development.

As a boy the Judge attended the subscription school, held in a log building with clapboard roof and doors, the seating capacity of the room being ample for a dozen pupils. The benches were made of hewn logs, with pegs of the same material acting as supports. The destinies of this primitive seat of learning were presided over by Steven A. Stevens, who is now one of the prominent agriculturists of Montgomery County, Mo.,

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and a very old man. Meager indeed were the advantages offered to the sons of the pioneers of primitive Missouri, and those who attained fame did so through their own indomitable will, unaided by fortune.

When a boy of sixteen years our subject went to work at the cabinet-maker's trade, and his skill in this occupation is shown by some of the substantial furniture used in his modern and comfortable dwelling. In 1849 he left the log cabin which had been his home, and started out in life for himself. He engaged in cutting cordwood near Coppa Grace, in the Mississippi Bottoms, receiving as compensation seventy-five cents per cord. About that time he secured employment in rafting logs, which found their way to St. Louis, and on many such an expedition he was a sturdy and able assistant.

Returning to his home when in the twentieth year of his age, Mr. Gilmore engaged in carpentering, an occupation which at that time was considered very profitable, and for which mechanics were in demand. Through his skill in this direction several good and substantial homes of the log-cabin type replaced the stately forest trees, and substantial church structures took the place of the noble pines of the forest. From the walnut that abounded in those days on the banks of the Cuivre and other streams he constructed coffins, which he found a remunerative employment. In connection with carpentering at this time he also carried on farming.

When in his twenty-first year Mr. Gilmore married Miss Elizabeth Gilliland [sic], a native of Millwood Township, Lincoln County. This lady was a daughter of John and Elizabeth (Presley) Gilliland, with whom she remained until her marriage, November 13, 1851. By her marriage she became the mother of eight children. Flora Agnes, the eldest, was married to Thomas Hammett, a farmer of Cedar County, Mo.; Elizabeth F. is the widow of James Wambles, formerly a farmer and stock-raiser of St. Clair County; Cynthia is the wife of Dorsey Mudd, a well-to-do resident of Montgomery City, Mo.; James T., a farmer of Millwood Township, is also successfully engaged in teaching school in the Dowell district of Union Township; Nancy is the wife of B. F. De Jarnett, a blacksmith of Mackville; Eveline H. married James Harris, a farmer of Millwood Township; Mildred, the youngest daughter, is the wife of John A. Eversmeyer, a farmer of Millwood Township; and U. W. is raising cereals and stock in Millwood

Township. The mother of these children passed from earth May 20, 1870, and was laid to rest in what was known as the Sulphur Lick Burying-ground. The church edifice that in early days marked this spot has long since gone to decay, and naught remains but the memory of the old structure cherished in the hearts of the pioneers.

October 11, 1874, Judge Gilmore married Miss Mattie, daughter of John L. and Agnes (Trale) Moore. This lady comes of good old Kentucky lineage. Her parents migrated from that state and settled in Missouri in the early days of Lincoln County's history. She was born in Millwood Township, March 2, 1848, and was the fifth among ten children, there being four daughters and six sons. The family of which she is a member is noted for longevity. Her grandmother, Mrs. Sarah (Hammond) Trale, lived to celebrate her ninety-ninth birthday, and was a remarkable lady, intellectually, at the time of her death. Mrs. Gilmore lost her father and grandfather several years ago. Her mother, Mrs. Moore, now in the seventy-seventh year of her age, retains the full possession of her physical and mental faculties, and often rides several miles on horseback to visit her daughter.

The second marriage of Judge Gilmore has been blessed by the birth of five children: Ida F., wife of Thomas Dwyer, a farmer of Audrain County, Mo.; and Lucke [sic] M., Valeria May, Ellen E. and Everest [sic], who are the joy and pride of their fond parents' hearts. Mrs. Gilmore is an estimable Christian lady, beloved wherever known, and popular in the social circles of the community.

In 1851 Judge Gilmore gave his attention entirely to agriculture. He first farmed fifty acres of the old homestead, and after the death of his mother began the management of the estate of two hundred and sixty-five acres. He also owns one hundred and fifty-five acres near the growing village of Silex. His modern residence was erected under his personal supervision, as were also the various other farm buildings. He is a Democrat, and cast his first Presidential ballot for James Buchanan. Though he has never sought political office, a wise constituency saw fit to place him in the Associate Judge's chair in 1886, and he is now serving his fourth term in that capacity. He is honored for his integrity, impartial spirit and fair dealing in meting out justice to all who come within his jurisdiction.

GILLLAND GENEALOGY

Judge Gilmore is a descendant of noble Kentucky ancestry. His father, James Gilmore, removed from that state to Missouri in 1827, in company with that good old pioneer, Daniel Clare. Together these sterling sons of Kentucky purchased five hundred and fifty acres of timber-land in what is now known as Millwood Township, Lincoln County, and began felling the trees of the forest. They erected a log cabin, and when the wild flowers again blossomed they had a sufficient clearing to admit the sunlight into the primitive home. Indians were plentiful in the neighborhood, and the howling of the wolves often caused the hardy pioneers to get down their trusty rifles. Deer abounded in the woodland and on the prairies, and many a noble drove was seen within their wooded enclosures.

Two years after coming to Lincoln County, James Gilmore married Miss Elizabeth Hammond, daughter of Thomas Hammond, who preceded James Gilmore to Missouri, and was one of the well known figures of Lincoln County for many years. The marriage of Mr. and Mrs. Gilmore, solemnized February 19, 1828, was of brief duration. On the 27th of September, 1830, he passed away, leaving his wife with an only child, a son of less than two months. On the old homestead, whose acres he had tilled, he was laid to rest, an honored man, whose memory will be revered through the coming years.

Some years later his widow married^[288] Richard Wommack, who afterward became one of the factors in the history of Lincoln County and Missouri. He was among the first Assessors of this county, and in 1848 was elected Sheriff. The duties of this office obliged him to visit each home and collect taxes. During the '50s he twice represented his district in the Legislature, and was otherwise prominently identified with the interests of the county. His occupation was that of a farmer and stock-raiser, in which he was successful. He took the part of a father to his orphaned stepson, caring for him as for his own children, of whom there were ten, seven daughters and three sons. Of this number six survive, as follows: Motley, a farmer of Millwood Township; Carrie Ann, who first married Robert Morris, and after his death became the wife of Henock Truskett, a farmer of Burr Oak Township; Paralallee, first the wife of LaFayette Verdier, and

afterward married to George A. Palmer, a farmer of Montgomery County; Elizabeth, wife of Milton Motley, a farmer of Pike County; Dr. X. B., a successful physician of Millwood; and B. H., a farmer of Union Township, Lincoln County. The mother of our subject was born December 17, 1809, and died in May, 1873. Her second husband, Mr. Wommack, is also deceased. Both have for many years slept in honored graves, and their memory is treasured by their descendants and by all who knew them.^[289]

N.B. One item missing from the biography above is Judge Gilmore's brief marriage to his first wife's half niece, Elizabeth A.⁴ Gililland (*Jesse R.*³, *John*², *John*¹) (q.v.), between the two marriages that are mentioned. This second Elizabeth died shortly after childbirth in 1873.

In 1860 John T. Gilmore, 28, a farmer born in Missouri, with \$2,640 real and \$1,390 personal estates, resided in Millwood, Millwood Twp., Lincoln Co., Mo., with Elizabeth, 27, born in Missouri, and with Flora A., 8, "Elisabeth," 7, Martha E., 5, and Cynthia, 2, all four born in Missouri, and with David Presley, 16, born in Missouri, and John O. Long, 22, born in Ireland, with 100 personal estate.^[290]

In 1870 "Jno." T. Gilmore, 40, a farmer born in Missouri, with \$4,000 real and \$2,400 personal estates, resided in Millwood, Millwood Twp., Lincoln Co., Mo., with Flora, 18, "Elizh," 16, Evaline, 15, Cynthia, 13, James, 10, Nancy, 8, "Milly," 6, "Tully," 3, male, "Infant," 1/12, male, born in May, all born in Missouri, and with two farm laborers.^[291] Note that there are four Gilmore children, Margaret, 17, "Mattie," 12, Johnson, 10, and Rebecca, 7, next door in the household of Elizabeth Gililland, widow of John² (q.v.). Also note that Elizabeth, John Gilmore's wife, was absent from this census, probably having died in or as a consequence of the birth of the "infant" (both occurred in May 1870).

The Gilmore family shares the dwelling with the family of Horacie and Nancy Clair, with five children and a nephew.^[295]

On 1 Apr. 1884 John T. Gilmore signed his will in Lincoln Co., Mo., and it was proved 2 Jan. 1899. It mentions “my wife Martha Gilmore,” “my minor children,” and makes Martha executor. Witnesses were Charles Martin and Jesse J. Shaw. On 29 May 1885 two slight modifications were made to the will. Witnesses were George W. Colbert and Jesse J. Shaw.^[296]

N.B. This James is often identified with the James T. Gililand born 1830, who married Nancy J. Powell. This is an understandable error given the 1860 census item for James “R” Gilliland, 30, with Nancy J., 18, and Mary E., 7/12, in Lost Branch, Millwood Twp., Lincoln Co. Mo.^[324] I believe the “R” in that item is an error. I’ve tentively identified James T. as son of Mathias² not John². But Robert² is also a possibility, although the slot for a son born about 1830 seems already taken by John R.³.

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Uncle Leaf was a local stocktrader of wide reputation in his day, and was noted for his sterling qualities of honesty and integrity in his trading.

Health having failed him several years ago, he spent considerable time in Colorado, where he was temporarily improved. Returning to Missouri, he spent several years assisting Mrs. A. L. Gililland, his sister-in-law, in managing her farm and also in rearing her then little son Gay, who has since reached the years of maturity. The last several years he had made his home with his sister, where he died.

He was held in the very highest esteem by his many relatives and friends, and was always considered a wise counselor in all business transactions; and morally speaking he was a model for the community. He was a member of the Harrison burial association of Silex, Mo., of which R. P. Dwyer is manager and undertaker. This is a good company and pays it dues promptly.

Funeral services were conducted at the home by Bro. Copher of Moberly, Mo., after which the remains were interred in the Sulphur Lick cemetery to await the call of the resurrection morn.—J. L.C.^[347]

And they tended to reside in a family cluster as the 1850 census item shows. Also, the Hendricks family found its way to Northern California as did other children of Mathias R.² Gililland. (Napa and Sonoma Counties abut one another.)

This published biographical sketch from 1904 contains several details about the Hendricks family which corroborate what we know:

James M. Hendricks. Among the prosperous agriculturists of Sonoma county who have met with success in their independent calling is James M. Hendricks, owner of a well-kept and productive ranch in Mendocino township. Energetic, industrious and capable, he has acquired a comfortable competency through his own exertions, and while improving his own property has materially assisted in advancing the industrial and business interests of the community. A son of the late Moses C. Hendricks he was born January 25, 1847 in Jackson County, MO, where he spent his childhood days.

A Kentuckian by birth, **Moses C. Hendricks** was born in June, 1822, in Simpson county and was there reared and educated. Removing with his parents to Missouri in 1840 he followed farming and stock raising in that state until 1852. Disposing then of his farm, he came with his family in an ox team train to California, driving about one hundred head of cattle across the plains. Locating in Solano county, he purchased land in Suisun valley, and lived there until the fall of 1853, when he disposed of his prop-

erty at a large price. Going back to Missouri, he returned to Solano county with a herd of cattle in 1854. Disposing of those at an advantage, he again went by water to Missouri in 1855, and there purchased a farm, which he traded the following year for cattle, which he drove to the Suisun valley, Solano valley, Solano county, Cal. Purchasing a squatter's claim, he carried on farming and stock trading a number of years, when he had to give up his land, losing his entire farm due to defective titles. Renting land, he then took care of his cattle until 1861, when he sold out his stock. Purchasing horses, he started for Texas, but on arriving in Missouri he made that his stopping place, remaining until 1864, when he lost all his stock. Getting an ox team, he again came to Solano county, where he foreclosed a mortgage he held on a farm, and resided until 1872. Coming then to Sonoma county, he purchased land, and was engaged in stock-raising near Skagg's Springs until his retirement from active pursuits. Renting his farm at that time, he removed to Healdsburg, and there spent his remaining days, dying at the age of seventy-eight years. He was a staunch Democrat in politics, and a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church South. His wife, whose maiden name was **Emeline Gilliland**, was also a member of the same church. She was born in Lincoln County, Mo., and died at the age of sixty-nine years in Sonoma county, at the home of her son **James M. Hendricks**.

The second in succession of birth of a family of twelve children, nine of whom grew to years of maturity, **James M. Hendricks** was reared in California, coming to this state as a child of five years. Remaining beneath the paternal roof until about thirty years of age, he assisted in the care and management of the house farm and the stock. In 1871 he bought his present ranch of one hundred and sixty-three acres, on which he has since resided. It is well-improved, being furnished with substantial farm buildings, the whole having a air of thrift and prosperity quite attractive to the passing traveler. Eighteen acres of his land are devoted to the culture of grapes, and his orchard contains eight acres of land set out to fruit trees of various kinds.

Mr. Hendricks married **Elizabeth Allen**, who was born in Mendocino township, a daughter of W. T. Allen, a pioneer of this county, who came here in 1853, and for many years served as justice of the peace. He died in

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Mendocino township at the age of seventy-three years. Mr. and Mrs. Hendricks are the parents of three children, namely: George (who assists his father on the . . .^[360]

In 1850 Moses C. “Hendicks,” 27, a farmer born in Kentucky, with \$600 real estate, resided in Sni-A-Bar Twp., Jackson Co., Mo., with Emeline, 24, born in Missouri, Catherine, 6, James, 4, and Christina, 3, all born in Missouri. Next door was William “Gillilan,” 23, and Mary, 19, and beyond them Richard Ives and Mary.^[361]

On 19 Nov. 1850 Moses “T.” Hendricks was appointed administrator of the intestate estate of “James Hendricks late of the County of Jackson.” in Jackson Co., Mo. On that same date Moses C. Hendricks was bonded 19 Nov. 1850 as principal, with Thomas H. Wilson, Robert St. Clair, and John G. Hendrickson as securities, for \$10,600, that Moses T. Hendrickson [*sic*] would administer the estate of James Hendricks deceased. Moses C. Hendricks swore that the heirs of the estate were “his widow & relict Sarah Hendricks & his children, Charity C. Hendricks **Mary C. Gilliland** [*sic*] Jas Hendricks Moses T. [*sic*] Hendricks, and the heirs of Peter Hendricks, all residing in Jackson County, Mo. except the heirs of Peter Hendricks who resides [*sic*] in Tennessee [*sic*].” There appears to be a confusion between Hendricks and Hendrickson in this record (H:410), and between Moses C. Hendricks and Moses T. Hendricks. For example, the very first line mentions “Moses [scribble] Hendricks as principal,” where the scribble makes the initial there unreadable. Moses T. Hendricks was clearly appointed administrator on H:165, but he is clearly listed as “Moses T. Hendrickson Administrator” on H:410. Two of the signatories are clearly Moses C. Hendricks and John G. Hendrickson. Moses C. Hendricks clearly lists Moses T. Hendricks as heir. I suspect these are transcription errors and that Moses T. everywhere should

be Moses C., and that Moses Hendrickson should be Moses Hendricks.^[362] Note that this is about the estate of the *father*, James Hendricks, of our Moses C. Hendricks.

Further note that the deed of 5 Feb. 1819, Logan Co., Ky., between Mathias “Gilleand” and his wife, Katherine, of Logan Co., Ky., and John “Gilleand,” of Logan Co., Ky., was witnessed by a Peter Hendricks.

In 1900 Mary C. Gililland, 69, a widow born Sept. 1830 in Kentucky of a father born in North Carolina and a mother in South Carolina, resided in Maricopa Co., Ariz. Terr., in the household of her son, James M. Gililland, 42 (q.v.). Mary had had four [sic] children, with three surviving.^[366]

Find a Grave for James T. Gililand states this (I have preserved the spelling, some of which might have been introduced during the transcription to the webpage. The first two paragraphs are not backed with evidence):

James was the fourth of thirteen children **born to John Richardson and Elizabeth Presley Gililand**. He was born, raised and lived his entire life in Lincoln County, Missouri. **[I do not know the provenance of this information, but I think it is suspect.]**

On March 16 [sic], 1859 James married Nancy Jane Powell. The daughter of Joseph G. and Zilliah Brunk Powell.^[369] They settled on a farm in Millwood, Lincoln County, Missouri. The subject of the above resolutions was born February 9, 1830 and on March 3 [sic], 1859 was married to Miss Nancy J. Powell by Elder R. S. Duncan. To that union were born six daughters, whom were present at their fathers burrial.

Mr. Gililland with his wife united with Fairview Baptist Church in November 1877 and was ever afterwards a faithful member. He was universally esteemed by a large circle of friends and acquaintances.

My argument that James³ Gililland (and his neighbor Andrew³ Gililland, next sketch) were sons of Mathias² Gililland is not tight. B. A. Gililland died at his residence in this city Sunday morning about 1 o'clock, after an illness of several weeks' duration. He was the eldest son of Robert and Anna Moore Gililland of Kentucky, and was born in Simpson county, Kentucky, May 27, 1828, being 68 years, six months and 23 days old at death. He was buried in the city cemetery with Masonic ceremonies Tuesday after services at the Baptist church conducted by the pastor, Rev. C. A. Mitchell, assisted by Revs. R. S. Duncan and R. E. McQuie.

Phemia Snethen of this county on the 2nd day of October 1882, a sister of Duncan and Taylor Snethen. To this union there were born six children, four of whom two girls and two boys, survive him, two girls having died in infancy.

In 1872 Mr. Gililand was elected justice of the peace in Lincoln county and held that office fourteen years. He lived on his farm in Lincoln county until five years ago, when he moved to this place with his estimable family, and has since been ranked among the best citizens of the town. He was a member of the Masonic order nearly twenty years, having been a charter member of Olney lodge, and afterward a member of the Griswold lodge near Price's Branch.

He was converted at about the age of 28, united with the Missionary Baptist denomination and was a member of old Sulphur Lick, Bethlehem and Fairview churches in Lincoln county, served as clerk in the two former for a number of years. When he moved to this city he with this wife transferred their membership to the Baptist church of this place, in which relation he lived until his death.

He leaves two brothers, Doc of this place and George of Lincoln county, and four sisters.^[440]

I mysteriously lose track of this family almost immediately, as if it were killed off. There seems to be no mention of them in the 1860 census. Even the son, Stephen, only appears twice in the record, so far as I've discovered.

In the May Term 1869 of the Lincoln Co., Mo., Probate Court, mention is made of the estate of William Hudson deceased.^[461] I believe, however, that this was William Hudson, born 1804, died 1869, married to Sarah, with two children, Arthur C. and Maria A. There are a dozen or so probate records concerning them.

His parentage. I quote LuAnn Elsinger's analysis of this problem:

John's parentage is unknown at this time. Most trees online have him listed as the son of Robert Gilliland and Anne Moore. However, that can't be the case. As noted above, John and Rebecca appeared on the 1850 census. Robert and Anne were also listed on the 1850 census in Lincoln County, Missouri and had a son, John R., living with them. Robert and Anne could not have had two sons named John. Looking at the other possible relationships between this John Gilliland and the other Gillilands that were living in Lincoln County at the time of the 1850 census we see two other possibilities, both with sons of John Gilliland and Charity Richardson (just as Robert was). The first is Mathias R. Gilliland. Mathias had a son named John who was born circa 1820. However, this John Richard Gililland married Mary Ives on July 3, 1842 and was listed on the 1850 census with five children. The second is with John Richardson Gililland who also had a son named John born circa 1825. But, once again, this John Barnabus Gililland is well documented and was not the John Gilliland who married Rebecca Stonebreaker. That leaves only one other possible relationship between this John Gilliland and the family of John Gilliland and Charity Richardson. Their son James Richardson Gilliland was recorded on the 1840 census record in Simpson County, Kentucky with his parents living with him as well as a male, aged 10-14. This young male could be the John Gilliland who married Rebecca Stonebreaker.^[504]

James Gililland was the second teacher to take charge of the first school in district no. 1, Prairie Twp., Audrain Co., and “James Gililland taught the first school in the new house of worship, which was erected in 1858.” He also started the first debating society, in which (probably his brother Benjamin) Buck was one of the first disputants. James was listed with his father, Jesse R. Gililland, as a person living in the eastern part of Prairie Twp. at the beginning of “the war” (1861). In a business directory, included in the history, James A. Gililland was listed with James T. Benton in a firm called Benton & Gililland, specializing in real estate, loans, insurance, and collections. He was also listed in the firm Reed & Gililland, blacksmiths, consisting of J. W. Reed and J. A. Gililland. James and his wife, Lucinda “A.,” were among the original members of the First Baptist Church of Laddonia, organized 3 Dec. 1878.^[541]

acquainted with Miss Elizabeth Carter, a daughter of the well-known Johnny Carter of Virginia, who was of one of the first families of that State, being a descendant of Robert Carter, the president of the Council of Virginia in 1726, and one of the wealthiest and most eminent men of the colony. Young Gatewood and Miss Carter were married in about 1806. . . . At her death she left him two sons, William Carter, born in 1807, and Joseph Edwin, born in 1809.

. . . He took a regular course at the St. Louis Medical College, of St. Louis, Mo., and graduated with distinction in 1857. In the vote of the faculty on his graduation he received the support of every professor of the institution.

Immediately after his graduation Dr. Gatewood returned to Pike county and located at New Harmony, where he engaged in the practice of his profession. He success there was prompt and he soon had a large and rapidly increasing practice. He made himself a neat and comfortable home at New Harmony, and on the 11th of August, 1858, he was married to Miss Mary Agnes Gililand, a daughter of 'Squire Jesse R. Gililand, now of Farber, in Audrain county. Mrs. Gatewood is a lady of superior mind and culture and a most entertaining and instructive conversationalist. She was born in Lincoln county, Mo., February 4, 1840, and was educated at Pittsfield, Ill. In 1861 Dr. Gatewood was solicited by many old friends who had known him from boyhood to return to Bowling Green for the prac-

tice of his profession. In 1870 “Robt” H. T. Gatewood, 41, a physician born in Kentucky, with \$3,000 real and \$250 personal estates, resided in Bowling Green, Pike Co., Mo., with Mary A., 30, born in Missouri, and with R.A.J.L., 9, male, Catherine “C.,” 7, and Jesse R., 3, all born in Missouri.^[560]

In 1880 Robert Gatewood, 51, a physician born in Kentucky of a father born in Virginia and a mother in Kentucky, resided in Cuivre Twp., Audrain Co., Mo., with his wife, Mary A., 40, born in Missouri of Missouri natives, and with his son, “Jaul,” 19, daughter, “Katie” O., 17, and son, Jesse R., 3, all born in Missouri, and his niece Catie B. An obituary for Rosetta:

The death of Mrs Rosetta R. Gililand^[569] occurred at her house in College addition last Friday at noon after an illness extending over five days only. Her sickness did not take a hopeless turn until about twelve hours before she died and her watchful friends were hopeful until that time.

Funeral services were held at the Baptist church Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock and were conducted by Rev. orter, pastor of the Baptist church. The deceased had been a member of the Baptist church for the past fifteen years.

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In 1887 the Gililland family moved to New Mexico, first settling at Deming for a few months and then coming on to the Sacramento section, this county, in the same year. They settled on the Fresnal, where they lived for a number of years. Mr. Gililland's death occurred just two years ago.

Mrs. Gililland leaves seven living children and many grandchildren as her survivors. The three sons are all stockmen of the southwest and well known in Alamogordo and throughout Otero county. The daughters are Mrs. Raley, Orogrande, Mrs. Shindler and Mrs. Hornbuckle, Arizona, and Mrs. Andy Meyer, Texas.

Mrs. Gililland was affectionately and widely known as "Grandma" by many scores of neighbors and friends, and her life duties were largely made up of services and neighborly ministrations to others. To the many neighbors and relatives around her in pioneer days when there were no physicians within fifty miles, she was physician and nurse. Many a patient owed a new lease of life to her remedies and nursing and many an infant first saw the light of day with "Grandma" Gililland's assistance.

Patient and kind in sickness and distress, she yet had the strong heart and nerves of a man, and no matter what emergency arose she never lost her head. This trait, doubtless more ornless natural and characteristic of her was nevertheless schooled into her by the environment of her early life as a member of a pioneer family in Texas surrounded by Indians, in the troublous border days.

She had a rare fund of reminiscences of early days in Texas. Which lost none of the excitement after the time she moved to this section of New Mexico.

Grandma Gililland is gone and in the hearts of relatives and friends and neighbors, her going has left a void that will not be filled this side of eternity.^[571]

John S. Gililland came into Wise County in what may be defined as the last year of the pioneer period, which was 1874, the year of the Huff family massacre by the Indians. He came to Decatur from Arkansas, but lived formerly in Collin County, Texas, to which county he came from Missouri, the state of his birth. He was born at Old Bailey's landing, on the Mississippi river, the place then being called Lincoln, the date being January 31, 1845. His father, A. J. Gililland, was a blacksmith, and was twice married, having four children by each union. John S. was the second son of the first group. His father came to Collin County in 1853, locating on David's Ridge, west of McKinney, near the Dallas and Preston roads. In 1867, at the age of 10 [sic, 20, he's enlisting!], John S. enlisted in Co. D., 6th Texas cavalry, afterwards Ross' regiment [sic, Ross's regiment], the first volunteer organization to leave Collin County. Later on he was exempted from service on account of his youth, but returned to Collin County and rejoined Throckmorton's company. He then participated in campaigns in Arkansas and Louisiana. In June, 1853, he was taken prisoner at Butler, La., and confined at New Orleans for eight months, when he escajjed [sic, escaped, obviously an OCR program has been used to convert page scans to text] under the most thrilling and dramatic circumstances. He rejoined his company the day following the Pleasant Hill fight in Louisiana. He then obtained a furlough and came home. His father had in the meantime moved to Grayson County. Mi. [sic, Mr.] Gililland then spent eight years in Arkansas, in Washington County, in which State he married Jane Kinnebrough in February, 1806 [sic, 1866]. In 1874 he came to Decatur, locating on the eastern edge of town, and two years later opened a blacksmith and woodworking shop, which occupation he has followed continuously and successfully since. At an early period he served Decatur a term or two as city marshall. He is a quiet, unpretentious gentleman, a conscientious and persistent workman, and a first-class citizen, being admired and respected by all. Mr.

and Mrs. Gililland have reared a bright, healthy family of children, now all married and prosperous, named as follows: Jim, the oldest son, of Com-manche [*sic*, Comanche] County, Ok.; Aimer [*sic*, Almer], of Roan's Prairie, Texas; Porter, La Grange, Texas; Minnie, wife of Conductor White, C. R. I. & P. Ry.; Walter, associated with his father at Decatur; Roy, of Fort Worth.^[597]

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Marriage problem. The marriage records have Joseph marrying in both May and Sept. 1873. So first wife Sarah might have died just after marriage, or perhaps the marriage was annulled. Another possibility is that “Joseph K.” in the first marriage record is a transcription error (from the minister’s notes, say, which might have used abbreviations Jos^h or Jos^a) for “Joshua K.,” Joseph’s brother. We know that Joshua King Gilliland’s middle initial was definitely K., but we are unsure of Joseph’s middle initial. It is given as A. in Joseph’s death record (apparently an obituary). I read it as an H. (it matches the first letter of “Holy” in the preceding line of the record) in the record of the marriage to Margaret. The simplest solution is to assume that the “Joseph K.” marriage record is accurate, but a caution flag is raised.

owned the Mockingbird Gap Ranch which abutted the McDonald Ranch, famous as the location of Trinity Site, where the first atomic bomb was exploded.

The following item, apparently an obituary, was found among some old photos sent to my father (Alvy Ray⁷ Smith) by my grandmother Pearl, wife of Alvy Ray⁶ Smith, Jim's nephew:

When he was a very small child the family moved to Kimble County, Texas. At the age of 12 the family, with a small herd of cattle moved to near Deming, New Mexico on the Mimbres River. At the age of 13 the family moved with the cattle to the Sacramento Mountains [N.M.] to the old Gililland Farm near where Mountain Park now is. Working with and for various cattle ranchers in the White Mountains and on the Tularosa Valley and in the Sacramento Mountains quite a time being on the Famous Oliver Lee Ranch. In November 1896 was married to Miss Adella May Gould. On June 15, 1902 he arrived with his wife and small herd of cattle and established the old Jim Gililland Ranch in Socorro County in the San Andres Mountains. Which Ranch he operated individually and successfully for more than 37 years. In February 1940 he and Mrs. Gililland sold their Ranch holdings and after traveling one year in Eastern States bought property in Hot Springs where they made their home until his passing. For a short time prior to his retiring from ranch operations he was elected a member of the Advisory Board with the U.S. Grazing Service. He was a Peace Officer for many years [!] by various appointments by County and State Officials. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge and for a time he was a member of the Odd Fellow Lodge. Survivors besides his wife include sisters, Mrs. Lucretia Miller, Fort Thomas, Arizona and Mrs. Lucy Raley, El Paso, Texas. Brothers George Gililland, Taylor, Arizona and Dick Gililland, Tularosa, New Mexico.

On 29 July 1902 the following family of Weed, N.M. Terr., was rejected for identification as Mississippi Choctaw Indians: Adella M. Gililland, daughter of Jacob B. Gould and Elmira E. Gould, claimed Choc-

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taw. See appendix G for other Gould family members who also tried unsuccessfully to be counted as Choctaws.^[773]

In 1910 James R. Gililland, 36, a stockman born in Texas of a father born in Missouri and a mother in Illinois, resided in Estey, Socorro Co., N.M. Terr., with his wife of 13 years, “Edella” G., 33, born in Texas of a father born in Texas and a mother in Illinois. Edella had had one child, with none surviving. Next door was William F. Gililland, 69, born in Missouri.^[774]

A 1948 obituary for Adella (compare the Jacob Beckwith Gould family Bible in appendix G):

The death of Mrs Adella Gililland, widow of the late Jim Gililland, pioneer figure, occurred Wednesday morning at the home of her nephew and niece, Mr. and Mrs. Roy Tucker in Tularosa. . . .

Mrs. Gililland was among the first settlers in the Tularosa basin and the Sacramento Mountains, being one of the pioneer Jake Gould family, and a niece of the late, well-known Jim Gould. . . .

The [four surviving] sisters are Mrs. Emma Bigelow, and Mrs. Nettie Fry, both of Medford, Ore.; Mrs. Della Laughby of Southgate, Calif.; and Mrs. Minnie Marcrum, Bishop, Calif.

Mrs. Gililland had made her home in Hot Springs just preceding and following the death of Mr. Gililland. She was the owner of a hotel there.^[775]

(obit.), Tex., died 12 Jan. 1956, El Paso, El Paso Co., Tex., and was buried 14 Jan. 1956 in Restlawn Memorial Park, El Paso, El Paso Co., Tex.^[804] She married 1901 (obit.), Jarilla [now Orogrande], Otero Co., N.M. Terr., **ROBERT L. RALEY**, who was born Oct. 1873, Alabama.

My father, Alvy Ray⁶ Smith, reported the following in a letter of 9 June 1990:

She was quite a character (see p. 194 of *Tularosa* by Sonnichsen - Bob Raley was Aunt Lucy's husband) . . . Aunt Lucy lived a hermit's life in a small shack in the Orogrande Mountains - with just her burros and dogs. . . . The last time I saw Aunt Lucy . . . she showed me a personal letter from Franklin D. Roosevelt thanking her for some "spy" work she had done in the desolate Orogrande Mountains [N.M.]. She resembled my grandmother - short, chunky, a mass of white hair, and she either smoked a pipe or chewed tobacco. [The *Tularosa* reference concerns the famous Fountain murder case in New Mexico which has never been solved and for which much bitterness still exists over a century later (see brother James R. Gililland's sketch).] Again, when Bob Raley, Gililland's

brother-in-law, was killed by Bill McNew in the fall of 1915, it was whispered that too much talk about the Fountain case had brought on hard feelings - though the actual bone of contention was a well which both sides claimed.

The following is from a letter, about Bob Raley's murder, from Maurine Webb to my father, Alvy Ray⁶ Smith, dated 18 July 1990. Maurine Webb, a granddaughter of Lucy Raley, was an avid genealogist of the Gilliland family before the internet arrived and changed everything:

In Orogrande [Otero Co., N.M.], in 1915, there was only one telephone. Bob & Lucy Raley and 7 children lived about 3 miles from this telephone. They lived in Lucky Flat and the phone was installed in the Calthorp home near the R.R. depot.

A messenger brought word to Bob that his lawyer from Alamo[gordo] was going to call him on the telephone at about noon so Bob hitched up the buggy, because Lucy insisted on going with him, and left home for the Calthorp house.

He parked the buggy in front of the house, helped Lucy out, she was pregnant, opened the fence gate to go in & was shot by a rifle over the left eye. Another shot, intended for Lucy, missed both . . . because Lucy grabbed Bob & fell with him or she would have been killed also. Bill McNew was lying on the floor aiming the rifle out the front door, his son George, who lives in Las Cruces, wrote a letter describing these events.

Somehow the screen door with 2 bullet hole punches ended up on Lucy's screened in porch and she often pointed to them saying "this one was Bob's and this one was mine." The door was turned upside down when it was put on the porch so the patches were near the top. "Grandmother Lucy said Bob's blood stained the street in front of Calthorps for years."

My father, Alvy Ray⁶ Smith, stated in a letter dated 19 July 1990 the following about the story above:

Maurine's version was closer to what I have heard. Dad and Mom lived in an old house in Orogrande, not far from the RR depot. There were bullet holes in the door - and Dad said they were made when Bill McNew shot Bob Raley. Re: George McNew - Maurine's ltr. He was

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rough ranch boy - brought up at Orogrande. Went to NMSU (NM A&M) - straight A student in biology - PhD from Iowa State - For many years either Pres or Dean at Cornell - finished out his career as Director of a think tank in NY - has retired to Las Cruces. Perry McNew - Grandson of Bill McNew, George's nephew - was my roommate at NMSU for awhile.^[805]

The following is from Josh Crook of Socorro, N.M. (in a letter to me):

In case you didn't know, the reason that some locality records are listed as "Jarilla, NM" and others "Orogrande" reflects the time periods. Originally, the district was known as Silver Hill or the Jarilla District for the Jarilla Mountains where the area is located. In June, 1904, a 6.5 ounce gold nugget was found on one of the gold placer claims. Later, a newspaper man dubbed the discovery oro grande (big gold in Spanish)—see the article in *New Mexico Magazine*, v. 42, #3, p. 2-5 (1964). Eventually, the name Orogrande stuck. In other words, the record of those who were born or died in that area before about 1905-6 would have lived in Jarilla. Whereas, later, the identical area was called Orogrande. When Fayette Jones (professor and, by then, former president) of the NM School of Mines described the district in July 1904, it was still called Jarilla (Silver Hill). However, the records that I have seen from several mining companies of 1906-1907 call it Orogrande. The first time the name Orogrande was used in the *El Paso Herald* (from the information that I have) was September 12, 1906.

Bob and Lucy Raley who lived in Lucky Flat lived about 4 miles NW of the present town of Orogrande. According to some of the old records (WWII era—Lawson Entwisle's geologic map of the area) Lucky Flat was

located just north of the May and Lucky mines. The Lucky Mine was one of the more well-known mines in the district. The site of Lucky Flat is in the central and southernmost 40 acres of Sec 3, T 22S, R8E, NMPM (see Orogrande North topo sheet—The Lucky is incorrectly called the Garnet Mine on this map). Today, there is little more than rusty garbage in that area. My senior thesis area was on a mining claim about 1/4 mile NW of the Lucky Flat site.

In 1900 Robert L. Raley, 26, single, a stockman born Oct. 1873 in Alabama of a father born in Ireland and a mother of unknown nativity, resided in Eddy Co., N.M. Terr., in a household of two other single men.^[806]

In 1910 Robert L. Raley, 40, married nine years, born in Alabama of Ireland natives, resided as an inmate in the county jail at Alamogordo, Otero Co., N.M. Terr.^[807]

N.B. New Mexico became a state on 6 Jan. 1912.

In 1920 Lucy Raley, 41, a widow farmer born in Texas of a father born in Missouri and a mother in Illinois, resided in Orogrande, Otero Co., N.M., with her daughters “Eliz.,” 15, Ruth, 14, Rachel, 12, son, Richard, 11, daughter, Martha, 8, and son, Samuel, 6, all born in New Mexico of a father born in Alabama.^[808]

In 1940 Lucy Raley, 61, a widow prospector (and other items) born in Texas, resided alone in Orogrande, Otero Co., N.M. She had resided in the same house in 1935. Next door resided William H. McNew, 37, a cattle rancher born in New Mexico, his wife, Ina, 37, born in Oklahoma, and their son, William H. Jr., 8, born in New Mexico. They had resided at the same place in 1935.^[809]

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An obituary for Lucy:

Alamogordo—Funeral services for Mrs. Lucy Raley, 77, longtime New Mexico resident and member of the widely-known Gililland family, were conducted recently from Kaster and Maxon Funeral Home in El Paso.

Mrs. Raley died in her home in El Paso after a six-month illness. She was buried in Restlawn Memorial Park in El Paso. Pallbearers were Tom Bell, McDonald Leighton, Pat Simons, W. R. Tunnell, William Pierce and A. C. Collins.

Survivors are seven children: Mrs. Ellis Wright, Red Rock N.M.; Mrs. Lloyd [sic] Posey, Cloudcroft; Mrs. Paul Holder, Alamogordo; Mrs Emmet [sic] Ballou, Miami, N.M.; Dick Raley, Cloudcroft; Mrs. Martha DeArman, El Paso and Sam Raley, Cliff, N.M.; a sister, Mrs. T. N. Miller, Thatcher, Ariz., and a brother, Dick Gililland, Alamogordo.

Mrs. Raley was born in Brown County, Texas, and was brought by her parents, Mr. and Mrs. W. F. Gililland, to the Mimbres country north of Deming in 1885. The family moved a year later to the Sacramento Mountains and lived at Fresnal, now Mountain Park. In 1889, they moved to the Sacramento River area.

Lucy Gilliland [sic] taught school on the Sacramento in 1899 and 1900 and was married in 1901 at Jarilla, now Orogrande, to Robert L. Raley. She moved from Orogrande to El Paso in 1943.^[810]

Uncle Dick and Aunt Geneva stayed with us a few times here in Clovis – he was a great story teller – and when I would ask him for more specific details about the Fountain killing and other sensitive things, he would say: “Let’s let a few more of these old buzzards die, then I’ll fill you in.” Before he got to that, he died. Their San Andreas ranch was on the remote side – 50 miles or so west of Tularosa to Rhodes Pass (where Eugene Manlove Rhodes is buried) – then north for a number of miles. Very rugged country. The one time my family went out there . . . we went on north, sort of on the ridge line of the San Andreas to Uncle Jim [Gililland]’s ranch – located in Mockingbird Gap. . . . If we would have gone a few more miles north of Uncle Jim’s ranch, we would have been at the Trinity Site – where the first atom bomb was exploded. When Uncle Dick was evicted from his ranch by the Government so they could drop missiles on it – he moved into Alamogordo.

Raley, of the family home in Capitan; one daughter, Mrs. Lewie (Nancy) Harris of Alamogordo; two sons, Jack Raley of Creston, Iowa, and Lealon Raley of Sacramento, Calif.; a brother, Sam Raley, of Lordsburg; five sisters, Mrs. Loyd (Elizabeth) Posey of Alamogordo, Mrs. Ellis (Mary) Wright of Deming, Mrs. Emitte (Rachel) Ballou of Albuquerque, Mrs. Paul (Ruth) Holder of Ruidoso Downs and Mrs. Lynn (Martha) DeArman of El Paso; and nine grandchildren.

Richard Lafayette Raley was born Aug. 19, 1908 in Orogrande and early learned the ways of independence and the love of the outdoors which were to characterize his life.

Left fatherless at age seven by a bullet from a gunman's hand, Raley later recalled the hard years during which his mother kept her band of seven children together and fed while eking out a living.

Working from his childhood, Raley trapped and sold hides, herded goats and sheep, broke horses, caught and sold wild horses, and he recalled with a chuckle how at 14 he got a "real good job" driving a fresno team 12 to 14 hours a day building a water tank on the Oliver Lee ranch for \$1.50 a day and his meals.

When he was 16 he was breaking stock and wearing a sixshooter and also in his 'teens he and his friend Tom Moody rounded up a band of 114 wild horses they sold in El Paso for \$3.50 a head.

To call the role of the ranches he worked for is to list the outfits which have become legendary in the Basin—the Hatchet, the Diamond A, Diamond Bar, Circle Bar and of course, he also worked for his uncles, Dick and Jim Gililland in the San Andreas.

He prospected some, too, but "never made a dime at it," and he was greatly amused during World War II when he was called to service and "spent 17 weeks learning to live in a tent and shoot a gun." It was after re-

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turning from service that he began his career as a government trapper, to which he devoted most of the rest of his life.

He was an ardent hunter on the trail, and was always made happy by catching a “varmint” which had been raiding his rancher friends’ stock. He often said, “you have to think like them (predators) to trap ‘em and I know just what they’re thinking all the time.”

An accomplished story-teller, he has been likened to the late Will Rogers for his tales of the country and his experiences. An acquaintance has remarked, “I never heard him tell a story that wasn’t interesting!”

Withal his rough-hewn nature, he was widely respected as an humanitarian, and of him it has been said that “he lived so close to nature, and loved it so much, that he could see beauty in blowing sand and rolling tumbleweed; he could hear the music in the howl of a lonely coyote or the chorus of a pack.”^[906]

APPENDIX A. THE MATHIAS RICHARDSON FAMILY

First Generation

1. **MATHIAS¹ RICHARDSON** was born 14 July 1749,^[922] **Virginia or North Carolina**, and died after 27 June 1827 when he signed his will and before 27 Dec. 182[8?] when it was proved. He married **about 1770 FRANCES** —, who was born 30 Aug. 1752,^[923] and died **15 Aug. 1820, Anderson Co., S.C.**^[924]

Pendleton District, S.C., lasted from 1786 to 1826, abutting mostly Georgia to the west and southwest and a little of North Carolina to the north. In 1826 it was split into Pickens and Anderson Counties. Pendleton was the northwestmost piece of South Carolina. Anderson became the southern half of that extremely northwestward located district.

Greenville District, S.C., abutted Pendleton District on the west. Greenville Co. now abuts Anderson Co., S.C. They are separated by the Saluda River.

In 1790 Mathias Richardson, over 16, resided in Pendleton District, S.C., with two males under 16, and five females.^[925]

On 30 Jan. 1795 Mathias Richardson of Washington District, Pendleton Co., S.C., bought for £5 sterling from Benjamin Clardy of the same place, 47 acres in Pendleton Co. “on the branches of Saluda River,” part of a tract of 247 acres granted by letters patent to [I could not read the rest of the body of the conveyance]. William Stanton and William Farriss were the witnesses. The deal was acknowledged 3 Mar. 1795 and recorded [11?] Mar. 1801.^[926]

Benjamin Clardy

Because a Norman or Normand Clardy appears in several deeds and because a daughter, Frances, of Mathias Richardson married a Clardy, I pay particular attention to the Benjamin Clardy in the deed of the preceding paragraph. We have the following 1847 obituary for his wife that gives us some detail:

Agness Clardy, departed this life January 17th, 1847, at the house of William Faris, where she was kindly treated until death. She was the daughter of John and Mary Booth. She was raised in Virginia, Amelia county; born November 17th, 1755; married **Benjamin Clardy**, June 25th, 1771. In the Summer of 1776, she joined the Methodist Church, at what was then called "the Five Forks." She gave a home to one of the first Methodist preachers who traveled and preached in that section: his name was Shadford. After which time she, with her husband, moved to Bedford county VA.; then to Lawrence district, South Carolina: **then to Pendleton District, now called Anderson**, and in the year 1816, moved to Franklin county, Tenn., where her husband died, in faith, 1823. Those who read this may see that she was a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church better than 70 years; and I can say, truly a very acceptable one. . . .^[927]

In 1830 Norman Clardy, 50-60 (born 1770-1780), resided in Simpson Co., Ky., with a woman 40-50, one boy under 5, one boy and one girl 5-10, one female 10-15, one male and one female 15-20, and one female 20-30.^[928] So Norman and Benjamin might have been brothers.

On 29 Sept. 1795 Mathias Richardson of Washington District, Pendleton Co., S.C., bought for £60 sterling from William Hallum of the same place, 150 acres "on saluday River washington District Pendleton County," a tract granted by letters patent to William Hallum on 6 Mar.

1786. **John Gililand** was one of the witnesses. The deal was acknowledged 21 Dec. 1795 and recorded 11 Mar. 1801. Signed **John Gililand**.^[929]

On 15 Oct. 1795 **Mathias Richardson** of Washington District, Pendleton Co., S.C., bought for £100 sterling from **William Low** of the same place, 630 acres “on saluday River at the north of Hurricane Crick in Washington District Pendleton County,” a tract granted by letters patent to **William Low** on 5 June 1786. **John “Gililand,”** William Stanton, and William Farriss were witnesses. The deal was acknowledged 21 Dec. 1795 and recorded 11 Mar. 1801. Signed **John Gililand**.^[930] It is **probable** that William Low was the father of Agnes Low[e] who married John² Gililand.

Placeholder: From the Revolutionary War pension application file for William Lowe (pension granted): “**William Lowe** lived in Surry County, North Carolina six or seven years after the Revolution, when he moved to South Carolina **on the Saluda River**, lived eleven years, then moved to Kentucky. The Rev War ended in 1783, so he would have been on the Saluda from say 1789 or 1790 to 1800 or 1801, when he moved to Kentucky, received his pension in Simpson Co. So this appears to be a match with the William Low above. He was in the Battle of King’s Mountain, among others. Logan Co., Ky., was founded in 1792. Simpson Co. was formed from Logan Co. in 1819.

In 1800 “Nathias” Richardson, over 45, resided in Pendleton Dist., S.C., with a woman over 45, two girls under 10, one male and two females 10–16, and one (four?) male 16–26. William Stanton, 26–45 [born 1755–1774], resided next door with a woman over 45, one boy and two girls under 10, and one male and one female 16–20.^[931]

On 2 June 1804 Matthias Richardson of Pendleton Dist., S.C., bought from James Tarrant of Greenville Dist., S.C., for \$600, a tract of 100 acres in Greenville Dist. on Golden Grove Creek. Witnesses were William “Fariss” and Thomas Paynes. On 27 Nov. 1804 Kerriah Tarrant, wife of James, relinquished her dower rights on the property. The deed was acknowledged and recorded 27 Nov. 1804, Greenville Dist., S.C.^[932]

In 1810 Mathias Richardson, over 45, resided in Pendleton Dist., S.C., with a woman over 45, and one female 10–16. Listed next to him is “Mat” Richardson, 26–45, surely Mathias Jr., with a woman, 16–26, two boys and one girl under 10.^[933]

On 27 June 1827 Mathias Richardson signed his will in the Pendleton District [which would have been recently made Anderson Co.], S.C. It was proved 27 Dec. 182[8][the 8 is possibly a 9 but not a 7]. In it he mentions “my sons and daughters of the following names viz. **Charity Gilliland** [sic], Catharine Stanton, John Richardson, Mathias Richardson jun^r, Frances Clardy, Elizabeth Ward, Mourning Tarrant, Anna Dossett,” “my three grand children, Aaron, Mathias and David, (sons of my daughter Martha Garrison dec^d),” and appoints “my sons John & Mathias Richardson, and also William Stanton, Executors.” Witnesses: John Wilson, Samuel Wilson, and Clark Wilson.^[934]

Jefferson Co., Ala.,¹⁹⁴² married before her father's will of 27 June 1827 **BENJAMIN TARRANT**, born 8 Oct. 1792 (gravestone), South Carolina, son of James Tarrant, and died 15 Feb. 1874, and was buried with his wife.

An obituary for Benjamin:

Died, at the residence of his son-in-law, Mr. George Barton, on, Sunday, the 15th last, the Rev. Benjamin Tarrant, at the advanced age of eighty-one years.

The subject of this notice was born in South Carolina, but removed with his father, the Rev. James Tarrant, to Jones' Valley in 1819. He was one of a large and respectable family connexion, many of whom reside in this county at the present day. He served his country in the war of 1812 and was a pensioner of the United States at the time of his death. He had also been a member of the State Legislature, during the time that the Capital was at Tuscaloosa.

But his greatest distinction was that of a Methodist preacher, in which capacity [sic] he served his church for the space of about thirty years. Having been converted from infidelity when more than fifty years old, he became a zealous and widely known minister of the Gospel and was distinguished for his zeal and usefulness in calling sinners to repentance. With his own hand he received more than six hundred members into the Church and was present at the conversion of thousands. His last sermon was preached at the Turkey Creek Campmeeting in 1872, since which time he was seldom able to attend church; but declined gradually, till on the evening of the Holy Sabbath, he fell asleep. He had survived most of his contemporaries [sic], and having passed his four-score years, the silver cord was gently loosed, and, with an unfaltering trust he walked through the valley and shadow of death, not fearing any evil.¹⁹⁴³

APPENDIX B. THE WILLIAM LOWE FAMILY

First Generation

1. **WILLIAM**¹ **LOWE** was born 17 Feb. 1756 (Rev War pension file), Virginia,^[986] died 9 Mar. 1835, and was buried (Rev War memorial) in Skeen Cem., Franklin, Simpson Co., Ky.^[987] He married **MARGARET** —, whose first name we know from two deeds of 1796 in one of which she relinquished her dower rights.

Margaret's surname is claimed to be **Farr** or **Fair** in numerous places, but I have yet to find definitive evidence. She is further claimed to be the daughter of **Barnabas Farr** or Fair (or even Fehr). I will address that possibility later in this sketch. We know definitely that William had a son named **Barney**, from an 1815 deed from father to son.

From William Lowe's Revolutionary War pension application file, in a letter written 26 Mar. 1934 written in response to a written inquiry:

William Lowe was born February 17, 1756 in the state of Virginia, name of county not given, nor are the names of his parents shown. He moved when an infant to North Carolina.

While residing in Surry County, North Carolina, William Lowe, served as a private with the North Carolina troops, as follows:

In the summer of 1775, six weeks in Captain Joseph Phillips' company, Colonel Dyer's regiment, went out to quell the Scotch Tories; in 1776, thirteen weeks in Captain William Dobson's company, Colonel Joseph Williams' regiment, marched to "Over Hill Town" against the Cherokee Indians and burnt many of their towns; in 1780, three months in Captain Minor Smith's company, Colonel Benjamin Cleveland's regiment, was in the battle of King's Mountain [sic] and a skirmish with the Tories on Wa-

tauga River; in 1781, just before the battle of Guilford, three weeks in Captain William Bostick's company, under Colonel Pickens.

William Lowe lived in Surry County, North Carolina six or seven years after the Revolution, when he moved to South Carolina on the Saluda River, lived eleven years, then moved to Kentucky.

He was allowed pension on his application executed, July 24, 1832, then a resident of Simpson County, Kentucky.

The Rev War ended in 1783, so William Lowe would have been on the Saluda River in South Carolina from say 1789-1790 to 1800-1801, when he moved to Kentucky and received his pension in Simpson Co. So this appears to be a match with the William Low in the deed with John Gililand repeated below.

The following was published in an 1885 history of Kentucky Baptists:

William Lowe, a very eccentric man, although a member of no church, after he came to the West, was one of the earliest and most active preachers within the bounds of old Red River Association. An aged citizen of Simpson county communicated the following sketch of this singular man, some fifteen years ago [1870].

He was born in Virginia, Feb. 17, 1756. In early childhood he was taken by his parents to Orange^[989] county, North Carolina, where he was raised up. At the age of 20, he enlisted in the Colonial Army and served a

term in the War of Independence. He then apprenticed himself to a wheelwright. **On the 21st of May, 1778, he was married to Margaret Fair.** He was a recklessly wicked youth; but was under conviction of sin, at the time of his marriage. His wife, also, very soon fell under deep conviction, and the bridal chamber became a house of mourning. Having no Bible of their own, they borrowed one, and gave themselves to reading God's Word, and to prayer. The wife was first to find peace. She immediately united with a Baptist church. After a time, Mr. Lowe united with the Methodists. Six years later, he moved to "the Indian-land" in South Carolina. Here he joined the Baptists, and was set apart to the ministry. He preached only a few months when he was excluded for heresy. After this he joined the Dunkers; but left them in less than a year, after which he never belonged to any church. **In the spring of 1796, he moved to Sumner county, Tennessee, and, in October of the same year, having previously opened a trace across the Ridge, he settled in what is now Simpson county, Ky., and became the first resident in that district.** Here he spent the remainder of his life. Being a man of warm benevolence, of great energy and perseverance, and, withal, a very skilful mechanic, he was very useful to the future settlers of the county. He manufactured the first axe, the first plow, the first spinning wheel, and the first mill (for making hommony), that were made within the present limits of Simpson county. **He also preached the first sermon and married the first couple (James Butler and Charity Lowe) in that county.** He was very eccentric, and was generally supposed to be crazy; but he maintained an unimpeachable moral character, and devoted his energies, with great activity, principally to the good of others, and was held in high esteem by his neighbors. As soon as the people began to settle around him, he began to preach to them with much zeal, going from house to house, warning and entreat[ing] sinners, with many tears. He baptized no one, and gathered no church; but he sowed the seeds of gospel truth in a virgin soil, and watered them with his own tears, and the "great Day" will reveal whatever of good he accomplished. He became very corpulent in his old age, but still continued to preach; and when he became too helpless to stand, he would sit in a chair and exhort the people.

He died of dropsy of the heart, March 9, 1835. Among his last words were these: "If this is death, it is not so bad as I expected."^[990]

William Lowe was in the Battle of King's Mountain. Note that Bethuel Riggs, part of this (my) family complex, was also there but too late to fight in the actual battle.

N.B. Logan Co., Ky., on the southern border of Kentucky, was founded in 1792. Warren Co. was formed from Logan Co. in 1796 (effective in 1797). Simpson Co. was formed from Logan Co. in 1819.

On 5 June 1786 **William Lowe** was granted, for £14 sterling, 630 acres "situate in the district of Ninety Six on the South Side of Saluda River," by the state of South Carolina.^[991]

N.B. 96 was founded in 1769 and terminated in 1800. It was one of the seven original judicial districts of South Carolina. 96 was subdivided into six counties in 1785. Greenville Co. was formed from Indian lands adjacent to 96 in 1786 and included in 96. Pendleton Co. was similarly formed in 1789 and 96 extended to include it. In 1791 Washington Dist. was formed from the northwest portion of 96, being essentially the two counties Pendleton and Greenville. In 1800 the old districts of 96 and Washington were abolished. Whatever it was called, this region was sliced in half by the Saluda River.

On 16 Apr. 1790 **Wm. Lowe** witnessed the will of James Wilson of Pendleton Co., S.C., which will mentions John Wilson, brother of said James, John's oldest son, Robert, James's wife Keziah Wilson. Other witnesses were Francis Nunn and Robert Maxwell. The will was recorded 24 Jan. 1793.^[992]

On 7 July 1792 **William Low** of Pendleton Co., S.C., sold to Keziah Wilson of the same place, for £7, 123 acres in Pendleton Co. on Saluda River. Line runs on Hurricane Creek. Witnesses were John Wilson and Francis Nunn.^[993]

On 15 Oct. 1795 **Mathias Richardson** of Washington District, Pendleton Co., S.C., bought for £100 sterling from **William Low** of the same place, 630 acres “on saluday River at the north of Hurricane Crick in Washington District Pendleton County,” a tract **granted by letters patent to William Low on 5 June 1786. John “Gilliland,”** William Stanton, and William Farriss were witnesses. The deal was acknowledged 21 Dec. 1795 and recorded 11 Mar. 1801. Signed **John Gililand.**^[994]

On 13 July 1797 William Low was taxed in Warren Co., Ky., on 1 male over 21 and 2 horses.^[997] So was Michael “Derrybury” on the same date on 1 male over 21 and 5 horses.^[998] I found neither in the 1799.

The next three items are repeated from the John¹ Gililand sketch for convenience:

On 24 Apr. 1799 **William Lowe** paid tax in Logan Co., Ky., for two 200-acre tracts on Drakes Creek in Logan Co. and for one 200-acre tract on Drakes Creek in Warren Co., for land entered by respectively William Lowe, **James Butler**, and a Mr. Lawrence, with 1 white chargeable male over 21 and 5 horses.^[999]

On 21 Aug. 1799 **John “Gillian”** paid tax in Logan Co., Ky., for 200 acres on Drakes Creek, for land entered by and surveyed for Susannah Smith, with 1 white male over 21.^[1000]

William Low was in the 1801 tax list for Warren Co. (taxed on 14 Mar. 1801).^[1002] No Derryberry was listed.

William Low was in the 1802 tax list for Warren Co. for 200 acres lying Logan Co. on “DCreek.”^[1003] No Derryberry was listed.

On 13 July 1803 John “Derebery” was taxed in Warren Co., Ky., on 100 acres lying in Warren Co. on “DrakesC,” entered in the name of James Butler.^[1004] William and “Jno” Low were taxed on 13 July 1803 for land on “Drakes C.”^[1005]

William Low was taxed in Warren Co., Ky., on 5 May 1804 for land on “Sinking C.”^[1006]

William Lowe and John Lowe were taxed in Warren Co., Ky., on 13 Aug. 1805 for land on “D Creek.” For William, it was on two parcels, one of 200 acres in Logan Co. in the name of William Lowe, and the other of 600 acres in Warren Co. in the name of M. On 10 Aug. 1807 Thomas Crawford and Nancy [variously Ann] his wife of Rutherford Co., Tenn., sold to William Low of Warren Co., Ky., for \$500, a tract of 200 acres in Warren Co. "On Gardiners Sinking Creek." It was acknowledged 7 Sept. 1807.^[1009]

In 1810 William Low, over 45, resided in Warren Co., Ky., with a woman over 45, one girl under 10, and two males 10-16. Barney Low or Law, 16-26, was listed nearby with a woman 16-26, and one boy and one girl under 10. David and Thomas Heffington and Norman Clardy are also listed on the same page.^[1010]

On 15 Feb. 1811 **David Heffington and "Dourthe" his wife** [variously Douroth, Daurotha, Darotha] of Warren Co., Ky., sold to Henry "Garrit" [variously Garrett, Garret] of the same place, for \$550, a parcel of 99 acres in Warren Co., Ky. The land description mentions a "conditional line, made Between David Heffington and Normand Clardy." Witnesses: James "McConel" and "John Darraberry." The deed was acknowledged 1 July 1811.^[1011] This supports the unproved claim that William Lowe had a daughter "Dorothea" who married David "Helsington." It appears that, in fact, William had a daughter "Dorothea" who married David "Heffinton." We deduce that she was William's daughter from the cluster of deeds including this one and the next four.

The next four deeds were acknowledged on the same day 1 July 1811. Each has William and Margaret Lowe selling to the buyer for \$200 each, a 100-acre parcel of Warren Co., Ky., land. The buyers were David Heffington, James McConnell, Jeremiah Chapman (who paid \$400), and John Derreberry. John Derreberry was probably a son-in-law, and so too, perhaps, was David Heffington. But I don't yet recognize James McConnell or Jeremiah Chapman as in-laws. Yet, this cluster of deeds does appear familial. In fact, the deed in the immediately preceding par-

On 29 June 1811 **William Lowe and “Margeret” his wife**, of Warren Co., Ky., sold to **James McConnel** [variously McConell, McConnell] of the same place, for \$200, a parcel of 100 acres in Warren Co., Ky. The land description mentions a William B. Low and James Butler. Witnesses: Jeremiah Chapman and Henry Garrett The deed was acknowledged 1 July 1811.^[1013]

On 13 July 1811 **John “Derriberry”** [variously Derraberry, Derryberry] and **“Maryann” his wife** [variously Marryann], of Warren Co., Ky., sold to Normand Clardy of the same place, for \$600, a parcel of 100 acres in Warren Co., Ky., “being a part of a Survey made in the name of James Butler and Patted in the name of William Law [sic].” Witnesses: Jeremiah Chapman and John B. Smith. The deed was acknowledged 11 Dec. 1811.^[1016]

nesses were **William Lowe** and **John F. Lowe**. It was proved 16 Dec. 1816 and recorded 22 Jan. 1817.^[1019] N.B. William Alderson in Sumner Co., Tenn., born about 1829 (so at least a generation younger than William Alderson Jr. of this deed), married Frances Reeder, daughter of Martha A. (Gililland) Reeder. It is believed that John¹ Gililland died in Martha Reeder's home.

On 13 Nov. 1817 **Barney Lowe and "Margrate" his wife**, presumably of Warren Co., Ky., sold to John Lowe, presumably of the same place, for \$120, a parcel of 46 acres in Warren Co., "being a part of the tract that I Barney Lowe sold to William Anderson [sic] where the s^d John Lowe now lives on." Witnesses were William Anderson and William Lowe. Acknowledged 4 Nov. 1822.^[1020]

On 14 Sept. 1820 **William Lowe** of Warren Co., Ky., bought from Mordecai Conyers and his wife Elizabeth of the same place, for \$500, a parcel of 174 acres (presumably) in Warren Co. and consisting of several tracts. Witnesses: John Beckham and William Lowe. Acknowledged 6 Nov. 1820.^[1024]

In 1820 **William Low**, over 45, resided in Petersburg Twp., Simpson Co., Ky., with a woman over 45, a male 10-16.^[1025]

In 1830 **William Low**, 70-80, resided in Simpson Co., Ky., with a woman 60-70. On the same page was **John F. Low**, 40-50, with one girl under 5, one girl 5-10, one male and one female 10-15, and one male 20-30.^[1026]

Caution: The DeBerry family claims descent from the Derryberry family, complete to changing the old name to DeBerry in online genealogies. I'm unsure of this identification. An argument for the identity is the naming of descendants. For example, I'm looking just now at an online genealogy that has Mary Ann Lowe, daughter of William Lowe and Margaret Farr, married to John K. Dickerson DeBerry. Two of their children are purportedly named William Lowe DeBerry and Barnabus Fahr DeBerry. But I'm having trouble believing that John K. Dickerson DeBerry is the same person as John R. Derryberry. My caution flag is up here because William Lowe is a Revolutionary War soldier whom people would like to claim as an ancestor. Although I can see "Dereberry" might be construed as a corruption of "DeBerry," it's difficult to believe that "Derryberry" is such a corruption. And there are lots of Derryberry records in that part of Kentucky at the time. It seems more likely that "DeBerry" is a fancifying of "Derryberry." Nevertheless, a name like Barnabus Fahr DeBerry carries weight.

Biography

John R. Derryberry was born about 1775, based on a consensus of the available census records. He was born most likely in Rowan Co., NC, where his presumed father Michael seems to have lived at the time. (He lived in that part of Rowan Co. that became Burke Co., NC when the latter county was formed in 1777.) Besides his father, John R. was probably the other taxable male (probably age 16-21) in his Michael's household in the 1796 Russell Co., VA tax list.

John R. shows up in Warren Co., KY in 1800 when he married Mary Ann, daughter of William Lowe, and on the tax lists there starting in 1803. William Lowe held land adjoining a parcel owned by Michael Derryberry, suggesting John and Mary Ann met as neighbors. This close association, as well as the inability to place John R. with any of the other Derryberry family groups, suggests the relationship between Michael and John R. was father and son, and that John R. was his oldest son given the 1796 tax list mentioned above. Furthermore, a land grant to Michael back in Burke Co., NC dated 1795 notes it was certified by Peter Phillips and John Derryberry, the latter possibly being this John R., age about 21 at the time.

We can surmise that John and his father Michael went first from North Carolina to Virginia, then to Warren Co., KY in about 1797. Both John and Michael may have backtracked east from there and then returned. Michael appears on a 1799 tax list in Grainger Co., TN, and

John's oldest son William consistently claims to have been born in North Carolina in 1801. This means John would have to have married in Warren Co. in 1800, returned to North Carolina by 1801, and then returned to Warren Co., KY again by 1803. Michael likewise returned to Warren Co., but he left after several more years, while John stayed.

Michael left Warren Co., KY for Tennessee about 1808, likely taking his other children with him. However, John R. remained in Kentucky, apparently in that part of Warren Co. from which Simpson Co. was formed in 1819. He is said to have paid taxes on 100 acres in Simpson Co. during the period 1819-1835 (source: Bob G. Derryberry's "Derryberry Book Revision"). He last appears on a Simpson Co. land grant from 1838, and not on the 1840 census, suggesting he died there between 1838 and 1840. (It is alternatively possible that he went with his wife and children to Missouri and died en route or shortly after arrival. However, the fact that he received a land grant in Kentucky that year suggests he was not prepared to leave the area.)

John and Mary had six known children, plus perhaps two others who died as children sometime before 1820. Although all records pertaining to John refer to him as Derryberry, all of his children adopted the shortened spelling DeBerry during the period 1845-1851; this surname spelling seems to have been a common trait of Derryberrys who spent time in Kentucky. John's married daughter Elizabeth (McDonald) moved over the border into Robertson Co., TN, while the remaining children moved to Missouri about 1838, all probably leaving Kentucky shortly after their father's death. John's widow Mary went to Missouri with them, dying there sometime between 1870 and 1880 at a very advanced age.

[John and his wife were age 26-44, and a brother or brother-in-law may have been living with them. John also appears on the 1810 tax list for Warren Co., KY, although his father Michael does not. These two unknowns do not appear in the 1820 census or after.]

In the 1830 census, all of his children were probably still at home with the exception of Dorothy Newby. The 1810, 1820, and 1830 census records appear to vary wildly about the ages of these children.

John probably died between 1838 (date of land grant above) and 1840, when the census does not show him and instead show his children as heads of household. Son John L. is in Clinton Co., MO with brother William and either Robert or Barnabas, and daughter Elizabeth is in KY with brother Jesse and either Robert or Barnabas. The J. L. living next to John in MO cannot yet be accounted for, but is probably a duplicate entry for John L.

(Some researchers estimate John died about 1854 in Platte Co., MO. This is probably based on the fact that a John Derryberry or DeBerry appears on Kentucky tax lists through 1854. However, the post-1835 entries probably refer to this **John's first cousin once removed, John W. DeBerry**, who also lived in Simpson Co., KY.)

On 25 Apr. 1799 **James Butler** paid tax in Logan Co., Ky., for 100 acres on Drakes Creek in Logan Co., for land entered by **Michael Derribery** and surveyed for James Butler, with 1 white male over 21.^[1047]

In 1800 James Butler was listed on a tax list for Logan Co., Ky.^[1048]

On 9 Sept. 1801, 200 acres of land in Logan Co., Ky., on the West Fork of Drakes Creek were surveyed to James Butler.^[1049]

On 6 Oct. 1820, 15 acres of land in Simpson Co., Ky., were surveyed to James Butler.^[1050]

In 1840 Charity Butler, 50-60, resided in Hancock Co., Ill., with one male 10-15, one male 15-20, three males 60-70, and possibly one male 70-80. Next to her was listed John Butler, 30-40.^[1053]

In 1850 Charity Butler, 68, born in North Carolina, resided in Pottawattamie Co., Iowa, in the household of John L. Butler, 42, a blacksmith born in Ky., Caroline, 38, born in Tenn., Kenion, 19, male, Charity, 16, Kesiah, 15, all born in Kentucky, Phoebe, 13, born in Missouri, Caroline, 11, Sarah, 10, and John, 7, all born in Illinois, and James, 4, and Lucy, 2, both born in Nebraska Terr.^[1054]

Skeen, 50, a farmer born in Tennessee, with \$6,750 real and \$6,550 personal estates, with Permelia, 49, born in Tennessee, and with Jasper N., 21, a farmer, “Aarchabald,” 15, Mary E., 14, and America F., 2, all born in Kentucky, and two laborers.^[1060] Note that John F. Lowe died in the residence of K. T. Skeen in 1854. This census item suggests that Permelia Skeen was another Lowe daughter. Also note that **James R. Gililland** bought land 13 Mar. 1843 in Sumner Co., Tenn., bordering that of “Kenson” T. Skeen, probably this K. T. Skeen, further bringing the Gililland and Lowe families together.

APPENDIX C. THE ALEXANDER GILLILAND FAMILY

We explore here a potential ancestor of our John¹ Gililland, and tentatively find that he could not have been. There is a strong DNA argument against it, for one thing.

On 15 May 1772 **Alexander “Gilliand”** was surveyed 200 acres in Tryon Co., N.C., “lying on both sides Andrew Falls Branch of Crowder’s Creek . . .”^[1064]

On 25 Mar. 1780 the State of North Carolina granted 137 acres to **Alexander “Gililland”** in Tryon Co., N.C., for a fee of 50 shillings per hundred acres, “on both sides of the ridge Road Betwixt Falls branch & Crowders creek Including James Grahams Improvement Beginning at a Red oak near John Smiths line . . .”^[1065]

Tryon Co. was located on the southern border of North Carolina with what would become South Carolina. Tryon Co. was divided in 1779 (despite the 1780 date in the paragraph above) into Rutherford and Lincoln Counties, N.C. Part of it would become Greenville Co., S.C.

On 18 Sept. 1795 Alexander “Gilliland” of Lincoln Co., N.C., signed his will, and it was “probated 1796.” It mentions (spelling preserved, and the not-to-be-missed images of the pages themselves included in the Illustrations section, starting with Figure 2): “My Beloved Wife Rebaca gilleland,” “My son James Gilleland,” “My [D]atter Elesebeth Wilson,” “My son John,” “**I Lefe to him [John] the End of my plantion joining to John Dinwoeds,**” “My Datter Franceses gilleland,” “My Son Robart gilleland two hundred Eakers of Land Lying in Comberland,” “My Son Wil-

liam Gilleland one Hundred Eakers of Land over falls Brench,” “My Datter Marey gilleand,” “My Son Thomas Gilleland,” “My Step Datter Mary Wilson,” “My Stepson James McColette [or McColeth],” “My Stepson Samuall McCollette [or McColleth].” He appointed “My wife Rebeca gilleland and John Dinwodey Excuros of this My Last Will testament.”^[1066]

On 30 June 1797 the State of North Carolina granted 100 acres to **Alexander “Gililand”** in Lincoln Co., N.C., for a fee of 30 shillings per hundred acres, “On the little Cataba and Lick fork of Falls branch beginning . . . to the beginning entered the 14th April 1794.”^[1067] **So who is this Alexander? Alexander¹ has died by 1797.**

There was an index entry for another grant to **Alexander “Gililand”** of 100 acres Lincoln Co., N.C., Land Grants 5:574, but vol. 5 is missing from the LDS records.

Jumping forward almost a decade:

On 18 Mar. 1805 **Robert “Gilliland”** of Warren Co., Ky., sold to **Alexander “Gilliland”** of the same place, for \$300, a parcel of 150 acres in Warren Co. “on the Waters of Drakes Creek.” Robert Gilliland and his heirs, assigns, etc. quit claim the land granted by the Governor of Kentucky on 14 Nov. 1803. Witnesses were Isaiah Lewis, Margaret Melton, and William Melton. The deal was acknowledged 18 Aug. 1805.^[1068]

On 14 Aug. 1809 **Alexander “Gilliland” and Susanah his wife**, of Warren Co., Ky., sold to John Gibson of the same place, for \$1,200, a parcel of 150 acres in Warren Co. “on the waters of Drakes Creek.” The

deal was partly proved 4 Sept. 1809, and Susanah was separately quizzed. The deal was fully acknowledged 11 Oct. 1809.^[1069]

Genealogical Summary of this family in North Carolina:

1. ALEXANDER¹ GILLILAND died in 1796 after signing his will 17 Sept. 1795 and before its proof in 1796. He married (1) 18 Nov. 1767, Lincoln Co., N.C., FRANCES ELIZABETH BAIRD. He married (2) REBECCA (–) MCCULLOCH, who was born about 1750 (calculated), died 29 June 1837 (gravestone), aged 87 years, and was buried in Bethel Presbyterian Church Cem., Clover, York Co., S.C.^[1070] Rebecca came to the marriage with at least three children whom I list for convenience.

There are many variations on Rebecca's surname: McCollette, McColleth, McCullough, McCully, McCulloh, and so forth. I have settled on the spelling McCulloch from an 1805 guardianship bond (q.v.), but it might have been spelled McCullock there.

However, DNA test results show otherwise. The Thomas Gilliland who married Martha Patsy Armstrong belongs to a different group than the Alexander Gilliland family. These results are found in the McClellan DNA project. "The genetic distance (different markers) between [a Gilliland in Group 2 of which Thomas who married Martha Patsy Armstrong belongs] and his closest match with a Gilliland in Group 1 [of which Alexander and his family belong] is nine. It would

have to be no greater than five to be even possibly related.") [This states that Alexander is a Group 1 YDNA contributor to the DNA project. We know that John¹ Gililand belongs to Group 2.]

Alexander Gilliland-Born between 1794 and 1795. He is not listed in Alexander's Will written on September 18, 1795. It is said he died as a child, so therefore, was probably dead when the Will was written in 1795.

APPENDIX D. WILLIAM LOWE'S REVOLUTIONARY WAR AFFIDAVIT

This is William Lowe's affidavit of his Revolutionary War service in his (successful) application for a pension:¹⁰⁷⁴

State of Kentucky | Warren County } ss.

On the 24th day of July 1832 personally appeared in open Court before the justices of the County Court of Warren County now sitting, William Lowe a resident Citizen of the adjoining County of Simpson and State aforesaid aged Seventy Seven years on the 17th day of February 1833 – who being first duly sworn according to the law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7th 1832 – That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers & served as herein stated –

1st That he volunteered into the service of the army of the Revolution from the County of Surry & State of N: Carolina sometime in the summer (he thinks) of 1775 under the command of Capt Joseph Philips. He joined the army for the purpose of quelling certain Scotch Tories who had risen near the "sand hills" in N Carolina under the command of a Col McCloud he thinks – There was a Capt Jarvis marched in company with him – He was under no general officer. He belonged to the regiment of a Col Dyer, as well as he remembers his name. He marched from Surry County to Cross Creek on Cape Fear River then encamped here for 8 or 10 days, till we heard that McCloud had been defeated by an officer named Caswell – as well as he remembers – we were then marched back & discharged. He was only out about six weeks and got no discharge – There was a Capt Good out with him

2^{dly} – He volunteered again into the service from the same County & State in the latter end of the summer or beginning of the fall of 1776 one or three months tour, under the command of Capt William Dobson – Major Joseph Winston & Col Joseph Williams – There were thrie other

Carolina on Saluda river where he lived 11 years then to Kentucky where he now lives – He has his birth recorded in his family register, now at home. He can prove a portion of his services by a Mr Clark but who he has been unable to get to the Court House owing to his advanced age – This forwards the certificates of Joseph Smith & Zachariah Morris a minister of the gospel . . .

APPENDIX E. BARNABAS FAIR'S REVOLUTIONARY WAR AFFIDAVIT

This is Barnabas Fair's affidavit of his Revolutionary War service in his (successful) application for a pension:¹⁰⁷⁶

State of Alabama | Tuscaloosa Circuit & County } ss.

On this 6th day of October A.D 1832 personally appeared in open court before the Anderson Crenshaw Judge of the circuit court of Tuscaloosa County now sitting Barbabas Fair a resident of the [State of] Alabama in the County of Tuscaloosa, in the third Judicial circuit aged seventy four or seventy five years , who being first duly sworn according to Law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June the 7th 1832

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers and served as herein stated

Col Campbell Commanded the Lieuten[ant] Col Cleveland was Cols of the Regiment, Captain Minor Smith, Lieutenant Vaniene Hawton, Ensign Oliver Charles subordinate officers—that he entered the service as a drafted militia man for three months, that he was then about 19 ye[ars] of age and the time he entered the service was in the fall time of the year, pretty early in th[e] season, though the particular date is not recollected. That he served in said Regiment under the officers aforesaid in the Battle of Kings Mountain, that in this service he recei[v]ed no wounds nor was he in any engagement bes[ides] this during the time, That Capt Smith who commanded him at nearly the first [fire?] was shot through both his cheeks, but survived. That at the end of his service aforesaid he was discharged, but if it was done by a writing he does not now remember it, at any rate if he got a written discharge he has so mislaid or lost it that he knows not what has become of it. he is however sure he served his full time & honorably returned to his fathers residence.

This affiant was born in Pensylvania about sixty miles from Philadelphia as his parents have told him & while very young his parents removed to

the State of North Carolina Surry County, from which place he was drafted, as [?] set forth, that , that part of Surry County as it was then known has by a division of the county now the name of Stokes. After the Revolutionary war was closed he removed to South Carolina Pendleton District at which place he resided untill the year of 1818 when he removed to this State, and settled in the County of Tuscaloosa where he has ever since resided.

That after the expiration of his first service he was again drafted for eighteen months, he thinks the next succeeding fall to his former draft, & being under the control of his father & his services being required at home, his father rather than spare him hired a substitute at the price of seventy pounds

When Cornwallis was marching through North Carolina with his army this affiant was again called into service, but the date he is unable to remember but refers to History for that fact [2 Nov?] he remembers for how long a time he was called on by - he is inclined to the belief that the call was one of an unlimited character for the protection generally of the country—he was present under this call at the Battle of Guilford not though immediately in the action, owing to Captain William Bostick who commanded the company getting sick & not bringing them into action. General Pickens commanded as General that part of the troops to which this affiant belonged—and shortly after, he went in pursuit of the Tories in the up country—upon which expedition this affiant was frequently engaged in [scouts?] and small encounters—or skirmishes but no regular or serious battles against them, and in time he during the whole war untill the close of it was called upon and acted as a militia man ready & prepared for service

—During this period it became a part of his duty to be one of a guard or Escort for the Representatives of the State of North Carolina when they assembled at the Moravian Town in Surry County.

This affiant states that he has as before stated no written discharge within his power, nor is he able to prove by any one in this part of the country that he knows of the services he has rendered in the Revolution, but relies upon the truth of his own statement, and a character for veracity which he hopes is unsullied.

In stating the instances of his service, he has not heretofore spoken of any Regular officer particularly—It will be seen he was at no time but at the battle of Guilford under the command of regular officers except there were some at Kings Mountain—In that battle the commander in Chief was Genl [Gyssene?]-He also states, that to put his whole service together he does not know precisely what length of time it will make but it is a good deal more than two years.

He has no Register of his age—His father kept one, and he has kept an account from it so as to bring his age to the number of years he first stated. . . .

APPENDIX F. THE BARBABAS FAIR FAMILY

I shall use the form “Fair” for his surname, but it is far from settled. Farr and Fehr are other common variations.

Barnabas “Farr,” in his Revolutionary War pension application affidavit of 8 Oct. 1832, written from Tuscaloosa, Ala., he states that he is 74 or 75 years old [so born about 1757 or 1758]. Further:

This affiant was born in Pennsylvania about sixty miles from Philadelphia as his parents have told him & while very young his parents removed to the State of North Carolina Surry County, from which place he was drafted, . . . , that part of Surry County as it was then known has by a division of the County now the name of Stokes. After the Revolutionary war was closed he removed to South Carolina Pendleton District at which place he resided, untill the year of 1818 when he removed to this State, and settled in the County of Tuscaloosa where has ever since resided. [N.B. Stokes Co. was formed from the eastern half of Surry Co. in 1789.]^[1077]

Rather than further transcribe the affidavit, I here present the summary of Barnabas “Fair”’s Revolutionary War service for which his pension was granted:

While residing in Surry (later Stokes) County, North Carolina, Barnabas Fair was drafted under Ensign Oliver Charles, Lt. Samuel Haws, Capt. Minor Smith, and Col. Campbell and was in the battle at Kings Mountain. Fair was allowed pension on his application executed 6 October 1832 while residing in Tuscaloosa County, Alabama, and aged seventy-four or seventy-five years.^[1078]

So we see that Barnabas Farr/Fair fits rather nicely into the family cluster as regards the Battle of Kings Mountain and residency for a time

in the Pendleton Dist., S.C. So a sister of his would be a fitting wife for William Lowe.

On 14 May 1757 “Johannes Fehr,” son of Bernhard and Dorothea Fehr, was baptized, 3 weeks old, Windsor Twp., Berks Co., Pa. **Johannes is believed to be our Barnabas.** John and Anna Maria Hill were his godparents.^[1079] N.B. Windsor Twp., Berks Co., Pa., is about 60 miles northwest of Philadelphia. His calculated birthdate was 23 Apr. 1757.

On 19 Sept. 1785, Surry Co., N.C., Barnabas Farr was bonded to marry Elizabeth Waggoner, with Peter Elrode as bondsman.^[1080] This might be son Barnabas (see next paragraph) or it might be a second marriage for the elder Barnabas. The second conjecture is consistent with the will in the next paragraph.

On 2 Aug. 1787 Barnabas Fair, planter, signed his will in Surry Co., N.C., and it was proved (recorded) Nov. 1787. Robinson and William Halbrook. [The signature is difficult to read but appears to begin with the word “Johan” or “Johen.” The third part of it appears to be “Fehr.” The middle part is the most difficult, perhaps “Br^mHar^r.”]^[1081] Notice that daughter “Margrate.” She would be a good fit for William Lowe and her father spells her name in one of the ways it appears in the deeds.

APPENDIX H. DAYMON GILILLAND GENEALOGY

We know that Daymon Gililland was a YDNA contributor to the Gilliland DNA Group at FamilyTreeDNA.com. In this appendix I will attempt to work backwards to a connection in the main body of the book. Should that occur, then I will move the contents of this appendix into the main body.

First Generation

1. **WILLIAM¹ GILLILAND** was born about 1801, Kentucky. He married **FRANCES BRIDGES**, who was born about 1801, North Carolina, daughter of James and Nancy (–) Bridges.^[1086]

In 1830 William Gilliland, 20–30 [born 1800–1810], resided in Jackson Co., Ala., with a woman 20–30, one boy [James C., born 1829] and one girl under 5 [born 1825–1830], and two girls [**Rebecca?**, born 1824] 5–10 [born 1820–1825].^[1087]

On 2 Feb. 1842 William “Gilliland” and “Francis Gililland his wife late Francis Bridges” and “Alfred Crawford and Catharine Crawford his wife late Catharine Bridges,” of Graves Co., Ky., sold to William N. Cannon, of Barren Co., Ky., for \$100, a tract in Barren Co., Ky., “on the waters of Bearer Creek and adjoining to the lands of John Perkins and David Warren being the tract upon which Richard Bridges now lives and which tract belonged to James Bridges dec^d in his lifetime. The interest in said land herein intended to be conveyd is the portion of the said Frances and the said Catharine as two of the heirs of James Bridges dec^d.” The deed was properly acknowledged by all four parties on 21 Feb. 1842. It was recorded in Barren Co., Ky., on 1 Aug. 1842.^[1088]

On 28 Oct. 1844 John Burkett and Ann, his wife, of Marshall Co., Ala., sold to Richard Bridges, for \$50, a tract of 150 acres in Barren Co., Ky., “on the waters of Beaver Creek . . . being the same land conveyed by Robert Bird and wife to the late James Bridges who was the father of Ann Bridges now wife of John Burkett and the said land willed by said James Bridges dec^d to his widow Nancy Bridges now dec^d (who was the Mother of Ann Bridges now wife of John Burkett).” It was properly acknowledged by John and Ann Burkett on 27 Oct. 1844.^[1089]

N.B. Van Zandt and Kaufman Counties were both formed side by side from Henderson Co., Tex., in 1848.

In 1850 William “Guilland,” 49, a farmer born in Kentucky, resided in Henderson Co., Tex., with Frances, 49, born in North Carolina, and with James C., 21, John R., 19, William B., 17, “Elisa” N., 14, Mary E., 9, all born in Alabama, and with John L. Flowers, 7, William B. Flowers, 5, both born in Kentucky, and Margret A. Flowers, 2, born in Texas, and William Page, 41, a wheelwright born in Georgia with \$1,500 real estate.^[1090] Note that the children born in Alabama imply this family was in Alabama 1829-1841.

The following four grants appear together in the Van Zandt Co., Tex., Deeds. I have reordered them slightly to support the notion that they form a family group, father William Gililand with 640 acres, and his three sons, John R., William B., and James C. Gililand, with 320 acres each, all abutting or near the father’s grant:

On 25 Sept. 1851, at Austin, the State of Texas granted to **William Gililand** 640 acres in Nacogdoches Dist., Van Zandt Co., “on the head waters of Twin Creek a branch of Cedar Creek known as Survey No. 91 about 10 miles S35°W from Canton.”^[1091]

On 26 Sept. 1851, at Austin, the State of Texas granted to **James C. Gililand** 320 acres in Nacogdoches Dist., Van Zandt Co., “On Alligator Creek a branch of Kickapoo Creek about 10½ miles S from Canton Known as Survey No. 93.” The land description mentions “the SE Corner of W^m Gilillands Survey No 91.”^[1094]

In 1860 “W^m” Gilliland, 59, a farmer born in Kentucky, with \$1,920 real and \$1,580 personal estates, resided in Big Rock, Prairie Beat, Van Zandt Co., Tex., with Frances, 59, born in North Carolina, and with W. B., 26, a farmer born in Alabama, with \$1,200 real and \$865 personal estates, and with W. B. Flowers, 15, born in Kentucky, M. A. Flowers, 13, born in Texas, and “Jno O.” Flowers, 17, a farmer born in Kentucky. Next door was “Jno” R. Gilliland, 28, born in Alabama, and next to him was Charity Gilliland, 30, born in Georgia, and children.^[1095] “Jno” and Charity are shown residing in two different dwellings, but in fact, they were just newly married (on 7 July 1860 with the census enumeration on 28 July 1860). Curiously, this marriage happened before the first wife’s death in Dec. 1860.

- + 5 iv **WILLIAM B.**² GILLILAND, was born about 1833, Alabama, married **HANNAH TIGERT**, and had four children. *This is Daymon Dale Gililland’s line.* Note change in surname spelling.
- + 6 v **ELIZA [ELZIRA]**² GILLILAND, was born 7 Nov. 1837, Alabama, married **WILLIAM B. CLARDY**, and had at least nine children.
- + 7 vi **MARY E.**² GILLILAND, was born about 1841, Alabama, married **ROBERT H. CLARDY**, and had at least one child.

Second Generation

2. **REBECCA**² GILLILAND (i.^{?William}¹) was born say 1824, Kentucky. She married before about 1842, probably Kentucky, – **FLOWERS**. Both died leaving three children to be raised by her father.

Hypothesis: Online genealogies suggest that the mother of the Flowers children was a Rebecca Gililland, without sources of course. It would make sense that her children might be raised by a sister or brother if she died prematurely. We note that W. B. Flowers, who appears in 1850 and

In 1860 J. C. Gilliland, 31, a farmer born in Alabama, with \$820 real and \$1,570 personal estates, resided in Big Rock, Prairie Beat, Van Zandt Co., Tex., with M. J., 30, born in Alabama, and with M. F., 6, female, and “Texas,” 4, female, both born in Texas.^[1102]

In 1870 James C. Gilliland, 42, a farmer born in Alabama, with \$600 real and \$500 personal estates, resided in Canton, Van Zandt Co., Tex., with “Mahale,” 41, born in Alabama, and with Milly F., 16, “Texana,” 13, Eudora, 8, James M., 5, Laura B., 3/12, born May, all born in Texas.^[1103]

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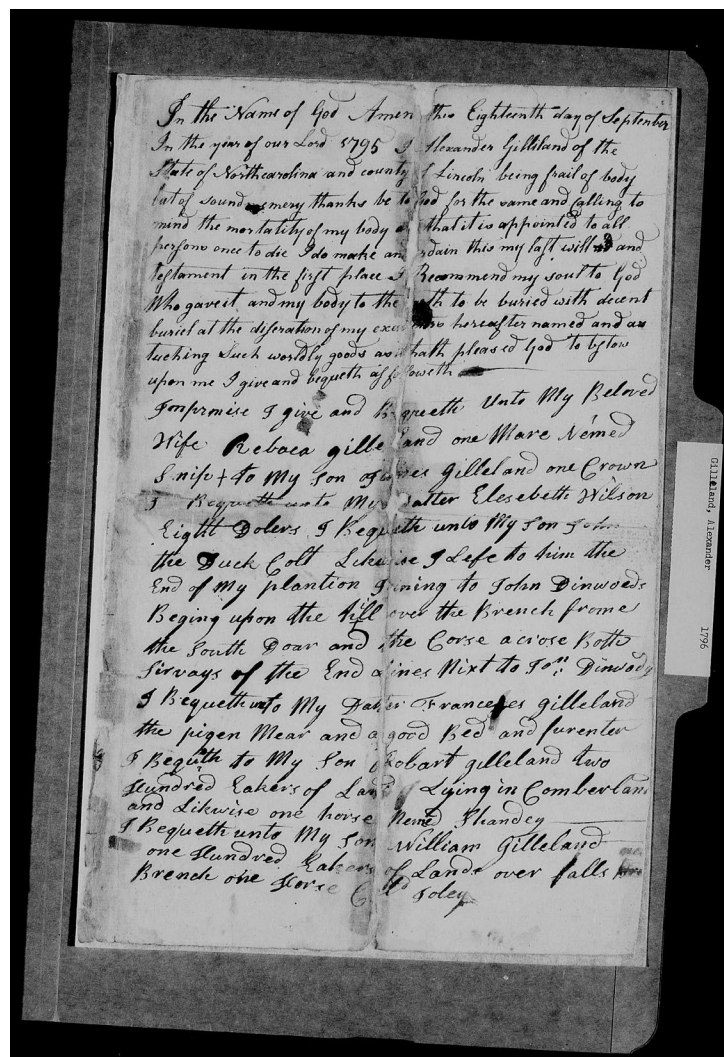


Figure 2. Alexander Gilliland's will, p. 1.

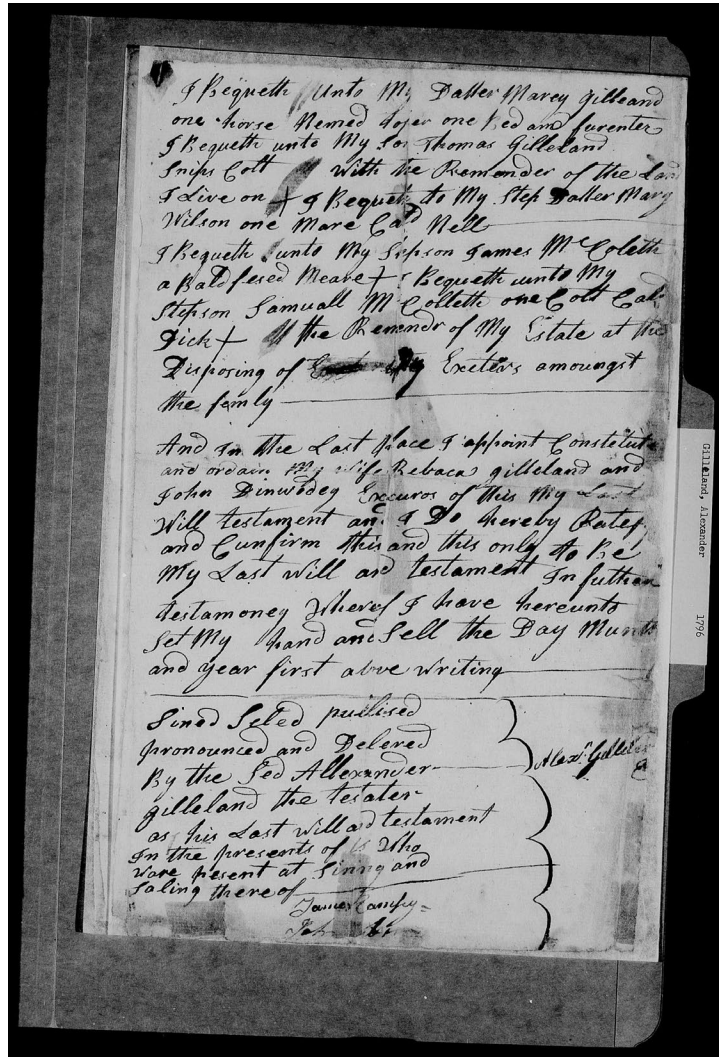


Figure 3. Alexander Gilliland's will, p. 2.

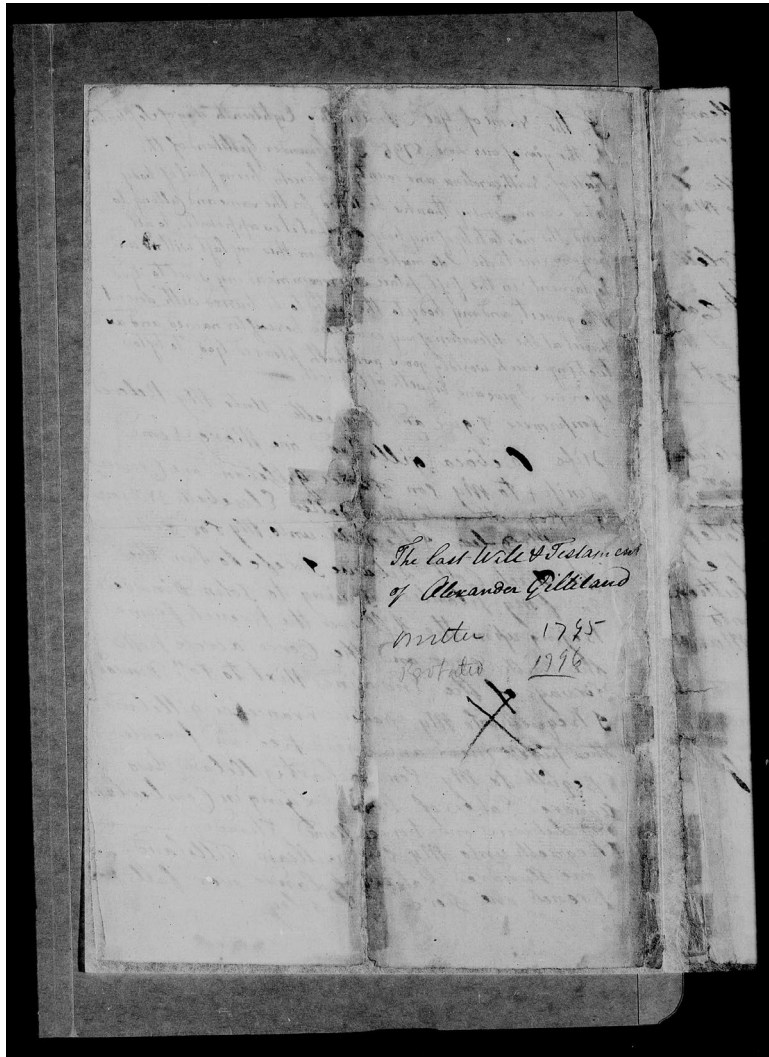


Figure 4. Alexander Gilliland's will, p. 3.

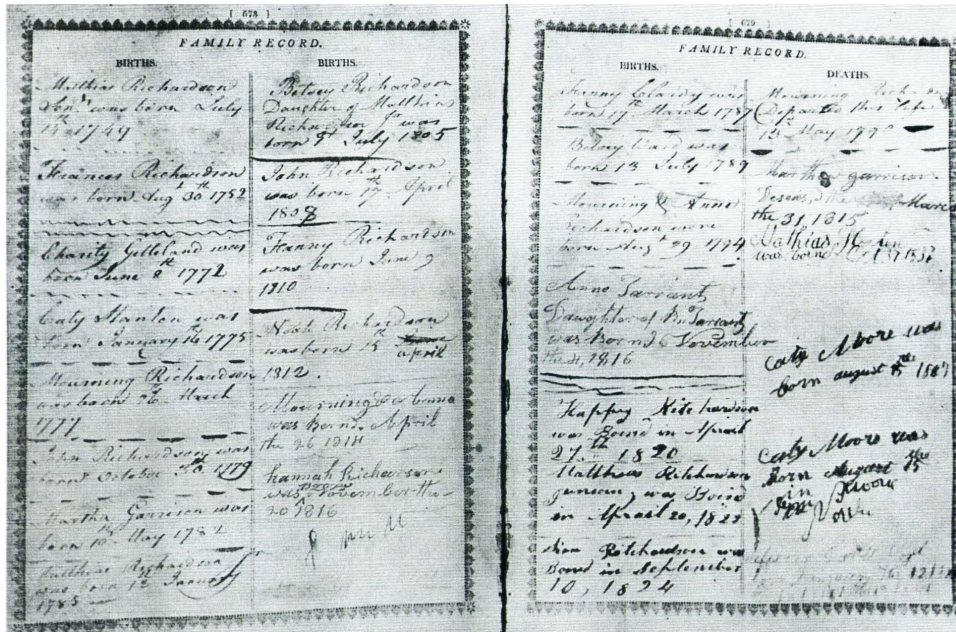


Figure 6. The actual Matthias Richardson Bible Record. The Charity Gililand item is mistranscribed in the previous figure.
