LINEAGE LIST NOTATION

To facilitate stepping “backward” through the genealogy, I utilize one small addition to standard (actually “modified”) *Register* format. A leading subscript to a person in a lineage list is the person number for that individual in this work. For example (a fictitious one), Caleb⁶ Riggs (₅₃Joseph⁵, Joseph⁴, Edward³, Edward², Edward¹) was son of person 53, Joseph⁵ Riggs (₂₁Joseph⁴, Edward³, Edward², Edward¹), who in turn was son of person 21, Joseph⁴ Riggs, and so forth. This technique may be applied to any person in a lineage list. However, to reduce visual clutter, I will use it here for at most one person per lineage list, usually the first.

A superscript asterisk (*) indicates the first person in a lineage list who is not genetically related to the next older person in the list. For example (also fictitious), Nathan^{13*} Knoll (₁₉₁Martha¹², Edward¹¹, Theodore¹⁰, Edward⁹, Elias⁸, Elias⁷, Preserve⁶, Zebulon⁵, ?Joseph⁴, Edward³, Edward², Edward¹) was an adopted son of Martha¹² Riggs. Note also the question mark (?) in this lineage list, indicating that the father-son relationship of Joseph⁴ and Zebulon⁵ has not been proved.

N.B. The National Genealogical Society has now carefully codified modified *Register* format, mentioned above, so it is often called NGSQ format. Whatever the nomenclature, the above paragraphs describe departures from it.

METHODOLOGY AND STYLE NOTES

Un sourced material. Some claims without accompanying sources are important to preserve, as hints to future researchers or simply to indicate that I am aware of commonly claimed dates, names, or places, but am not certain of them. I enter these in footnotes and not in the main text. I do not always explicitly flag these claims as unsourced, but they should be understood as such by their presence in the footnotes only. This type of information often comes from compiled, but unfortunately unsourced, genealogies that have the appearance, to me at least, of being well researched and based on solid evidence. The footnote hint might inspire a future researcher to find the elusive evidence, whereas I had not done so by the time this book went to press.

Census litany. Rather than trying to be creative on each of hundreds of census readings, I have chosen to state them with a common “litany.” To make census litanies easy to spot, I usually introduce each one with the year. For example, a reading from the U.S. census for 1900 will begin “In 1900”

Online sources. I have made much use of online sources, usually secondary, such as the listing of gravestones in a particular cemetery. The problem with this practice is the supposed ephemeral nature of the web. Many online sources may simply disappear from the web over time, or change addresses at least. I have therefore made a copy of every webpage used in this work and archived it for future reference. Very notable exceptions are the many databases available from major servers, such as <Ancestry.com>, which I assume, with some trepidation, will be permanently available by some means. The URL for a website is identified by enclosing < > brackets. When a URL needs to wrap at the end of a line for good visual appearance, I have inserted a hyphen in an appropriate location. This line-breaking hyphen should be omitted, of course, when the URL is used as an internet address.

Abbreviations. To fit this book into one bound volume, I have resorted to abbreviations. With one exception, I always abbreviate state

names and month names. I do not abbreviate state names in the main text that stand alone. However, state names in footnotes are always abbreviated, even in the titles of books.

I do not abbreviate anything in a quotation. An abbreviation in a quotation is present in the original.

I use succinct forms for the sources in footnotes. The bibliography should be consulted for full expansion of a source reference. See the abbreviations section of the front matter for the full list of abbreviations used in the census references. In all cases, the census was read from <Ancestry.com>, and the roll numbers correspond to the microfilm series used by that organization.

Verb tenses. Past tense is normally used, but a record is described in the present—e.g., Joe Riggs was born in 1836, but a death certificate for Joe Riggs states that he was born in 1836.

PREFACE

This is an attempt to chase down a family connection between Reginald Gervis Hargreaves, who married Alice Pleasance Liddell (of *Alice in Wonderland* fame), and my Hargreaves family.

I started with this description from *The County Families of the UK*:

Hargreaves, Jonathan, Esq., of Cuffnells, Hampshire.

Fourth son of the late Thomas Hargreaves, Esq., of Oakhill, Accrington, co. Lancaster, by Anne, dau. of John Hoyle, Esq., of Haslingden; b. 1810; m. 1846 Anna Maria, 2nd dau. of Christopher Harland, Esq., of Ashbourne, co. Derby, and has, with other issue,

***Reginald Gervis**, b. 1852.

Mr. Hargreaves is a Magistrate for Hants, and J.P. and D.L. for co. Lancaster.—Cuffnells, near Lyndhurst, Hants.^[1]

My Hargreaves family issues from Burnley, Lancashire. Accrington and Haslingden are nearby so it is conceivable that there is a Hargreaves connection. It is quite a remote possibility because Hargreaves is such a common name in this part of Lancashire.

Now that I have just about completed my study of the John Hargreaves family I can argue more strongly that there probably is not a family connection (other than that all the Hargreaveses of this part of Lancashire are probably all part of a single DNA clan). The most obvious reason is an economic one. My Hargreaves family of Burnley was poor and unhealthy, causing my ancestor Henry Hargreaves to flee to Australia in 1840 to successfully carry on his line. The contemporary Hargreaves family of nearby Accrington was wealthy and had no thought of leaving the country (although we will find that two orphan children of the family did emigrate to New Zealand).

Another argument is geographical: The towns of Accrington, Pendle Forest, Whalley, Burnley, Altham, and Haslingden are all near one another, but families tended to stay in one community, even when separated by only a few miles. Yet, there is sufficient geographic overlap of the family of this study and my Hargreaves family to justify at least looking for a connection.

In summary, I have not found a connection, but I have discovered a very interesting family, one that represents the old story of business success leading to upward social mobility, entry into the landed gentry, and positions of power, and even entry into the nobility (if only tangential and slight).

Note added 31 Dec. 2012: I have met through email Georgia⁸ Chenevix Trench and her sister Lucy⁸ Trench whose family descends from the Hargreaves of Broad Oak. They also descend from Richard Chenevix Trench, who had the original idea for the *Oxford English Dictionary*. Georgia told me of the fascinating travel book about her great-grandmother Amy Jane (Hargreaves) Pocklington, written by Amy's grandson and Georgia's father, Charles Chenevix Trench. From this book I learned that the family story is that the money comes from the famous spinning jenny invention of James Hargreaves, credited as one of the driving forces of the Industrial Revolution.^[2] It is true of course that the Hargreaves of this book did get their wealth from the cloth industry of Accrington, Lancashire, and that James Hargreaves was famously of nearby Blackburn. But I've found no documented connections of the two families. Nevertheless, family myths sometimes harbor a nugget of truth, so the fact that this family passed down this particular myth is acknowledged. Perhaps someday we will actually know one way or the other.

Note added 20 May 2018: I received today a fascinating email from Stacy Cole of Brunswick, Ga., who has found the will of Joseph⁶ Hargreaves who came to Georgia, became a big slaveholder, and presumably fathered Shadrach Hargreaves. Here are relevant parts of Cole's email:

I was searching for information on Joseph Hargreaves and found your website, and the book you've written on John Hargreaves. The book mentioned Shadrach, reputed to be the son of Joseph Hargreaves.

I am working on a project to record the names of African Americans mentioned in pre-Civil War wills in Liberty County, Georgia, and just finished summarizing Joseph Hargreaves' will, which provides for Shadrach to be educated by his nephew Joshua H. Hargreaves from Liverpool, England.

Although not so stated in the will, it appears that Shadrach is likely a son of Joseph Hargreaves and an African American woman, probably a slave. Joseph also leaves money to two female enslaved persons, Nanny and Binah. Nanny, Binah, and Shadrach are all mentioned and given an appraised value in the estate inventory. Joseph Hargreaves had 126 enslaved persons when he died, appraised at \$31,815. His entire estate, including the slaves, was appraised at \$33,473.

I thought you might like to have this information, if you don't already have it. I've put below the summary I did of the will, and a link to an image of the original will, which has the estate inventory following it.

I have added the will to this book as a new appendix. This appears to provide the answer to who Shadrach⁷ Hargreaves was, and why he was treated so specially in the wills of the family.

THE DNA EVIDENCE

Note added 1 Sept. 2012: A DNA test has just completed that compared a living descendant of John Hargreaves (probably he baptized 30 May 1708, Padigham, Lancashire) to a living descendant of Richard Hargreaves (who married 23 Oct. 1809, Padigham). So both patriarchs were of the Padigham/Burnley area. The DNA test yielded interesting results, indicating a possible genetic connection, despite my theorizing above against it on class grounds. Following are the Y-chromosome DNA signatures of Tony (from John) and Alan (from Richard), where a = 1, b = 2, . . . , z = 26, A = 27, B = 28, . . . , Z = 52, is used to shorten the list of 67 numbers. The locations (markers) where the two signature differ are shown in blue:

So Tony and Alan match at 60 of 67 markers. This is not enough to guarantee a MRCA = Most Recent Common Ancestor within historical time, but probabilities give a 96% chance of sharing an MRCA within 28 generations with this amount of (mis)matching. At 25 years per generation, that implies a MRCA about seven centuries ago. So sometime after about 1300 Tony and Alan shared a common ancestor, with high probability. Another way to say this is that there probably was one Hargreaves patriarch several centuries ago from whom all the Hargreaveses in or from the Padigham/Burnley area descend. This is a theory only, as we have only a two samples.

So Tony and Daniel match at 63 of 67 markers. This is still not enough to guarantee an MRCA = Most Recent Common Ancestor within historical time—*lacking any other knowledge*—but in this case we *know* there is a genetic connection by scholarly paper trail evidence: John⁴ is their MRCA (assum-

ing I have that ?George⁶ step correctly argued). The point is that 4 mutations are certainly possible in 300 years, while maintaining kinship. (I estimate that John⁴ was born c1680 and started having children c1700, over 300 years ago, so the 4 mutations accumulated over that time. That's about 1 mutation every 75 years on average, or every 3 generations or so.)

JOHN HARGREAVES OF LANCASHIRE

FIRST GENERATION

1. **JOHN¹ HARGREAVES**, of Higham, Lancashire, within the Forest of Pendle, was born about 1600.^[3] He died before 12 Feb. 1679, the date of his son James's will. He was probably the John Hargreaves of Pendle who was buried 16 Oct. 1673, St. Leonard, Padiham, Lancashire.^[4] He married^[5] **ISABEL** —, who was living as of the will of 12 Feb. 1679. She married (2) — Radcliffe, of Copthurst,^[6] near Higham. She was probably the Isabell Ratclif who was buried 14 Nov. 1684, St. Leonard, Padiham.^[7]

N.B. The first four generations are only as good as the chart from which they are taken (Figure 3), provenance unknown at this time but appearing to be from an old Burke's.

Known children:

- 2 i **JOHN² HARGREAVES**, of Higham, perhaps the Johannes "Hargraves," son of Johannis Hargraves of Pendle, baptized 24 Apr. 1625, St. Leonard, Padiham, Lancashire.^[8] He died after 12 Feb. 1679, the date of his brother James's will, of which he was executor, and before 2 Apr. 1685. So he was probably the John Hargreaves of Higham who was buried 9 Jan. 1684/5.^[9] He married **ELIZABETH** —, who was living on 2 Apr. 1685, when she was appointed executrix of her husband's will.^[10]

York, who died 3 Mar. 1793, and was buried 7 Mar. 1793, Wheatley Lane Inghamite Chapel, Fence in Pendle, Lancashire.^[37]

Height and Higham are locations along the modern Barrowford Rd. that runs roughly north-east from Padiham to Nelson (and Barrowford) where it intersects the main highway running northish from Burnley. Paralleling Barrowford Rd. is Wheatley Lane Rd. which departs from Barrowford Rd. at Fence. So Padiham, Burnley, and Nelson form a rough triangle a few miles long on each side. The Pendle District of Lancashire contains all the places mentioned above except Padiham and Burnley which are just south of it about a mile. Newchurch-in-Pendle lies in the district a mile or so north of Fence. These places appear fairly often in this genealogy in the early generations. The district is named for Pendle Hill, the most noticeable geographic feature of the area. The Pendle District lies along the southern flank of Pendle Hill. Roughlee is about two miles northwest of Nelson.

Craven is the Anglican archdeanery in North Yorkshire which includes the deanery of South Craven, encompassing the parish of South Morton. Craven lies just east of Lancashire, with South Craven not far from the Padiham and Burnley area, bordering in fact on the Pendle District of Lancashire.^[38]

No further information is supplied for Jonathan, Joshua, Joseph, and William. This list differs slightly from Burke's "Hargreaves Pedigree" (**Error! Reference source not found.**) which lists children in this order: John (his heir), John, Jonathan, James, Robert, Joshua, Joseph, and William. In my list below are several other children, John and the twins, Joshua and Joseph, who died as infants, and the names reused for subsequent children. The order of the last three children, dictated by the records, is William, Joshua, and Joseph, rather than that given in either of the two Burke pedigrees. It is possible that the William listed below died as an infant, and that another William was born after (the second) Joseph below, to make the Burke pedigrees consistent. Assuming Mary was 18 at marriage, she would have been 42 at the birth of the second Joseph.

According to the baptism records for their children, John and Mary joined the Wheatley Inghamite Chapel, Wheatley Lane Rd., Fence-in-Pendle, Wheatley Carr Booth (now part of the parish of Old Laund Booth).^[40] It was founded by Benjamin Ingham, with land purchased on 1 May 1749, and the first sermon preached by Ingham on Christmas Day, 1750. It broke with the Church of England in 1754 to become Dissenters. By 1813 the Wheatley Lane church was one of only six remaining Inghamite "societies." It is now the only remaining Inghamite church.

John's will mentions his wife Mary and his sons in this order (when they are listed together): "my said Sons John Jonathan James Robert William Joshua and Joseph Hargreaves." This is the same birth order as justified below. The will makes his wife, Mary, executrix of his estate, and James Roberts, father of his son Robert's wife, Sarah, executor of it.

John mentions in the will a tenancy "in Salwick near Preston In the said County of Lancaster by one Indenture of Demise, or Leave, Granted me from Thomas Clifton of Lytham Hall in the said County of Lancaster Esquire for the term of Two lives, both which are now in being." The Salwick property is a surprise because it is quite distant from the Pendle Hill and Burnley area, located between Preston and Blackpool, the western side of Lancashire, about 7 or 8 miles west of Preston.^[41] The will apparently grants the second (remaining) life on this tenancy to his son James if he has legal issue, but otherwise it goes to his son Jonathan.

The will also mentions Richard Hargreaves, of unstated relation, but the legal wording is consistent with Richard's being John's brother. (We know he was not a son.) The will mentions, "in the tenure or Occupation of me the said John Hargreaves and Richard Hargreaves our Assigns, Or Undertenants, And of the yearly Rent to the Lords and Ladies of the said Forest of three Shillings, and being of the Copyhold tenure have also Surrendred the same to Use of my last Will, Subject Nevertheless to such a Charge as I shall hereafter charge the same, or some part thereof withall." The legal language is confusing but suggests that John and Richard are the "Two lives" on this copyhold (but not the Salwick tenancy). I cannot parse the will well enough to understand what tenancy is referred to here. The immediately preceding lines refer to a messuage or tenement, at Newhouse, or Sagar Hill, so it might mean one there.

The other two were said to be 'in reversion and remainder' and effectively formed a queue. When the first life died, the second-named inherited the property and nominated a new third life for the end of the new queue." Presumably the "two lives" mentioned in John's will are the last two on such a queue. However, the tenancy at Salwick is not described as a copyhold. Some of John's other tenancies are described that way, however.

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The evidence above is what leads me to believe that Richard might be John's brother. He is possibly the Richard Hargreaves, son of John Hargreaves, who was baptized 28 Dec. 1702, St. Leonard, Padiham.^[42] And if Richard's a brother, then Elizabeth, baptized 14 Apr. 1706, St. Leonard, was probably a sister.^[43] There was also a James, baptized 21 Mar. 1699/1700, St. Leonard, who might have been a brother but the identification is a little less clear.^[44] So long as we're synthesizing a new family, we might as well entertain this well-placed marriage: John Hargreaves married 9 Dec. 1697, St. Leonard, Padiham,^[45] Agnes Howarth. However, both John and Agnes were of Rossendale, Lancashire, which has not been mentioned heretofore. Rossendale is south of Burnley, five miles or so, and not part of the Pendle District.

John's will also mentions a "Copyhold Messuage Farm or Tenement commonly called and known by the name of Sharps Tenement, situate lying and being in Wheatley Carr in the Forest of Pendle aforesaid." Wheatley Carr is the location of the Wheatley Inghamite Chapel. The will goes on to say, "the Reversion and Inheritance of all that Messuage or Dwelling House, together with the Chapel, or Meeting House, with the Stable, Chapel Yard, Lands, Grounds and Appurtenances to the same belonging, now in the Possession of the Trustees for the said Chapel, or Meeting house, and situate lying and being at, or near Wheatley Carr aforesaid." Although I have not yet successfully sorted through the legal language, this seems to imply some association of Sharps Tenement and Chapel at Wheatley Carr, which seems likely to be the Wheatley Inghamite Chapel.

Known children:

- 25 i ?**JOHN**⁶ **HARGREAVES**, died young, presumably before the next John. Known only from the Burke's "Hargreaves Pedigree." He is puzzling because father John's marriage was Oct. 1739, leaving no time between the marriage and the birth of John, next. He is listed in the pedigree just after the John below, but that doesn't make sense either. The Burke and Burke's "Hargreaves of Broad Oak" does not list him, and the older Hargreaves pedigree chart doesn't either. **I conclude that he did not exist.**

N.B. Until 1858, Downham was, for probate purposes, in the Archdeaconry of Chester. It is located just north of Pendle Hill in Lancashire; Higham and Padiham are located just south of it. Burnley, Accrington, and Altham are located just south of Padiham and Higham. Whalley Parish includes all of them. Cheshire and Lancashire were historically separated by the Mersey River (Cheshire south of it), and are now separated by Manchester.

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lected together into a book in 1882, *Messrs. Hargreaves' Calico Print Works at Accrington, and Recollections of Broad Oak*. The following excerpt is from the part *Recollections of Broad Oak*:

Thomas, second son of John and Alice Hargreaves, was born at Wheatley-lane, Pendle Forest, on the 21st December, 1771, St. Thomas' Day, and he was called Thomas from that. He received no education but what he obtained at a night school, his daily occupation, when a boy, being that of a hand-spinner. Spinning machines in those days were worked by a treadle, and the remuneration given to young Thomas was a penny a day. His parents, who were in comfortable circumstances, had a farm at Wheatley, and they decided that when their son came of an age to go from home he should learn the calico-printing, which emanated into life in North-East Lancashire. This, Thomas did not like, and I have been told by his younger sister, the late Mrs. James Holgate, of Burnley, that he shed tears at the thought, and said it was sending him to a business he knew nothing about, and added that if he went to machine-spinning (then fast superseding hand-spinning in Lancashire)^[86] he might make something out of it.^[87]

This book, besides being genealogically informative, is also an interesting look at the beginnings of the Industrial Revolution in England. Featured among its pages are John Dalton, who taught several of the Hargreaves boys; John Mercer who invented mercerized thread; Robert Peel, manufacturer and father of the Prime Minister, Richard Cobden and John Bright, who socialized with one of the Hargreaves sons while creating the Anti-Corn-Law League.

Another clue about John comes from *Burke's Family Records*, exciting to me initially because it places John Hargreaves in Burnley, Lancashire, my Hargreaves family locus:

v. Adam [Dugdale], of Dovecot House, Lancashire, b. Jan. 1771, m. 25 Dec. 1800, Mary, dau. of John Hargreaves [sic], of Wheatley Lane, Burnley, Lancashire, and *d.s.p.*^[88]

. . . signed 'Patteson, Manchester'; (2) Jonathan Hargreaves, 1805, and Jane his widow, 1828, with shield-of-arms, signed 'Webster's, Kendal'; (3) three children of Thomas and Nancy Hargreaves, 1812, 1814, 1818; (4) Lawrence Hargreaves, 1844, and Jane his wife, 1829, signed 'Patteson, Manchester'; (5) Robert Hargreaves, 1814, et al., signed 'Webster's, Kendal'.^[116]

which fits this Hargreaves family remarkably well, assuming all the dates are death or burial dates. It appears to be a cemetery listing, but I don't know what the "signed" phrases refer to, and the mention of Kendal is troublesome because of its distance from the Padiham area. Note that (1) Jonathan (probably our Jonathan⁶) married a Jane, and there was a Jane buried in 1828; (2) Thomas⁷ (*John*⁶) married a Nancy, and had children who died in 1812, 1814, 1818; (3) Lawrence⁷ (*John*⁶), who died in 1844, married a Jane, who died 1829; and (4) Robert⁶ (*John*⁵) died in 1814.

We know that James had no issue as of the signing of his father John's will on 27 May 1776, as it allows for the possibility that he might never have legal issue. He married (2) 28 Nov. 1784, St. Thomas, Liverpool,^[139] **MARY WINTER**, who was born 14 Apr. 1760, baptized 20 Apr. 1760, St. Thomas, Liverpool,^[140] daughter of (see argument below) Thomas and Mary (Eden) Winter, and died 26 Dec. 1824, aged 64 (Figure 8 gives her death as 24 Sept. 1824), and was buried in Trinity Cem., Liverpool. The marriage of James and Mary was witnessed by John Eden. The argument that Mary Eden was Mary Winter's mother follows:

Mary Eden was born about 1730, died Sept. 1812, aged 82, and was buried in Trinity Cem., Liverpool. She married, first, 26 Nov. 1755, St. Peter, Liverpool, Thomas Winter. She married, second, as a widow, 28 Mar. 1769, St. Nicholas, Liverpool,^[141] James Shanks, and had two children: (1) Catherine Shanks, born 17 Feb. 1770, baptized 8 Mar. 1770, St. Nicholas, Liverpool,^[142] buried 28 Jan. 1795, Holy Trinity Cem., Liverpool, aged 24;^[143] and (2) James Shanks, born 12 Oct. 1771, baptized 10 Nov. 1771, St. Thomas, Liverpool,^[144] died 22 Apr. 1807, aged 36, buried Holy Trinity Cem. The two Shanks children were those buried with the Hargreaves family in Trinity Cem. Since the Shanks family and the Hargreaves family were so close, it is probably the case that Mary Winter, who married James, was daughter of Thomas and Mary (Eden) Winter. She also was probably the Mrs. Shanks of the will. She is probably the "Mrs. Winter (afterwards Sheepshanks [sic])" of Figure 9.

His will mentions his wife, Mary, “nephew Joshua Hartley Hargreaves now living with me,” and “my Nephews William Hargreaves and Reginald Hargreaves of Burnley in the said County Manufacturers Sons of my Brother Robert Hargreaves.” It also mentions “my Nieces Mary Dugdale and Sarah Holgate.” Joshua Hartley⁷ Hargreaves was raised as a son by James and Mary, and treated as a brother by their son, Winter Ainsworth.

JOSHUA⁶ **HARGREAVES** (₂₂*John*⁵, *John*⁴, *John*³, *Robert*², *John*¹) was born 30 Dec. 1760, baptized 13 Feb. 1761, Wheatley Lane Inghamite Chapel, Fence in Pendle, Lancashire.^[169] John's (Sr.) will signed 27 May 1776 implies that Joshua had not reached 21 at that time. He and his brother Joseph emigrated to America, separately it appears, to South Carolina. Joshua died intestate before 15 July 1803, Charleston, S.C., when an administrator for his estate was appointed.

Joshua had a son Joshua Hartley⁷ Hargreaves born probably late 1792 in Lancashire, implying that he had married there. He probably had married **MARY** —, the widow of "Joshuah" who was buried 2 Jan. 1829, Wheatley Lane Inghamite Chapel, Fence in Pendle, Lancashire.^[170]

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N.B. Some sources claim that Joshua Hargreaves married Elizabeth Blandford Cantey, widow of James Cantey, but the prenuptial agreement in the sketch of brother Joseph⁶ Hargreaves proves that the marriage was to him, not Joshua (q.v.).

Benjamin Ingham, founder of the Inghamite churches, went to Savannah, Ga., with both John and Charles Wesley, friends of his, in 1736–1737 [see book, *The Oxford Methodists*, on Google Book, 63–80, for his letter home. I include this because it hints at how or why Joshua and Joseph, baptized Inghamites, found their way to America.

In 1790 “J & J. Hargraves” resided in St. Phillips and St. Michaels, Charleston, S.C., with four males over 16, one female, one other free person, and four slaves.^[171] **Joshua Hartley⁷'s 1792 or 1793 birth in Lancashire is inconsistent with this record.**

On 11 Nov. 1793 James Mulryne of Liberty Co., Ga., mortgaged his property to “Joshua Hargreaves and Joseph Hargreaves otherwise called Joshua and Joseph Hargreaves,” merchants of Charleston, S.C., for £195.5.6 (South Carolina sterling money), with £97.12.9 due 1 Mar. 1794 with interest, and with 10 shillings due at signing. The property, containing 170 acres, was “composed of two tracts of land situate lying and being in the County of Liberty and South Newport Bridge.” The mortgage was acknowledged 13 Nov. 1793 and recorded 14 Nov. 1793.^[172]

In 1784 Joshua Hargreaves arrived as a passenger in Charleston, S.C.^[173] **Son Joshua Hartley⁷'s 1792 or 1793 birth in Lancashire is inconsistent with this record unless his wife also came to America and Joshua Hartley was born there. And then she returned to England. Or Joshua returned to England at least once.**

In 1794 [sic] Joseph Hargreaves arrived as a passenger in Charleston, S.C.^[174] **Note that this is inconsistent with the 1793 mortgage record above.**

In 1794 Joshua & J. Hargreaves, merchants, were listed in a Charleston, S.C., directory.^[175]

In 1800 Joshua “Hargraves,” 26–45 [born 1755–1774], resided in Charleston, S.C.^[176]

In 1800 Joseph “Hargraves,” 26–45 [born 1755–1774], resided in Charleston, S.C., with a woman 26–45, and one boy under 10, and four slaves.^[177] **This is puzzling since it suggests he was married and had a child by 1800.**

In 1800 “Jos^a & Jos Hargreaves of Ch^ton S^o Carolina” were taxed in Holland McTyeires’s Dist., Richomond Co., Ga., for one improved lot in Augusta, Richmond Co., Ga., and property (14,000 acres) west of Oconee, Washington Co. but states Franklin Co., Ga.^[178]

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On 1 Apr. 1800 James Allisson, a cooper of Charleston, S.C., was bonded for a payment of £200 to Joshua Hargreaves and Joseph Hargreaves, merchants of the same place. And on 2 Apr. 1800 Allisson mortgaged a Charleston lot to the Hargreaves brothers.^[179]

On 3 or 4 Apr. 1800 Joshua Hargreaves, a merchant in Charleston, S.C., mortgaged a parcel of land to Spencer Man and Frantz Jacob Foltz (the firm of Man and Foltz), also merchants in Charleston, for a penal sum of \$32,000 with a condition requiring payments of \$16,000 in four annual installments with interest. The parcel consisted of lots 50 and 53 “in Mazyck Borough adjoining the City of Charleston.” Then, on 2 Aug. 1802 Joshua Hargreaves sold, for \$16,000, the same two lots to George Veree, of Charleston, and Joshua Hartley Hargreaves, of [blank], copartners and traders in the firm George Veree & Company. Both transactions were acknowledged 15 Sept. 1802 and recorded 18 Sept. 1802.^[180]

N.B. Mazyck Borough is probably the section of modern Charleston, S.C., known as Mazyck-Wraggborough, an area of charming homes. It’s named for Isaac Mazyck, a Huguenot who left France via London where he purchased a cargo of goods which he brought to Charleston in 1686.

In 1802 Joshua Hargreaves, distiller, was listed in the New Charleston Directory and Stranger’s Guide.^[181]

In 1803 Joseph Hargreaves, merchant, was listed in a Charleston directory.^[182]

On 15 July 1803, letters of administration were granted by the Charleston District, S.C., to Adam Tunno for settling the affairs of Joshua Hargreaves, a Charleston merchant, who died intestate. The report was due 15 Oct. 1803.^[183]

On 14 Feb. 1804 the Master in Equity of the Eastern Circuit of South Carolina sold to John Price, “whereas Alice Ashworth Ellen Cobbam, Alice Cobbam & others” of Great Britain had complained 27 Sept. 1803 in the Court of Equity against “Joseph Hargreaves Adam Tunno Archibald McLachlan & Edward Mortimer,” the Court decreed (apparently in its Oct. term) that a portion of land belonging to “the Concern of the Said Joshua & Joseph Hargreaves” should be sold at public auction. The land (described in the next paragraph below) was sold to the highest bidder, John Price,

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for \$5,800.^[184] This and the next several paragraphs appear to be parts of the settlement of Joshua Hargreaves's estate by administrator Tunno.

On 14 Feb. 1804 by John Price sold to Adam Tunno, both of Charleston, for 5,800 "Spanish Milled Dollars," a parcel of land in the village Mazyck Borough near Charleston, consisting of lots 11, 12, 13, and part of 14, measuring 200 feet northwardly along Charlotte Street and about 240 feet eastwardly along Washington Street.^[185]

On 1 Aug. 1804 the Master in Equity of the Eastern Circuit of South Carolina sold to George Verree Esq., a merchant in Charleston, two lots in Mazyck Borough, who subsequently mortgaged them to Joseph Hargreaves, guardian of Joshua's minor son, Joshua Hartley Hargreaves, because of the following [this is the proof that Joshua Hartley was son of Joshua]:

Whereas Joseph Hargraves of the City of Charleston and State aforesaid Brother of Joshua Hargraves Deceased on or about the twentyeth day of June last [20 June 1804] did file his Petition in the Court of Equity at charleston in the s^d State wherein wherein [sic] he Setfourth that Joshua Hartly Harvegraves [sic] Son of Said Joshua Hargraves an infant under the age of twenty one Years and then recident [sic] in England was possessed of and entitled to certain property in this State but had no guardian or other person leagaly [sic] authorised to manage the Same that he the Said Petitioner as being the next relatives of the Said Minor Was desirious [sic] of being appointed Guardian of his Estate and Effects and the Said Joseph Hargraves further Setforth in his petition that the aforesaid Joshua in his lifetime by artickels [sic] of Copartnership Dated the Second day of August 1802 [2 Aug. 1802] entered into between him on behalf of his Son the Said Miner [sic] engaged the principal part of the property of his Son in the Business of Distilling Spiritous Liquors in Connection with the Said George Verree under the firm of George Verree & Co for the term of Eleven Years from that date reserving to himself the right of Managing the Interests of his Son in the Said Concern that the Said Joseph not wishing that the property of his Nephew Should be embarked admidst to the Hazards attendant on Trades and Which from his tender Years he could not at all Manage was Desirious that the Said Concern Should be terminated and the Interests of the Said Minor be rel[?]ed in Some more Secure and permanent property and the Said Joseph also further Setforth in his Said peitition that the Said George Varrees [were?] Willing that the Said Copartnership Should be desolved and the property thereof Sold and Devided [sic] in Such Manner as to meet the interests of the Said Infant that the property of the Said Concern Consisted principally of the land and Building of the Distillery in Mazyck Borough Commonly Caled [sic] Fitz-Simons Distillery and the Negroes Conected [sic] therewith and the Stock and [?] Subject to a mortgage of about four thousand Dollars Yet due . . .^[186]

The record above suggests that Joshua Hartley Hargreaves would reach his majority 11 years after 2 Aug. 1802. In other words that he was then 10 years old, thus born about 2 Aug. 1792.

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+ 71 iii JOSHUA HARTLEY⁷ HARGREAVES, born about 1793 (about 2 Aug. 1792 by the argument in the sketch above) 18 Nov. 1792, possibly in Charleston, S.C., married ELIZABETH LYDIATE, and had five children.

35. JOSEPH⁶ HARGREAVES (₂John⁵, John⁴, John³, Robert², John¹) was born 8 June 1763, and baptized 30 June 1763, Wheatley Lane Inghamite Chapel, Fence in Pendle, Lancashire.^[187] John⁵ Hargreaves's will signed 27 May 1776 implies that Joseph had not reached 21 at that date ("to be paid unto my Son Joseph Hargreaves . . . when he shall attain his Age of Twenty One Years"). Joseph died before 12 May 1835, the date of a codicil to the will of Joshua Hartley⁷ Hargreaves, who mentions "my late Uncle Joseph Hargreaves." Indeed, below we prove that Joseph died before the proof of his will on 4 Aug. 1828, Liberty Co., Ga.

He married 9, 10, or 12 Jan. 1801 (but certainly on or after 9 Jan. 1801, see prenuptial agreement of that date), Independent Congregational (Circular) Church, Charleston, S.C.,^[188] ELIZABETH BLANDFORD (INGLESBY) CANTEY, daughter of William and Mary (Blandford) Inglesby. She had married, first, James Cantey, born in Liberty Co., Ga., son of James and Margaret (Anderson) Cantey, died 1799, Liberty Co.

N.B. Some sources claim that Joshua Hargreaves married Elizabeth Blandford Cantey, widow of James Cantey, but the prenuptial agreement in this sketch proves that the marriage was to Joseph, not Joshua (q.v.).

Joseph apparently did not have lawful children (but see 1800 census), but there is evidence that he had one or more children by a slave woman in Georgia, **BINAH HARGREAVES**, who was born about 1796, Georgia, and resided in 1870 in Liberty Co., Ga. (see 1870 census below), with \$100 in real estate.

Benjamin Ingham, founder of the Inghamite churches, went to Savannah, Ga., with both John and Charles Wesley, friends of his, in 1736–1737 [see book, *The Oxford Methodists*, on Google Book, 63–80, for his letter home. I include this because it hints at how or why Joshua and Joseph, baptized Inghamites, found their way to America.

A mention of Joseph Hargreaves in a history book, associating him with at least one remarkable person, General Daniel Stewart:^[189]

As early perhaps as 1795, Mr. Andrew Walthour, having a farm in that part of the district, began to spend the sickly portion of the year at what was then called the Sand Hills, now Walthourville [Liberty Co., Ga.]. His example was followed by others, and by the early part of the present century there was quite a little village formed.

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Among the early settlers may be mentioned the names of Andrew Walthour, after whom the place was called, John Bacon, General Daniel Stewart, Thomas Bacon, William I. Way, John Dunwody, Samuel Lewis, William Anderson, Charlton Hines, Captain William Hughes, Dr. Samuel Axson, Thomas Quarterman, **Joseph Hargreaves**, Joseph Way, Mrs. John Stewart, William N. Way, Thomas Mallard, and others.^[190]

Many of the names in the list above are also found in Joseph Hargreaves probate file (see appendix E).

The following records are repeated from brother Joshua's sketch for comparison:

On 11 Nov. 1793 James Mulryne of Liberty Co., Ga., mortgaged his property to "Joshua Hargreaves and Joseph Hargreaves otherwise called Joshua and Joseph Hargreaves," merchants of Charleston, S.C., for £195.5.6 (South Carolina sterling money), with £97.12.9 due 1 Mar. 1794 with interest, and with 10 shillings due at signing. The property, containing 170 acres, was "composed of two tracts of land situate lying and being in the County of Liberty and South Newport Bridge." The mortgage was acknowledged 13 Nov. 1793 and recorded 14 Nov. 1793.^[191]

In 1784 Joshua Hargreaves arrived as a passenger in Charleston, S.C.^[192] **Son Joshua Hartley's 1792 or 1793 birth in Lancashire is inconsistent with this record unless his wife also came to America and Joshua Hartley was born there. And then she returned to England. Or Joshua returned to England at least once..**

In 1794 [sic] Joseph Hargreaves arrived as a passenger in Charleston, S.C.^[193] **Note that this is inconsistent with the 1793 mortgage record above.**

In 1794 Joshua & J. Hargreaves, merchants, were listed in a Charleston, S.C., directory.^[194]

In 1800 Joshua "Hargreaves," 26-45 [born 1755-1774], resided in Charleston, S.C.^[195]

In 1800 Joseph "Hargreaves," 26-45 [born 1755-1774], resided in Charleston, S.C., with a woman 26-45, and one boy under 10, and four slaves.^[196] **This suggests that Joseph was married and had a child by 1800.**

In 1800 "Jos^a & Jos Hargreaves of Ch^rton S^o Carolina" were taxed in Holland McTyeires's Dist., Richomond Co., Ga., for one improved lot in Augusta, Richmond Co., Ga., and property (14,000 acres) west of Oconee, Washington Co. but states Franklin Co., Ga.^[197]

On 9 Jan. 1801 an elaborate prenuptial agreement was made in South Carolina between Joseph Hargreaves, a merchant of Charleston (the first part), Elizabeth Blandford Cantey, widow of the same place (the second part), and William Inglesby and Joshua Hargreaves, both of the same place (the third part). Elizabeth's late husband, James Cantey, of Liberty Co., Ga., had died on 15 Aug.

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1799 and left a will, quoted in this document, which mentions “my Beloved Wife Elizabeth Blandford Cantey my Son William Cantey” and any other child or children she might be pregnant with. Also mentioned were his grandmother Elizabeth Williams, her marriage to Philip Williams, and his grandfather James Cantey, grandfather David Anderson, and various property including slaves and 50 acres of land “on the forks of the Altamaha River in the State of Georgia called the Bull Town Trail and of the Plantation whereon I now reside.” The document addresses the upcoming marriage of Elizabeth to Joseph Hargreaves [sic, not Joshua]. Joseph agrees to have no share of Elizabeth’s Cantey estate except as specified in this document, but in particular no debts of Joseph Hargreaves are to be paid from her estate. For one dollar, William Inglesby [probably Elizabeth’s father or perhaps a brother] and Joshua Hargreaves agreed to these conditions and agreed to make all necessary legal arrangements to uphold it for Elizabeth. The document was signed and sealed by all four people. To it was attached a list of slaves by name, including **Nanny** and **Binah**. The agreement was acknowledged 4 June 1801 and recorded 2 Jan. 1802.^[198]

On 9 Mar. 1803 Joseph Hargreaves, of Charleston Dist., S.C., having survived the death of his business partner (and brother), Joshua Hargreaves, and upon the failing of their company Joshua & Joseph Hargreaves, sold for one dollar most of the company’s assets to pay off the company’s major creditors, the principal assets captured in the table below. The instrument was acknowledged and recorded 11 Mar. 1803:^[199]

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On 15 Aug. 1805, Charleston Dist., S.C., Elizabeth Blandford Hargreaves, the wife of Joseph Hargreaves, relinquished to Adam Tunno her right of dower.^[200]

Joseph Hargreaves of Liberty Co., Ga., signed his will 13 Dec. 1825, and it was proved 4 Aug. 1828. This surprising document (see appendix for its entirety) has as its first items (not counting the pro forma burial and debts item) these:

I will and ordain, that immediately after my decease, my executors herein after named do pay, from out of my estate to the said Nanny and Binah the sum of one hundred dollars each free from all incumbrances and charges whatsoever, the same being for their maintenance and support. And my executors are directed to sell a box of plate, now in my storeroom, at my plantation, and to distribute the money arising from the sales thereof, in equal proportions to the said Nanny and Binah.

I do give, devise and bequesth unto him the said Shadrach the one full fourth part of my estate, both real and personal, that I may die possessed of.

It is my wish and request, that the said Shadrach may receive an English education (the best to be obtained) that his estate, so given and bequeathed, may or can afford; and that when he shall have attained to a fit and proper age, he may be put to some business or trade, such as he may with prudence choose. But should it so happen, that the said Shadrach shall have departed this life before attaining to the age of twenty years, than and in that case, the said estate, so given and bequeathed to the said Shadrach, and all and every part thereof, shall become the estate, right and property of my nephew Joshua H. Hargreaves.

The remaining three-fourths of Joseph's estate he bequeathed to his nephew Joshua H. Hargreaves. Then this:

It is my wish and request, that the said boy Shadrach aforementioned, after my decease, and as soon as the same can be done with safety and convenience, be sent to Europe to my nephew Joshua H. Hargreaves, in him reposing all trust and confidence, when he the said Shadrach shall come under his care and charge.

The will is followed by an inventory made 16 Oct. 1828 that lists 125 slaves by first name and value, the total value of them being \$31,815. (The total value of the inventory was \$33,473.) Listed together in the inventory of slaves are nos. 28–30, with values in dollars:

28	Binah	400
29	Old Nanny	100
30	Shadrach	200

Thus it appears that Joseph had no lawful children, leaving everything to Shadrach and to his nephew, Joshua H., whom he made guardian of Shadrach. Since Joseph showers so much legacy on Shadrach we are probably safe in assuming that Shadrach was his son by a slave mother [see next paragraph]. Since Binah and Nanny are singled out in the first item of Joseph's will for special treatment, we can probably assume that they are Shadrach's slave family. It appears that Binah or Nanny was Shadrach's mother. We argue below that Binah was probably Shadrach's mother, and hence Old Nanny probably his grandmother.

Indeed, the complete original will of Joseph's has come to light before it was seriously redacted by his executor and his nephew Joshua (see appendix E). It shows explicitly that Nanny's daughter

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was Binah, and Binah's son by Joseph was Shadrach. Joseph intended all three to be emancipated, a wish thwarted by his executor and nephew and perhaps Georgia law.

A codicil, dated 12 May 1835, to the will of (nephew) Joshua Hartley⁷ Hargreaves, mentions Shadrach as "reputed son of my late Uncle Joseph Hargreaves," and implies that he was not yet 21 (the codicil granted him £3,000 at 21). This implies that Shadrach was born somewhere between 1814 and 1835. Joseph's will implies that Shadrach was not yet 20 when the will was signed on 13 Dec. 1825 ("before attaining to the age of twenty years"). This implies that Shadrach was born somewhere between 1805 and 1825. Together these clues put his birth between 1814 and 1825.

The following item in England suggests that all might not have turned out well for Shadrach:

On 10 May 1841, Shadrach Hargreaves, 23 [born about 1818], was imprisoned for 14 days for fraud, tried at the Liverpool Borough Sessions.^[201] This suggests that Shadrach went to Lancashire after he reached 20 or 21 (1838 or 1839), but after his guardian Joseph H. Hargreaves had died in 1836, in Liverpool. Without this protection he was found guilty of fraud, of claiming probably to be Joseph's kin and owed £3,000.

In 1830 the estate of Joseph "Hargroves decd" had 16 male and 17 female slaves under 10, 19 male and 19 female slaves, 10-24, 17 male and 6 female slave 24-36, 11 male and 10 female slaves 34 -55, and 4 male and 6 female slaves 55-100, for a total of 125 slaves.^[202]

On 11 Mar. 1833 Thomas Mallard of Liberty Co., Ga., executor of the last will and testament of Joseph Hargreaves, late of the same place, sold to Joseph Jones of the same place, a planter, for \$31 (the highest bid), per court decree of December Term 1832, an undivided moiety of a tract of land of 330 acres (so 165 acres) in Liberty Co. "on Bulltown Swamp" from the estate of Joseph Hargreaves deceased.^[203] Cf. the Bull Town Trail property in the 1801 prenuptial agreement.

In 1850 Binah "Hargrove," 60, a black woman, resided in Liberty Co., Ga., with Henry, 8, black, and Matilda, 1, mulatto.^[204]

In 1870 Binah Hargreaves, 74, a black washerwoman with \$100 real estate, born in Georgia, resided in McIntosh, Liberty Co., Ga.^[205]

Raffles, Thomas (1788–1863), independent minister, only son of William Raffles (d. 9 Nov. 1825), solicitor, was born in Princes Street, Spitalfields, London, on 17 May 1788. He was first cousin of Sir Thomas Stamford Raffles [q.v.] His mother was a Wesleyan methodist, and he joined that body at ten years of age. In 1800 he was sent to a boarding-school at Peckham, kept by a baptist minister On the sudden death (5 Aug. 1811) of Thomas Spencer [q.v.], minister of Newington Chapel, Liverpool, Raffles was invited to succeed him. He preached at Liverpool in November 1811, accepted the call on 11 Jan. 1812, began his ministry on 19 April, and was 'set apart to the pastoral office' on 28 May, the congregation having removed on 27 May to a new chapel in Great George Street.

His ministry in Liverpool, which lasted till 24 Feb. 1862, was one of great eminence. No nonconformist minister in Liverpool held for so long a period so commanding a position. In politics he took no public part, though a liberal in principle. In September 1833 he declined an invitation to succeed Rowland Hill (1744–1833) [q.v.] at Surrey Chapel, London. He was chairman of the Congregational Union of England and Wales in 1839. On 19 Feb. 1840 his chapel in Great George Street was destroyed by fire. A new chapel on the same site was opened on 21 Oct.

In conjunction with George Hadfield (1787–1879) [q.v.], Raffles was one of the main founders in 1816 of the Blackburn Academy for the education of independent ministers, of which Joseph Fletcher, D.D. [q.v.], was the first theological tutor. The removal of the institution to Manchester, as the Lancashire Independent College, was largely due to Raffles. From March 1839 till his death he was chairman of the education committee, and raised a large part of the money for the existing college buildings at Whalley Range, near Manchester, opened on 26 April 1843. On 20 June 1861 his services to the college were acknowledged by the foundation of the Raffles scholarship and the Raffles library. He had received the degree of LL.D. from Marischal College, Aberdeen, on 22 Dec. 1820, when his testimonials were signed by the Dukes of Sussex and Somerset; and in July 1830 the degree of D.D. from Union

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College, Connecticut.

In the history of nonconformity, especially in Lancashire, he was deeply interested, accumulating a large collection of original documents, of which much use has been made by Halley and some by Nightingale. These manuscripts are now in the library of the Lancashire Independent College. He was a great collector of autographs of all kinds. He left forty folio volumes of them, and as many quartos, besides a collection of American autographs in seven volumes.

Raffles died on 18 Aug. 1863. He was buried on 24 Aug. in the Necropolis, Liverpool. In person he was tall and dignified, his voice and manner were suasive, and his powers of anecdote were famous. In the pulpit he wore cassock, gown, and bands. He married, on 18 April 1815, Mary Catherine (b. 31 July 1796, d. 17 May 1843), only daughter of James Hargreaves of Liverpool. He had three sons and a daughter; his eldest son, and biographer, being Thomas Stamford Raffles, at one time stipendiary magistrate of Liverpool.^[268]

Joshua Hartley Hargreaves was promoted to ensign in the 2d Regiment of the Royal Lancashire Militia on 26 or 27 Feb. 1812.^[309] He was a lieutenant in the 2d Battalion of the Royal Lancashire Militia, on 8 May 1814, when his commission was signed.^[310]

Joshua Hargreaves, brewer, is listed in a directory of Liverpool for 1823–1824, and Winter Ainsworth Hargreaves, ale and porter brewer, is also listed.^[311]

Joshua Hartley Hargreaves is listed in the 1828–1829 and 1834 *Pigot's Directory* for Liverpool, under Brewers, at 29 Smithfield St.^[312]

Joshua named three of his children after his cousins with whom he was raised, Mary Catherine, Winter Ainsworth, and James, children of his uncle James Hargreaves. He was a cousin of Winter Ainsworth⁷ Hargreaves (*James*⁶, *John*⁵), according to Winter's will of 17 Nov. 1826 (q.v.).

Joshua signed his will 28 July 1828, proved 16 Dec. 1836. It mentions his wife Elizabeth and children (unnamed), and also the late Winter Ainsworth Hargreaves (no relationship stated). In a

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codicil signed 12 May 1835 he left £3,000 to Shadrach Hargreaves, when he reached 21, “the reputed son of my late Uncle Joseph Hargreaves,” “on condition of his executing a release of all claims and demands which he may have or claim to have under the will of my said late Uncle Joseph.”

Miss Eliza Hargreaves, 17, and Winter Hargreaves, 11, immigrated to New Zealand from England, on the *Bolton*, which sailed from Gravesend on 19 Nov. 1839 and arrived in Port Nicholson [now Wellington Harbour], New Zealand, on 30 Apr. 1840.^[313] Winter’s age is correct at sailing, but misleading because he turned 12 the very next week, on 25 Nov. 1839.

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Liverpool, and was therefore surely the namesake for this Winter⁸, who died 10 Apr. 1883, aged 55, Macquarie Street Asylum, Parramatta, NSW, buried 12 Apr. 1883, Rookwood Necropolis, Sydney, NSW.^[319]

A Winter Ainsworth Hargreaves married 6 June 1850, Claines, Worcester, England,^[320] Caroline von Windheim. I include him because of his (unusual) name, and the timing, but I have nothing that connects this Winter to the current Winter⁴. And it would have been about this time that Winter⁸ was prospecting for gold in Australia and California.

In Sept. 1837 Winter Ainsworth Hargreaves entered King William's College, Castletown, Isle of Man, left 1 Feb. 1840, and "Went to New Zealand."^[321]

On 30 Apr. 1840 Winter "Hargraves," 11 (his age at sailing on 19 Nov. 1839), arrived in Port Nicholson [Wellington] aboard the *Bolton*, from London, with his sister, Eliza, 17, with the family of Rev. John Frederick Churton, the first Church of England minister of New Zealand. See Eliza's sketch for more information.

The 24 Apr. 1877 issue of *The Sydney Morning Herald*, NSW, Australia, stated that Winter Hargreaves, 50, entered the Sydney Infirmary for a fracture of the ribs.^[322]

72. On 10 May 1841, Shadrach Hargreaves, 23 [born about 1818], was imprisoned for 14 days for fraud, tried at the Liverpool Borough Sessions.^[327] This suggests that Shadrach went to Lancashire after he reached 20 or 21 (1838 or 1839), but after his guardian Joseph H. Hargreaves had died in 1836, in Liverpool. Without this protection he was found guilty of fraud, of claiming probably to be Joseph's kin and owed £3,000.

In 1841 Shadrach Hargreaves, 20, of independent means, born in "foreign parts," resided in St. Martin, Liverpool, in the household of Nicholas Lee, 20, of a beer house, and Nathaniel Lee, 15,

The demise of Mr. Benjamin Hargreaves deprives Accrington of one of its most honoured citizens. In the course of a long life, covering some three-quarters of a century, Mr. Hargreaves had exerted himself for the good of those around him as much as man could possibly do, and by an intelligent use of the faculties which it has pleased Providence to bestow upon him had made the world the happier for his existence, and has now left it better than he found it. The public spirit with which the late Mr. Har-

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greaves was always animated might well be made an example for imitation by many whom he has left behind him. In Accrington especially, his death will make a great void; but fortunately he will leave behind him relatives as generous and public spirited as himself, and these, we believe, now that the last tribute of respect has been paid to the memory of the deceased, will do their best to maintain all the characteristics by which the name Hargreaves has been so long distinguished.

Death of Mr. Benjamin Hargreaves

Mr. Benjamin Hargreaves, the last of the male line of the Accrington branch of the Hargreaves family, died on Sunday afternoon, at his residence, Arden [see Figure 14], Accrington, in the 74th year of his age. The deceased had earned popularity and distinction among all classes by his many acts of benevolence and his unremitting attention, during a period of half a century, to the welfare of the town and its various institutions. Mr. Hargreaves had been in failing health for the last twelve months, and for some time was confined to his room. He took to his bed about the middle of June, suffering from a complication of inflammatory diseases which threatened his life. He was attended by Dr. Booth and Dr. Ruttle, of Accrington; and Mr. Lund, of Manchester, and his two nephews (Mr. John and Mr. Reginald Hargreaves) were in constant attendance upon him in his last illness. The public of Accrington were very anxious to learn the progress of the sufferer, and daily bulletins were issued at the Mechanics' Institution. In the earlier part of the week the deceased appeared to have been considerably better, but on Friday a relapse set in, and the public of Accrington were startled and grieved at the announcement of his death on Sunday evening. In some of the churches and chapels the announcement was briefly made from the pulpit, and a few remarks of regret were expressed by the officiating ministers. On Monday morning the flag at the Town-hall was hoisted half-mast, and the flags of the Conservative Club, the Liberal Club, the Mechanics' Institution, and the Parish Church were similarly displayed, as a mark of respect to the memory of the deceased gentleman.

Mr. Benjamin Hargreaves was born at Oakenshaw House on Nov. 21, 1806. He was one of the numerous and gifted sons of Mr. Thomas Hargreaves, the founder of the Accrington branch of the Hargreaves family, and a gentleman who played no inconsiderable part in winning for Accrington the fame it has long enjoyed as a thriving mart of industry. Mr. Thomas Hargreaves, the son of parents living in Pendle Forest, received the advantage of a good education, and, being endowed with many natural talents, made considerable headway in his struggles with the world, till eventually at the close of the last century he occupied a prominent position at Broadoak Printworks. Mr. Thomas Hargreaves, in the beginning of the present century, removed from Oak Hill to Oakenshaw House, the birth place of the subject of this memoir, but after the lapse of about ten years returned to the house at Oak Hill, which had been rebuilt. He died in 1822, a few months after the demise of a favourite and promising son, Lawrence, and was interred in St. James's Churchyard. Mr. Benjamin Hargreaves at an early age was sent to Highbrake School, Huncoat. Subsequently he became a pupil of the great John Dalton,^[419] whose good opinion he speedily earned. He early displayed an inventive and mechanical genius, and was greatly attached to the experimental sciences. When about 22 years of age he went to Edinburgh, and there his mind was expanded and enriched by the teachings of Drs. Hope and Reid and Mr. Leslie (afterwards Sir John Leslie). He made considerable progress in his knowledge of botany, chemistry, and natural philosophy. Mr. B. Hargreaves also travelled over a good deal of Europe, and on returning to Accrington at once took an active part in public affairs. He took a prominent part in promoting the erection of the Peel Institution, and in making good use of it when built, himself amongst others being one of those who lectured to the public there. He had been president of the Institution from its commencement, and in 1879 was presented with an address and portrait.

The deceased gentleman was elected a member of the Local Board on the 11th Sept., 1870, and he

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remained there a useful servant to the town till 1878, when Accrington was incorporated. While on the Board he paid special attention to sanitary matters.^[420] The Local Board was dissolved on the 15th of April, 1878, a few days afterwards the charter of incorporation was received, and preparations were made for the municipal elections. Mr. Benjamin Hargreaves allied himself with the “Non-politicals,” and many of his best friends in order to be true to the Liberal party, felt obliged to vote against him. He put up for North-East Ward, but was defeated, the number of votes recorded in his favour being 579. Mr. F. N. Haywood stood at the head of the poll for the Ward with 900. The Corporation then lost a useful member, and great regret was expressed at the time at the course events had taken. Subsequently when the new commission of the peace for the county arrived, Mr. Hargreaves was one of the gentlemen unanimously nominated to the Chancellor for the office of magistrate, but he declined to act. He retired to Arden House, and devoted himself to his favourite scientific pursuits, yet was always ready at the beck [sic] of the poor and needy, and to lend aid to objects which had in view the social, moral and religious welfare of the people. His extreme readiness in this respect sometimes made him the subject of imposture. Mr. Hargreaves was a great benefactor to the churches in the town—to Christ Church and St. John’s in particular. The former church was founded by the Hargreaves family, and Mr. Benjamin was one of the first churchwardens and its main prop and stay. He was a regular attender at all Church conferences, and sometimes took an active part in the discussions. His sympathies were in no respect confined to particular objects. He scattered his benefits broadcast, and there is scarcely an institution in Accrington that cannot say it owes much to the liberality of Mr. Benjamin Hargreaves. He possessed a cultured and refined intellect, had a great love of fine arts, which seems to be inherent in the Hargreaves family, and was deeply versed in various sciences, in which he continually experimented, with a view to the practical benefit of his fellow-men. In his dealing with the world he was singularly straightforward and ingenuous, affable in his demeanour, interesting and instructive in his conversation, and an unmistakable gentleman.

The Accrington Town Council assembled on Monday afternoon, at the Town-hall in pursuance of the usual monthly notice, but as a mark of respect to the late Mr. Hargreaves, it was decided to defer transacting any business until after the funeral, and Mr. Rhodes speaking of Mr. Hargreaves said for the last half century he had taken a very active and intelligent part in the affairs of the town generally. There was scarcely an institution, secular or sacred, that had not participated in his bounties. His feelings and sympathies had always been closely connected with Accrington in its progress, and those who had had the pleasure of workign with him in a public capacity would keenly feel his loss. He seemed to live entirely for others and not for himself. His bounties were always at the call of the suffering, the needy, and the charitable.

On Monday the Town Clerk (representing the Corporation), and Mr. F. N. Haywood (on behalf of the Mechanics’ Institution), waited upon Col. Hargreaves with the view of ascertaining whether the funeral was to be a private one, as the members of both bodies were extremely desirous of following the remains of the late Mr. Hargreaves to the grave. Col. Hargreaves replied that, having regard to the expressed desire of Mr. Benjamin Hargreaves that his funeral should be conducted in a simple and private manner, his relatives were anxious that there should be no official display of any sort whatever at his funeral but at the same time should any one wish in his private capacity to pay the last tribute of respect to the deceased and follow his body to the grave he would be most welcome so to do.

The interment of Mr. B. Hargreaves took place on Thursday morning, at the Cemetery. The funeral was of a private character. About 120 townspeople joined in the *cortège, in route*. The hearse was preceded by the private carriages belong to the following:—Mr. George Walmsley, J.P., Mr. W. Wilkinson, J.P.,

The four mourning coaches which followed the hearse contained the following gentlemen:—Col. Hargreaves, Mr. Reginald Hargreaves, Col. Aikman, Mr. Sandwith, Mr. Henderson, Capt. In 1841 Robert Hargreaves, 33, a merchant born in the county, resided in Bank House in New Accrington Twp., Accrington, Whalley, Lancashire, with Louisa, 24, not born in Lancashire, and with Louisa Grace, 1, born in the county. There were four servants in the household. Listed next, at Broad Oak, was John Hargreaves.^[429]

He managed, or was part of, a firm of three employers, employing 876 people (506 men, 21 women, 247 boys, and 102 girls), and farming 202.5 acres. There were also seven servants in the household.^[452]

In 1861 Jonathan Hargreaves, 50, of Cuffnells, a magistrate and deputy lieutenant born in Oakenshaw, Lancashire, resided in Lyndhurst Parish, Hampshire, with his wife Anna Maria, 43, born in Ashbourne, Derbyshire, and his daughters, Fanny Helena, 13, and Emma Caroline, 10, both born in Accrington, Lancashire. There were also one governess and nine servants in the household.^[453]

The will of Jonathan Hargreaves, Esq., was proved on 19 June 1863, leaving effects valued at under £40,000:

The Will with a Codicil of Jonathan Hargreaves late of Cuffnells in the County of Southampton Esquire deceased who died 21 January 1863 at the City of Rome was proved at the Principal Registry by the oaths of Thomas Entwisle of Sandhills in the Parish of Christchurch in the said County Esquire and Anna Maria Hargreaves of Cuffnells aforesaid Widow the Relict two of the Executors.^[454]

The will itself appears in appendix J. It was signed by Jonathan Hargreaves of Cuffnells, Southampton, on 24 Jan. 1861. He signed a codicil to the will on 1 Apr. 1862. Both were proved in London on 19 June 1863. The will mentions “my dear Wife [unnamed],” “my only son Reginald Hargreaves,” “my daughter, Fanny Helena Hargreaves,” “my daughter, Emma Caroline Hargreaves,” and appoints Thomas Ashton, Thomas Entwisle, and Edward Harland executors. 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codicil he replaces mention of Thomas Ashton everywhere with Anna Maria Hargreaves of Cuffnells. The will requires that, should either daughter inherit the estate, then they should take the name “Hargreaves”—that is, append it to other names and use it as the family name.

In 1871 Anna Maria Hargreaves, 50, of Cuffnells House, a widow landowner born in Ashbourne, Derbyshire, resided in Lyndhurst Parish, Hampshire, with her son, Reginald “Jervis,” 18, and Emma Caroline, 20, both born in Accrington, Lancashire. There were also seven servants in the household.^[455]

On 14 Nov. 1871 Anna Maria Hargreaves, widow of Jonathan Hargreaves, of Cuffnells, signed her will, and it was proved 6 Feb. 1873 in London. A transcription of the will appears in appendix K. It mentions “I appoint my sister, Lady Gervis, guardian of my son, Reginald Gervis Hargreaves, during his minority,” “my brother, John Thomas Harland of Bellamour Lodge,” “my dear daughter Fanny Helena,” and “my dear daughter, Emma Caroline.”

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abeth (White) Spain,^[469] and died 2 Oct. 1910, Gladstone Rd., Parnell, Auckland,^[470] and was buried 5 Oct. 1910, Purewa Cem., Auckland.^[471]

We know Joseph was in New Zealand on 19 Sept. 1842 when he donated money to the construction of St. Paul's church in Auckland.^[472] His sister, Eliza, married 22 July 1841, Auckland, which would imply that Joseph arrived earlier than 1842 if he arrived when she did, but it seems that only Eliza and their younger brother, Winter, came earlier, as wards of Rev. John Frederick Churton (see Eliza's sketch). So it is not known which ship Joseph arrived on, or when exactly.

There is also this evidence of Joseph in Auckland in Sept. 1842:

William and Eliza Young became involved in a family matter. In September 1842 Best had lent his horse, Monops, to Eliza's brother, Joseph, with disastrous results. Unable to control the horse, Hargreaves had been thrown. The horse bolted into a swamp and injured itself on some outcrop of scoria. To make amends Hargreaves offered to pay for the horse and to take it over. However, Best said it was an accident and they should wait to see how the horse fared. At first Best treated it himself but after a week he called in a vet, who decided nothing could be done, and the animal was shot. On 6 September 1843 Best brought the matter to court, suing Hargreaves for the cost of the horse. William appeared as a witness on behalf of his brother-in-law, to the delight of the press reporter who proceeded to extract as much humour as he could from the spectacle of a well-known citizen appearing in the witness-box. The case seems to have been brought mainly to obtain a valuation of the horse.^[473]

From his 1880 death certificate we know he had been in New Zealand for 38 years, or since about 1842. From her 1910 death certificate we know Mary had been in New Zealand for 69 years, or since about 1841. From appendix A: "On 20 April 1841 [William] Spain and his family sailed from Gravesend for New Zealand on board the emigrant ship *Prince Rupert*." Since Joseph and Mary married in Australia in 1848, these can't have been continuous years in New Zealand.

A Mr. Hargreaves, possibly Joseph, departed 26 Aug. 1842 from Sydney, NSW, Australia, for the Bay of Islands and Auckland, New Zealand, aboard the *Medusa*.^[474]

The following is from an **unsourced** website giving a Maori-European history of the Auckland area:

24 July 1843

Joseph Hargreaves acquires an allotment of 83 acres on the east bank of the Tamaki, in the locality known today as Farm Cove. Land had first been offered for sale in the area on 30 December 1842, but as far as is known Hargreaves is the first European to actually live there. He later adds to his holdings,

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and builds a house he calls “Butley,” known to some as “Butley Manor” (it is demolished in 1972).⁴⁷⁵

It is backed up, with added detail, by this description of the Pakuranga suburb of Auckland, also **unsourced**:

The rest of Pakuranga was surveyed into larger farms of up to over a hundred acres. All of Pakuranga was part of the 40,000 acre Fairburn Land Claim. This was reduced to 5,495 acres in 1845. He continued to farm 1852 acres in Pakuranga. This included all the land from Roberts Road to the Tamaki River, including the present Town Centre. Larger land owners included: Joseph Hargreaves, John Williamson, William Bollard, H. R. Oakes, S. A. Wood, C. J. Stone, Captain C. H. M. Smith and Captain J. T. W. Bacot. Later prominent landowner's included the FitzGerald, Robert and Every Maclean, Roberts, Cherrys, Udys, Whites, Bells, Colonel de Quincey, Reeves, Pyes, O'Halloran, Bradburys, Andrews, Mattsons, Millens and Hattaways.

Being a farming district let us look at some of these farmers in more detail and the social activities of the area.

Joseph Hargreaves:

Born in Liverpool, England in 1821 he owned 462 acres in the Half Moon–Farm Cove area by the mid 1850s. The lush native grasses provided grazing with little clearing of the land. He acquired Allotment 4 of 32 acres on 24 July 1843. He built homestead beside the Tamaki River, the first European home in the Howick–Pakuranga area. This was sited where Fisher Parade joins Bramley Drive beside a small stream. The site was marked until the 1950 subdivision by aloes, old bricks and a well.

Hargreaves house was moved to a site opposite the present Farm Cove shopping centre. It is the single storied part on the 1894 photograph, a two storied portion being added later. Mrs. Hargreaves was a sister of Admiral Spain. The Hargreaves homestead in Butley Drive was called “Butley” farm. It was on the route from Howick to the Point England ferry, and when students from St. Johns College went to Howick to erect All Saints church in 1847 one was later to write “were ferried across The Tamaki River by one of the workmen of Mr. Hargreaves, a thriving settler who lives on the western side. After a hospitable entertainment of bread and milk, his being a dairy farmer, we walked over a beautiful flat space of country to the wooded ridge.”

The Hargreaves fattened cattle for the Auckland market and sold milk and butter to the new immigrants at Howick. Reverend Lush on March 18 1851 wrote: “Had dinner at 12 immediately after which mounted Jessy and rode to a Mr. Hargreaves a settler about 3 miles from Howick. He is one most respectable, and I suppose he is the wealthiest of my parishioners, 4 years ago he was the only settler this side of the Tamaki. He had then a fine farm of 200 acres, fenced, cleared and laid down in grass. Then came the Pensioners with their wives and children, and Hargreaves found a ready sale for his butter at 2/6 a lb and for his milk at 1/- a quart. He consequently made money fast. Since that time he has bought 200 acres more and has been fortunate enough to let his first farm stocked with 50 cows for 200 pound a year. I thought his house (Butley) most prettily situated—it is well sheltered with trees, a thing so many of the houses greatly need.”

They bought more land and then moved to the Kaipara where their descendants live today [Figure 17].

The Maclean brothers lived at “Butley” before buying Bleak House in 1857. Mr. T. R. Gill bought Butley in 1902, after Every Maclean's death, and farmed it until 1967 when his descendants sold it to Fletchers. Joseph Hargreaves sent samples of lignite (poor quality coal) to the 1851 Great Exhibition in London. During hard times, particularly during the 1930 depression it was dug from the banks of the

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Tamaki River in Pakuranga and used as fuel.

The Point England ferry connected Howick/Pakuranga and Auckland via St. Johns on the Tamaki Cart Road (now called Remuera Road). In 1850 the Government opened a ferry service at Panmure.

John Williamson was Hargreaves neighbour, and in 1850 acquired 93 acres by Crown Grant. Both were well known in Auckland. Hargreaves was a member of the Auckland Provincial Council, and Williamson was five times elected Superintendent of the Province of Auckland. He established the *New Zealander* newspaper, later to become the *NZ Herald*. He was also a member of the House of Representatives for the Pensioner Settlements from 1855 until 1875.^[476]

Another take on this history:

The First European owner of this land was William Thomas Fairburn who was a missionary with the Church Missionary Society. He set up the mission station at Maraetai in 1837, 3 years before Auckland began. The Maori, including Te Irirangi, insisted that Fairburn buy the land (40,000 acres) to prevent inter-tribal war. Fairburn did not want to buy the land because it would mean using up all of his life savings. He still had hoped to send his children to school back in England. But as a Christian act, to prevent any further bloodshed, he bought the land from Tamaki River to the Wairoa River at Clevedon and all the way back to the edge of Papakura. It cost him 90 blankets, 24 axes, 24 hoes, 14 spades, \$80 US, 900 pounds of tobacco, 24 combs and 12 plain irons. After the Treaty of Waitangi, the government reassessed all of the old land deals. They decided Fairburn could only keep 5,495 acres. The original 40,000 acres was valued at 302 pounds in 1836 and he received 75 pounds a year salary. Fairburn owned a large block of land at Otahuhu and a small farm at Maraetai.

The government then owned all of Howick and Pakuranga. The Fencible settlements of Otahuhu and Howick were placed on the land.

The plains of Howick and Pakuranga were covered with native grasses so that farmers could bring cattle and once it was fenced they could farm it and sell the milk, butter and cheese and grow crops of wheat, oats and Indian corn. The first farmer in Pakuranga was Joseph Hargreaves who started farming in 1843, alongside the Tamaki River. By the mid 1850s he owned 462 acres. Firewood was hard to get. Drunkenness was the most common crime but stealing firewood was the second most common. Hargreaves sold the land to Dr. W. H. Mahon, who came here on the ship called the *Mineroa*. He was a medical officer to the Howick and Panmure Fencible settlements and had originally been a doctor in the Royal Navy. He was very strict but he cared for his patients well. He built the large 2-storey homestead that was later called Bleakhouse. Dr. Mahon became a magistrate at the Howick courthouse which is now in the historical village. He moved to Onehunga in 1849 and Dr. John Thomas Watson moved into the homestead. He had travelled here from England with the Otahuhu Fencibles on the ship called *Ann*. He started a newspaper called the *Pensioner Gazette*, and bought a cutter (ship) to carry things from Auckland to settlements that were further out. The Governor at the time was not impressed so he had to stop both. Dr. Watson was elected to parliament (General Assembly). In 1857, he sold the land to Robert and E. Maclean.^[477]

On 19 July 1846 a Mr. Hargreaves, probably Joseph, entered Port Jackson, NSW, from Auckland, via the Bay of Islands, New Zealand, with William Spain, probably Mary's father.^[478] William Spain died 5 Apr. 1876, Woollahra, Sydney, NSW, registration place Paddington, Sydney, NSW, Australia,^[479] probate 26 Jan. 1877 in England.^[480] See more on William Spain in appendix A.

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On 17 Apr. 1848 Joseph Hargreaves or Hargreaves arrived in Auckland aboard the *Hyderabad*, having departed Sydney on 4 Apr. 1848.^[481] Joseph had married Mary Spain on 11 Jan. 1848 in Sydney.

In 1861 [a book published that year] Joseph Hargreaves, Esq., J.P., merchant [or perhaps landed proprietor], was one of 12 members of the New Zealand House of Commons representing Auckland.^[482]

From Mary's death certificate we know that there were eight of her children living at her death, four sons and four daughters.^[483] Their genders and ages (and approximate birth years) [best match] in order were: females, 62 (1848) [Mary 1848], 59 (1851) [William 1851]; male, 56 (1854) [Eliza 1853]; female, 52 (1858) [Clive 1857 or Lucy 1857]; males 50 (1860) [Edith 1860], 45 (1865) [Vivian 1862]; female 45 (1865) [?]; male 41 (1869) [Ernest 1869]. Blanche 1855 and Amy 1866 had died by 1910. Unfortunately the two lists don't match very well. There are at least three gender mismatches, and one age mismatch (Vivian). Clive 1857 is the most likely unmatched child, and he doesn't match the unmatched female (1865) even closely. But I don't trust his dates at all at this point. The count works however. By my count there were indeed four daughters and four sons alive at Mary's death: Mary 1848, Eliza 1853, Lucy 1857, and Edith 1860, and William 1851, Clive 1857, Vivian 1862, and Ernest 1869. In the language of Mary's death certificate, this would be F. 62, 57, 53, 50 and M. 59, 53, 48, 41. Cf. the certificate's list: F. 62, 59, 52, 45 and M. 56, 50, 45, 41. They are different lists, even with a bit of stretching.

From the wife, Lindsey Joyce (Peterson), of Joseph's great-grandson, Anthony Francis "Tony"⁷ Hargreaves (*Vivian*⁵, *David Terence*⁶):

Joseph Hargreaves and his family moved to the Oneriri in 1866—we have a copy of the 21 year lease in both Maori and English for the 8,600 acres. Joseph built a home in the Hargreaves Bay. Oneriri Station is the original Run, except for nearly 1,000 acres owned by Tony's cousin, John Hargreaves. . . . Tony and I don't farm any of the original Hargreaves Run as it was called early on. Tony was able to purchase a Ballot Farm (farms developed for ex-servicemen) not allotted to a returned soldier and not far from the family land.^[484]

An obituary of 26 Apr. 1880 for Joseph Hargreaves, sent me at Christmas 2018 by Lindsay Hargreaves.

We have to record the death of one of the earliest settlers in New Zealand by the demise of Mr. Joseph

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Hargreaves, of the Kaipara. Mr. Hargreaves first settled in East Tamaki. In the early days of the colony Dr. Campbell, Mr. James Williamson, and the late Mr. J. S. Macfarlane were his contemporaries. After residing for many years at East Tamaki, his station was bought by Messrs. E. and R. Maclean. Mr. Hargreaves removed to the Kaipara, where he had leased and purchased a large tract of land from the natives. He was a keen sportsman, although otherwise of very retiring habits. He was fond of all field games and sports, and his form was always conspicuous on the grand stand at Ellerslie. Mr. Hargreaves married Miss Spain, the daughter of Mr. Spain, Land Commissioner in the early days of the colony, and a barrister of eminence in Sydney. Captain Spain is his brother-in-law. Mr. Hargreaves leaves a large family of sons and daughters to mourn their loss.^[485]

An accompanying Christmas letter about Tony and Lindsay Hargreaves's family states:

Steven [Hargreaves, their son] took up the principal's reins at Macleans College this year (Macleans College is on land once owned by Joseph Hargreaves).

ELIZA⁸ HARGREAVES (₇₁Joshua Hartley⁷, Joshua⁶, John⁵, John⁴, John³, Robert², John¹) was baptized 15 Oct. 1822, Holy Trinity, Liverpool,^[491] and baptized 24 Oct. 1822, St. Peter, Liverpool, and died 21 Apr. 1845, and was buried in Grafton Cem., Auckland, New Zealand.^[492] She married 22 July 1841, Auckland,^[493] WILLIAM YOUNG, who was born in 1813,^[494] son of Robert Herries Spearman Young, and died 1893, and was buried in St. Mark's churchyard, Remuera, Auckland.^[495]

The following about Eliza is from a well-researched book on the Young family, *Father & Son: A Young Saga*:

As 1840 drew to its close, preparations in Auckland were still in a very unfinished state; but in the Bay of Islands the work of packing-up was nearly completed. The Rev. Mr. Churton [Figure 16] with his family and his Hargreaves wards had already arrived in Russell from Port Nicholson. Eliza Hargreaves came from Lancaster. She and her two brothers were orphaned when she was still in her middle teens. Her father willed her a share in his estate but as she was a minor she was appointed a Ward-in-Chancery, and to protect her from a fortune-hunting husband who might dissipate her capital her legacy was vested in her future children so only the interest was for her use. The founding father of the New Zealand family was Eliza's elder brother, Joseph Hargreaves, who was greatly interested in racing and who became Member for Auckland Suburbs in the House of Representatives in 1860. I have not discovered what ship he arrived in, but Eliza's younger brother, Winter Hargreaves, was only eleven when he and Eliza arrived as wards of the Rev. F. J. [sic] Churton on the Bolton. He was the same age as Churton's eldest son, Alexander. The rest of the Churton family were five girls (two, four, six, eight and ten years old) and the infant Charles, so Mary Churton would have been glad of the assistance of Eliza Hargreaves in looking after the children. Winter Hargreaves later went to Australia, near Bathurst, and afterwards prospected in California without much success and eventually returned to Australia. Joseph married a sister of Admiral Spain, and died in 1880 leaving four sons and six daughters. He first purchased land at Tamake [sic] but sold that and later bought a large tract of land on the Kaipara Harbour from the Maoris.^[496]

I don't read Joshua's will (appendix G) quite that way, but the effect is the same. What the will says is that all three of Joshua's children alive when he died (Joseph, Eliza, and Winter) inherited equally as tenants in common, not as joint tenants. This means that each of the three got one-third

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of Joshua's estate. Joseph and Winter got their thirds when they turned 21. Eliza got hers at marriage, since she was then under 21. It was true *before* she married that only the interest on her part of the estate was for her use. But at marriage, her third became hers completely. Since the estate was held in common by the siblings, it was undivided, unless specific legal action was taken to divide it. So the estate stayed intact, and her part was passed down to her heirs. In particular, Eliza's third could not automatically at death become her husband's (or her brothers'), but passed to whomever she chose, presumably her son.

The New Zealand Company sent out Rev. John Frederick Churton in 1839, so that is probably when Eliza, about 17, and Winter Hargreaves, about 12, first arrived in New Zealand. Their brother, Joseph, would have been about 19, and may have come at a slightly later time. We have this information about Churton's appointment to and arrival in New Zealand aboard the *Bolton*, from records of the New Zealand Company, 14 May 1840:

Your Directors have been deeply impressed with the importance of doing all they legitimately can towards imparting to the colony the means of religious and moral instruction. Accordingly a resolution has been passed whereby a free cabin passage to New Zealand has been, and continues to be offered to religious ministers of every denomination, provided the grounds of application in each case are considered satisfactory. Your Directors are gratified in stating that two clergymen, the one of the Church of England, the other of the Kirk of Scotland, have already availed of this resolution. The former (the Rev. John Frederick Churton), proceed in the *Bolton*, with an endowment from the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, to which the colonists added a considerable sum by subscription.^[497]

From the same report comes this information about the *Bolton*: It departed 19 Nov. 1839 from London under master J. P. Robinson, with 36 cabin passengers of the first class (9 adult males, 9 adult females, 9 female children under 15, and 9 male children under 15).^[498] From its passenger list we know it arrived at Port Nicholson [Wellington] on 30 Apr. 1840, with Eliza, 17, and Winter, 11, aboard.^[499]

From a report of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel about Rev. Churton, we see that he moved from Wellington to Auckland in January 1841, presumably with his wards in tow:

In 1839, at the application of "the Rev. Dr. Hinds" for "a chaplain to the settlers about to proceed to New Zealand," the Society sent out the Rev. J. F. Churton in that capacity. He accompanied some of the first emigrants, and reached Port Nicholson in April 1840. By September the colony numbered about 500, but most of the people were remaining at Petoni, the place originally fixed for the settlement, until the town, some seven miles distant, was finally allotted. At this town, then styled "Britania," but afterwards Wellington, Mr. Churton began to hold service in a native "warrie" . . . Consequently "respectable person" were driven from attendance, and in the absence of a more fitting place the Holy Sacrament was administered at his own "warrie."

But while his white congregation was reduced to sixty or seventy persons, the natives were forward in coming to service and evinced an eagerness for instruction. . . .

Sufficient local support not being forthcoming at Wellington, Mr. Churton, who waited there till he "became an impoverished man," removed to Auckland in January 1841.

The settlers at Wellington were displeased by what they consider a "desertion of them"

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At Auckland, the capital, Mr. Churton did not lack for support. Up to August 1841, when a Roman Catholic priest landed, he was the sole minister of religion.”^[500]

Excerpts from *Father & Son: A Young Saga*:

William [Young] had been born in 1813, the second of seven children. His father, Robert Herries Spearman Young, a judge under the East India Company, died from cholera in 1820 at the age of thirty-eight; the widow and family were maintained by the Company on pension, the widow for life, the children to the age of nineteen. In 1830 William became a clerk in the Treasury and was posted to New South Wales, where he remained until April 1840 when he was sent to New Zealand. These facts shattered Aunt Lizzie’s favourite tradition that William had attended Queen Victoria’s coronation. We had believed that William had accompanied the 80th Regiment from England and had spent only a few months in Australia; now we learnt that his stay in Australia on the way to New Zealand covered ten years.^[501]

It was true that William [Young] did arrive in Auckland on the *Chelydra*, with James Coates, the Rev. J. F. Churton and his family, and Eliza Hargreaves; but it was a journey only from Russell to the Waitemata [Auckland’s main harbor]. The true facts of his arrival in New Zealand . . . [come] from the journal of T. F. Cheeseman who recorded William’s passage to New Zealand on the *Buffalo* as a commissariat officer with the contingent of the 80th Regiment sent from Australia in support of the new governor, Captain William Hobson. The ship sailed from Sydney on 6 April 1840, arriving at the Bay of Islands on 16 April.^[502]

William Young arrived in the colony at the precise moment, with the precise qualifications, experience and temperament, to make him a leader of society in that small community. I think it is fair to call him “William Young of Auckland” because he settled there soon after his arrival in New Zealand at the age of twenty-seven and remained there until his death over fifty years later. His reputation has become somewhat dimmed with the passing of the years, but it can be said that in the 1840s and ‘50s he was one of the most highly esteemed citizens of the Queen City. Among that little group of settlers who awaited in Kororareka [now Russell] Governor Hobson’s decision on the siting of the colony’s capital, and who travelled down from the Bay of Islands to the Waitemata on the *Chelydra*, none was to have a greater influence than the man the press invariably referred to as “Wm. Young Esq.”^[503]

A press notice appeared in Auckland’s first newspaper venture, *The New Zealand Herald & Auckland Gazette*, setting out the marriage of “William Young on Tuesday, 22nd July, 1841, to Eliza, daughter of the late Joshua Hartley Hargreaves Esq. of Spring House, County of Lancaster, Eng.”; in the social notes it is recorded that “His Excellency the Governor and Mrs Hobson gave a ball and supper on the occasion.” In the archives of St Paul’s Church this is registered as the third wedding to be performed in Auckland, the second being that of a Maori couple. The Governor’s signature is on the marriage certificate as witness.^[504]

The most important press notice of 1848 appeared in the *New Ulster Gazette* of 1 May, announcing that William Young had been appointed by Governor Grey to be “Collector of Customs and Landing Surveyor at the Port of Auckland.” At the age of thirty-five he had achieved the senior position in his department, the ambition he had cherished ever since he joined the department in 1841. At the

In 1861 “Shadrack Hargraves,” 13, a scholar born in Liverpool, resided in Islington, Liverpool in the household of his **uncle**, William Fletcher, 25, tailor, born in Liverpool, and his (William’s) wife Mary Ann, 25, born in Churchstoke, Montgomery [and partially Shropshire], and daughter, Isabella, 1, born Liverpool, and one boarder, Thomas Harding, 34, a tailor born in Shrewsbury, Shropshire.^[511]

In 1881 Shadrach “Hargraves,” 32, a tailor born in Liverpool, resided in Islington, Liverpool as a boarder in a household of 20 mostly unmarried men, mostly born in Liverpool of different trades. One of them was James Fletcher, 37, a bricklayer born in Liverpool.^[512]

In 1861 George Hargreaves, 63, widower, an agricultural laborer born in Higham, Lancashire, resided in Higham, with his son, Thomas, 21, a cotton powerloom weaver born in Higham, his daughter-in-law (Thomas’s wife), Mary, 20, a cotton powerloom weaver born in Little Marsden, Lancashire, and his granddaughter, Susannah, 10 [sic, should be 1], a cotton powerloom weaver [sic] born in Higham.^[521]

In 1871 George Hargreaves, 73, widower, an farm laborer born in Higham, Lancashire, resided in Higham, with his son, Thomas, 31, a cotton weaver born in Higham, his daughter-in-law (Thomas’s wife), Mary, 30, a domestic born in Higham, Lancashire, and his granddaughter, Susannah, 11, and grandsons, George, 8, John, 4, “Shadrack,” 1, and Obednego, 1, all born in Higham. There is a brace around Shadrack and Obednego labeled: “The other is dead,” meaning probably that these were triplets and one died, no doubt named Meshack. There are other Hargreaveses nearby.^[522]

He leaves the Mount estate and the Brunswick plate and family plate to his son John Reginald, a life annuity of 600*l.* to his son Cecil Montague, and the residue of his property in equal shares to his said two sons.^[532]

A newspaper item concerning Sarah's father:

The death occurred early on Thursday last week, at his residence, Town Thorns, Easenhall, near Monks Kirby, of Mr. Washington Jackson, J.P. The deceased gentleman was senior acting magistrate at the Coventry Petty Sessional Court, having been appointed a justice of the peace July, 1867. . . . A native of Louisiana, he became a naturalised British subject, and lived the life of a country gentleman. . . He was a man of singularly amiable disposition and extreme courtesy to all those with whom he came into contact.^[533]

These young men, Americans on their father's side, and indeed a quarter Philadelphians, for their paternal grandmother was Miss Dawson, of this city . . . were the nephews of the late J. Norman Jackson. They are also cousins of young Lord Exmouth, who was here [Philadelphia] some two or three years ago, stopping with his great aunt.^[536]

In 1871 Thomas Hargreaves, 37, born in Lancashire, resided as a visitor in The Mount at Bishopstoke, Hampshire, headed by Bertha Warriner, 34, born in France, with her son, Ernle, 14, and her daughter, Caroline, 13, another visitor, Elizabeth Ross, 7, born in India, and six servants.^[537] Although listed as a visitor, Thomas and Bertha were by the later 1870s thought of as a couple by the Bishopstoke community.^[538] She was Gerardina [Geraldine] Bertha (Ross) Warriner, born about 1836, Boulogne-sur-Mer, France,^[539] widow of Walter Hungerford Warriner, who died 23 Nov. 1860, Cheltenham, Gloucestershire.^[540]

In 1871 Sarah Hargreaves, 36, a British subject born in Pennsylvania, resided in St. Margaret Parish, London, with her daughters, Grace, 16, born in Reading, Berkshire, and Annie, 13, a British subject born in Switzerland, son, Arthur, 11, and daughter, "Flora," 8, both born in Arborfield, Reading, son, John, 6, born in St. George, London, daughters, Lilian, 5, born in Arborfield, Reading, and Ella, 3, born in Brighton, Sussex, and 10 domestics.^[541]

In 1881 Sarah Hargreaves, 46, born in U.S., resided in The Hall, Arborfield, Berkshire, with her daughters, Edith, 20, born in Dover, Kent, and Florence, 18, born in Arborfield.^[542]

The following obituary for Mrs. Sarah Hargreaves, of Arborfield Hall, is from a website of the Arborfield Local History Society, republished from 2 Mar. 1918:

Widespread regret was expressed in Berkshire, and particularly in Arborfield and the district, when it became known that Mrs. Sarah Hargreaves, of Arborfield Hall, passed away at her residence on Saturday. The deceased lady had been in failing health for some time. She spent the winter at Bournemouth and returned to Arborfield Hall about a fortnight ago. Her condition became worse, and she gradually sank. Her end was not unexpected.

Aged 84, Mrs. Hargreaves was the daughter of Mr. Washington Jackson, Ballybay, co. Monaghan, Ireland, her mother being Annie Maria Dawson, a descendant of Mr. George Pelsant Dawson, of Os-goodby Hall, Yorkshire, and Arborfield Hall.

She married Mr. Thomas Hargreaves, J.P., of Arborfield Hall and The Mount, Bishopstoke, hon. lieutenant in the Royal Naval Reserve, who predeceased her on September 28th, 1891.

Mrs. Hargreaves has resided at Arborfield Hall for upwards of sixty years, coming there as a bride, and is a descendant of the Dawsons who formerly owned the Hall. The Dawsons were a very old and historic family, and quite a number of its members rest in the old churchyard, and in the church are several monuments to their memory. Here also is a window given by Mrs. Hargreaves in memory of her father-in-law.

...

Mrs. Hargreaves, who in her earlier days took a prominent part in county life, leaves six children – one son and five daughters. Two have predeceased her – one son and one daughter – the latter being Viscountess Exmouth. Her surviving son is Mr. John R. Hargreaves, of Drinkstone Park, Bury St. Edmunds, and her daughters are Lady Erskine, Mrs. Wollaston of Shenton Hall, Warwickshire, Mrs. Hippisley, of Sparsholt Manor; Mrs. King, wife of General King, of London; and Mrs. Ratcliffe, of London. It may be mentioned that Mrs. Hargreaves was sister-in-law to Mr. John Hargreaves, late of Maiden Erlegh Park.

... The funeral took place at Arborfield Church on Wednesday, when a large number of the parishioners and others attended. ... The coffin was drawn by some of the employees, who also acted as

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bearers, on a bier which had been presented to the parish in memory of Mr. Arthur Hargreaves, October, 1878. . . . The interment was in the family vault, where, and in adjoining vaults, rest several members of the Hargreaves family.

Sandwith, Dr. Humphry, created D.C.L. 4 June, 1856 (s. Humphry Sandwith, D.Med.), D.Med. Aberdeen, inspector-general during the defence of Kars, C.B., colonial secretary Mauritius 1857-9, agent for National Aid Society during the Franco-German campaign, died 16 May, 1881, aged 59.^[588]

A lengthy entry in the *Dictionary of National Biography* for him includes the following:

Sandwith, Humphry (1822-1881), army physician and author, was born and baptized at Bridlington, Yorkshire, on 12 April 1822, the son of Humphry Sandwith (d. 1867), a physician, and his wife, Jane, the daughter of Isaac Ward, a shipping merchant. . . .

In August 1849 he was invited to accompany an archaeological expedition under the command of Austen Henry Layard that sought to excavate Nineveh in Mesopotamia. . . .

His medical and organizational skills were pushed to the limit when the Russian siege of Kars led to starvation and rampant cholera among the besieged troops. After the fall of Kars in 1855 Sandwith was the sole British captive to be released by the Russians, in appreciation of his services to the sick and wounded among their forces as well as to his own.

With little to cheer about in the Crimean campaign, the British welcomed Sandwith as a hero. He found himself the toast of the country on his return in 1856: he had a private interview with Queen Victoria and Prince Albert; was made CB and received an honorary degree from Oxford University; lectured before the Royal Geographical Society; and was elected a member of the Athenaeum. He accompanied the official British delegation to the coronation of Tsar Alexander II. Sandwith wrote an account of his experiences, *A Narrative of the Siege of Kars* (1856), which showed the first signs of his shift to a more critical opinion of the Ottoman government and the Turkish peoples. The book proved a commercial and critical success, and Sandwith launched a lecture tour that benefited from his celebrity. On 29 May 1860 he married eighteen-year-old Lucy Ann Hargreaves (1842-1882), daughter of Robert Hargreaves; the couple honeymooned in Egypt, Damascus, Rhodes, and Constantinople.

Despite offers to join lucrative medical practices Sandwith decided to abandon his medical career, accepting instead an appointment as colonial secretary of Mauritius, in January 1867. . . .

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Over the next few years Sandwith was drawn into Cobdenite political circles by his wife's uncle, William Hargreaves, and in 1862 he was offered the opportunity to stand for the parliamentary seat at Wycombe. He declined, and instead became an adviser to Cobden and others on the so-called 'Eastern question'. . . . Sandwith took an increasingly active role in other radical liberal causes, joining John Stuart Mill on the Jamaica committee that sought to prosecute Governor Eyre in 1865, and participating in the popular agitation for parliamentary reform in 1866. With support from Mill, Goldwin Smith, and other liberals, he made an unsuccessful bid to enter parliament for Marylebone in the 1868 election.

During these years Sandwith lived in Wales, first at Llanrhaeadr Hall near Denbigh, then near Llandovery. His family soon grew to five children, with the first, Catherine Sinclair, born in 1862. . . .

In 1876 Sandwith had moved his family to Tours, France, probably because its climate was considered better suited to the needs of his tubercular wife and third daughter. Sandwith was in Paris when he died of heart disease on 16 May 1881. He was buried at Passy in south Paris.^[589]

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On 29 Apr. 1932 Alice Hargreaves, 79, born in London, England, resident of Kent, England, arrived in New York City aboard S.S. *Berengaria*, sailing from Southampton, 23 Apr. 1932, nearest relative “Son. Caryl Hargreaves,” of Cuffnells, Lyndhurst, Hampshire. Listed next to her is Caryl L. Hargreaves, 44, born in Bournemouth, England, resident of Lyndhurst, England, nearest relative “Wife Mrs. C. From an obituary for Alice Hargreaves in the *New York Times* of 1934, headlined, “Alice Hargreaves Is Dead in England | Inspired ‘Alice in Wonderland,’ Which Lewis Carroll Told to Her and Sisters in 1862 | Long Held Manuscript | Parted With It at Auction in 1928—Guest of Columbia at Carroll 1932 Centennial”:

London, Nov. 16.—Mrs. Alice Pleasance Liddell Hargreaves, who inspired Lewis Carroll’s immortal “Alice in Wonderland,” died at her home in Westerham, Kent, today after months of illness.

A gracious woman of 82, she retained to the end the vivid, imperishable memories of those golden afternoons when, as Dean Liddell’s 10-year-old daughter, she and her two sisters accompanied the whimsical mathematical don, the Rev. Charles L. Dodgson, on picnics along the Thames River at Oxford. She outlived almost all the others in the little circle out of which grew the children’s classic.

This afternoon there was a small gathering of relatives and friends at the residence, in a room hung with Sir John Tenniel originals of the illustrations for “Alice” and decorated with porcelain figures of the White Rabbit, the Mad Hatter, the March Hare and other beloved characters. After prayers by the Rev. Mr. Castle, funeral arrangements were decided on, with cremation and burial at Lyndhurst, her former New Forest home.

At The Breaches, an old, red-bricked, beamed house on Westerham Green, she lived with her unmarried sister, Miss Roda [sic] Liddell, and son, Captain Caryl Hargreaves. Two other sons died in the World War. Her husband, Reginald Hargreaves, died shortly after the war. One of the greatest joys of her last years was her baby grandchild, Alice Hargreaves, not yet 4, who accompanied her and her son on a visit to the United States two years ago.^[656]

To the chauffeur, C. W. Odell, death ended thirty-eight years of association. She frequently toured the countryside. It was while motoring last month that she became ill.

Then the Rev. Charles Lutwidge Dodgson, a deacon of Christ Church, returned to his study that night he placed a pile of clean white sheets of paper on his desk and began to write. He traced each word carefully with his pen, arranging the sentences on the paper neatly and clearly with mathematical precision.

Writing of “Alice” Is Begun.

Before going to bed on July 4, 1862, the Rev. Charles Lutwidge Dodgson, a deacon of Christ Church, wrote the following notation in his diary:

“I made an expedition up the river to Goodstow with the three Liddells; we had tea on the bank there, and did not reach Christ Church until half-past eight.” Later he added to the notation, “On which occasion I told them the fairy tale of ‘Alice’s Adventures Underground,’ which I undertook to write out for Alice.”

After writing until late at night in his study for many evenings, the clergyman completed a manuscript of ninety-two pages, some of which he adorned with illustrations. On the first page he pasted a photograph which he had taken of the little girl who had asked him to “put some nonsense” in his sto-

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ries and wrote a dedication in illuminated letters:

“A Christmas gift to a dear child in memory of a Summer day.”

He presented the gift to Alice Liddell, daughter of Dean Liddell of Christ Church College, Oxford, and the joint compiler of the Liddell and Scott Greek lexicon.

The manuscript was published later under the title “Alice in Wonderland,” with the name of the author as “Lewis Carroll.” Adorned with many illustrations by Sir John Tenniel, the book enjoyed wide popularity with children who wondered with Alice, “where is the use of a book without pictures or conversations.”

The young clergyman told many other stories to the three little girls on frequent boat rides on the Thames—stories that were never written—tales of strange characters who lived briefly for the entertainment of three little girls on a Summer’s day and then disappeared forever.

Manuscript Offered for Sale.

Sixty-six years after the story was first told to three little girls on a Summer day, Mrs. Alice Liddell Hargreaves, who had led the quiet life of a Victorian matron in a large house eighty miles from London, announced that she wished to sell the original manuscript of “Alice in Wonderland.”

Mrs. Hargreaves was reluctant to part with the manuscript, but revealed that she had been in straitened financial circumstances since the death of her husband, Reginald G. Hargreaves, in 1926. She had lost two of her three sons in the World War and had been obliged to rent the large house near Lyndhurst, a village in the New Forest, in which she had lived for forty-five years.

The manuscript was offered for sale at Sotheby’s auction rooms in London on April 3, 1928. It was purchased by Dr. A. S. W. Rosenbach, American book dealer, for \$74,259, one of the highest prices ever paid for a manuscript. Tears filled the eyes of the original Alice as the manuscript passed from her possession.

The original manuscript of “Alice in Wonderland”: is now owned by Eldredge R. Johnson of Moorestown, N.J., founder and former president of the Victor Talking Machine Company. He bought it from Dr. Rosenbach with two first edition copypies for a price saide to be “upward of \$150,000” for the three volumes.

After lending the manuscript for several public exhibitions he returned it to his home at Moorestown.

“I shall never dispose of the book,” he said.

In May, 1932, Mrs. Hargreaves came to the United States to attend a series of celebrations of the 100th anniversary of the birth of the quiet instructor of mathematics known to the world as “Lewis Carroll.” Millions of men, women and children in England and America followed the new adventures of an older Alice in a New Wonderland.

The little girl with the clear blue eyes and the far-away look was now a woman of 80. But she found the elevators shooting up and down the tall buildings of New York as fascinating as her imaginary journey down the rabbit-hole at the beginning of the story told to her by the young clergy man many years ago.

While in this country Mrs. Hargreaves received a degree of Doctor of Letters from Dr. Nicholas Murray Butler, president of Columbia University.

At the conclusion of the anniversary celebrations she returned to England and a quiet life in an old white house overlooking the green at Westerham in Kent.^[657]

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The second son of Joseph Leese, of the firm of Messrs. Kershaw, Leese & Co., cotton spinners and manufacturers, Stockport. He was the elder brother of Ernest Leese (Lancashire 1880–84); and father of Sir William Hargreaves Leese (MCC 1889–90), Vernon Francis Leese (Cambridge University 1892) and Neville Leese (MCC 1895). He was uncle of Charles Phillip Leese (Oxford University 1908–10, Lancashire 1911), and grandfather of Lieutenant-General Sir Oliver William Hargreaves Leese (Eton 1914, and President of Warwickshire 1959, Shropshire 1962, M.C.C. 1965–66, and The Cricket Society 1968–72).

Educated abroad, where he attended the Universities of Halle and Dijon, before going to London University where he graduated B.A. After that he went to St. John's College, Cambridge, for the purpose of reading law. He did not remain long, however, although he afterwards kept his terms and was called to the bar.

Seeing that the cotton industry was expanding he joined his elder brother, Spencer Leese, in a cotton spinning and manufacturing business at Fylde-road Mills, Preston. He left the firm in 1868 and the business continued in the hands of first Spencer Leese and later the younger brother Ernest.

On the dissolution of Parliament in 1868 he was adopted as a the Liberal Party candidate for the Preston constituency and was a firm advocate of Home Rule for Ireland. He was defeated, but in one of his speeches remarked, "I am not the younger son of a great lord, not the nominee of an influential country family; at best I am but a scion of the aristocracy of industry."

Towards the end of 1868 he was called to the bar at the Inner Temple and joined the Northern Circuit. He built up a considerable practise and took silk in 1891.

...
He married Mary Constance, the daughter of William Hargreaves, who was the brother of John Hargreaves, one of the founders of the Broad Oak Printworks, Accrington. The family were friends of Cobden and Bright and one of its members had stood for the Blackburn seat in the Liberal cause. For some time in the early 1880's Joseph Leese and his family resided in a house owned by William Hargreaves at Send Holme, Woking, Surrey. He was a Captain in 3rd Royal Lancashire Militia for some years in his younger days.

At the time of the 1881 Census he was living at Send Holme, Surrey, aged 36, a barrister in practise, with his wife Mary Constance aged 33, three sons, Vernon aged 11, Theodore aged 6 and Cecil M. aged 5 and 1 daughter, Constance aged 2. They have eight domestic servants.

His father lived at 1 Hazeldean, Withington, aged 66, a cotton spinner employing 1492 women. He stood as a Liberal candidate for Accrington in 1886, but was elected as Member of Parliament for Accrington in 1892, a seat he held until he retired in 1910. He was appointed Recorder of Manchester in 1893, a position he held until 1913. He was knighted in 1895 and made a baronet in 1908.

In his later years he lived in Surrey.

Mr. William Hartley Hargreaves, Manager of the Bank of New Zealand at Waimate, was born in Auckland, in 1851, and was educated at the Church of England Grammar School, Parnell, and at St. John's College, Tamaki. 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The Hargreaves Trust exists by virtue of a bequest made by the late William Hartley Hargreaves of Seaview Road, Remuera and formerly Manager of Waimate branch who retired on 15 September 1914 and died on 19 August 1936. His Last Will and Testament dated 16 August 1927 directed that after the death of his wife, daughter and son that the remaining capital and income be paid to the Directors of the Bank of New Zealand and was:

... to be placed to the credit of a fund established or if there be no such fund in existence at the date of my death then to establish a fund for the benefit of indigent widows of officers of the Bank of New Zealand and to be expended for such purpose in such manner as the Directors of the Bank of New Zealand shall in their absolute discretion think fit.

By "Order of the Court" in the High Court of New Zealand dated 28 July 1989 consent was granted to "the Scheme under the Charitable Trusts Act 1957 as filed therein" which determined that the fund in future be held for the benefit of those further parties listed—see below

The Fund was established in 1974 and prior to 1990 the sum, which had been disbursed in grants to widows was considerably less than the amount of income earned from investments. Therefore, BNZ sought and obtained a High Court Order permitting the beneficiaries of the Trust to include:

"Aunt Lizzie", as we came to call her as my children grew, had a profound respect for the pioneer settlers of New Zealand. Her father had been one of these, Andrew Duncan of Wanganui. Second only in her estimation to Andrew Duncan was her husband's grandfather, William Young. I don't think she ever met the man himself. There is no record of his visiting Taranaki and I am sure that Lizzie never left her family to take a perilous trip to Auckland. From "Grandma", William Spearman's wife, Eliza Horne Young, Aunt Lizzie would have learnt all the family traditions of the grandfather of the Youngs of Riverside.^[827]

Amy's grandson, Charles Chenevix Trench, wrote a book, *My Mother Told Me*, which recounts the adventures of the indefatigable, indomitable "Mrs. Pock," a no-nonsense world traveler in the grand Victorian manner—to Japan, China, India, Mexico, America, etc.—with her daughter, May, and sister, "Aunt Rose," and two maids, "Amos and Jackson," in tow. The stories are told in the voice of daughter May (as remembered by May's son Charles). "Aunt Rose" was Violet⁶ Hargreaves (*John*⁵), Mrs. Pocks's (Amy Pocklington's) sister.^[939]

On 12 Jan. 1906 there is apparently a record of [Mrs.] Evelyn Pocklington, 42, a tourist born in England destined for London, arriving in San Francisco aboard the *Siberia*, which had sailed from Yokohama, Japan, on 27 Dec. 1905, via Honolulu, Hawaii. With her were supposedly Evelyn May Pocklington, 18, and Violet Hargreaves, 28, both of England and destined for London, and two maids, Mary Amos and Mary Pollock, both 30.^[940] This record is supported by another, a list of passengers who arrived in Honolulu aboard the *Siberia* on 5 Jan. 1906, having sailed from Yokohama on 27 Dec. 1905.^[941]

However, the items above in the record of 12 Jan. 1906 are crossed out, and there is another record of the same party arriving in San Francisco on 26 Jan. 1906 aboard the *Mongolia* from Honolulu. This appears to make the latter record the accurate one, but it is unsupported by the 5 Jan. 1906 record above. I can't explain the 26 Jan. 1906 *Mongolia* record, but it appears to be bogus because there are tourist cards issued to Mrs. Evelyn Pocklington, 42, and Miss Evelyn Pocklington, 18, citizens of England, having arrived aboard the *Siberia* in Honolulu on 5 Jan. 1906.^[942]

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The infamous 1906 San Francisco earthquake occurred on 18 Apr. 1906, and Amy was there. She had dined with the great Caruso the night before, and May observed him singing in the street in his nightshirt after the quake, testing to see if his voice had been damaged.^[943]

On 28 July 1906 Amy Pocklington arrived in Southampton, England, from New York, on the *At-rato*, with May Pocklington, Violet Hargreaves, and two maids.^[944]

On 17 Jan. 1908 the same party (but with different maids) departed London aboard the *China* for Yokohama, Japan, via Sydney, Australia.^[945]

On 21 Nov. 1937 Mrs. Amy Pocklington, 74, of Cyprus, arrived in Liverpool, England, from Valparaiso, Chile, on the *Orpesa*.^[946]

We announce with deep regret the death of Lady Basing, which occurred on Wednesday, the 1st of June, at Naini Tal, India, the result of an attack of enteric fever. Lord Basing, who commands the 1st (Royal) Dragoons, arrived at Lucknow, the headquarters, accompanied by Lady Basing, about the end of April. Scarcely had the news of her grave illness reached this country, when it was followed by the sad intelligence of her death. She was the second daughter of the late Mr. John Hargreaves, of Maiden Erlegh and Whalley Abbey, and was married in Earley Church to the Hon. George Sclater-Booth in 1889. On this occasion troopers of the bridegroom's famous regiment, "the Rosyals," lined the aisle of the church. A large reception followed at Maiden Erlegh. Lady Basing, who was in her 37th year, leaves a family of two sons and a daughter [sic].^[967]

According to Arthur's grandson, Bryan¹² Strome, my correspondent on this family: "My grandfather was in Siam from 1895 to 1905 whereupon he got malaria. At this point, he returned to England where a doctor told him that he must go 'where the air is fresh.' Thence, he moved to Qualicum Beach on Vancouver Island."^[976]

On 17 Apr. 1916 Arthur Cecil Stawell Bryan of Qualicum Beach, Canada, registered for the 103rd Battalion of the Canadian Over-Seas Expeditionary Force. He was a single farmer, born 27 Oct. 1876, Lyndhurst, Hants., England, with next of kin listed as his mother, Mrs. W. "F." Bryan of Lyndhurst.^[977]

An obituary for Margaret's sister, Catherine (Morgan) Lane, contains much family structure:

Catherine (Kitty) Lane, long time Qualicum Beach resident, passed away May 4, 2008 at Trillium Lodge at the age of 98.

She was born in Pentre, Wales but came to Canada as a baby. After living on Sea Island, her family moved to Victoria where her father, Garfield Morgan, had been posted on his return from overseas in the First World War. Kitty entered Lampson Street School, now a city landmark.

Kitty arrived in Qualicum Beach with her family in 1919. She was by then 9 years old. Her father, Garfield, had been appointed quartermaster at the new Veterans Hospital. He met his wife, Annie, and the children Molly, Kitty and Peter at the railway station with a brown army ambulance. They rode in it to their new home which consisted of rooms at the back of a boat house containing boats for the use of the convalescing soldiers. The well for water was on the other side of the Island highway. It must have been inconvenient for Annie but the children loved living by the sea. Her brother Peter took to fishing but Kitty was the swimmer. After a few months the family moved to the "White House" which is now the Qualicum Beach Hospice. Kitty attended the local two room school and made several life long friends. She enjoyed Girl Guides.

When the hospital closed, the family moved back to a somewhat improved boat house and her mother, Annie, opened a tea room. In 1924, the family opened the Morgan Hotel which they operated for many years. Both places were "by the beach" and Kitty continued her enjoyment of the sea. In fact, she continued to swim on most days of summer until she was well into her eighties.

Kitty married George Lane in 1931. Together they built and ran Bayview Park Camp, a popular resort in Qualicum. George was a carpenter who also founded a local construction company. He took particular pride in having overseen the building of the original log home at Eagle Crest. Active in the life of the village, he was a charter member of the Canadian Legion and one of the original commissioners when Qualicum Beach was incorporated as a municipality in 1942. Sadly, he passed away in 1949 and Kitty was left a widow for nearly 60 years.

A great reader, Kitty kept in touch with world affairs throughout her life. She was always grateful to the ladies at the local library who gave her advice on books she might like. She enjoyed gardening and as the years passed her life seemed more and more in harmony with the seasons of her garden. Kitty remained in the home she had entered as a bride until an accident forced a move to a nursing home at the age of 95. Although determinedly independent, Kitty always appreciated the kindness and friend-

On 21 May 1909 “Neville” M. Henderson, 26, male, single, born in Horsham, resident of London, arrived in New York City aboard the S.S. *Mauretania* from Liverpool, in transit to the British Embassy in Tokyo, Japan.^[982]

On 31 Mar. 1937 Sir Nevile Meyrick Henderson, 54, ambassador, arrived in Southampton aboard *Cap Arcona* from Buenos Aires. His last permanent address was Argentina, and his proposed address in the UK was the Foreign Office, London.^[983]

Here is his Wikipedia entry:

Sir Nevile Meyrick Henderson, KCMG (10 June 1882 – 30 December 1942), was the third child of Robert and Emma Henderson and was born at Sedgwick Park near Horsham, West Sussex.^[984] Ambassador of Great Britain to Germany from 1937 to 1939, he believed that Adolf Hitler could be controlled and pushed toward peace and cooperation with the Western powers. In February 1939, he cabled the Foreign Office in London: “If we handle him (Hitler) right, my belief is that he will become gradually more pacific. But if we treat him as a pariah or mad dog we shall turn him finally and irrevocably into one.”

Henderson was ambassador at the time of the Munich Agreement, and counselled Neville Chamberlain to enter into it. Shortly thereafter, he returned to London for medical treatment, returning to Berlin in ill-health in February 1939 (he would die of cancer less than four years later).^[985]

During the course of 1939, Henderson came into frequent conflict with Alexander Cadogan, Permanent Undersecretary of the Foreign Office. Henderson argued that Britain should go about rearmament in secret, as a public rearmament would encourage the belief that Britain planned to go to war

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with Germany. Cadogan and the Foreign Office disagreed.

On the night of August 30, 1939, Henderson had an extremely tense meeting with the [German Foreign Minister] Joachim von Ribbentrop. Ribbentrop presented the German “final offer” at midnight, and warned Henderson that he received no reply as the dawn [sic], the “final offer” would be considered rejected. “When Ribbentrop refused to give a copy of the German demands to the British Ambassador at midnight of 30 August–31 August 1939, the two almost came to blows. Ambassador Henderson, who had long advocated concessions to Germany, recognized that here was a deliberately conceived alibi the German government had prepared for a war it was determined to start. No wonder Henderson was angry; von Ribbentrop on the other hand could see war ahead and went home beaming.”^[986]

While advising accommodation over Germany’s territorial ambitions in Poland—as he had in Czechoslovakia and Austria—it was Henderson who delivered the ultimatum on the morning of 3 September 1939 to Hitler stating that if hostilities between Germany and Poland did not cease by 11 a.m. that day, a state of war would exist. Germany did not respond, and Prime Minister Neville Chamberlain declared war at 11:15 a.m.

After returning to London, Henderson wrote a book, *Failure of a Mission: Berlin 1937–1939*, published in 1940 [G. P. Putnam’s Sons, 1940]. In it, he spoke highly of some members of the Nazi regime, including Hermann Göring. In contrast, he was not complimentary about Joachim von Ribbentrop.

Before his term in Germany, Henderson served as Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary to the Kingdom of Yugoslavia between 1929 and 1935,^[987] where he was in close confidence to King Alexander and Prince Paul. Henderson was on friendly terms with the members of the Astors’ Cliveden set, which also supported the appeasement of Hitler, and whose member was Prince Paul of Yugoslavia. Henderson wrote in his memoirs how eager Alexander was to show him his military plans to counter the Mussolini’s projected attack on Dalmatia, when the main body of the Italian Army has been sent overseas.^[988]

He had previously been in the U.S. in 1928.^[1009] On 4 Apr. 1929 he was issued an Alien Certificate by the U.S. Dept. of Labor in Vancouver, B.C., for readmission to the U.S.^[1010] He returned on the same vessel to Southampton, arriving 1 May 1929.^[1011]

On 20 May 1943 Caryl L. Hargreaves, 55, a diplomat and King’s Messenger, born in England, citizen of Great Britain, arrived in New York City aboard a Pan American Airways aircraft departing from Foynes, Ireland, on 14 May 1943, departed Darrell Field, Bermuda, 20 May 1943, and arriving at La Guardia Field, New York, 20 May 1943. His nearest relative was “Wife. Madeleine Hargreaves,” of Broadwood House, Sunningdale. He had previously visited the U.S. in Mar. 1947. He listed a contact, George Martin, Mortgage Corp., Ltd., 601 Howe St., Vancouver, B.C., as person he was to join.^[1016] He returned on the same vessel to Southampton, arriving 13 Apr. 1948.^[1017]

being correspondence and memorabilia of Caryl Liddell Hargreaves, who lived until 1955 . . . with numerous references to her sister Rhoda, as well as to Caryl’s “adorable” daughter Mary Jean. . . .

Alice’s third son was Captain, later Wing Commander, Caryl Liddell Hargreaves (1887–1955). Alice later claimed that his name “Caryl” was not specifically chosen because of “Lewis Carroll,” although it may be wondered whether this connection played a sub-conscious role in the choice of name. Like his brothers, Caryl was educated at Eton, lived mainly in a social set in London, but made occasional visits to his mother at Cuffnells in the years after his father’s death in 1926, when he undertook much of the financial management of the estate. In his early forties, and against his mother’s wishes, he married in 1929 a war widow, Madeleine Hanbury-Tracy, who bore him a daughter, Mary Jean

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A. WILLIAM SPAIN, 1803–1876

From the *Dictionary of New Zealand Biography*:^[1302]

William Spain was born at Cowes, Isle of Wight, on 14 March 1803, the fourth child of George Spain, merchant, and his wife, Sarah Rosendal. William was educated at Hyde Abbey School, Hampshire, trained as an attorney at Winchester and qualified in 1823. On 9 April 1825 at Watton-at-Stone, Hertfordshire, he married Mary Elizabeth White. Mary and William Spain had eleven children, two of whom died in infancy. A supporter of the Whig party, Spain became a central secretary for Hampshire, was active during the passage of the 1832 Reform Act, was involved for two years with the work of a New Zealand committee, and acted for some time as a private secretary to Lord Palmerston.

In January 1841 the secretary of state for the colonies, Lord John Russell, appointed Spain to the position of land claims commissioner in New Zealand. He was to investigate the claims of the New Zealand Company which held that it had bought some 20 million acres of land around Cook Strait in 1839. The company had already sent hundreds of settlers there by the end of 1840. On 20 April 1841 Spain and his family sailed from Gravesend for New Zealand on board the emigrant ship *Prince Rupert*. Among their fellow passengers were the colony's new surveyor general, Charles Ligar, and five assistant surveyors. In early September the *Prince Rupert* was wrecked without loss of life near Robben Island, Table Bay, south-west Africa. The commissioner's party and the surveyors continued their journey in a chartered brig, *Antilla*. They reached Auckland on 24 December 1841.

Although Russell had envisaged Spain's dealing with non-New Zealand Company claims, Governor William Hobson felt it was too big a job for one man to deal with in a reasonable time. Hobson already had two land commissioners at work on the non-New Zealand Company claims. These were Captain Mathew Richmond and Colonel Edward Godfrey, who had been appointed in September 1840 by Governor George Gipps. Hobson therefore decided to retain all three commissioners. Spain's work was to be confined to investigating the New Zealand Company claims and any non-company counter-claims to the same lands. He was instructed to give effect to the current Land Commission Act and also to two agreements made between the company, and the British and New Zealand governments in November 1840 and September 1841 respectively.

The commissioner began work in Wellington on 15 May 1842. The company's claim to the Wellington district rapidly collapsed in the Land Claims Court and this was paralleled by increasing Maori opposition to European occupation of town and Hutt Valley lands. This encouraged the New Zealand Company agent, Colonel William Wakefield, to offer to compensate those Maori who had missed out on the general payments made in 1839. Both Spain and the acting governor, Willoughby Shortland, considered this suggestion to be the most practical solution. Under the scheme, compensation was to be paid at the same time as the claims were investigated. This changed the focus of the commission's work from deciding which land was company land and which was Maori, to deciding where compensation was due and whether the original purchase was valid. The only lands to be excluded from alienation in this way were pa, cultivations, and burial grounds. In spite of this favourable development, Wakefield did all he could to obstruct Spain's investigations and it was not until the Wairau incident in June 1843 that he began to co-operate. The compensation scheme, and Wakefield's delaying tactics, made the Maori claimants increasingly

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sceptical of the land court's impartiality and deprived the commissioner of the earlier influence he had enjoyed with the Maori.

During his investigations Spain decided that the company had made valid purchases in only two of the areas it claimed: Manawatu and New Plymouth. Nevertheless, he awarded all the land it claimed to the company and compensation to the Maori. The only lands he did not award, because of Maori resistance, were the Manawatu and Porirua districts. However, in every instance, the compensation was accepted reluctantly or refused. Governor Robert FitzRoy issued only two Crown grants on the basis of Spain's awards because of Maori opposition to occupation of the other lands and their demands for further substantial payments. The Crown grants, signed in late July 1845, were for Wellington and Nelson.

Final settlement of the New Zealand Company's other claims did not occur until years later and was achieved in several ways, notably through land purchase and military force. In spite of the dissatisfaction with Spain's awards at the time, his thorough groundwork and the substantial files compiled during his investigations provided invaluable information for later settlements of the claims to lands in the Cook Strait region.

Spain and his family moved to New South Wales in 1845, where he practised as a solicitor until 1851. He was then appointed as the first inspector general of police and became a member of the Legislative Council of New South Wales. He resigned from both offices in December 1851. Spain returned to private practice until 1856 when he was reappointed to the Legislative Council. He held this office until 1858. In 1861 Spain retired to Waverley, Sydney. He died at nearby Woollahra on 5 April 1876.

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B. OBITUARY: GEN. SIR WILLIAM MONTAGU SCOTT MCMURDO

From *The Times*, Sat., 3 Mar. 1894:^[1303]

We have to announce that Sir William Montagu Scott McMurdo died at Nice yesterday.

Sir William McMurdo, Son of Lieutenant-Colonel Archibald McMurdo, of Lotus, N.B., was born in 1819. He was educated at Sandhurst, entered the army as Ensign in 1837, was promoted to Lieutenant in 1841, Captain in 1843, Brevet-Major 1848, Brevet-Lieutenant-Colonel 1853, Colonel 1854, Major-General 1868, Lieutenant-General 1876, General 1878. He married, in 1844, Susan Sarah, daughter of General Sir Charles J. Napier.

He served as Assistant Quartermaster-General of the Army under Sir Charles Napier during the campaign in Scinde in 1843, and was present at the battle of Meeanee, in which his horse was shot under him; at an affair with the enemy while conducting Major Stack's Brigade from Mutaree to form a junction with Sir Charles Napier's force at Hyderabad; and at the battle of Hyderabad; where he received a sabre wound in the right breast. For these services he was granted the medal with two clasps.

He again served as Assistant Quartermaster-General to Sir Charles Napier during the campaign against the mountain and desert tribes on the right bank of the Indus early in 1845. In 1851-2 he served as Assistant Adjutant-General of the Queen's troops under Sir Charles Napier in the expedition against the Afridis, including the forcing of the Kohat Pass, for which he received the Medal with Clasp.

At an early period of the campaign in the Crimea, when the inadequate means of land conveyance had become apparent, he was entrusted with the formation and command of the Land Transport Corps—since designated the military train—and for this service he received the C.B. He also received for his services in the Crimea the medal with clasp for Sebastopol, the ribband of the Legion of Honour, the Medjidie of the Fourth Class, and the Turkish Medal.

Not long after the volunteer movement of 1859 assumed a permanent character, Colonel McMurdo was selected as the fittest Officer for the responsible post of Inspector-General of Volunteer Forces for the term of five years: and on his retirement the most influential promoters of the movement raised a subscription in testimonial in recognition of his services.

In February, 1865, the honorary colonelcies of the Inns of Court Volunteers and of the Engineers and Railway Volunteer Staff Corps who were accepted by him. He retired from active service in the army in 1881, and after serving as Hon. Colonel of the East Yorkshire Regiment he was appointed, in June, 1888, Hon. Colonel of the Cheshire Regiment.

According to "Men Of The Time", Sir Charles Napier on many occasions expressed in very emphatic terms the high opinion he entertained of Sir William McMurdo's conduct and services.

From *The Times*, Mon., 12 Mar. 1894:

Our correspondent adds the following details of the life of the late General Sir W.M.S. McMurdo, an obituary notice of whom appeared in the Times a few days ago:

After his horse was shot under him at the conflict of Meeanee he went down on foot into the thick of the fight and slew Jan Mohomed, a warlike Chief, in single combat.

At the battle of Hyderabad, shortly after, Lieutenant McMurdo was again engaged in single combat, and again slew his man, but here he was himself wounded.

He accompanied Sir Charles Napier through all his remaining campaigns in Scinde, and during the latter's short tenure of office as Commander-in-Chief in India, from 1849 to 1851.

When Colonel McMurdo retired from the post of Inspector-General of Volunteers the Volunteers

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with one voice acknowledged their debt of gratitude to him, and as a practical proof of their feeling towards him they rebuilt, at their own expense, his residence, Rose Bank, on the banks of the Thames at Fulham which was destroyed by fire. At the entrance still stand two figures of volunteers in full uniform. During late years Sir W. Montagu McMurdo chiefly lived at a villa which he had built on the olive slopes of the Italian Riviera, above Alassio, paying summer visits to England.

Sir Montagu McMurdo received the Grand Cross of the Bath last year.

He was married in 1844 to the eldest daughter of his old chief, Sir Charles Napier, and by her, who survives him, leaves several children. One, Captain Arthur McMurdo, is A.D.C. to Sir H. Kitchener, the Sirdar of the Egyptian army, and has received the Distinguished Service Order. He was wounded in one of the engagements with the Dervishes. Lady McMurdo and two of his daughters, the Hon. Mrs William Bruce and Mrs Rawlins, were with Sir Montagu McMurdo at his death.

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C. WILL OF JOHN HARGREAVES THE ELDER, 1776

My transcription of portions of the will of John Hargreaves the Elder, signed 27 May 1776, proved 22 May 1777, from a digital photocopy of the original supplied to me courtesy of Lindsey Hargreaves in New Zealand, which in turn she made from a photocopy supplied to her courtesy of Sheila Powell in England. Although the will is written without paragraphs, I have introduced them in obvious places (indicated by uppercase letters in the original) for ease of reading:

In the name of God Amen, I John Hargreaves (the elder) of Higham in the Forest of Pendle and County of Lancaster Yeoman, being of sound and disposing mind and Memory (Praised be God for the same) Do make and Declare this my last Will and Testament, in manner and form following, that is to say,

First it is my Will and mind that all my Just Debts, Funeral Expences, and Charges of proving this my last Will, be paid and Discharged by my Executrix and Executors herein after named out of my Personal Estate.

Also it is my Will and mind, and I do hereby Give and Bequeath unto my Son John Hargreaves the sum of Five Pounds to be paid him by my said Executrix and Executors out of my said Personal Estate, At the end of Twelve Months next after my Decease, which said Legacy of Five pounds, with what herein after I shall Give him, or that he may be intituled to under this my said Will, and what I have heretofore Given, or setled [sic] upon him, is all the portion I ever Intend him.

Also I Give and Bequeath unto my son Jonathan Hargreaves the sum of Five Pounds, to be paid him by my said Executrix and Executors out of my said Personal Estate, at the end of twelve Months next after my Decease, which said Legacy of Five pounds, with what hereinafter I shall Give him, or that he may be Intitled to under this my said Will, and what I have heretofore Given, Or setled upon him, is all the portion I ever Intend him.

And whereas I am now possessed oF [sic], Interested in, Or otherwise well Intitled to all that One Messuage, Or Dwelling House, One Barn and other Buildings with the Lands and Hereditaments thereunto belonging, lying and being in Salwick near Preston In the said County of Lancaster by one Indenture of Demise, or Leave, Granted me from Thomas Clifton of Lytham Hall in the said County of Lancaster Esquire for the term of Two lives, both which are now in being, Under the Rents And Covenants therein Reserved and Contained;

Now therefore it is my Will and mind, And I do hereby Give Devise and Bequeath unto my Son James Hargreaves his Heirs Executors Adm^{rs} and Assigns (Or according to the Nature of the tenure thereof) All my Tenant Right Estate and Interest which I now have of in and to all the aforesaid Leasehold Messuage Farm or Tenement situate at Salwick aforesaid;

But in Case my said Son James Hargreaves shall happen to die without legal Issue of his body, Then and in such Case I do hereby Give and Bequeath the said premisses and every part thereof to my said Son Jonathan Hargreaves his Heirs Ex^{rs} Adm^{rs} and Assigns (Or according to the tenure or nature thereof)

Also I Give and Bequeath unto my said Son James Hargreaves the Sum of One Hundred Pounds, to be paid him by my said Executrix and Executors out of my said Personal Estate at the end of Twelve Months next after my decease.

Also it is my Will and Mind, And I do hereby Give and Devise to my said Son Jonathan Hargreaves and James Roberts of Northwood in the parish of [end of sheet 1] Whaley [sic] and to their Heirs for ever, Or to the Survivor of them and his Heirs for Ever, All that Copyhold Messuage Farm or Tenement commonly called and known by the name of Sharps Tenement, situate lying and being in Wheatley Carr in the Forest of Pendle aforesaid, with all and every the Lands Grounds Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the same belonging, or in any wise Appertaining, now in the possession of John Hargreaves my Son, or his Undertenants,

And also the Reversion and Inheritance of all that Messuage or Dwelling House, together with the

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Chapel, or Meeting House, with the Stable, Chapel Yard, Lands, Grounds and Appurtenances to the same belonging, now in the Possession of the Trustees for the said Chapel, or Meetinghouse, and situate lying and being at, or near Wheatley Carr aforesaid, and all which two last named Messuages or Tenements and Premises are in the whole of the Yearly Rent to the Lords and Ladies of the said Forest of Sixteen Shillings and Eight pence [and being of the Copyhold tenure have already surrendered [sic] the same to the use of my last Will] To hold the same unto them the said Jonathan Hargreaves and James Roberts and their Heirs for Ever, Or to the Survivor of them and his Heirs for Ever,

Upon Trust and Confidence Nevertheless, that immediately [sic] after my Decease, they the said Jonathan Hargreaves and James Roberts, and their Heirs, Or the Survivor of them and his Heirs, shall Vend Sell and Dispose of the said Messuage Farm or Tenement called Sharps Tenement with the Appurtenances, As also the said Reversion and Inheritance of the said Messuages or Dwellinghouse, Stable, Chapel Yard, and the Lands Ground and Appurtenances to the same belonging to the best benefit and Advantage, and for the best price, or profit they may, or can,

And out of the Monies Arising by the sale of the said Messuages Lands Tenements and Hereditaments, and from the Rents and Profits until such Sale, they the said Jonathan Hargreaves and James Roberts shall well and truly pay, Or Cause to be paid unto my Son Joseph Hargreaves three full parts thereof, when he shall attain his Age of Twenty One Years, And until that period of him, I do hereby Order and direct that my said Trustees, Or the Survivor of them shall place out the same at Interest upon the best real Security they can or may get for the same, and pay and apply the same as it becomes due for and towards his Maintenance and Education.

And also well and truly pay, or cause to be paid unto my Son William Hargreaves the fourth part, or remainder of such Rents, and purchase Money, or Money to arise as aforesaid, within One Kalendar [sic] Month next after the time they shall or may happen to Receive the purchase Money for the said premisses.

Also it is my Will and mind, and I do hereby Give and Devise unto my Son Joshua Hargreaves and to his Heirs and Assigns for Ever, All that One Messuage or Tenement commonly called or known by the name of the Newhouse, or Sagar Hill, with the Barn Buildings Lands Grounds Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the same belonging, Or in any wise appertaining situate lying and being in Higham booth aforesaid.

And now in the tenure or Occupation of me the said John Hargreaves and Richard Hargreaves our [end of sheet 2] Assigns, Or Undertenants, And of the yearly Rent to the Lords and Ladies of the said Forest of three Shillings, and being of the Copyhold tenure have also Surrendered the same to the Use of my last Will, Subject Nevertheless to such a Charge as I shall hereafter charge the same, or some part thereof withall.

Also I do hereby Give and Bequeath unto my said Son Joshua Hargreaves the sum of Two Hundred pounds to be paid him by my said Executrix and Executors when he shall attain his Age of Twenty one Years out of my said personal Estate, and the Interest in the mean time to be paid and applied [sic] towards his Maintenance and Education.

Also I Give and Bequeath unto my Son Robert Hargreaves the sum of Three hundred pounds, to be paid him by my said Executrix and Executors out of my said Personal Estate at the end of Twelve Months next after my Decease

Also it is my Will and Mind, And I do hereby Order charge and direct that Mary my Loving Wife shall have hold and Enjoy for and during the term of her natural life, and that free and clear from the Payment of any Rent Taxes Or Assessments whatsoever, One Bay of the Building adjoining the East End of the house at Sagar Hill aforesaid herein before Devised to my said Son Joshua, for her to live and Reside in (if she pleases) after my Decease, which said priviledge with the Legacies or Bequests herein after Given and Bequeathed her, with the Dowry she will or may be Intitled to out of the herein before mentioned Estates already by me Devised, shall be in full Lieu and Satisfaction of all her Dower, or thirds she might have, or otherwise claim of in to or out of all, Or any of my said Copyhold, Free-

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hold, Leasehold, or personal Estates, or any of them.

Also I do hereby Give and Bequeath unto Mary my said Wife and to my Son Joshua Hargreaves their Executors Administrators and Assigns All my Tenant Right, Estate, Interest, and term to come, Of in and to all that Messuage Farm or Tenement situate in Higham aforesaid, now in my possession, and which I hold by Leave under the Trustees of the Curacy of Burnley in the said County of Lancaster,

And also all my Household Good, and Husbandry Gears, Hay, Corn, Quick Goods, and Cattle, which I shall or may have in my Custody, or Possession, or otherwise belonging to me at the time of my Decease, Equally between them share and share alike.

Also I Give and Bequeath to my said Sons Jonathan Robert and Joshua Hargreaves (equally amongst them) All my Tools and Implements belonging my Trade I now follow, and which may belong to me at the time of my Decease.

And it is my Will and mind, And I do hereby declare that no Leasehold premisses herein before Devised, or Bequeathed, shall be called or Deemed Personalty.

And as to for and Concerning all the Rest Residue and Remainder of my Personal Estate of what kind or nature so ever (After payment thereof of all my Just Debts Legacies and Funeral Expences by my Executrix and Executors as aforesaid) I Give and Bequeath the same and every part thereof to my said Sons John Jonathan James Robert William Joshua and Joseph Hargreaves their Executors Administrators and Assigns for Ever equally amongst them share and share alike,

Provided always Nevertheless, And it is my Will and mind, that if any of my said Sons John Jonathan James Robert William Joshua and Joseph shall happen to die before any of their attaining their Respective Ages of Twenty One Years, Or time or times their said pecuniary Legacies shall become payable by virtue of this my [end of sheet 3] Will, Or their shares of the Remainder of my said Personal Estate without Legal Issue, That then and in such Case, I do hereby Direct and appoint such pecuniary Legacy or Legacies [interlined: share or shares of the Remainder of the said personal Estate] of him or them so dying, to go and be equally paid and divided amongst all my Sons then living, share and share alike, to such of them as shall or may happen to be under the Age of Twenty One Years, when, and as soon, as he shall attain his Age of Twenty one Years, and the Interest of such Share or Shares to be paid and applied [interlined: to] his, or their, Maintenance or Education, till he or they Respectively attain his or their Age of Twenty One Years.

And I do hereby Declare that my said Trustees shall and may keep and Retain so much money as they or either of them shall pay or Expend in the Sale of the said Trust premisses but of the said Trust premisses, or purchases Money, or what they or either of them shall pay, or lay out in the Execution of the Trust hereby in them Reposed, Nor that my said Trustees, or either of them, shall not be answerable or accountable one for the other, Or for the Acts or Deeds of the other, But each only for his own Act and Deed.

And that either of them shall not be answerable for any more Money than they shall severally and respectively actually Receive, Nor for any Loss but such as shall happen thro' their wilful [sic] Neglect and Default.

And I do hereby Ordain and appoint my Loving Wife Mary my said Son Jonathan and James Roberts to have the Government and Tuition of such of my Children as shall or may happen to be under Age at the time of my Decease during their respective Minorities.

And Lastly I do hereby Nominate Constitute and appoint my said Wife Mary said Son Jonathan and James Roberts Joint Executrix and Executors of this my last Will and Tenement [sic], Hereby Revoking and making void all former, or other Wills by me at any time heretofore made, Allowing and Confirming this only to be my last Will and Testament

In Witness whereof, I the said John Hargreaves have to this my Last Will and Testament contained in four sheets of paper, to the first three sheets of paper set my hand and to the fourth my hand and Seal this Twenty seventh Day of May In the Year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and Seven-

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ty Six.

Although the will is written without paragraphs, I have introduced them in obvious places (indicated by uppercase letters in the original) for ease of reading:

This is the Last Will and Testament of me James Hargreaves of Liverpool in the County of Lancaster Brewer made and duly published by me the ninth day of June One thousand eight hundred and twelve

It is my will that all my debts funeral Expences and the charges of the Probate of my will be fully paid.

I give and devise unto my beloved wife Mary Hargreaves for and during so much of her natural life as she shall remain my Widow one Annuity or clear yearly sum of Five hundred Pounds payable half-yearly.

I give and devise unto William Mollineux and Nicholas Robinson both of Saint Ann's Street in Liverpool aforesaid Merchants and Joseph Redish of Clarence Street in Liverpool aforesaid Accountant their Heirs and assigns all that my Messuage or Dwelling house on the Eastside of Highfield Street in Liverpool aforesaid now in my own occupation together with the Work house, old Stable, Kiln, old Warehouse, old Drinkhouse and old Brewhouse also all that Messuage or Dwelling house in Highfield Street aforesaid in the Possession of M^{rs} Shanks

Also all those four Messuages or Dwelling houses at the back of the last mentioned Messuage in a Place called Maiden Green

Also all that vacant or unbuilt Land situate on the Eastside of Highfield Street aforesaid

And also all that Messuage or Dwelling house on the Westside of Highfield Street aforesaid in the occupation of M^r Clark together with the Easements and Appurtenances thereunto respectively belonging

Upon Trust to permit and suffer my said Wife to have receive and take to her own use, for and during so much of her natural life as she shall remain my Widow, the rents Issues and Profits thereof

And from and after her decease or Marriage again which ever first shall happen

Upon Trust to sell and dispose of the same in such way and manner as they shall think Proper for the most money that can be had or got for the same

Nevertheless it is my Will and I direct that my son Winter Ainsworth Hargreaves or my Daughter Mary Catharine Hargreaves, in case he shall decline it, shall have the opportunity of becoming the Purchaser thereof or of any part thereof at a fair valuation to be put thereon,

And it is my Will that the monies to arise from the Sale and the Cash and Profits in the mean time shall sink into [end of sheet 1] and become part of the residue of my Estate and Effects therein after bequeathed and disposed of

It is my further Will and I direct that the Purchasers of my Houses and Buildings in Highfield Street aforesaid devised in trust as aforesaid, if they shall think proper, shall have the privilege of turning their foul Water into the Sough that is under my new Brewhouse and communicating with the common Sewer in Milk Street and Leeds Street in Liverpool and that my Trustees until the Sale thereof shall have and enjoy the same privilege

I give and bequeath unto my said wife for and during so much of her natural life as she shall remain my Widow All my other Messuages or Dwelling houses Lands Tenements and Hereditaments situate in Liverpool aforesaid (those only excepted which are herein after by me specifically devised to my son the said Winter Ainsworth Hargreaves his heirs and assigns)

And the use of all my household Goods Plate Linen China and Furniture of every description, Carriage Carriage horses and Saddle horses

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But in case my said wife shall happen to marry again then I give and bequeath unto her for and during the term of her natural life one Annuity or clear yearly sum of Five hundred and fifty pounds payable half yearly and such Parts only of my household Goods and Furniture as she may make choice of not exceeding in value the sum of Two hundred pounds or I give and bequeath unto her my said wife in that event the sum of Two hundred pounds at her election to be made within fourteen days after her marriage

And after the death or second Marriage of my said Wife I direct the whole, if she shall accept such sum or if not, the residue of my said household Goods and Furniture and my Carriage and Carriage and Saddle horses to be sold and the money arising therefrom to sink into and become part of the residue of my estate and effects herein after bequeathed

I give and devise unto my son the said Winter Ainsworth Hargreaves his Heirs and assigns for ever

All that my new Brewhouse Drink house and Engine house, new Warehouse new Counting house Sawpit and large and small new Stables and also the new Messuage or Dwelling house now in my own occupation partly adjoining the last described premises and fronting Milk Street in Liverpool aforesaid with the Easements and Appurtenances thereunto respectively belonging

I also give and bequeath unto my said son his Executors Administrators and Assigns All the Pans Vats Coolers and fixtures of [end of sheet 2] every denomination in and belonging to the said Brewhouse and Buildings devised to my said son also all my Casks Drays Carts and Implements of every description used by me or which I shall have in use at the time of my decease in my business of a Brewer and my Horses (my Carriage and Carriage and Saddle horses only excepted)

I give bequeath unto my said son all the debts sum and sums of money which shall be due and owing to me at the time of my decease whether the same shall be good bad or dubious and contracted in the way of my business of a Brewer before and since his my said son's attainment to the age of twenty one years together with such a sum of money out of my personal Estate as with the said Debts shall amount to the sum of Ten thousand pounds

It is my will and I hereby direct my Executors herein after named to place out and continue at Interest on good Mortgage Security, a principal sum arising from my personal Estate sufficient to pay my said Wife her Annuity of Five hundred pounds or Two hundred and fifty pounds in the event aforesaid during the term of her natural life

I give and bequeath unto my Executors herein after named their Executors and Administrators the Sum of Five thousand pounds or such other sum of money as will yield the clear annual Interest of Two hundred and fifty pounds

Upon Trust to place the same at Interest on good Mortgage Security and pay and apply the Interest thereof to or for the use of my said Daughter Mary Catharine Hargreaves from the time of my decease until her attainment to the age of twenty one years

I give and bequeath unto my said Daughter on her attainment to the age of twenty one years the sum of Five thousand pounds Sterling at her own disposal

But in case of her death under age leaving lawful Issue then I give and bequeath the said sum of Five thousand pounds unto such Issue equally when and as they severally attain the age of twenty one years but if my said Daughter shall leave only one Child then I give and bequeath the said sum of Five thousand pounds unto such Child on his or her attainment to the age of twenty one years

I give and bequeath unto my said Executors herein after named their Executors and Administrators the Sum of Twenty thousand pounds Sterling

In trust to place the same at Interest on good Mortgage Security or in the three per Cent Consols or in any [end of sheet 3] other of the public funds as will be most advantageous, the Interest and Dividends whereof it is my will shall accumulate until my said Daughter's Arrival at the age of twenty one years.

And from and after such her attainment to age

In trust to stand possessed of the said Principal sum of Twenty thousand pounds and the accumu-

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lated Interest or Dividends thereof for my said Daughter during the term of her natural life and from and after her decease whether the same shall happen in her minority or after her coming of age as aforesaid

In trust for the lawful Issue of my said Daughter if more than one equally as Tenants in common if but one then for such one Child their his or her Executors Administrators or Assigns when and as they severally attain the age of twenty one years a competent Part of the Interest or Dividends whereof it is my will shall be laid out in their maintenance education and bringing up during their minority

But in case my said Daughter shall happen to die under the age of twenty one years without leaving lawful Issue her surviving then

In trust to stand possessed of the said sum of Twenty thousand pounds and the accumulated Interest or Dividends thereof and also of the said sum of Five thousand pounds for the benefit and advantage of my said Wife during so much of her natural life as she shall continue my Widow

It is my will that in case my said Daughter shall die without having lawful Issue who shall live to attain the age of twenty one years the said principal sum of Twenty thousand pounds and the Interest or Dividends thereof not then disposed of shall sink into and form a part of the residue of my estate and effects and in like manner in case she shall die under the age of twenty one years without leaving lawful Issue who shall attain the age of twenty one years it is my Will that the said sum of Five thousand pounds which she would be entitled to absolutely at the age of twenty one years shall sink into the residue of my estate and effects Subject as to the said sum of Twenty thousand pounds to the life Interest of my said wife in the event of her continuing my Widow as aforesaid [end of sheet 4]

I give and bequeath unto my said Daughter after the decease or Marriage again of my said Wife all my Plate if my said Daughter attain the age of twenty one years but in case of her death under that age then I give and bequeath the same unto my said son if then living

I give unto my said Wife my Horse called Jimmy

I give unto my Nephew Joshua Hartley Hargreaves now living with me the sum of Twenty five pounds per annum from the time of my decease until his attainment to the age of twenty four years when I give unto him the sum of Five hundred pounds

I give and bequeath unto each and every other Child that I may happen to have living at the time of my decease or born in due time after my decease the sum of Five thousand pounds to be paid to them when and as they severally attain the age of twenty one years

And it is my Will that a competent Part of the Interest thereof in the mean time shall be laid out by my Executors in their maintenance education and bringing up and that the accumulated Interest from the time of my decease shall be paid to them on their respectively coming of age as aforesaid

And whereas it is my Will that the residue of my estate and effects real leasehold and personal shall from the time of my decease accumulate for the benefit of my said Son and Daughter and their respective Issue in equal moieties and that the rents and Interest thereof shall not be received by them until their attainment to the age of thirty years except in the case of marriage with the consent of my Executors herein after named or a majority of them in which event they shall be entitled to the rents and Interest thereof at their respective ages of twenty seven years

Now I do hereby give and devise all the rest residue and remainder of my Estate and Effects real leasehold and personal unto my Executors herein after named their Heirs Executors Administrators and Assigns

Upon Trust as to one moiety thereof for the benefit and advantage of my said son during the term of his natural life from and after his attainment to the age of thirty years or twenty seven years in case of his Marriage before his age of twenty seven years with the consent of my Executors herein after named [end of sheet 5] or a majority of them

And from and after the decease of my said son then

In trust for the children of my said son who shall be living at the time of his decease and the Issue of such of them as shall be then dead (such Issue taking their deceased Parents share) as Tenants in com-

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mon their Heirs Executors Administrators and Assigns

And Upon Trust as to one other moiety thereof for the benefit and advantage of my said Daughter during the term of her natural life from and after her attainment to the age of thirty years or twenty seven years in case of her marriage before her age of twenty seven years with the consent of my Executors herein after named or a majority of them

And from and after her decease then

In trust for the Children of my said Daughter who shall be living at the time of her decease and the Issue of such of them as shall be then dead (such Issue taking their deceased Parents share) as Tenants in common their Heirs Executors Administrators and Assigns

It is my will and I hereby direct that in case my said Son or Daughter shall die without leaving lawful Issue the fortune by me given and devised to him or her for life shall go to the Survivor his or her Heirs Executors Administrators and Assigns Subject nevertheless to the life Estate of my said Wife therein as herein before provided for her in the event of her surviving my said Daughter and continuing my Widow

And that in case my said Daughter shall die under the age of twenty one years without leaving Issue the said sum of Five thousand pounds herein before given to her shall in like manner go over to my said Son his Executors Administrators and Assigns

But if my Son and Daughter shall both die without leaving lawful Issue of either of them or any brother or Sister to be born surviving them I give and devise all the said rest and residue of my said Estate real leasehold and personal together also with the said sum of Five thousand pounds in the event of my Daughter dying under twenty one years of age and the said sum of Twenty thousand pounds herein before bequeathed to or in trust for her and her children Subject as [end of sheet 6] aforesaid unto my Nephews William Hargreaves and Reginald Hargreaves of Burnley in the said County Manufacturers Sons of my Brother Robert Hargreaves and to my said Nephew Joshua Hartley Hargreaves and my Nieces Mary Dugdale and Sarah Holgate their Heirs Executors Administrators and Assigns as Tenants in common

But in case my said Niece Mary Dugdale shall die without leaving lawful Issue or the Issue of any Child it is my Will that her one fifth part of the said Property shall go to and I hereby give and devise the same from and immediately after her decease unto my said Nephew Joshua Hartley Hargreaves his Heirs Executors Administrators and Assigns for ever

It is my will and I hereby direct that in case of any deficiency of my said Wife's Income of Five hundred pounds per Annum or Two hundred and fifty pounds per Annum in the event aforesaid from any cause whatever, the same shall be made good and paid to my said Wife out of the moiety of the residue given and devised to or in trust for my said Son as aforesaid

It is also my Will and I hereby direct that the said sum of Twenty thousand pounds given to or in trust for my said Daughter in manner before mentioned shall be laid out in a Purchase of a freehold or Copyhold Estate of Inheritance upon the Trust and for the Purposes in this my will before mentioned and subject as aforesaid

And that the whole of the residue and remainder of my personal Estate shall be placed at Interest on good Mortgage Security in the names of my Executors as often as the same shall amount to the sum of Three hundred pounds and come to their hands as such Executors

It is my further Will that the said fortune devised and bequeathed to or in trust for my said Daughter (the said sum of Five thousand pounds only excepted) shall not be subject or liable to the debts Controul [sic] or Engagements of any Husband she may have and that her receipt alone from time to time for the rents Interest and Dividends shall be a good discharge to my [end of sheet 7] said Executors

It is my further Will that in case my said Son shall be unfortunate in business or otherwise embarrassed so as to require pecuniary assistance it shall be in the power of my said Executors to advance him from time to time any sum or sums of money from the rents Interest and Dividends of his moiety of

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the residue of my Estate and Effects not exceeding one half part of the yearly amount thereof

I declare that my Executrix and Executors shall be my Successors for the benefit of my Estate in a Business which I now carry on in Partnership with James Hodgson of Liverpool Timber Merchant under certain articles of partnership

I give to my Maid Servant Emmy Ashburner the sum of Thirty pounds

I appoint my said Wife and the said William Mollineaux Nicholas Robinson and Joseph Redish Executrix and Executors of this my Will

I give to my said Executors William Mollineaux Nicholas Robinson and Joseph Redish the sum of Fifty pounds apiece

I declare that the receipt or receipts of my said Trustees or of any of them or of the Survivors of Survivor of them his Executors or Administrators shall be a full and absolute Discharge to the purchaser or purchasers of all or any Part of the Premises which may be sold and to his her and their respective Heirs Executors Administrators and Assigns for the monies in such receipt or receipts expressed to be received and after such receipt or receipts shall be given such purchaser or purchasers his her or their Heirs Executors Administrators and Assigns shall be discharged of and from such purchase money and shall not be accountable for any loss misapplication or nonapplication thereof or of any part thereof

And I direct that all Grants Conveyances and other dispositions of my Estate and Effects or of any part or parts thereof by my said Trustees or the Survivors or Survivor of them or the Heirs Executors or Administrators of such Survivor shall be valid and effectual for the purposes thereby intended

I also declare that my said Executors or any of them shall not be chargeable with or accountable for any losses which may happen to my Estates so as such Losses happen without their wilful neglect or default nor for more than they shall severally actually receive nor one of them for another of them nor for the acts or defaults receipts or Disbursements of another but each of them for his and her own acts Deeds defaults receipts and disbursements only

And that they shall and may retain and reimburse themselves respectively all such Costs Charges and Expences as they or any of them shall expend or be put unto [end of sheet 8] in the performance of this my Will

And I hereby revoke all former and other Wills and Testamentary Writings by me at any time heretofore made

This is the unredacted version signed by Joseph [the paragraphing is mine and I boldface those words that are redacted from the final version and italicize words inserted in the redacted version]:

In the name of God, Amen. I Joseph Hargreaves of the State of Georgia and County of Liberty Planter considerably indisposed in Body but of sound mind memory and understanding do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner following—viz—

It is my will and desire that my body be decently interred at the discretion of my Executors herein after named and that my funeral Expenses and all and every of my just & lawful debts be paid and satisfied –

after which I will & ordain that my two servant women Nanny & Binah her daughter for their good and faithful services and for other good causes and considerations be forever set free and emancipated grant^s to them & each of them all the liberties & priviledges which free negroes and mulattoes are entitled to by the Laws of this State or otherwise and that immediately after my decease my executors do pay from ? of my Estate to the said Nanny & Binah the sum of one hundred dollars each free from all encumbrances & charges *whatsoever* the same bring for their maintenance and support – and my Executors are directed to sell a box of Plate now in my store room at my plantation & distribute the proceeds in equal proportions to the s^d Nanny & Binah

and further and that for good causes & consi[deratio]ns I do will and ordain that my mulattoe Son Shadrach an Infant about nine years of age the child of the s^d Binah be set free & forever emancipated hereby granting to him all the liberties and priviledges which mulattoes are entitled to by the Laws of this State or otherwise –

and the said Shadrach being my son I do give *devise* & bequeath unto him *the said Shadrach* for a support & maintenance the one full fourth part of my Estate both real and personal that I may die possessed of the same to him his heirs & assigns forever –

I do hereby request my Executors to take upon them the burden of guardians and Trustees to the said Shadrach giving & grant^s to them & each of them all the powers rights & priviledges incident to guardianship or Trustee –

It is my wish and **desire** *request* that the said Shadrach **shall** *may* receive an English education the best to be obtained **and** that his estate so given & bequeathed may or can afford and that when he shall have attained to a fit & proper age he may be put to some business or trade such as he may with prudence **with the assent of his Guardian or Trustees** choose –

But should it so happen that the said Shadrach shall have departed this life before attaining to the age of twenty *one years* **and which period of time I do appoint that he shall receive and take into his possession the Estate both real and personal so to him given with the increase & profits accruing therefrom after full & just payment of all demands for his maintenance & education & other necessaries & require[ment?]s – with which he may have been furnished then & in that case, the s^d Estate so given & bequeathed to the s^d Shadrach & all & every part thereof shall become the Estate right & property of my nephew Joshua H. Hargreaves hereinafter named to him his heirs & assigns forever –**

It is my will & desire and I do herein & hereby give *devise* and bequeath unto my nephew Joshua H. Hargreaves of Liverpool England (Brewer) all & every the other three fourths of my s^d Estate both real & personal the same to him his heirs & assigns forever the same not being herein & hereby otherwise disposed of –

I do hereby also direct, that a copy properly certified of this my last will & testam^t be transmitted to my s^d nephew immediately after the probate thereof and he is hereby requested to come to this county if he can do so without manifest inconvenience in order to adjust the affairs of my Estate or to assist in

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their said adjustm^t -

I give and devise *and bequeath* to the Georgia education society the sum of one hundred dollars -

It is my will and desire that if it sh^d so happen that any of my slaves sh^d be necessarily sold or disposed of that they be disposed of in families as nearly as possible as they may be connected & to humane masters & my executors are hereby vested with authority in such case to sell at private sale in preference to public auction -

It is my wish & request, that the said boy Shadrach *mentioned* after my decease and as soon as the same can be done with safety & convenience be sent to Europe to [?] my nephew Joshua H. Hargreaves in him reposing all trust & confidence when he the s^d Shadrach shall come under his care & charge -

Lastly I do *herein and* hereby nominate constitute and appoint my worthy friends Thomas Mallard Thomas Bacon John Dunwody & my nephew Joshua H. Hargreaves Executors of this my last will & testament in them reposing every trust & fervently requesting them that they will take the burden of this my last will & **testament** upon them **together with the Guardianship & Trust therein & thereby requested and reposed** and that they will in all and **in** every respect & in every thing do & perform the tenor of the same as herein expressed meant & intended **and to do or cause to be done every act matter or thing to the necessary accomplishment of the same as ? the freedom & emancipation of the persons therein named sh^d the same be found necessary to be done -**

In the name of God, Amen. I Joseph Hargreaves of the State of Georgia and County of Liberty, planter, being considerably indisposed in body, but of sound mind, memory and understanding, do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner following.

It is my will and desire, that my body be decently interred at the discretion of my executors herein after named, and that my funeral expenses, and all and every of my just and lawful debts be paid and satisfied.

I will and ordain, that immediately after my decease, my executors herein after named do pay, from out of my estate, to the said Nanny and Binah the sum of one hundred dollars each free from all incumbrances and charges whatsoever, the same being for their maintenance and support. And my executors are directed to sell a box of plate, now in my storeroom, at my plantation, and to distribute the money arising from the sales thereof, in equal proportions, to the said Nanny and Binah.

I do give, devise and bequeath unto him the said Shadrach the one full fourth part of my estate, both real and personal, that I may die possessed of.

It is my wish and request, that the said Shadrach may receive an English education (the best to be obtained) that his estate, so given and bequeathed, may or can afford; and that when he shall have attained to a fit and proper age, he may be put to some business or trade, such as he may with prudence choose.

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But should it so happen, that the said Shadrach shall have departed this life before attaining to the age of twenty years, then and in that case, the said estate, so given and bequeathed to the said Shadrach, and all and every part thereof, shall become the estate, right and property of my nephew Joshua H. Hargreaves, herein after named, to him his heirs and assigns forever.

It is my will and desire, and I do herein and hereby give, devise and bequeath unto my nephew Joshua H. Hargreaves, of Liverpool England, brewer, all and every the other three fourths of my said estate, both real and personal, this same to him, his heirs and assigns forever; the same being not herein and hereby otherwise disposed of.

I do also hereby direct, that a copy, properly certified, of this my last will and testament be transmitted to my said nephew immediately after the probate thereof; and he is hereby requested to come to this county, if he can do so without manifest inconvenience, on order to adjust the affairs of my estate, or to assist in their said adjustment.

I give, devise and bequeath to the Georgia Education Society the sum of one hundred dollars.

It is my will and desire, that should it so happen, that any of my slaves should be necessarily sold or disposed of, that they be disposed of in families, as nearly as possible as they may be connected, and to humane masters; and my executors are hereby vested with authority, in such case, to sell at private sale in preference to public auction.

It is my wish and request, that the said boy Shadrach aforementioned, after my decease, and as soon as the same can be done with safety and convenience, be sent to Europe to my nephew Joshua H. Hargreaves, in him reposing all trust and confidence, when he the said Shadrach shall come under his care and charge.

Lastly, I do herein and hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my worthy friends, Thomas Mallard, Thomas Bacon, John Dunwoody, and my nephew Joshua H. Hargreaves, executors of this my last will and testament, in them reposing every trust, and fervently requesting the, that they will take the burthen of this my last will upon them; and that they will in all and every respect, and in every thing, do and perform the tenor of the same, as therein expressed, meant and intended.

F. WILL OF WINTER AINSWORTH HARGREAVES, 1826

Following is my transcription of the will of Winter Ainsworth Hargreaves, signed 17 Nov. 1826, proved 26 Nov. 1827, from a digital photocopy of the original supplied to me courtesy of Lindsey Hargreaves in New Zealand, which in turn she made from a photocopy supplied to her courtesy of Sheila Powell in England. Although the will is written without paragraphs, I have introduced them in obvious places (indicated by uppercase letters in the original) for ease of reading:

This is the last Will and Testament of me Winter Ainsworth Hargreaves of Liverpool in the County of Lancaster Brewer.

Subject to the payment of my Debts funeral expences and the charges of the Probate hereof I give to my Cousin Joshua Hartley Hargreaves the Sum of Seven thousand pounds for his own use absolutely

And as to all the rest residue and remainder of my Estate and Effects Freehold Copyhold Leasehold Real Personal or other Estate and Effects whatsoever and wheresoever and all such as I have any power to give dispose of or appoint unto and to the use of my Executors hereinafter named and their Heirs Executors Administrators and Assigns respectively according to the nature of the property absolutely and for ever or for and during all my Estate Term and Interest therein including all Mortgage and Trust Estates nevertheless as to the Estates vested in me upon Trust or by way of Mortgage Subject to the existing Trusts and Equity or right of Redemption thereof and to convey assign release and dispose of the same as occasion may require, and where any money shall be owing to me from any such Mortgage or Trust Estate to receive the same and apply it as part of my Estate

And as to all the rest residue and remainder of my said Freehold Copyhold Leasehold Real Personal and other Estate and Effects

Upon Trust to pay and apply the yearly rents interest and annual produce thereof unto and to the separate use of my Sister Mary Catharine Raffles to be paid to her on her own separate receipt and so that she may not anticipate charge or encumber the same and so that it shall not be liable to the Debts disposition or controul [sic] of her present or any husband and from and after her decease

Upon Trust to pay divide and distribute all the said residue of my said real copyhold leasehold and other Estate [end of sheet 1] and Effects equally between and amongst all the children of my said Sister who shall be living at her decease and the Issue then living of any such children of my said Sister who may die in her life time equally share and Share alike as Tenants in Common absolutely and for ever such Issue taking the part or share only his her or their deceased parent would have taken if such deceased Parent had been living at the decease of my said Sister.

And I direct that the shares of all the Females who may become interested under my will shall be for their own separate use respectively and the interest on the shares or presumptive shares of each and every of such Children and Issue as may be minors or a proper portion thereof shall be at the discretion of my Executors and the Survivor of them applied in and about their respective maintenance and education during their respective minorities

But if there should be no such children or child of my Sister or Issue of such living at her decease or being such should die under the age of twenty one years

Then Upon Trust for such person and persons and in such shares and in such manner as my said Sister shall by any Instrument in writing or Will or writing in nature thereof to be signed in presence of any one or more credible witness or witnesses give devise bequeath or appoint the same.

I authorise and empower my Executors and the Survivor of them to carry on and conduct any Brewery Business and concerns in such way as they or he shall think best until sold or otherwise disposed of but with full power to discontinue the said business when they shall think prudent so to do

And I direct that notwithstanding the appointment of my Cousin Joshua Hartley Hargreaves as one of my Executors he shall be allowed for managing and conducting my Brewery concern so long as my Executors or the Survivor of them shall think it prudent to carry on and conduct the same such reasonable compensation as he [end of sheet 2] and any other Executors shall think proper to be allowed

And I authorise my Executors to compromise with any Debtor or Debtors to to [sic] me or my Estate or for or in respect of any debt that may become due and owing during their Executorship and to sue or not sue for the same as they or he shall judge best and to give up and abandon bad or desperate Debts when thought not prudent to sue for it being my intention and desire to give my Executors a full discretionary power in respect thereof and in respect of all matters and things relating to the conduct of such Trade and Business as well as in and about the general management of my Estate and Effects

And I direct that the receipt or receipts of my said Trustees and Executors or the Survivor of them his Heirs Executors Administrators or Assigns shall from time to time be a good and sufficient discharge to the purchaser or purchasers of all [end of sheet 3] or any part of the said Estates or to any other person or persons paying to them any other sum or sums of money under the Trusts of this my will for so much money as shall therein be expressed to have been received and that such purchaser or purchasers or other person or persons shall not be answerable for any loss misapplication or non-application thereof or of any part thereof

And I do hereby declare that my said Trustees and Executors and the Survivor of them his Heirs Executors Administrators or Assigns shall not be chargeable or accountable with or for any more of my Estate and Effects and other the Trust property and premises aforesaid than they shall respectively actually receive nor for any loss that may arise from the invalidity of any Security or from the Insolvency or failing of any Bank in which any part of my Estate may be placed, nor for any loss damage or Injury my Estate may suffer or sustain from or by reason of carrying on such business as aforesaid or the dealings or transactions thereof nor for any act omission or misconduct of any Clerk or persons to be employed by my said Executors or any of them nor in any other way to arise or accrue from their management of my Estate nor from any error in Judgment nor in any other way, unless arising from wilful misconduct or wilful default nor shall the one of them be answerable for the other of them but each for his own acts and defaults only

And further that they may respectively reimburse themselves all sums of money costs charges damages and expences which they shall respectively pay incur or be put unto in carrying into execution the Trusts of this my will or in employing any Clerks Accountants or other persons to assist them in and about the same and that the whole of my Estate and Effects shall as far as may be a security to them for their indemnity in acting under my will and in the Trusts thereof

And if any of my [end of sheet 4] Executors shall decline or refuse to act as Trustee or Executor of this my will or if any of them whether having begun to act or not should wish to withdraw or retire from the business so to be carried on or from the Executorship and Trusts of my will generally or in part he shall be fully at liberty so to do and the other or others of them living and acting shall be competent to act in every respect as if such Executor withdrawing or refusing to act had not been named as a Trustee or Executor of my will

And I appoint the Reverend Thomas Raffles Doctor of Laws Minister of the Gospel the said Joshua Hartley Hargreaves and Thomas Crosthwaite of Liverpool aforesaid Merchant Executors of this my will [interlined and initialed: to each of whom who may act I give One hundred pounds.]

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And I do hereby revoke all former and other wills by me at any time heretofore made

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G. WILL OF JOSHUA HARTLEY HARGREAVES, 1828

My transcription of portions of the will of Joshua Hartley Hargreaves, signed 28 July 1828, proved 16 Dec. 1836, from a digital photocopy of the original supplied to me courtesy of Lindsey Hargreaves in New Zealand, which in turn she made from a photocopy supplied to her courtesy of Sheila Powell in England. Although the will is written without paragraphs, I have introduced them in obvious places (indicated by uppercase letters in the original) for ease of reading:

This is the Last Will and Testament of me Joshua Hartley Hargreaves of Liverpool in the County of Lancaster Brewer

First I direct the payment of my just debts funeral expences and the charges of the probate of this my will, and subject thereto I give to my dear Wife Elizabeth Hargreaves All my Household Furniture plate Linen and china and Household Stock and utensils whatsoever.

I give all my Messuages Lands Tenements and Hereditaments and other my real Estate whatsoever and wheresoever whether freehold copyhold or leasehold or of whatever nature or kind the same may be and all the residue of my personal Estate and Effects whatsoever and wheresoever of or to which I or any person in trust for me am is or shall be seized possessed or entitled or over which I have any power of disposition or appointment unto Thomas Kirkpatrick of Liverpool aforesaid Oil Manufacturer Robert Taylor Woodward of Wavertree near Liverpool aforesaid Gentleman and my said Wife Elizabeth their Heirs Executors Administrators and Assigns absolutely according to the nature of the property for ever or for and during all my Estate and Interest therein

Upon Trust to pay and apply unto my said Wife Elizabeth a clear annuity or yearly sum of Two hundred pounds of lawful English money during her life in case she shall so long continue my widow to be paid quarterly from the day of my decease and a proportionate part up to the day of her death or marriage again which shall first happen

But if she shall marry again I direct that the said Annuity shall thereupon cease and instead thereof I give to her in that event an annuity of one hundred pounds of like lawful money to commence from such marriage again and to be payable by equal quarterly payments in each year during her life and a proportion up to her decease to be for her own separate use and to be paid to her on her own separate receipt and receipts and not to be subject to the debts or control of any Husband and so that the same may not be anticipated or incumbered in any way

And then Upon Trust to pay apply distribute and divide all the rest residue and remainder of my said Estate and Effects (including the principal [end of sheet 1] monies which may be set apart to produce the said respective annuities to my Wife when and after such annuity or annuities shall have ceased) unto and equally amongst such of my children as shall be living at the time of my decease, and the issue then living of such of them as may be then dead (such issue taking equally amongst them, if more than one, the part or share only which their deceased parent would have been entitled to if living) and to their respective heirs executors and administrators share and share alike as tenants in common and not as joint tenants the share of each of the same children or issue being a male to be payable at his age of twenty one years, or being a female at the age of twenty one years or day of marriage which shall first happen

And I direct that my said Trustees and Executors and Executrix and the survivor of them his or her executors administrators and assigns shall apply all or any part of the dividends and interest of the share of each of my said children and issue during his or her minority in and towards his or her maintenance education and advancement in such manner as my said Executors and Executrix and the survivor of them shall think fit

And that so much of the said dividends and interest of the share of each of the same children respectively as shall not be so applied shall from time to time be added to the principal of the same share and accumulate in the nature of compound interest until the principal shall become payable

And whereas I have taken a Lease from the Executors of the late Winter Ainsworth Hargreaves of

the Brewery in Highfield Street for the term of Seven years and I am desirous that the Brewery concern should be carried on by my Executors and Executrix in case the said Lease should not have expired at the time of my decease

Now I do hereby authorize and empower my Executors and Executrix or the survivor of them to carry on and conduct the said Brewery business during the remainder of the said term for the advantage of my general [end of sheet 2] Estate (unless my Executors and Executrix shall think proper sooner to put an end to the same)

And I give to my Executors and Executrix and the survivor of them full power and discretion as to the mode of conducting the same, the extent of business to be carried on, and as to the capital to be employed therein, and I hereby charge and make liable all my property and effects to secure and indemnify them him and her from all liabilities risk loss damage or expences whatsoever and declare that they shall not be in any way personally responsible for any loss in carrying on and conducting the said concern and business nor for any error in judgment or involuntary mistake and that they may fully reimburse and indemnify themselves from any part of my Estate for all damages expences and liabilities incurred

And I hereby authorize and empower them whenever they shall think proper (although the said Lease should not then have expired) to put an end to the said Brewery concern and wind up the same and withdraw my capital therefrom if they shall at any time think it prudent to do so and to sell and dispose of my interest in the said Lease

And I hereby authorize and empower my said Executors and Executrix and the survivor of them to settle and adjust all accounts that shall or may be open and depending between me or my Estate and any person or persons whomsoever and to receive or pay the balance or balances which shall appear to be due and owing

And also if they he or she shall so think fit to compound for any debt or debts and to accept and take such composition for the same or to abandon any debt or claim altogether or not to sue for the same as they he or she shall in every or any such behalf deem adviseable and on receipt of such debts or such composition for the same as aforesaid to give such discharges for the same as shall be proper

And also to submit any such accounts or debts or any disputes or claims relating to my Estate to Arbitration and to act in relation to the same as the Arbitrator or Arbitrators [end of sheet 3] shall award

And generally to manage and get in my debts and all my personal Estate and Effects in such manner as they may think most for the advantage of my Estate

And I authorize them or the survivor of them from time to time to employ any manager or managers, clerk or clerks, Accountant or Accountants to assist them in carrying on the said business or in keeping or making out the accounts relative to my trust property and to allow to each of them such Salary or remuneration as my said Executors and Executrix or the survivor of them shall think fit

And I hereby authorize and empower my said Executors and Executrix and the survivor of them if they he or she shall think fit and proper so to do to sell and absolutely dispose of all or any part of my real or personal Estate and Effects (including my interest in the said Lease if they should see fit to put an end to the said Brewery concern before the determination of the term) and to receive the purchase money and to convey assign and assure the same to the purchaser or purchasers thereof

And I declare that the receipt and receipts of my said Executors and Executrix and the Survivor of them his or her Executors and Administrators shall be a good and valid discharge and discharges to any purchaser or purchasers who shall not be bound to see to the application or be accountable fore the non-application or misapplication thereof

And in the mean time and until such Sale or Sales or disposal shall be made I authorize and empower my said Executors and Executrix and the survivor of them to Lease and set my Houses Lands Tenements and Hereditaments or any of them for such rents and terms as shall to them seem reasonable and proper

And to place out at interest any part of my Estate and Effects on good real or Leasehold securities in

England or in the Government funds or Liverpool Dock or Corporation Bonds or other similar securities and from time to time to alter vary and change any such securities at their his [end of sheet 4] or her discretion

I give devise and bequeath unto the said Thomas Kirkpatrick Robert Taylor Woodward and my said Wife Elizabeth their heirs Executors administrators and assigns all such Freehold and Leasehold Messuages Lands Tenements and hereditaments as are vested in me as a Mortgagee or Trustee in any way according to my right title and interest therein respectively as far as I am interested therein

Upon the Trusts nevertheless and for the ends and purposes fo which the same respectively are held by me

And I direct that my said Executors and Executrix and the Survivor of them his or her Executors and Administrators shall be charged and chargeable only for such monies as they shall respectively actually receive notwithstanding his or her joining in any receipt for the sake of conformity

And that each of them shall be answerable for his or her own acts and defaults only and not for the others or other of them

And that they or any of them shall not be answerable for any misfortune loss or damage which may happen to any part of my Estate and Effects unless the same shall happen through his her or their own wilful default respectively

And also that it shall and may be lawful for them each and every of them their and each and every of their heirs executors and administrators by and out of the monies which shall come to their hands to reimburse themselves himself and herself respectively all reasonable costs charges and expences which they or any of them may expend or be put unto in or about the execution of this my Will

And I appoint the said Thomas Kirkpatrick, Robert Taylor Woodward and my said Wife Elizabeth Executors and Executrix of this my Will requesting each of them to accept of the sum of Fifty pounds

But in case my siad Executors and Executrix should think it prudent to carry on the said Brewery concern then I give to each of them in addition to the said Legacy of Fifty pounds the sum of One hundred pounds a year so long as they shall carry on the [end of sheet 5] said business as a compensation for their trouble in conducting and managing the same; the same Legacies to be paid only in case they shall act

And I revoke all former wills by me at any time heretofore made and do declare this present writing to contain the whole of my last Will and Testament

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H. WILL OF ROBERT HARGREAVES, 1848

This transcription of portions of the will of Robert Hargreaves, signed 24 Nov. 1848, proved 27 Sept. 1854 in Chester and 23 Oct. 1854 in London, was provided to me by Jodie K. Hartshorne Williams. Genealogically it only proves that he had a wife Louisa and two brothers John and William. Since the children were all minors at his death, Louisa got everything, and the children are unnamed:^[1304]

This is the last Will and Testament of me, Robert Hargreaves of Bank House in Accrington in the County of Lancaster, Calico Printer. I bequeath all the furniture, plate, linen, china, books, prints, pictures, wines, liquors, fuel, and other household effects, carriage, carriage horses, harness, corn, hay and straw of which I shall die possessed unto my dear wife Louisa absolutely.

And I give devise and bequeath all my real estate And all the residue of my personal estate unto and to the use of my brothers John Hargreaves and William Hargreaves and to Thomas Groot of Liverpool in the said County, Accountant, their heirs, executors, and administrators Upon the trusts hereinafter declared (that is to say)

As for and concerning my dwellinghouse, outbuildings, gardens and land thereto adjoining in Accrington aforesaid with the appurtenances now in my own occupation Upon trust to permit and suffer my said wife, whilst my widow, to occupy and enjoy the same or to let the same and to receive the rents thereof for her own use. And as to all the residue of my real estate and all my residuary personal estate not withstanding of money (and also on the decease or marriage again of my said dear wife) as to my said dwellinghouse, outbuildings, gardens and land limited in trust for her during widowhood as aforesaid Upon trust that the trustees or trustee for the time being of this my will do and shall sell and absolutely dispose thereof respectively by public auction or private contract or partly by either mode and subject or not to any sort of conditions of sale restrictive of title or evidence of title to be deducted and generally in such manner as they or he shall think best for the most money which in their or his judgement can be obtained for the same with power to buy in and to receive any contracts for sale of the premises or any part thereof and to resell the house by either of the modes aforesaid. And upon further trust that the said trustees or trustee do and shall get in and convert into money and receive all my monies and securities for money and do and shall out of the monies to arise by such sale or sales (other than from the sales of the premises hereinbefore limited In trust for my wife whilst my widow) and to be got in and received as aforesaid appropriate and invest such a sum in any of the parliamentary stocks or public funds of Great Britain or at interest upon Government or real or leasehold charities in England or Wales or on the Bond or Bonds of a body corporate as by the dividends, interest and annual income thereof will produce the clear yearly sum of two thousand pounds and do and shall pay the same dividends, interest and income to my said dear wife whilst my widow. And until such appropriation and investment shall be made do and shall pay to her being my widow an annuity or yearly sum of two thousand pounds free from all deductions by four equal quarterly payments, to be made in advance in every year, the first of such payments to become due immediately on my decease and to be made in ten days after and the second quarterly payment to become due at the end of three months after. And I declare that the provision hereinbefore made for my said wife shall be accepted by her in full satisfaction of her claim to dower or free bench out of any real estate of which I now am or shall hereafter be seized.

And I declare and direct that the trustees or trustee for the time being of this my will shall stand possessed of and interested in all the residue of the monies to arise from the sale and conversion into money of my real estate and residuary personal estates and to be got in and received as aforesaid and of and in the stocks, funds or securities in or upon which the same respectively shall be invested and also

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after the decease or second marriage of my said dear wife of the monies, stocks, funds and securities appropriated to satisfy her said annuity and of the interest, dividends and annual produce thereof respectively In trust for all my children living at my decease or born in due time after who being a son or sons shall be of or shall attain the age of twenty one years and who being a daughter or daughters shall be of or shall attain that age or shall be married or shall marry with the consent of her or their guardian or guardians for the time being if more than one such child to be divided as follows (that is to say) if they shall be all of the same sex then in equal shares, but if there shall be one or more of such sex, then to be divided so that each such son shall have twice as large a share as each such daughter and if there shall be only one such child, then the whole to go in trust for such one child provided always that if any one or more of my children should happen to die in my lifetime leaving issue who shall survive me and shall be of or shall attain the age of twenty one years, then and in every such case such respective Issue shall have and be entitled to and equally among them when more than one of or class the share or respective shares of the said trust monies, stocks, funds and securities to which his, her, or their parent or respective parents would have been entitled on surviving me.

And I further declare it to be my will and mind that four fifth parts of the share to which any daughter of mine shall become entitled of and in the said trust monies, stocks, funds and securities under the trusts hereinbefore contained shall remain vested in and be held by the trustees or trustee for the time being of this my Will as the settled fortune of such daughter upon the trusts following namely Upon trust to pay the income of such settled fortune of such daughter to her during her life upon her own receipts for her own sole and separate use, free from the debts or control of any husband and so that she may not be able during coverture to dispose of or charge any part of such income in the way of anticipation. And from and after the decease of each such daughter, her respective settled fortune and the income thereof shall be held in trust for such one or more of her issue and if more than one in such parts, shares and proportions as such respective daughter shall, whether married or single, by deed or will from time to time or direct or appoint and in default of such direction or appointment or for as the same shall not extend then in trust for the child or children of such respective daughter of mine who being a sons or sons shall attain the age of twenty one years or being a daughter or daughters shall attain that age or marry with the consent of her or their guardian or guardians if more than one such child in equal shares, but if only one, then the whole to be in trust for such one child. But no such child was or whose issue shall take any portion of such respective settled fortune by virtue of any such appointment as aforesaid shall participate in the unappointed share thereof without bringing such appointed portion into hotchpot and accounting for the same accordingly unless my daughter making such appointment shall direct the contrary in writing and if any daughter of mine shall die without leaving any issue who under the trust or power hereinbefore contained shall obtain a vested interest in my same daughters settled fortune, then and in such case, I declare and direct that the settled fortune of any and each such daughter of mine so dying as aforesaid shall be held in trust for such person or persons and for such interests and purposes as my same respective daughters whether married or single shall by her will direct or appoint, and in default of such direction or appointment in trust for such of her kindred living at her decease as if she had died without having been married and intestate would be entitled to her personal estate under the statute of distributions and in the same shares and proportions as that statute specifies or determines.

And I further declare and direct that during the minority of any and such of my children being a son or sons and during the minority and discoveriture of any and such of my children being a daughter or daughters and also after the decease of any and such daughter during the minority of her respective Issue, it shall be lawful for the trustees or trustee for the time being of this my will, but without prejudice to the trust hereinbefore contained for the benefit of my said dear wife, whilst my widow, to pay and apply the whole or any part of the income and accumulations of income of the presumptive share for the time being of said such child and ra??? Issue of mine under the trusts aforesaid for and towards his, her or their respective maintenance and education and to accumulate so much of such income as

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shall not be so applied in argumentation of the principal of the respective share producing such income all or any of such accumulations nevertheless to be applicable as aforesaid.

And I also authorize and empower the said trustees or trustee for the time being to advance and pay (subject and without prejudice as aforesaid) any item not exceeding one thousand pounds out of the presumptive share for the time being of any or such child of mine being a son or sons in the said trust monies and premises for and towards his or their respective preferment or advancement in the world or otherwise for his or their respective benefit. And also after the decease of any or each of my daughters as aforesaid (but without prejudice) to advance and pay any part not exceeding one moiety of the presumptive share for the time being under the trusts aforesaid of any and each son of such respective daughter in her respective settled fortune for and towards his preferment or advancement or otherwise for his respective benefit.

And I direct that the said trustees or trustee for the time being of this my will shall not call in or require payment of such part of my property as shall be embarked in business at the time of my decease in less than seven years hereafter unless they or his in their or hid direction shall deem it necessary but that they or he may waive the same at any time earlier at the option of my surviving partner or partners.

And I declare and direct that it shall be lawful for the trustees or trustee of this my will to postpone to such period as to them or him shall see expedient the sale and conversion of my real and residuary personal estate not consisting of money or securities for money and also the conversion and getting in of any part of my residuary personal estate which shall consist of money or securities for money but such unsold and outstanding estates shall be subject to the trusts hereinbefore contained concerning the monies, stocks, funds and securities aforesaid and the rents and yearly produce thereof be deemed annual income for the purposes of such trusts, but as to the premises hereinbefore limited in trust for my said wife, whilst my widow, subject to such trust.

And I authorize and empower the said trustees or trustee for the time being of this my will from time to time to devise or lease all or any part or parts of my real and leasehold estates subject as last aforesaid in the meantime and the same shall be sold for any term of years not exceeding fourteen years in possession at the best yearly rent which can be reasonably obtained for the same provided nevertheless. And I declare it to be my will that when my said now dwellinghouse and premises hereinbefore limited In trust for my said wife, whilst my widow, as aforesaid shall become saleable, any of my children shall have the option of becoming the purchaser thereof at such sum as shall be agreed upon between such child and the trustees or trustee for the time being of this my will the eldest son to have the first option and if he should decline, then the next eldest son in succession. And if no son should wish to become such purchaser, then my eldest daughter to have such option and if she should decline, the next eldest daughter in succession. But I further declare that no person who shall become a purchaser of the same dwellinghouse and premises under the trusts hereinbefore contained shall be in anywise concerned to enquire whether my children have all refused to purchase the same or whether any of them shall be under any legal disability my intention being that the option hereinbefore limited shall be obligatory personally only on the trustees or trustee for the time being of this my Will and that their or his declaration that none of my children choose to purchase the same shall be for ever after conclusive proof of the fact.

And I also authorize and empower the trustees or trustee for the time being of this my Will to invest all the monies which shall come to their or his hand by virtue of this my Will and shall not be immediately applicable to the trusts hereinbefore contained in or upon any of the stocks, funds, or securities hereinbefore mentioned and to alter, vary and transpose the same stocks, funds, and securities and also the stocks, funds and securities hereinbefore mentioned from time to time for or into any others of the like nature as it may appear desirable.

I devise all my real estate (if any) which at my decease shall be vested in me as trustee or mortgagee to the said John Hargreaves, William Hargreaves and Thomas Groot, their heirs and assigns, subject to the equities affecting the same respectively. And I empower the trustees or trustee for the time being of

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this my Will to give receipts for all monies and effects which shall be paid or delivered to them or him by virtue of this my Will and declare that every such receipt shall exonerate every purchaser and other person from all liability to see to the application or disposition of the money or effects therein mentioned. And I empower the trustees or trustee for the time being of this my Will to compound or allow time or accept security, real or personal, for the payment of debts owing to my estate and to adjust by arbitration or otherwise disputes in relation thereto or in relation to debts or demands against my estate and also in the sale and conversion of my estates and effects to give such redit or they or he shall think proper. And in case the trustees hereinbefore named or any of them shall die in my lifetime or shall on my decease renounce the trusts of my Will or in case any trustee for the time being shall or become unwilling or unable to act, or shall cease to reside in England, then I empower my said wife being my widow or if she shall be dead or married again, then the surviving or continuing trustee or in default of any such, then the retiring trustees or trustee, or the executors or administrators of the deceased trustee as the case may be by writing to nominate a new trustee or new trustees for the purpose of filling such vacancy or vacancies and such new trustee or trustees shall have the same powers in all respects as the trustees hereby appointed. And I direct that the respective trustees for the time being of this my Will shall be responsible only for so such money as shall come to their own respective hands and that they shall not be answerable for involuntary losses or for the acts, deeds, or defaults of each other. And I expressly and specifically declare that any trustees or trustee who shall pay over to his co-trustees or co-trustee or shall, do, and concur in any act enabling them or him to receive any monies with a view to the same being applied to the general purposes for my Will or for any definite or prescribed purpose authorized by my Will shall not be obliged to see to the due application thereof, nor shall such trustees or trustee be subsequently considered responsible by an express motive or imitation of the actual misapplication of the same monies, nevertheless I declare that this clause shall not be in any manner be construed to restrict the power of any trustee to require from his co-trustees or co-trustee an amount of the application of monies in their or his hands or to insist on their or his replenishing any sum or sums which such trustees or trustee may have misapplied my sole intention being to relive my trustees from the operation of the rule of equity which renders one trustee liable to make good monies misapplied by his co-trustee being convinced that this exemption from legal responsibility will not induce them to abate their friendly vigilance.

And I empower my trustees to retain and allow to each other the costs and expenses incurred in the execution of the trusts or in relation thereto.

And I appoint my said dear wife and my trustees hereinbefore named *Executrix and Executors* of this my Will.

And I appoint my said dear wife, whilst my widow, sole Guardian of such of my children as shall be in minority. And if she should marry again before they shall all have attained the age of twenty one years, then immediately on her marriage again, I declare and direct that the trustees or trustee for the time being of this my Will shall become and be and continue the Guardians and Guardian of such of my children as shall be in minority.

In Witness whereof, I have to the foot or end of this my last Will and Testament contained in this and the six preceding sheets of paper (each such preceding sheet being identified by my signature at the bottom) signed my name this twenty fourth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty eight.

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I. ONERIRI LEASE TO JOSEPH HARGREAVES, 1866

My transcription of the English part of the lease to Joseph Hargreaves of 8,609 acres for 21 years, signed 16 Aug. 1866 by Joseph and a Maori man, Wiremu Tipene Hawato, from a digital photocopy of the original supplied to me courtesy of Lindsey Hargreaves in New Zealand. For the Maori portion and interpreter's affidavit see Figure 23:

This Deed made the Sixteenth day of August in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty six Between Wiremu Tipene Hawato of Kaipara in the Province of Auckland an Aboriginal Native of the one part and Joseph Hargreaves of Auckland in the Province aforesaid Gentleman of the other part witnesseth that the said Wiremu Tipene Hawato Doth hereby demise and lease unto the said Joseph Hargreaves All that piece of Land containing by admeasurement Eight thousand six hundred and nine acres more or less situate between the Otamatea and the Oruawharo Rivers in the District of Kaipara and known by the name Puketotara being a peninsula Bounded on the north by the Otamatea River and the Whakaki branch of the Otamatea River and an isthmus from Te Reaki on the Whakaki branch to Te Uaki on the Oruawharo River Two thousand eight hundred and five links Bounded on the East by the Oruawharo River on the South and West by the Oruawharo River and the Wairoa River And also all those Islands immediately adjacent to the said peninsula known by the names and containing the quantities following respectively that is to say Nga motu Two acres one rood and four perches Moturoa Two acres three roods and twenty four perches Motuouhi¹³⁰⁵ One acre and twenty two perches and Ruatan[uw?]ha Two acres and five perches which said piece of land and islands are numbered 38 (in red) and are more particularly delineated on the plan drawn at the foot hereof and therein colored red Together with all the rights and appurtenances thereunto belonging To hold the same unto the said Joseph Hargreaves his executors administrators and assigns for the term of Twenty one years from the first day of August one thousand eight hundred and sixty six Yielding and paying therefor unto the said Wiremu Tipene Hawato his heirs or assigns the sum of Two hundred pounds for the first year of the said term and the sum of Three hundred pounds yearly for each and every year during the remaining portion of the said term by yearly payments on the first day of August in every year the first of such payments having been made on the sixteenth day of August 1866 And it is hereby expressly declared and agreed by and between the said parties hereto that the said Joseph Hargreaves his executors administrators and assigns shall have full right and liberty to fence in break up and cultivate or otherwise improve all or any portion of the land hereby demised And also to cut any Timber standing or growing upon the said land which may be required for firewood fencing or any purpose whereby the premises hereby demised may be improved but not for purposes of sale or disposal to any other person or persons In witness whereof the abovenamed parties have hereunto subscribed their Names the day and year above written

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J. WILL OF JONATHAN HARGREAVES, 1861, AND CODICIL, 1862

This transcription of the will of Jonathan Hargreaves, signed 24 Jan. 1861, with codicil signed 1 Apr. 1862, proved 19 June 1863 in London, was provided to me by Jodie K. Hartshorne Williams.^[1306]

This is the last Will and Testament of me, Jonathan Hargreaves of Cuffnells in the County of Southampton, Esquire. In the first place, I direct that all my just debts and funeral and testamentary expenses be fully paid and satisfied with all convenient speed after my decease. I give to my dear Wife a legacy or sum of Five hundred pounds sterling to be paid to her immediately after my decease. And I give to my said dear Wife during her lifetime, if she shall so long continue my Widow, the use and enjoyment of the Mansion or dwellinghouse at Cuffnells aforesaid, wherein I now reside with the farm lands, gardens, outbuildings and Appurtenances thereto belonging commonly called or known as the "Cuffnells Estate", free from the payment of all rates and taxes to be chargeable thereon (which I direct shall be paid by my Trustees or Trustee for the time being from and out of my general personal estate as the same shall become due). And I also give to my dear Wife during the like period, the use and enjoyment of all my household furniture, plate, linen, china, glass, pictures, prints, books, wines, horses, carriages, and all other effects which at the time of my decease shall be in or about my said Mansion or dwellinghouse, outbuildings, lands and premises, she keeping the buildings therein in repair to the satisfaction of the trustees or trustee for the time being of or acting under this my Will. And I further give to my said dear wife during the term of her natural life, if she shall so long continue my Widow and remain unmarried, such an annuity or yearly sum as together with and including the provision made for her under our marriage Settlement will amount to the clear yearly sum of One thousand and five hundred pounds sterling. And I direct that the said additional annuity or yearly sum shall be paid to my said Wife for her own separate use and benefit by equal quarterly payments from the day of my death and without any deductions or abatement whatsoever (except for or on account of the income or property tax). And I do hereby subject, charge, and make liable all my real and personal estates (except the said Cuffnells Estate) to and with the raising and payment of the same additional annuity as aforesaid) during the Widowhood of my said Wife. And in case of nonpayment thereof or of any part thereof, I give her such of the like powers and remedies for the recovery thereof by duty and distress upon the said real estates or any part thereof as Landlords have by Law for the Recovery of rents in arrear upon leases or common demised. And as to and concerning my said mansion or dwellinghouse called Cuffnells with the Farm, lands, grounds, gardens, outbuildings and appurtenances thereto belonging and all other the premises called or known as "The Cuffnells Estate" (subject to the free use and enjoyment thereof by my said Wife during her Widowhood as aforesaid), I give, devise, and appoint the same mansion or dwellinghouse, farm, lands, grounds, gardens, outbuildings and other hereditaments and premises with the appurtenances unto and to the use of Thomas Ashton of Aston Rectory in the County of Derby, Esquire; Thomas Entwisle of Hinton Admiral in the County of Hampshire, Esquire; and the Reverend Edward Harland of Colwich Vicarage in the County of Stafford, Clerk; their heirs and assigns forever. But upon the trusts and for the intents and purposes hereinafter expressed and declared concerning the same (that is to say) Upon trust from and after the decease or marrying again of my said Wife (whichever event shall first happen) to permit and suffer my only son Reginald Hargreaves, if he shall then have attained the age of twenty five years, to enter into, have, hold, occupy, possess and enjoy my said mansion or dwellinghouse, farms, lands, grounds and other hereditaments and Premises called Cuffnells and to receive and take the rents, issues, and profits thereof for his own use and benefit during the term of his natural life, but if my said son shall be under the age of twenty five

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years at the time of the decease or marrying again of my said Wife, then I direct my said Trustees or Trustee to receive and take the rents, issues, and profits of my said Cuffnells Estate and to pay and apply the same or a competent part thereof for or towards the maintenance and education or advancement in life of my said son in the meantime and until he shall attain the full age of twenty five years and to accumulate the surplus thereof (if any) for his use and benefit on attaining that age, when it is my Will and desire that he, my said son, shall be put into possession of my Cuffnells estate and thereforth hold and enjoy the same for his own use and benefit during the term of his natural life and from and after the decease of my said son, then Upon trust that they, my said trustees or trustee, for the time being do and shall stand seized of my said estate called Cuffnells with the appurtenances, In trust for the second or such other of the sons of him, my said son Reginald Hargreaves, and the heirs of such second or other Son as he, my said son, shall in and by his Will or any Codicil thereto to be by him legally executed, direct or appoint. And in default thereof and subject thereto, In trust for the first and every other son of my said son Reginald Hargreaves, severally and possessively, according to seniority of age and the heirs of the body and respective bodies of such son and sons lawfully issuing so that every elder of such sons and the heirs of his body may always take before the younger of such sons and the heirs of his body issuing. And in default of such issue, In trust for my daughter, Fanny Helena Hargreaves, during the term or her natural life for her own sole separate and inalienable use independent of any husband with whom she may intermarry and so as not to be subject to his control, debts or engagements or to any charges or encumbrance by her by way of anticipation or otherwise. And after her decease, In trust for the first and every other son of her my said Daughter, Fanny Helena Hargreaves, severally and successively according to seniority of age and the heirs of the body and respective bodies of such son and sons lawfully issuing so that every elder of such sons and the heirs of his body may always take before the younger of the same sons and the heirs of his body issuing. And for default of such issue, In trust for my daughter, Emma Caroline Hargreaves, during the term of her natural life for her like sole, separate and inalienable use not independent of any husband and her from anticipation, charge or encumbrance by her. And after her decease, In trust for the first and every other son of her, my said daughter Emma Caroline Hargreaves, severally and successively according to seniority of age and the heirs of the body and respective bodies of such last mentioned son and sons lawfully issuing So that every elder of such sons and the heirs of his body may always take before the younger of the same sons and the heirs of his body issuing. And in default of such issue of all my said three children as aforesaid, Then I direct my said trustees or trustee for the time being to stand seized of the same estate called Cuffnells, In trust for such person or persons for such estate or estates, interest or interests, and with under or subject to such powers, provisos, limitations, declarations or directions and generally in such manner and for such purposes as the survivor or longest liver of them, my three children, shall at any time after the decease of the others of them by any deed or instrument in writing to be by such survivor sealed and delivered in the presence of and attested by two or more reliable Witnesses or by his or her last Will and Testament in Writing or any Codicil thereto legally executed and attested, direct or appoint, give, devise or dispose of the same or any part thereof. And in default thereof and subject thereto (if partial or incomplete), In trust for the survivor or longest liver of them, my said three children, and his or her, heirs and assigns forever provided always and I do hereby request and direct that if either of my said daughters, Fanny Helena and Emma Caroline, shall by virtue of or under this my Will come into possession of my said estate called Cuffnells or be entitled to the rents and profits thereof and shall be then married to or shall afterwards marry with any person or persons who shall not previously be or have assumed the said the name of "Hargreaves", Then such of my said daughters who shall so come into possession of my said Cuffnells Estate or be entitled to the rents and profits thereof and her husband shall with all convenient speed afterwards assume and take upon herself and himself and be called by the surname of "Hargreaves" in addition to and after any other surname or surnames which he, she or they may have previously used and also do and shall with all proper

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and reasonable expedition apply for and obtain the Royal Sign Manual or some other sufficient license, power, or authority for enabling or empowering him, her or them to use and continue the said Surname of "Hargreaves" in manner aforesaid and also do and shall at all times afterwards use and continue to use and adopt the said Surname of "Hargreaves" in all Deeds, letters and writings and upon all other occasions. And I give to every daughter of mine (now born and hereafter to be born) who shall be living at the time of my decease or born in due time afterwards a portion or sum of Twelve thousand pounds sterling to carry interest after the rate of four pounds per return per annum from the day of my death and to be raised and paid from and out of my estate, real or personal or both (except the Cuffnells Estate), as hereinafter mentioned and provided for. And I will and direct that each daughter of mine upon attaining her age of twenty five years (if not previously married) shall be entitled to have receive and take the interest and annual income of her portion or fortune for her own use and benefit. And upon the respective marriages of each of my daughters (whether before or after attaining the age of twenty five years), It is my Will and mind and I particularly request and direct that her said portion or fortune under this my Will may be settled and secured so and in such manner as that the interest and annual income thereof may be payable and paid into the proper hands of each such daughter for the term of her natural life for her own sole separate and inalienable use and benefit, independent of any husband and free from any anticipation during coverture and so that after her decease, the principal or Capital may go, remain, and be for the benefit of all and every the child and children of such daughter respectively who shall attain the age of twenty one years or be previously married in equal share and proportions, if more than one, and if but one then to such one only with the usual powers and provisions for the maintenance and education during the minority of such child or children and so and in such manner as that the husbands of such of my Daughters respectively who shall depart this life without leaving a child who shall live to attain the age of twenty one years or be previously married shall be entitled to receive the interest and annual income of the portions of such of my daughters during their natural lives respectively and subject thereto and as hereinbefore is directed to be provided so and in such manner that each of my daughters notwithstanding any coverture she may be under, shall in the event of her leaving no such child as aforesaid have an absolute power of appointment and disposition by said Deed, Will or Codicil or other instrument in the nature of a Deed, Will or Codicil or partly by one and partly by the other over the whole of the portion provided for her by this my Will and as to such portion or part or share thereof over which she shall neglect to exercise such power of appointment or disposition, then so and in such manner as that such daughters portion or the part or share whereof no such appointment or disposition shall be made subject as aforesaid go to and be distributed amongst the next of kin of such Daughter as if she had died single and unmarried, independent and exclusion of any husband she may leave her surviving, his executors, administrators or assigns such Settlement respectively to contain all other usual and necessary powers and provisions. And as to the portion or portions of such of my daughters as shall depart this life without having been married, It is my Will and I do direct that the trustees or trustee for the time being under this my Will shall, after the decease of such of my Daughters as shall so die unmarried stand possessed of the portion or respective portions of such daughters, Upon trust to pay, apply, transfer and dispose of the same and the interest and annual income thereof unto or In trust for such person and persons and in such parts, shares and proportions and for such interests and purposes and with, under, and subject to such powers, restrictions and declarations and in such manner and form as such of my Daughters as shall so die without having been married by any deed or deeds, instrument or instruments in writing with or without power of revocation and new appointment to be sealed and delivered by them respectively in the presence of and to be attested by two or more credible Witnesses or by their respective last Wills and Testaments in Writing or any Writing of appointment purporting to be or in the nature of a Will or any Codicil thereto to be only signed and acknowledged by them respectively shall direct or appoint of or concerning the respective portions of my said Daughters who shall so die without hav-

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ing been married or the interest and annual interest thereafter any part or share thereof. And for want of such direction or appointment or as to such part or share whereof no such direction or appointment shall be made my Will is that the trustees or trustee for the time being under this my Will shall stand possessed of the respective portions of such of my daughters as shall die without having been married or such part or share thereof, whereof no such direction or appointment shall be made, In trust for the next of kin of my Daughters so dying without having been married as aforesaid according to the Statute of Distributions in such case made and provided and shall and do, pay, apply, transfer, and dispose of the same according by Provided always and I do hereby declare and direct that until each of my daughters shall attain the age of twenty five years or be previously married, the interest and annual proceeds or income of her said portion or fortune under this my Will shall from time to time be paid by the trustees or trustee for the time being of or acting under this my will to my said dear Wife as long as she shall continue my Widow so that the whole or so such thereof as she shall think proper may be applied by her for or towards the maintenance, education or advancement in life of such daughter in such way and in and or as she, my said Wife, shall during such Widowhood, in her direction think proper, but in case of the marriage again of my said Wife before each of my daughters shall attain the age of twenty five years or be married, the interest and annual proceeds or income of her said portion or fortune under this my Will shall from time to time be paid, applied, and disposed of by the trustees or trustee for the time being of or acting under this my Will for or towards her maintenance, education and advancement in life in such way and manner as the said trustees or trustee for the time being shall in their or his direction think proper and in case there shall be any surplus of such interest or annual proceeds or income which shall not be applied for any of those purposes in manner aforesaid, Then such surplus shall be added to the capital of the portion or fortune or respective portions or fortunes producing the same and shall be deemed part thereof and accumulate and go in augmentation of the same. And I give, devise, appoint and bequeath all the rest and residue of my real estate, whatsoever and wheresoever (save and except my Cuffnells estate herein before disposed of) and also all and singular my monies, stocks, funds and securities for money and all other personal estate, property and effects whatsoever which shall belong to me at my decease (subject to the right of my said Wife, to use and occupy during her Widowhood, my furniture and other effects at Cuffnells hereinbefore bequeathed or referred to), Unto and to the use of the said Thomas Ashton, Thomas Entwisle, and Edward Harland, their heirs, executors, administrators and assigns according to the different natures and qualities thereof respectively Upon the trusts and to and for the ends, intents, and purposes and with under and subject to the powers, provisos, declarations and directions hereinafter expressed, declared and contained of and concerning the same (that is to say) Upon trust that they, my said trustees or trustee or the survivors or survivor of them or the heirs, executors, administrators or assigns of such survivor, do and shall with the consent of my said Wife during her Widowhood and afterwards at their or his discretion make, sale, and dispose of all or any part of my said real estates, except the "Cuffnells estste", either by Public Auction or Private contract and either altogether or in lots or parcels at such time or times and subject to such stipulations or conditions relative to the Title or evidence of the title or to the mode of payment of the purchase money or to any other matter connected therewith as my said trustees or trustee shall judge expedient or their or his Counsel shall advise with power to five reserved biddings and buy in any lot or lots at any auction and to rescind and vary any contract for sale without being liable for any contractual loss and also to execute such instruments and assurances as shall be requested for effecting such sale of my said real estates. And also upon trust with all convenient speed after my decease, to get in, sell, and convert into money all such parts of my residuary personal estate (Subject as aforesaid) as shall not consist of money or securities for money and receive and recover all sums of money and debts which at my decease, shall be due and owing to me or my estate but nevertheless I give to my said Trustees or Trustee, for the time being, discretionary powers to postpone for such period as to them or his shall seem expedient, the sale of all or any part of my said real estate and the

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getting in of my residuary personal estate consisting of stocks, funds or securities for money of any description and I declare that from the time of my decease the unsold real estate and outstanding personal estate shall be subject to the trusts herein declared concerning the net produce of the said real and personal estates and the rents, interest and annual produce thereof shall be deemed annual income for the purposes of such trusts. And upon further trust that they, my said trustees or trustee, do and shall with and out of the monies to arise from the sale of my said real and personal estates and the rents, interest and annual produce thereof respectively in the meantime pay and satisfy all my just debts and funeral and testamentary expenses. And in the next phase pay to my said dear Wife during her Widowhood, the portion of annuity hereinbefore given or provided for her as aforesaid when and as the same shall become due or payable and also pay and satisfy the interest from time to time to arise or grow due and payable for or in respect of the portions or fortunes of my said daughters respectively until the same shall become due and payable as aforesaid. And then do and shall lay out and invest the residue or surplus of the monies to arise from such sale and conversion of all or any part of my said real or personal estate as aforesaid in their or his names or name in or upon some of the public stocks or funds or on real securities in England or Wales or not elsewhere with liberty to change and vary the same stocks, funds and securities or any of them from time to time for others of the same or like nature at the discretion of my said trustees or trustee for the time being. And I authorize and empower my said trustees or trustee to appropriate and set apart any of such stocks, funds, or securities as aforesaid as or for the portions or fortunes of my said daughters or any of them and subject and without prejudice to the trusts and directions aforesaid and also subject and charged with the raising and payment of the principal or capital of the portions or fortunes of my said daughters as and when the same or any part thereof respectively shall become due or payable under this my Will. I direct my said trustees or trustee for the time being to stand and be seized and possessed of my said real and personal estates or so such thereof respectively as shall then remain unsold or unconverted and also of the net proceeds and produce thereof. And the stocks, funds, and securities whereon the same or any part thereof may be then invested, In trust for and for the use and benefit of all and every my sons who shall be living at the time of my decease or born in due time afterwards and shall live to attain the age of twenty five years to be divided between them in equal shares and proportions (if more than one) as tenants in common and their respective heirs, executors, administrators and assigns. And if I shall have but one son who shall attain twenty five, then the whole to be conveyed, paid, assigned and made over unto and for the use and benefit of such only Son on his attaining the said age of twenty five years provided always and I do hereby declare and direct that until each of my sons shall attain the age of twenty five years, the interest and annual proceeds or income of his said portion or fortune under this my Will shall and may from time to time be paid by the trustees or trustee for the time being of or acting under this my Will to my said dear Wife so long as she shall continue my Widow, the whole or so such thereof as she should think proper to be applied by her for or towards the maintenance, education, or advancement in life of such sons in such way and manner as she, my said Wife, shall during such Widowhood in her direction think proper, but in case of the marrying again of my said Wife before each of my sons shall attain the age of twenty five years, the interest and annual proceeds or income of his said portion or fortune under this my Will shall and may from time to time be paid, applied and disposed of by the trustees or trustee for the time being of or acting under this my Will for or towards his maintenance, education and advancement in life in such way and manner as the said trustees or trustee for the time being shall in their or his discretion think proper and in case there shall be any surplus of such interest or annual proceeds or income which shall not be applied for any of those purposes in, under, or aforesaid, Then such surplus shall be added to the Capital of the portion or fortune or respective portions or fortunes producing the same and shall be deemed part thereof and accumulate and go in augmentation of the same. But in case I shall leave no son living at the time of my decease or born alive afterwards or having any such son or sons he or they shall respectively die before attaining the age of

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twenty five years, Then I direct that my said trustees or trustee for the time being do and shall stand and be seized and possessed of my said residuary real and personal estates or so much thereof respectively as shall then remain unsold or unconverted and also of the net proceeds or produce thereof and the stocks, funds, and securities whereon the same or any part thereof may be then invested and the full benefit and advantage of the same (Subject and without prejudice to the trusts and directions hereinbefore contained) In trust for the benefit of all and every my Daughters who shall be living at the time of my decease or born in due time afterwards and to be settled in case of marriage and subject to powers of disposition and appointment in case my said daughters or any of them shall remain single in like manner in every respect as I have hereinbefore directed with reference to the respective portions or fortunes hereinbefore provided for them. And in case I shall have but one such daughter, then In trust for the benefit of such only Daughter and to settle the same in case of marriage or hold the same subject to her disposition and appointment as hereinbefore is provided with reference to the original portion of Twelve thousand pounds and in default thereof for her next of kin provided always and I do hereby declare and direct that until any sale or sales shall be made by my said trustees or trustee for the time being of my said residuary real estate under or by virtue or for the purposes of this my Will it shall and maybe lawful to and for them, my said trustees or trustee, for the time being from time to time with the consent in Writing of my said Wife during her Widowhood and afterwards at their or his own discretion to devise and lease all or any part of my said real estate (except the Cuffnells estate aforesaid) to any person or persons for any term or number of years not exceeding ninety nine years in possession and not in reversion so as there be reserved in every such lease, the best and most improved yearly rent that can be reasonably had or gotten for the same without taking any fine or premium and so as there be contained in such devises or leases, clauses of reentry for the nonpayment of the rent or rents to be thereby reserved by the space of twenty days next over or after the same shall become due and payable and so that the lessee or lessees execute a counterpart or counterparts of such lease or leases and so that no lessee to whom such lease shall be made be by any clause or words therein contained authorized to commit waste or exempted from punishment for committing waste. And I hereby declare that the receipt and receipts of my said trustees or trustee for the time being for any sum or sums of money to arise from the sale or sales and conversion hereinbefore directed and authorized to be made or for any other monies to be received by them or him under the trusts or for the purposes of this my Will shall be a good and sufficient discharge or good and sufficient discharges to any purchaser or purchasers or other person or persons paying the same respectively and that such person or persons, his, her or their heirs, executors, administrators or assigns respectively shall not alter payment of such sum or sums of money and obtaining such receipt or receipts for the same as aforesaid be bound or concerned to see or inquire as to the application thereof nor be in anywise answerable or accountable for any loss, misapplication or nonapplication thereof or any part thereof nor shall any person or persons be obliged or at liberty to see or inquire as to the propriety or expediency of making any such sale or sales as aforesaid or otherwise in relation thereto. And I devise unto and to the use of the said Thomas Ashton, Thomas Entwisle and Edward Harland, their heirs and assigns all the real estate of which I am or may be at the time of my decease a Trustee in order to be disposed of according to the trusts upon which I hold the same. And I also devise to them all the real estate of which I am or may be mortgaged so as to be disposed of (but subject to the equity of redemption respectively subsisting thereon) according to the disposition hereinbefore made of my personal estate and effects. I nominate and appoint my said Wife sole Guardian of my children during their minority and I appoint the said Thomas Ashton, Thomas Entwisle and Edward Harland, Executors, of this my Will provided always and I do hereby further declare and direct that in case the said Thomas Ashton, Thomas Entwisle and Edward Harland or any or either of them or any future trustee or trustees to be nominated and appointed as hereinafter mentioned shall happen to be or be desirous to be discharged from or shall neglect or refuse or become incapable to act in the trusts of this my Will at any time or times before the same trusts shall be fully performed or

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otherwise determined, Then and in every such case it shall and may be lawful for the survivors or survivor or others or other of them, the said Thomas Ashton, Thomas Entwisle and Edward Harland or the heirs, executors, administrators of such survivor, or the surviving or continuing trustee for the time being to nominate and appoint any other person or persons to be a trustee or trustees for the purposes of this my Will in the places and stands or place and stand of the said trustees hereby appointed or such of them or such future trustee or trustees as shall so happen to die or be desirous to be discharged from or neglect or refuse or become incapable to act in the trusts aforesaid. And I direct that upon every such nomination or appointment the trustee or trustees for the time being or if all the trustees shall be then dead, the heirs, executors or administrators of the surviving trustee shall convey, assign, transfer, and make over the said trust estates and premises and all trust monies, stocks, funds, and securities which shall be then vested in him or them under or by virtue or for the purposes of this my Will, So and in such way and manner as that the same may be effectually vested in or in the joint names of the surviving or continuing trustee or trustees and such new trustee or trustees or in the names of such new trustees only (as the case may happen). But nevertheless upon the same trusts and to and for the same and intents and purposes as are hereinbefore expressed and declared of and concerning the same or to, for, or upon such of those trusts, intents and purposes as shall be then subsisting or capable of taking effect which person or persons so to be appointed a trustee or trustees as aforesaid shall and may therefore set in the management and execution of the trusts of this my Will or such of them as shall be then subsisting or capable of taking effect as fully and effectually in all respects and with the like indemnification powers and authorities as he or they might have done in case he or they had been originally in and by this my Will nominated and appointed a trustee or trustees for the purposes aforesaid. And also that they, the said several trustees and such of them, their and such of them of their heirs, executors and administrators shall and may by and out of the monies which shall come to their respective hands by virtue of the trusts aforesaid retain to and reimburse himself and themselves and allow to each other all costs, charges and expenses whatsoever which they or any of them shall or may respectively sustain expend, disburse, be at, or put unto in or about the execution of the trusts hereby in them reposed or any matter or being anywise relating thereto. In Witness whereof, I have hereunto signed my name at the foot or end hereof and acknowledged the same to be my last Will and Testament in the presence of the two credible persons whose names are entered to be hereunto subscribed as Witnesses to such my signing and acknowledgment this twenty fourth day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty one.

Whereas by my said Will I have nominated and appointed Thomas Ashton to be one of the Trustees and Executors thereof and whereas I am desirous of revoking such nomination and appointment and of substituting Anna Maria Hargreaves of Cuffnells to be one of the Trustees and Executors of my said Will in lieu of the said Thomas Ashton. Now therefore I do hereby revoke, cancel, and make void all devises and bequests to the said Thomas Ashton in my said Will contained as one of the Trustees thereof and the appointment of the said Thomas Ashton one of the executors thereof. And in his place I do

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nominate, substitute, and appoint the said Anna Maria Hargreaves as a Trustee and *Executor* of my said Will and do give, devise and bequeath to her conjointly with the other trustees therein named all and singular the trust estate and premises therein devised and bequeathed to such trustees upon the several trusts and with all the powers therein contained relating to the said trust estate and premises as if the name of the said Anna Maria Hargreaves had been therein originally inserted instead of the name of the said Thomas Ashton. This transcription of portions of the will of Anna Maria (Harland) Hargreaves, signed 14 Nov. 1871, proved 6 Feb. 1873 in London, was provided to me by Jodie K. Hartshorne Williams.^[1307]

This is the last Will and Testament of me, Anna Maria Hargreaves of Cuffnells in the County of Southampton, widow of Jonathan Hargreaves, late of the same place, Esquire, deceased. I wish to be buried in the same vault with my late dear excellent husband. I leave my Blessing to my dear children and may God bless and keep them. I ask them to hold in loving remembrance the memory of their excellent father who was the purest and most unselfish and the most upright man I ever knew and to remember his beautiful life and character as their best inheritance. And I appoint my sister, Lady Gervis, guardian of my son, Reginald Gervis Hargreaves, during his minority. And I appoint my brother, John Thomas Harland of Bellamour Lodge in the County of Stafford, Esquire; Thomas Entwisle of Wolhayes in the County of Hants, Esquire; and Henry Edmund Watson of Shirecliff Hall in the County of York, Esquire; Trustees and Executors of this my Will. I give to my said dear son the portrait of himself by Ebbir and the interior views of the Library at Oak Hill by Lassiter, also my sapphire and diamond ring. To my dear daughter Fanny Helena, the portrait in chalk of herself by Frederick Taylor, my turquoise bracelet, large and small turquoise rings, blue enamel and carbuncle bracelet, ruby ring, gold chain with diamond and enamel locket, coral bracelet Roman necklace and earrings, gold brooch, and my gold and enamel Garde ville and To my dear daughter, Emma Caroline, the miniatures taken of herself by Gaston and the chalk by Ebbir, her portrait by Graves and my emerald earrings, diamond and carbuncle locket and bracelet, large and small diamond rings, diamond and opal ring, portr box, Roman Bulla watch, chain and appendages and my gold bracelet. I devise unto my said son, Reginald Gervis Hargreaves, in fee simple, all the real estate whatsoever and wheresoever of or to which I shall be seized or entitled at the time of my decease. But in case my said son shall die in my lifetime or shall survive me but die under the age of twenty one years, I devise the same unto my said daughter, Emma Caroline Hargreaves, in fee simple. I bequeath unto my said dear daughter, Fanny Helena, the legacy or sum of three hundred pounds sterling to be paid to her as conveniently may be after my decease. I also bequeath to her for her separate inalienable use without power of anticipation, an annuity of one hundred pounds to be paid to her by half yearly payments on the twenty fifth day of March and the twenty ninth day of September in each year during her life, the first of such half yearly payments to be made on each of the said half yearly days as shall happen next after my decease. But in case my said daughter shall at anytime become entitled to the possession or enjoyment of the Cuffnells Estate devised by the Will of my said late husband, I direct that the said annuity shall immediately thereupon cease and be no longer payable. I bequeath unto my said dear daughter, Emma Caroline, all my jewellery not specifically bequeathed, wearing apparel, books, pictures, china and any other articles of furniture or ornament which may belong to me at the time of my decease. I appoint and bequeath all the rest, *residue*, and remainder of the Personal Estate and Effects whatsoever of or to which I am now or at the time of my decease shall be seized, possessed or entitled or have any power of appointment or testamentary disposition over including the principal sum of ten thousand pounds and all other the monies and premises comprised in or affected by or subject to the trusts of the settlement made on the marriage of my husband and myself unto my said son, Reginald Gervis Hargreaves, absolutely, but in case he shall die in my lifetime or shall survive me but be under the age of twenty one years, I appoint and bequeath the same and every part thereof unto my said daughter, Emma Caroline Hargreaves, absolutely. And I declare that the devises and bequests made by this my Will to or in favor of such of my said daughters shall

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be for her separate use and with respect to the said annuity hereinbefore bequeathed to my daughter Fanny Helena, I declare that the same shall be a charge upon my real and residuary personal estate, but I request my said son, if he shall attain the age of twenty one years, to secure the payment of the said annuity by giving to her or to trustees for her a bond for the payment thereof and from the time of such bond being given, I declare that my residuary personal estate shall be discharged from the payment thereof. In Witness whereof, I have hereunder set my hand this fourteenth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy one.

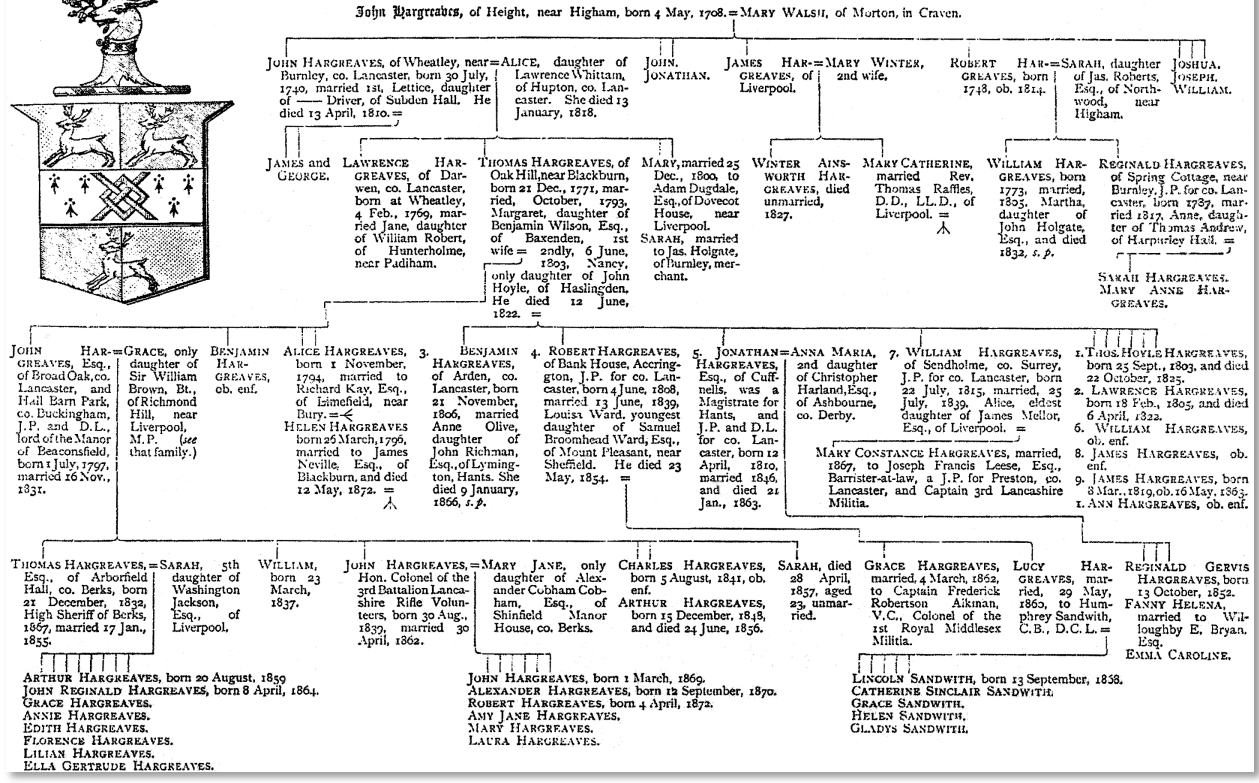
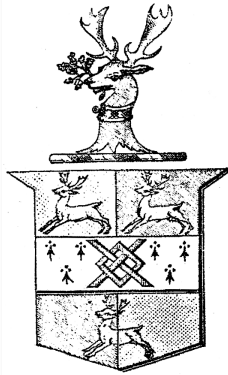


Figure 2. A Burke's Hargreaves pedigree chart

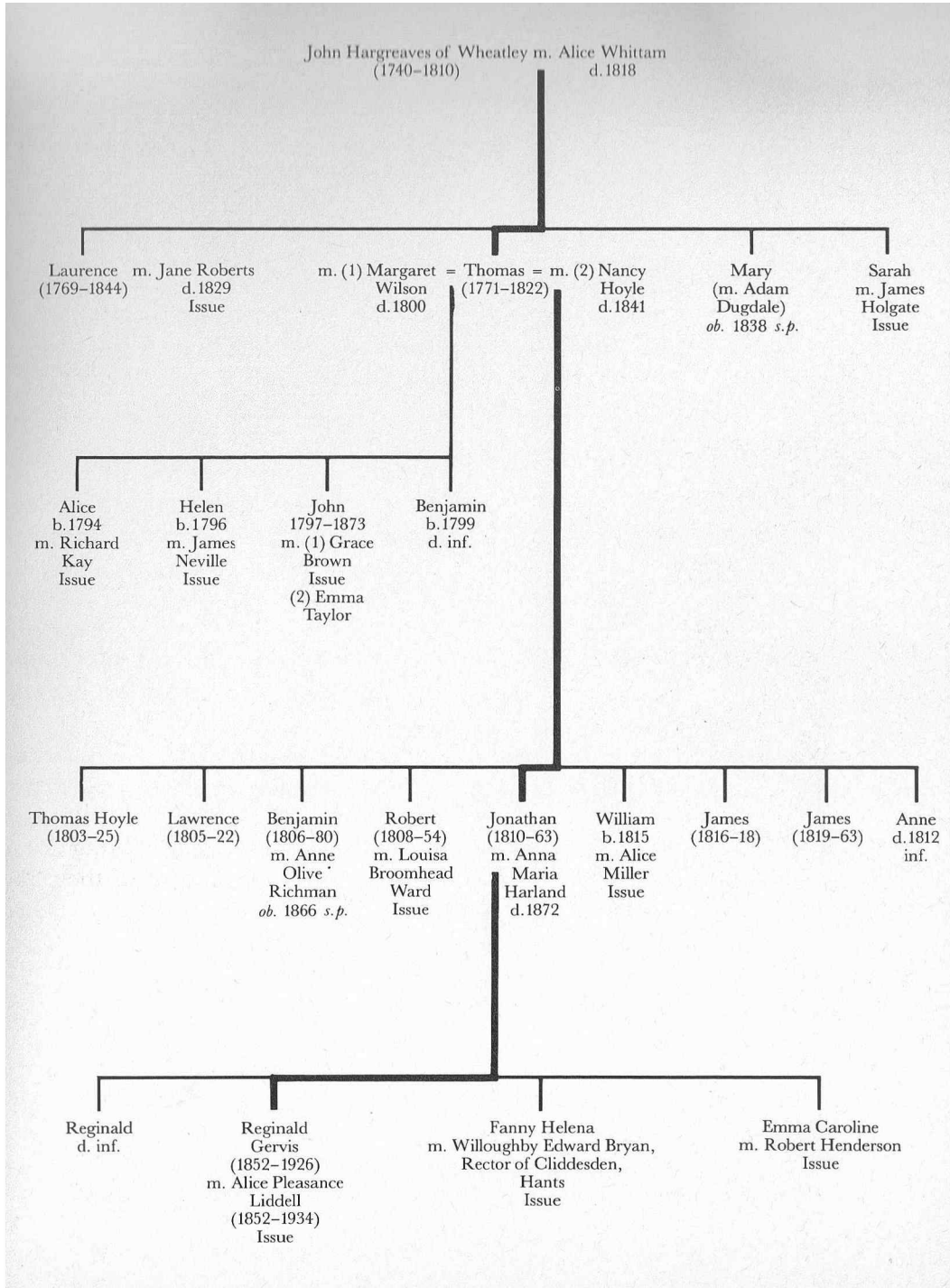


Figure 5. The Strome diagram, contributed by Brian¹² Strome

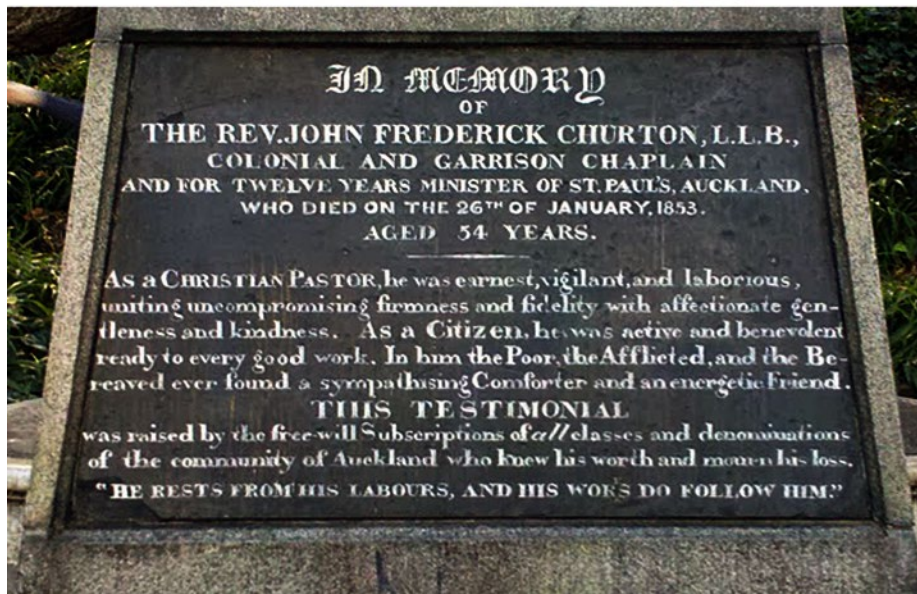


Figure 16. Plaques for Gov. Hobson and Rev. Churton on St. Paul's memorial, Emily Place, Princes St., Auckland

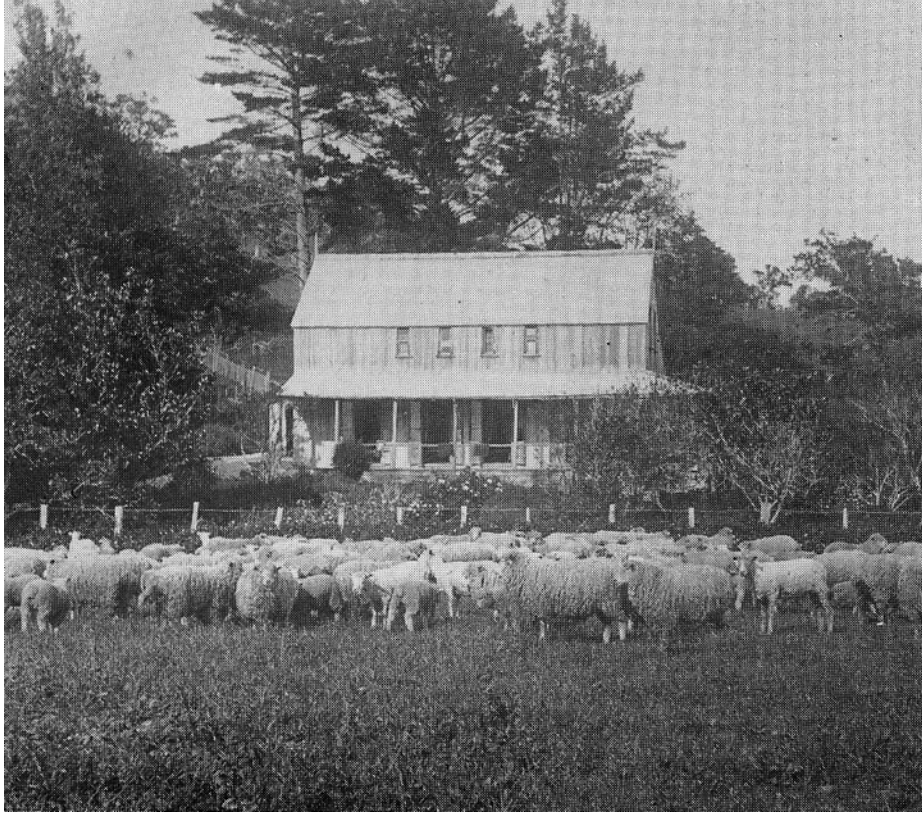


Figure 17. Joseph⁸ Hargreaves homestead, built 1865, on Hargreaves Bay or Basin, Oneriri Peninsula, New Zealand

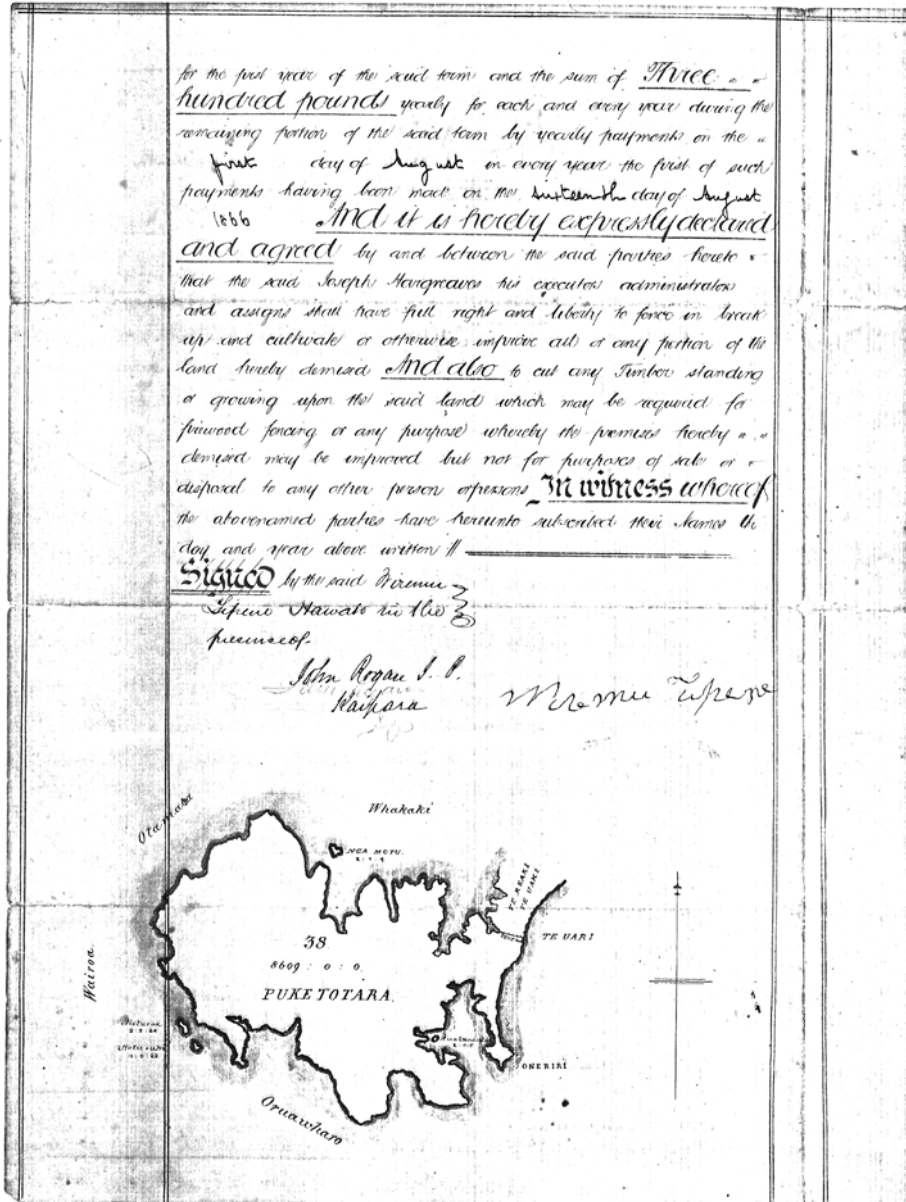


Figure 22. Second page of English deed to Joseph Hargreaves of Oneriri land, 16 Aug. 1866

Memorandum of Agreement made and entered into this sixteenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty five between Hiram Tihene, Pirama, Te Whomaiti, Matihikaha and other native chiefs of Kaipara of the first part and Joseph Hargreaves Esquire of Auckland gentleman of the second part as follows

The said Hiram Tihene, Pirama, Te Whomaiti, Matihikaha and others who have subscribed their names hereunto agree to lease to Joseph Hargreaves Esquire his heirs executors and assigns for a term of twenty one years all that piece or parcel of land situated in the district of Kaipara and called Puketotara commencing at the narrow neck of land opposite Hainpohi at the boundary of Te Pahi's land then following the Omahoa river which is the southern boundary bounded on the west by the Kaipara Harbour on the north by the Tamatea river and on the east by the Whakake river and following that river as far as the boundary of Te Pahi's land then following that boundary to the point of commencement also including all small islands immediately adjoining the said block on all sides at and for a rental of two hundred pounds sterling for the first year and three hundred pounds sterling per annum for the remaining portion of the term aforesaid to be paid annually as it becomes due.

The said Joseph Hargreaves Esquire his heirs executors and assigns to have to the full and undisturbed possession of the whole of the aforesaid property during the whole period aforesaid with full right to clear cultivate and fence in the said property or otherwise improve it as he may think fit also the right to cut timber for firewood fencing or any other purpose whereby the said property may be improved but not for purposes of sale or disposal to any other person Also the right to destroy all dogs found trespassing on the said land without a master.

The term of the above lease shall commence from the date of execution of a duly authorized lease under a crown grant or certificate of title under the Native Lands Act 1862.

In token of our adhering to all the terms of this Agreement we have

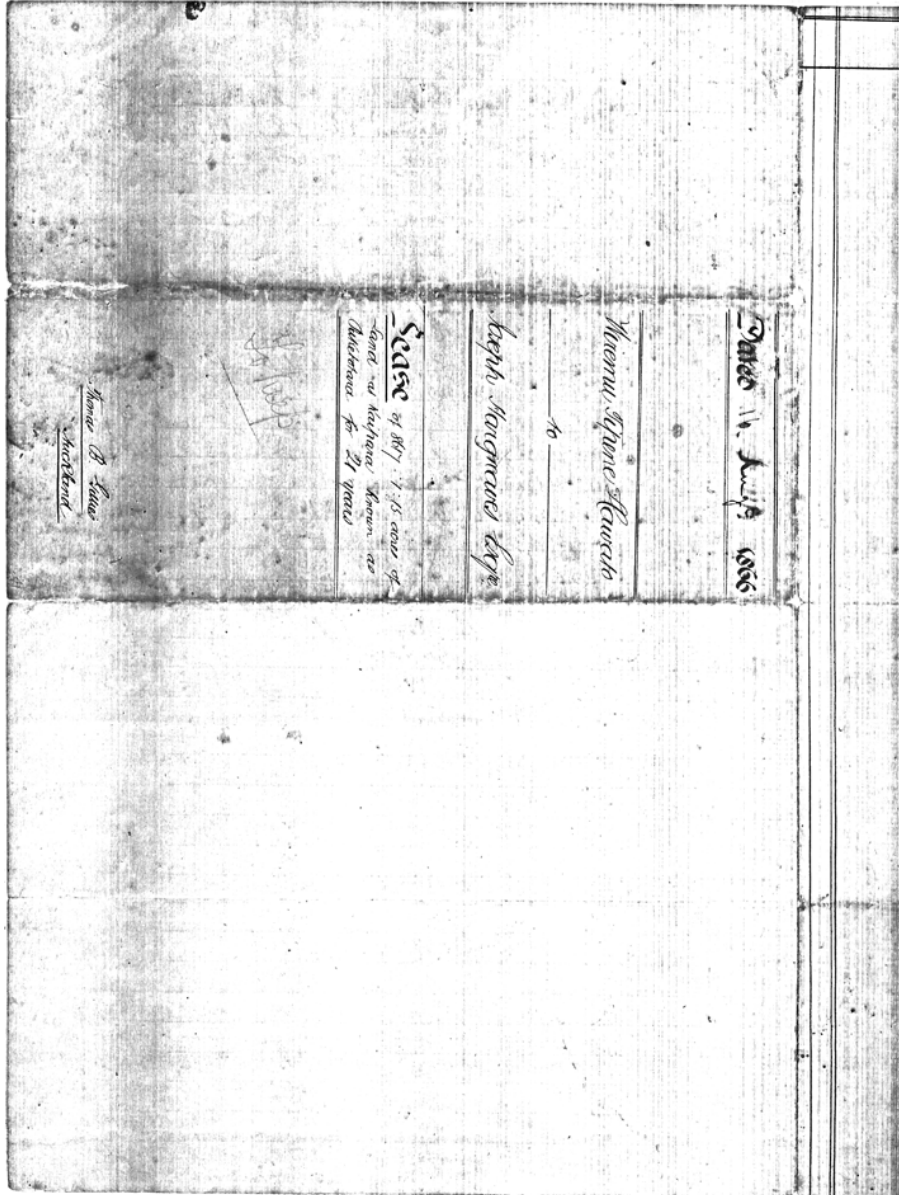


Figure 28. File jacket for the lease to Joseph Hargreaves of Oneriri land, 16 Aug.1866

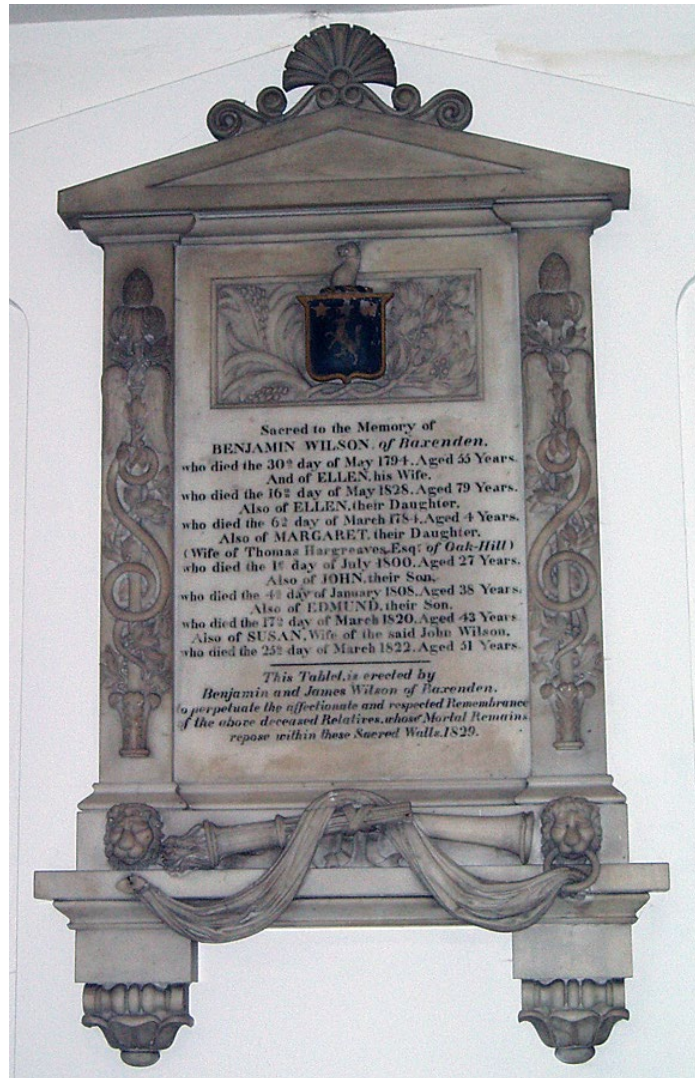


Figure 30. The family of Margaret Wilson, wife of Thomas⁷ Hargreaves (copyright held by Jules Drake)
