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LINEAGE LIST NOTATION

This document is written in "Register format," a format popular with scholarly genealogists named for the New England Historic Genealogical Society (NEHGS) and its learned journal the NEGHS Register. To facilitate stepping "backward" through the genealogy, I utilize one small addition to standard (actually "modified") Register format. A leading subscript to a person in a lineage list is the person number for that individual in this work. For example, Caleb Smith⁶ Riggs (70Joseph⁵, Joseph⁴, Edward³, Edward², Edward¹) was son of person 70, Joseph⁵ Riggs (37Joseph⁴, Edward³, Edward², Edward³), who in turn was son of person 37, Joseph⁴ Riggs, and so forth. This technique may be applied to any person in a lineage list. However, to reduce visual clutter, I will use it here for at most one person per lineage list, usually the first.

A superscript asterisk (*) indicates the first person in a lineage list who is not genetically related to the next older person in the list. For example, Skylor Nathan^{13*} Knoll (*Martha Jane*¹², *Edward Clark*¹¹, *Theodore Dalzel* A. ¹⁰, *Edward*⁹, *Elias*⁸, *Elias*⁷, *Preserve*⁶, *Zebulon*⁵, *!Joseph*⁴, *Edward*³, *Edward*², *Edward*¹) was an adopted son of Martha Jane¹² Riggs. Note also the question mark (?) in this lineage list, indicating that the father-son relationship of Joseph⁴ and Zebulon⁵ has not been proved.

It is traditional in American genealogy to label the immigrant's generation as no. 1. The generation preceding his is A, preceding A is B, and so forth.

METHODOLOGY AND STYLE NOTES

Unsourced material. Some claims without accompanying sources are important to preserve, as hints to future researchers or simply to indicate that I am aware of commonly claimed dates, names, or places, but am not certain of them. I enter these in footnotes and not in the main text. I do not always explicitly flag these claims as unsourced, but they should be understood as such by their presence in the footnotes only. This type of information often comes from compiled, but unfortunately unsourced, genealogies that have the appearance, to me at least, of being well researched and based on solid evidence. The footnote hint might inspire a future researcher to find the elusive evidence, whereas I had not done so by the time this book went to press.

Census litany. Rather than trying to be creative on each of dozens of census readings, I have chosen to state them with a common "litany." To make census litanies easy to spot, I usually introduce each one with the year. For example, a reading from the U.S. census for 1900 will begin "In 1900"

Online sources. I have made much use of online sources, usually secondary, such as the listing of gravestones in a particular cemetery. The problem with this practice is the supposed ephemeral nature of the web. Many online sources may simply disappear from the web over time, or change addresses at least. I have therefore made a copy of every webpage used in this work and archived it for future reference. Very notable exceptions are the many databases available from major servers, such as <Ancestry.com>, which I assume, with some trepidation, will be permanently available by some means. The URL for a website is identified by enclosing <> brackets. When a URL needs to wrap at the end of a line for good visual appearance, I have inserted a hyphen in an appropriate location. This line-breaking hyphen should be omitted, of course, when the URL is used as an internet address.

Abbreviations. I use abbreviations. With one exception, I always abbreviate state names and month names. The exception: I do not abbrevi-

ate state names in the main text that stand alone. However, state names in footnotes are always abbreviated, even in the titles of books.

I do not abbreviate anything in a quotation. An abbreviation in a quotation is present in the original.

I use succinct forms for the sources in footnotes. The bibliography should be consulted for full expansion of a source reference. See the abbreviations section of the front matter for the full list of abbreviations used in the census references. In all cases, the census was read from <Ancestry.com>, and the roll numbers correspond to the microfilm series used by that organization.

Verb tenses. Past tense is normally used, but a record is described in the present—e.g., Joe Gopnik was born in 1836, but a death certificate for Joe Gopnik states that he was born in 1836.

PREFACE

I was inspired to write this book by a recent (2022) article on DNA and the Robert¹ Lockwood family, by Capers McDonald, published in the trusted scholarly journal *The Genealogist*. See the bibliography for the full reference.

My now deceased brother-in-law, Doug Lockwood, and I used to enjoy pursuing his family genealogy and traced it back to Claud Jacob⁹ Lockwood (as he is known in this book). Doug is known here as James Douglas¹¹ Lockwood. I was just starting then to use FamilyTreeDNA.com (FTDNA) to study the DNA of people I was pursuing genealogically. One of the early family members I tested was Doug's son, my nephew, Todd Andrew¹² Lockwood. This was the early days of testing, so I could test on only 37 markers at the time. Capers's article has reinspired me to formalize what Doug and I started and then let drop when Doug died.

I compared Todd's 37 markers to the first 37 markers of the STR sequence published in Capers's paper. It was a 37 for 37 match.

I wrote Capers who expressed interest in possibly obtaining more data for his overall Lockwood DNA project. I spent a day (7 Apr. 2022) assembling the bare bones of a genealogy for Todd in an attempt to join what I knew to what Capers knows. This book (after much fleshing) is the result.

To get started I used the Holden and Lockwood book on the Lockwood family (see bibliography). It is flawed in the eyes of scholarly genealogists, ^[2] hence the parts of it I use here (for inspiration on where to look for actual records) are printed in red, and they are eventually to be excised and replaced with sourced information. See The DNA Evidence section for further information.

THE DNA EVIDENCE

From an article in a 2022 issue of *The Genealogist* by Capers McDonald, we know that the 111-marker "genetic signature" of the immigrant founder, Robert¹, of the Lockwood family featured in this book is the following (spaced in groups of 10 markers: 1–10, 11–20, ..., using the simple number-to-letter code in the footnote):^[4]

Robert¹ Lockwood:

The markers in red (and blue) are explained shortly.

For comparison, here is the 111-marker genetic signature for Todd¹² Lockwood of the title of this book (the descent chain is established in this book):

Todd¹²'s 111 markers match at 110 of the 111 markers of the Robert¹ Lockwood genetic signature. Todd is almost certainly a direct male heir. The descent list is accurate from Jacob⁷ down to Todd Andrew¹², as established in this book. On 7 Apr. 2022, I discovered a crucial record that linked Jacob⁷ to Jesse⁶ (*Gilbert*⁵). See Figure 6. I believe that I have established

lished, with massive help from others, the list from Jesse⁶ back to Robert¹, and hence from Todd¹² back to Robert¹.

On 5 June 2022, I downloaded the 111-marker signature for Todd¹² from FTDNA.




Figure 1. The date of Robert³ Lockwood's will: the "sevententhe Day of may."

To show how this book relates to Capers McDonald's work, I include a summary of the DNA evidence McDonald has established for several lines of the Lockwood family, descending from Robert¹. This comes from his Figure 1 and Table 1. To conserve space, I list, as he does, only the markers shown in red, which are markers no. 21, 23, 25, 33, 34, 50, 51, 57, 59, 73, 89, 94, 104, in FTDNA order. These are the only markers of the 111 that differ among the various contributors to his project. Todd¹² also differs in position 98, so I add that marker to the strings below in blue. It has value y in the genetic signature published by McDonald, but it has value x in Todd¹²'s signature:

So, using the maximum parsimony rules,^[5] the Most Recent Common Ancestor (MRCA) of A¹¹ and B¹⁰, namely Hezekiah⁵, would probably^[6] have had this signature—where {mn} means either m or n:

And this would probably be Hezekiah⁴'s signature too, by the rules. Using the maximum parsimony rules again, the MRCA of M¹¹ and Hezekiah⁴, namely Gershom³, would probably have this signature, which is exactly M¹¹'s:

Using the maximum parsimony rules again on these three signatures, their MRCA, namely Jonathan², would probably have this signature, which again is exactly M¹¹'s:^[7]

Jonathan² Lockwood (*Robert*¹):

only the one son, then, by the rules, father1 has value m at that marker (probably). We have no evidence otherwise. Suppose father2 has exactly two sons, son2 and son3, and that son2 has value m for the particular marker, but son3 has value n there. Then, by the rules, father2 has value {mn}, m or n, at that marker—we cannot tell which. Now consider grandfather1, with sons father1 and father2. By the rules, the given marker for him must have value m (from father1) or {mn} (from father2), and the rules tell us that this simplifies (probably) to just m. That is because it is more likely that the son with value n is the single anomaly (i.e., mutation from m to n), than that there were two matching mutations from n to m in the other two sons of that generation.

- 6. The word "probably" is inserted everywhere because Mother Nature might not actually follow probability rules. I often omit it, but it should always be assumed.
- 7. When there are three branches (three sons of a common father), then taking a majority vote of the son's contributions is equivalent to invoking the maximum parsimony rule. For example, here Gershom³ and Robert³ have an **o** for marker 23 (the second one of the red ones), but Still John³ has a **p**. Their MRCA is their father Jonathan², whose value for that marker would be by the rules {oop}. It is more likely that there was one mutation to **p** from this father's **o** at that marker than that there were two matching mutations to **o** from his **p** there. Thus {oop} simplifies to **o**, which is equivalent to majority vote at this one node.

So, using the maximum parsimony rules, the MRCA of E^{11} and F^{11} , namely Jabez⁵, would probably have this signature:

and this would be Joseph²'s signature too, by the maximum parsimony rules. Applying the maximum parsimony rules to the MRCA of Jonathan² and Joseph², namely Robert¹, yields his probable genetic signature on these 14 variable markers, which again is exactly M¹¹'s:

So in this case a majority vote of the variable marker values yields the correct signature, but majority vote is not to be trusted in general.

The remaining 97 markers in Robert¹'s signature would be the ones in black as first specified in this section.

We can also use Todd¹²'s 111 marker values as additional evidence. Consider his variable markers and those of C¹³. Their MRCA is Robert³ (*Jonathan*², *Robert*¹). Maximum parsimony dictates the variable markers of Robert³ to be

But this does not change the computation of Jonathan²'s signature at all, and hence does not change the computation of Robert¹'s signature.

So M¹¹'s signature is seen to be (probably) the genetic signature of Robert¹. Hence it is also called the *Robert*¹ *Lockwood Modal Signature*.

To establish the early generations, I quote Capers McDonald who has done deep research on several branches of the Robert¹ Lockwood family:

Robert¹ Lockwood (*Edmund*^A) was baptized in Combs, Suffolk County, England, 18 January 1600/01, and died in Fairfield, Connecticut, between 21 May 1657, when appointed sergeant, and 11 September 1658, the date of his estate inventory.^[9] He married in probably Salem, Massa-

Again I quote Capers McDonald:

Jonathan² Lockwood (*Robert*¹) was born in Watertown, Massachusetts, 10 September 1634, first child of Robert and Susanna (Norman) Lockwood, and died in Greenwich, Fairfield County (formed 10 May 1666), Connecticut, 12 May 1688. He married by 6 January 1664, a daughter of Jeffrey Ferris. Jonathan evidently relocated from Massachusetts with his father, English immigrant Sergeant Robert Lockwood, about 1646. He is named among the nine children in Robert Lockwood's estate inventory of 1658.^[19]

In 1672 the town records of Greenwich, Conn., record the names "Jonathan Lockwood" and "Gersham Lockwood" in a "List of the names for year 1672, with the drafts of of the Land on the Eastern Division in Greenwich."^[20]

On 27 May 1676 Jonathan Lockwood bought property at Greenwich of Richard Bullerd. [21]

In 1685 Lt. Jonathan Lockwood swore to inventory of "Widow Bullard" in Fairfield, Conn., probate records. [22]

What serves essentially as the will of Jonathan Lockwood was recorded on 9 May 1688 in the Greenwich land records as a "Deed of Gift." In it, he named his wife and children and distributed land to his children. Gifts were made to five sons, beginning with "son Jonathan being my eldest." "Unto my second son Robert" he granted "halfe my lands and meadows layd out or unlayed out below & above the Contrye roade lying on the west side of Myanos River;" "unto my third son Gershom the other halfe of the above s[ai]d lands & meadows." Others were his "fourth son Joseph" and "son Still John being my youngest." Greenwich landowners listed on 21 May 1688 included Jonathan Lockwood, Jonathan Lockwood Jr., Robert Lockwood, and Gershom Lockwood.

Jonathan's widow, Mary (Ferris) Lockwood, married second, as his third wife, Thomas Merritt of Rye, New York. Documentation of her marriage settlement was included with papers relating to her estate, both of which give concrete evidence of her Lockwood children. In the marriage agreement, dated 5 June 1696, "Marah [Mary] Lockwood of Greenwich somtime wife to Leftenant Lockwood Deseased" mentioned her "severall Children by my first Husband namely Jonathan Lockwood: & severall of them being at present in there non age." Mary was dead by 26 January 1707/8, when the probate court in Greenwich ordered an inventory to be made with division of her estate to her [surviving] children "Rob Lockwood Gershom Loc[woo]d Joseph Lock[woo]d Abagail Backster [Baxter] Still John Loc [woo]d." The four sons signed acceptance of the inventory in Greenwich, 31 January 1707/8, as "Natural sonns unto Mrs Mary Merritt."

Figure 1 above] May 1731 and 23 January 1732/3, the dates of his will and its proof. He married in Greenwich, Mary —, who died there after 23 January 1732/3. Robert Lockwood was appointed 13 August 1694 to take the Greenwich town list. He deeded land in Greenwich to his brother Gershom Lockwood 25 May 1696 and in a related document acknowledged their shared "deede of gift from our Honorable father Lieutenant Lockwood, deceased . . ." He exchanged lands in Greenwich with his brother Still John Lockwood 17 June 1702. [29]

The soldier, Gilbert Lockwood, died August 7, 1836." So his birth calculates to 1747. Image 465 of 1489 is his original affidavit of 10 June 1833, aged 86 years. U.S., Revolutionary War Pensioners, 1801–1815, 1818–1872, image 114 of 256 online, note beside Gilbert Lockwood: "Died 9th Aug* 1836 paid 1st qr 1837."

Lockwood & went down to Greenwich were [sic] he was in the service about three months as a private."^[52] This establishes Capt. Samuel⁵ Lockwood as Gilbert⁵ Lockwood's brother, and hence both as sons of Samuel⁴ Lockwood.

On 28 Sept. 1799 Gilbert Lockwood was listed in a tax assessment roll for Marbletown, Ulster Co., N.Y., for \$330 real and \$90 personal estates, a tax of 42¢. Next to him (L's listed together) was Samuel I. Lockwood, for \$110 real and \$45 personal estates, and tax of 15¢. [53] So Samuel I. was probably younger than the wealthier Gilbert, and was of age as of 28 Sept. 1799, implying he was born before 28 Sept. 1778, and was probably Gilbert's son.

On 28 Aug. 1800 Gilbert Lockwood was listed in a tax assessment roll for Marbletown, Ulster Co., N.Y., for \$370 real and \$64 personal estates, a tax of 43¢. Next to him (L's listed together) was Samuel Lockwood, for \$110 real and \$30 personal estates, and tax of 14¢. ^[54] So this Samuel was probably younger than the wealthier Gilbert, and was of age as of 28 Aug. 1800, implying he was born before 28 Aug. 1779, and was probably Gilbert's son.

On 8 Sept. 1802 Gilbert Lockwood was listed in a tax assessment roll for Marbletown, Ulster Co., N.Y., for \$450 real and \$92 personal es-

tates, a tax 33.8¢. Next to him (L's listed together) was Samuel Lockwood, for \$110 real and \$30 personal estates, and tax of 8.7¢. [55]

On 22 Aug. 1803 Gilbert Lockwood was listed in a tax assessment roll for Marbletown, Ulster Co., N.Y., for \$450 real and \$102 personal estates, a tax 37.2¢. Next to him (L's listed together) was Samuel Lockwood, for \$110 real and \$30 personal estates, and tax of 9.4¢. [56]

In 1810 Gilbert Lockwood, over 45 [born before 1765], resided in Marbletown Twp., Ulster Co., with a woman, over 45, two girls under 10, one female 10–16, one male 16–26, and one male and one female 26–45. Listed nearby were the families of Daniel Lockwood, 26–45 (born 1765–1784), Jesse Lockwood, 16–26 (born 1784–1794), and Samuel I. Lockwood, 26–45 (born 1765–1784). Daniel was probably Gilbert's putative son, Dan H. Lockwood, said to be born in 1783. Jesse was almost certainly Gilbert's son, Jesse Lockwood, born 1788. I have not yet identified Samuel I. Lockwood, but he was possibly Gilbert's son, Samuel Lockwood, born 1770.

On 15 Nov. 1826 a case was heard at the Court of Equity in Kingston, Ulster Co., N.Y., of complainant "Janet" A. "Halsted" vs. defendants "Rebecca Lockwood, Gilbert Lockwood and Phebe his wife, John "Halsted" Lockwood, Isaac Lockwood, "Frederich" Lockwood, Dan Lockwood, Mary Ann Lockwood and William H. Lockwood" concerning "Aaron Belknap the guardian ad litem for the infant defendants John Halsted Lockwood, Isaac Lockwood, Frederich Lockwood, Dan Lockwood and Mary Ann Lockwood." [58] Gilbert had a son named Wil-

liam H. and a daughter-in-law Rebecca Bush (probably the defendant Rebecca Lockwood in this case), married to another son, Gilbert (Jr.). The next document in the deed book is for Catherine Stoutenburgh, with land abutting that of William Lockwood. The other Lockwoods listed were underage children of Gilbert (Jr.), with widow Rebecca. See Catherine⁶ Lockwood's sketch.

On 28 Dec. 1833, Capt. Gilbert Lockwood, 87 years old [so born about 1746] was placed on the pension roll for New York. This is Revolutionary War veteran of the pension file application already mentioned, for soldier S.23305, Gilbert (or Guilbert) Lockwood, of Ulster Co., with wife Phebe. [60]

War pension application, q.v.), died 7 Mar. 1839 (before his will was proved in Greenwich on 28 Mar. 1839, see probate file), and was buried in the First Congregational Church Cem., Greenwich, Fairfield Co., Conn. [63] He married (see will) **MARY** —, buried near her husband. [64]

On 30 Aug. 1832, Drake Lockwood, a resident of Greenwich, Fairfield Co., Conn., swore an affidavit in his application for a pension for his Revolutionary War service. He was 69 at the time, and swore that he "was born in said Greenwich August 10th 1763." [65]

On 12 Jan. 1832, Drake Lockwood of Greenwich, Fairfield Co., Conn., signed his will, and it was proved 28 Mar. 1839. It mentions "my wife Mary Lockwood," "my Children namely John Lockwood, Frederick A. Lockwood, Leaticia M. Peck, Mary Lockwood Charlott Lockwood, Angeline Lockwood and Eliza Lockwood." These were the children who had survived their father.

It was witnessed by Samuel I. Lockwood and [Samuel's niece by sister Catherine] "Jennet" A. Halstead.^[79]

Wife of Samuel Lockwood;" Find a Grave, no.65626002, no gravestone photograph, so not proved, Tallitha Carey Lockwood, born 13 Dec. 1777 [sic], died 8 Apr. 1841 (aged 63 [sic]), buried Lower Cincinnatus Cem., Cincinnatus, Cortland Co., N.Y., with this remark which appears to be taken from a record or from a gravestone: "Wife of Samuel Lockwood, aged 64 yr 3m 26d." The Carey surname is unproved.

In 1820 Samuel Lockwood, over 45 (born before 1775), resided in Marlborough Twp., Ulster Co., with a woman over 45 (born before 1775), one male under 10 (born 1810–1820), and two females 10–16 (born 1804–1810). [80]

In 1830 Samuel Lockwood, 50–60 (born 1770–1780), resided in Wawarsing Twp., Ulster Co., with a woman 50–60 (born 1770–1780), one male and two females under 10–15 (born 1815–1820), two males 15–20 (born 1810–1815), and one female 20–30 (born 1800–1810). [81]

In 1840 "Sam¹" S. Lockwood, 20–30 [so, the younger Samuel], resided in Woodstock Twp., Lenawee Co., Mich., with a woman 30–40 [which fits Jude Swartout], one boy and one girl under 5. This family is listed between Isaac Swartout, 20–30, a woman, 20–30, two boys under 5, and "Tho⁵" Swartout Jr., 40–50, a woman, 40–50, one female 15–20, and one male 20–30.^[82]

On 17 Jan. 1843, Andrew Swartout and Judy [Judah overwritten with Judy], his wife, of Woodstock Twp., Lenawee Co., Mich., sold to John Lockwood and Sarah Lockwood (their relationship unspecified) of the same place, for \$500, a parcel of 22 acres in Woodstock Twp. Judy sold, for \$1, all rights and title of her dower to the land to John and Sarah. The deed was acknowledged the same day, with Judy independently interviewed from her husband. [83] I take this as evidence that John and Sarah were siblings.

Lockwood, 39, a farmer born in New York, with \$500 real estate, and with Rebecca, 20, born in New York, and John, 14, Sarah, 11, Ellen, 3, and Mary, 1, all born in Michigan. An "Andrewe Swarthout," 60, family resided next door, with Judah, 54, and resident, Thomas, 55, all born in New York, and and beyond them, the Isaac "Swarthout," 35, family, with Mary Ann, 32, born in New York. [84]

See Figure 7-Figure 8 for details about the Swartout family.

In 1860 "Samul" S. (or perhaps I.) Lockwood, 48, a farmer born in New York, with \$1,000 real and \$390 personal estates, resided in Woodstock, Woodstock Twp., Lenawee Co., Mich., with Phebe J., 30, born in New York, and Ellen, 12, Marion, 10, Walter, 9, Lewis, 8, Josephine, 6, Estella, 4, and "Walise," 1, all born in Michigan. Next door resided the Isaac "Swartout," 46, family, with Mary A., 43, born in New York. [85]

On 2 Nov. 1807 Frederick Bush, of Marbletown, Ulster Co., N.Y., sold to "Rebacca Daughter of the said Frederick Bush... in Consideration of the natural love and effection..." (further described in the deed below). [86]

On 1 May 1817 Gilbert Lockwood Jr. and Rebecca, his wife, of Marbletown, Ulster Co., N.Y., sold to Garret G. Dubois of Marbletown, for \$600, a tract of land in Marbletown at "Ashocen," labeled as lot no. 45 on a map "which was conveyed by the trustees of Marbletown unto Frederick Bush on the first day of April 1803, and was conveyed by Frederick Bush unto his daughter Rebecca aforesaid [hence Rebecca Bush was the wife of Gilbert Lockwood Jr.] on the second day of November 1807," containing 66.4 acres. Witnessed by Samuel I. Lockwood and "Jennet" A. Halstead, and acknowledged 2 May 1817. [87]

The heirs of Gilbert Lockwood Jr., as of the 13 Mar. 1838 deed (see [sister] Catherine⁶ Lockwood) "John H Lockwood, Frederick Lockwood, Isaac Lockwood, Dan Lockwood and Mary Ann Lockwood."

the 1810 census MARY [MARITJE] VAN DER BOGART, who was born 31 Oct. 1786, Claverack, Columbia Co., N.Y., [92] daughter of Peter and Hanna (Bressee) Van der Bogart [Bogert]. Mary definitely died after the 1855 census, and presumably before the two deeds of 13 and 15 Mar. 1858 (see son Philip's sketch) which sold off land of hers apparently, without her participation.

In 1850 Mary Lockwood, 64, resided in Kingston Twp., Ulster Co., N.Y., with James, 34, a farmer, Gilbert "J.," 32, "Hellen" Ann, 29, Hannah "Mairea," 27, Mary A. Van "De Begart," 18, and Rufus Van "De Begart," 14, all seven born in New York. [97] Cf. niece Mary Ann "Vanderbogert" of the 1855 census.

On 22 Jan. 1853, Mary Lockwood, of Kingston, Ulster Co., N.Y., deeded several parcels in Kingston, in a complex deed, to Peter V. D. Lockwood, James H. Lockwood, and Gilbert I. Lockwood, all of the same place, for \$100. Acknowledged 4 Feb. 1853. This appears to be Mary selling, for a very low price, many pieces of real estate to three of her four putative sons, a few years before her death, reputedly in 1857.

On 2 May 1853, Peter V. D. Lockwood and Sarah, his wife, James H. Lockwood, and Gilbert I. Lockwood, of Kingston, Ulster Co., N.Y., sold to Jacob Burger, of the same place, for \$315, a parcel of .68 acres in Kingston. ^[99] The three of them then proceed to begin selling the properties.

In 1855 Mary Lockwood, 68, born in Columbia Co., N.Y., a widow, resided in Kingston, Ulster Co., N.Y., with her children, James H. Lockwood, 37, and Gilbert I. Lockwood, 35, both farmers born in Ulster Co., N.Y., and with her niece, Mary Ann "Vanderbogert, "20, born in Ulster Co., with a laborer and a servant. Mary and James H. had resided there 37 years, Gilbert I. 35 years, and Mary Ann, 20 years. Next door was Peter V. D. Lockwood, 40. [100]

time after the 1855 census. He married **DEBORAH** —, who was born about 1795 (1855 census) or 11 June 1801 (calculated), Ulster Co., N.Y., died 22 Dec. 1875 (gravestone), aged 74 years 6 months 11 days, and was buried in Oakland Cem., Huntington, St. Croix Co., Wisc., ^[106] where her son Christopher was buried.

On 9 Sept. 1825 William H. Lockwood and Deborah, his wife, of Olive, Ulster Co., N.Y., sold to "Genet" A. Halstead ["Janet" is written intraline above her name], of Woodstock, Ulster Co., N.Y., for \$1,400, a tract of land in Olive at or near "Ashokon," "being the same that is now occupied and possessed by the said party of the first-part [William and Deborah]." The land description begins "Beginning on the northerly side of the Ashokon road in the South east Corner of a lot of land converyed by Guilbert Lockwood to Guilbert Lockwood Jun^r on the 4th day of October in the year 1809," containing 25 acres, and also another tract of land "Known and Called by the name of the Ashokan Islands lying between the two streams of the Esopus Creek opposite Ashokon." Acknowledged 29 Sept.1825.^[107] Since William H. was a son of Gilbert, this deed strongly suggests that Gilbert Jr. was too.

On 22 Dec. 1826 "Janet" A. Halstead of Woodstock sold back to William H. Lockwood of Olive, for \$1,500, the exact properties (with exactly the same descriptions) described in the previous deed of 9 Sept. 1825. [108]

In 1840 William Lockwood, 50–60, resided in Olive, Ulster Co., N.Y., with a woman 40–50 [1790–1800, Deborah], one female under 5 [1835–1840, Jane], one male and one female 10–15 [1825–1830], one male and one female 15–20 [1820–1825]. This suggests additional children.

In 1850 William H. Lockwood, 61, a farmer born in New York, resided in Olive Twp., Ulster Co., N.Y., with Deborah, 46 [sic], born in New York, and with Christopher, 23, Catharine, 18, and Jane, 15, all born in New York. Next door resided Jacob S. Lockwood, 25. [110] Catharine was Christopher's wife, judging by subsequent censuses for him.

On 19 Aug. 1853 William H. Lockwood and Deborah, his wife, of Olive, Ulster Co., N.Y., sold to Christopher S. Lockwood of the same place, for \$100, a parcel of land "in the town of Olive aforesaid on the East Side of the Esopus Creek and is part of the farm of the Said William H Lockwood," containing "one acre one yard and Eighten rods of land."^[111]

In 1855 William H. Lockwood, 68, a farmer born in Dutchess Co., N.Y., resided in Olive Twp., Ulster Co., N.Y., where he had been resident for 59 years, with his wife, "Debaraugh," 60, born in Ulster Co., N.Y., and with his child, Jane, 18, born in Ulster Co., N.Y. [112]

According to an obituary for son Christopher, he removed to Wisconsin in Apr. 1860. This might have been when Deborah moved there too.

In 1810 Jesse Lockwood, 16–26 (born 1784–1794), resided in Marbletown Twp., Ulster Co., with a woman 16–26, one female under 10 (born 1800–1810), and one female 10–16 (born 1794–1800). Listed nearby were Gilbert Lockwood, over 45, Samuel I. Lockwood, 26–45, and Daniel Lockwood, 26–45.

In 1820 Jesse Lockwood, 26–45 [born 1775–1794], resided in Middletown Twp., Delaware Co., N.Y., with a woman 26–45, four boys and one girl under 10, and one female 10–16. The five children under 10 fit the first five children in the list below (including those marked with ?). However, there is no daughter listed there corresponding the one female 10–16, so perhaps there is another daughter to discover.

In 1830 Jesse Lockwood, 40–50 [born 1780–1790], resided in Middletown Twp., Delaware Co., N.Y., with a woman 40–50, two boys and two girls under 5, two females 5–10, two males 10–15, and two males 15–20. [118]

In 1840 Jesse Lockwood, 50–60 [born 1780–1790], resided in Shandaken Twp., Ulster Co., N.Y., with a woman 50–60, one girl under 5, one male 10–15, one male and one female 20–30. [119]

In 1850 Jesse Lockwood, 62, a farmer born in New York, with \$4,000 real estate, resided in The Corner, Shandaken, Ulster Co., N.Y., with John, 21 [sic], a farmer, "Genet," 23, female, James, 19, a farmer, and Maria, 17, all born in New York. Next door resided James Lamson, 35. [120]

On 4 Nov. 1854, Jesse Lockwood, of "Sandaken," Ulster Co., N.Y., sold to William Devall, of Woodstock, Ulster Co., N.Y., for \$80, a parcel of land in Shandaken. [121] This deed is consistent with Jesse's being a widower.

In 1855 Jesse Lockwood, 66, a widower farmer born in Ulster Co., N.Y., resided in Shandaken, Ulster Co., N.Y., with his children "Jenette", 29, born in Delaware Co., and Maria, 23, born in Ulster Co. All three had resided in Shandaken for 17 years. On the same census page are John W. Lockwood, 28, James M. Lockwood, 24, and James M. Lamson. [122]

On 23 June 1855, Jesse Lockwood of Shandaken, Ulster Co., N.Y., sold to James M. Lockwood of the same place, for \$50, a parcel of land "in the town of Shandaken aforesaid at or near a place called the Corner Commencing on the west Side of the Kingston & Delaware Plank Road," containing "from one fourth to one half of a acre of land more or less." The sale was acknowledged on 26 June 1855. [123]

An obituary for Lauretta:

I have no direct proof that Philip was a son of Daniel⁶, but his name being so like his putative brother Peter's is evidence that supports it. And Mary Lockwood of the next two deeds appears to be their mutual mother. And the two deeds of 13 and 15 Mar. 1858 tie Philip to his putative siblings, Peter, James, and Gilbert, although implicitly (and with Mary, their putative mother).

My argument that Ann Elizabeth was Ann Elizabeth Ladew, daughter of Abraham D., and hence sister of Rebecca D. Ladew who married Philip V. D.⁷ Lockwood's cousin, William W.⁷ Lockwood follows: Abraham D. Ladew was born 29 July 1790 (calculated), died 26 Aug. 1871, aged 81 years 28 days, and was buried in Hudler Cem., Mt. Tremper, Ulster

Co., N.Y.^[203] He married Leah —, who was born 5 June 1793 (calculated), died 24 June 1859, aged 66 years 19 days, and was buried with her husband. These deaths are recorded in *Old gravestones of Ulster Co., N.Y.: twenty-two-thousand inscriptions*, Shandaken. In addition to Abraham D. and Leah Ladew in that cemetery, there are several other Ladews: Rebecca D., two children of Oliver and Almina Ladew, Rebecca D., and others. Ann Elizabeth is not mentioned explicitly, but Oliver and Almina are. The deeds of 6 June 1844 and 26 Aug. 1844 abstracted in following paragraphs have Philip and Ann Elizabeth Lockwood jointly buying and selling land with Oliver and Almina Ladew, implying undivided ownership and hence that Ann Elizabeth and Oliver Ladew must have been siblings, since Philip and Almina probably were not. [205]

by "said Lockwood." On the same date Mary and Philip paid \$1 to Egbert Elmendorf for his release of any claim he might have on the said parcel. [207]

On 24 Sept. 1836, Mary Lockwood, and Philip V. D. Lockwood and Ann Elizabeth, his wife, all of Kingston, Ulster Co., N.Y., sold to Nicholas N. Read, of Hurley, Ulster Co., N.Y., for \$200, lot no. 2 in Kingston, containing 53.6 acres. It was acknowledged 24 Sept. 1836. Mary Lockwood was presumably the same as she of the preceding deeds.

On 6 June 1844, Samuel Butler and Mary C., his wife, of New York City, N.Y., sold to Philip V. D. Placeholder: According to these Figures, Valentine Lockwood was a farmer of Delaware Co., N.Y., in 1834 when his daughter, Martha, was born there (his only child it is claimed). He moved to Broome Co. in 1836, where he died. The 1850 census gives Valentine two children. Thus the Figures are not to be completely trusted.

On 31 Jan. 1840, Valentine Lockwood and "Mahitable," his wife, of Colesville, Broome C., N.Y., sold to Martha Gleason, of the same place, for \$100, 20 acres in Colesville "off the east end of that portion of lot number forty one (41) in Watt's Patent so called Conveyed to Valentine Lockwood by Deed from John A. Collier, Recorded in Broome County Clerk's office." The deed was acknowledged the same day. Mahitable was quizzed separately about it on 10 Oct. 1842. [248]

On 10 Sept. 1843, Valentine Lockwood, of Colesville, Broome C., N.Y., signed an unusual document. It transfers to John Wight, of Colesville, for \$1, "all my real & personal estate of whasoever kind & wheresoever situated." The intent was that Wight would sell the assets to pay off the debts and retain a reasonable amount to pay himself for the effort, then return any excess to Lockwood. This is an unbelievably trusting document, so John Wight must have been a family member. [249] Figure 11 suggests that he might have been the father or brother of Sally Wright [but note different spelling of the surname] who married Augustus Baker's father, Peter Baker.

JACOB⁷ LOCKWOOD (34Jesse⁶, Gilbert⁵, Samuel⁴, Robert³, Jonathan², Robert¹) was born about 1817 (1850 census), Delaware or Olive, Ulster Co., N.Y., [268] and died after the 1880 census (enumerated 23 June 1880), but his gravestone claims that he died 16 Apr. 1880. Since his widow applied for his Civil War pension on 18 Aug. 1881, I surmise that his death date was actually 16 Apr. 1881. He was buried in Arkville Cem., Delaware Co., N.Y. On 24 Sept. 1872, "Jenett Lockwood (single lady) [and] Susan Lampson (widow)," of Shandaken, Ulster Co., N.Y., sold to the trustees of the First Baptist Church of the Corner, in the same place, for \$45.66, a parcel of land in Shandaken containing .4566 acre. [328] Susan Lampson [Lamson] was Jenett's sister.

On 22 Mar. 1880, "Jennette" Lockwood, of Shandaken, Ulster Co., N.Y., sold to Susan Lamson, of the same place, for \$400, a parcel of land in Shandaken at a place called the Corner containing 72 acres, less approximately half an acre sold already to the Corner Baptist Church. The church is mentioned in the description of the parcel as is "the Easterly corner of the old farm of Jesse Lockwood deceased." The land was jointly owned by both, having been conveyed to them by Jesse Lockwood on 16 Nov. 1863 and recorded in Ulster Co., Deeds, 127:502. Acknowledged 24 Mar. 1880. [329]

Marion Leroy Lockwood was born May 15, 1849, in Michigan, and died Feb. 12, 1925, at the age of 75 years, 8 months, and 27 days.

In 1873, Mr. Lockwood came to Smith County, Kansas, three years later he was united in marriage to Miss Katie Clark.

In 1883 he and his family moved to Salem, where he worked at the carpenter trade, and began writing for the Smith County Pioneer. Moving to Smith Center in 1890 he established the Smith County Journal. Three years later he sold this plant and moved to Lebanon. Later he moved to Easton Kansas (now Ottawa) where he again entered the newspaper business.

He returned to Lebanon in 1907 where he opened up a Job Printing Office which was under his management up to the time of his death.

Hurley, July 18.-In the death of Gilbert Isleton Lockwood, the village has lost another of its oldest citizens. Mr. Lockwood came to Hurley in 1895 and up until last year had been actively engaged in operating a sawmill on the Mountain Road. Lately, he had been compelled to give up active work on account of failing health, his son, Clarence, succeeding him at the sawmill. Mr. Lockwood was always interested in public affairs, especially in all that pertained to education in which he displayed a considetrable [sic] grasp and [sic] well as interest. For years he had been school trustee in West Hurley and for many years he served as school clerk for this district. On the establishment of the Township School Law, he was most naturally elected as presiding officer of the board, where his knowledge of school affairs served a most excellent foundation for the office. In all matters pertaining to the management of the schools, his counsel and advice were always clear and most fitting. Up to the very end, as the affairs of the board were rapidly approaching completion, he manifested his oldtime interest. In every way, he proved himself a wise, public spirited citizen. Although mostly engaged in his life in the lumber business, still he had experiences that were a source of pleasure to those who listened to his stories of his life when he ran the stage from Kingston to Ellenville. THOMAS SWARTOUT.

A Revolutionary Soldier.

THOMAS SWARTOUT was born March 2,1763 or 5,in Fishkill, N.Y. (From dates on his gravestone he was born in 1753,but from his pension record he was born 1756)He served in the War of the American Revolution as private; enlisting six different times, always at Fishkill, N.Y. (Dutchess Co.) as follows:

April 1,1776, to Oct.1,1776, in Wm Clark's Co.of Rangers.
April 1,1777, for 3½ mo.in Henry Wyckoff's Co.of Rangers.
Oct.1777, for 4 wks., under Capt. John Shultz and Col. Erinkerhoff.
Mayl,1778, for 3½ mo.under Capt. Thomas Storm and Col. Lovell.
Summer 1778 for 3 weeks under Capt. John Shultz and Col. Lovell.
Summer 1779 for 4 weeks under Capt. Occ. Brinkerhoff and Col.
Lovell.

After the war he lived at Olive, Ulster Co., N.Y. and here Sept. 11,1832, he applied for a pension. It was allowed and he drew

\$40.00 a year until his death, Sept.12,1848. He is buried in Cement City, Michigan. His grave was located by Mrs. W. H. Cortright, Regent of Charity Cook Chapter, D. A. R. and June 26,1925 it was marked by this chapter with appropriate services, 150 guests were present. His children were;

His children all came to Michigan, Cornelius coming first. He purchased 100 acres of land in Lenawee Co., paying \$1.25 an acre for it. He did not like this new country so returned to New York, selling his land to his brother James, who came and seeing the possibilities of this new country wrote back home glowing account of Michigan and so interested the family that a brother Andrew came, bringing his wife, Juda(Avery), their eleven children and his father, our Thomas. They arrived in May, 1836.

Thomas was a man of much possessions in the esst, most of which he sold. However, he reserved 40 acres so that if he did not like the new home he would have a place of his own to return to. On the land which he kept was a water power and a saw mill. He gave his son, Cornelius, the use of this property if he would pay the taxes. Ten years after Andrew and his family came to Michigan, he with several of his family went back to Ulster Co. for a visit, but the father Thomas was getting old and did not cabe to make the trip, for he liked Michigan. He died here Sept. 12, 1846, aged 95y, 6m, 10d. The day Michigan became a state, Andrew's twelfth and last child was born. They called the child Andrew after his father. This son, now 86, and his bother Zetus, now 91, are living in Cement City, both able to attend the services honoring their grandfather.

Married at Jackson, Mich., 18 Nov., 1858, Emily Swartwout, daughter of Isaac and Mary A. Swartwout of Woodstock, Mich. She was born 21 Dec., 1840. His early life was passed in Sharon, Mich., where his father owned a farm, and where he was for a time engaged in trade. He afterward removed to Jackson and lived there until his death, which occurred 15 Dec., 1869, Æ. 40. His widow married the Rev. Mr. Bush, a Baptist clergyman (now deceased), and removed to Missouri. She resides at Lincoln, Neb. (1891).

children, five of whom are living, namely: Amanda B., Mrs. Kent; George M. and Adelia, residing in Binghamton; Amy, in Jersey City; and Mary, in Chicago, Ill. The two that died were: Holland, at thirty years; and Isaac, killed in the late war at the age of twenty-five years.

Mr. and Mrs. Eri Kent have had ten children, seven of whom are living, namely: Alice, Mrs. Eli Stow, of Binghamton; Jane, Mrs. William Tiffany, of Susquehanna, Pa.; Charles H., of Windsor; James, of Binghamton; and Nellie, wife of the Rev. Orville Frink, of Fulton, N.Y., who was a prisoner during the war at Libby Prison, Va.; Mary, wife of Vernon Blatchley, and Alida, Mrs. Clarence Hewitt, both residents of Windsor. Charles, George, and Martha died between the ages of three and six. Mr. and Mrs. Kent are among the most respected settlers of the town of Windsor. She is an earnest and edifying member of the Baptist church, which her husband attends, although he has not connected himself with any church.

UGUSTUS BAKER, who is living on his seventy-acre farm in the town of Fenton, School District No. 1, enjoying the fruits of many years of industry and toil, is one of the substantial farmers and prominent citizens of Broome County, where none are better or more favorably known. A sketch of his family may not be uninteresting to the many readers of this volume who have long esteemed his acquaintance and friend-

ship. There is so much to be said of his own life that but a brief outline of his kindred can be given here, though their good words and works, like his own, deserve many pages.

His paternal grandfather, Thomas Baker, married Harriet Bolson, of Peekskill, Dutchess County, and with a brother settled in Ithaca at an early day. When about fifty years of age, he moved to Luzerne County, Pennsylvania. He was a farmer in moderate circumstances; and he and his wife worked together industriously and cheerfully, devoted to each other, and looking forward to days of quiet pleasure with their children. Six sons and four daughters were born in their home; and it was theirs to see them turning the milestones of the years, as they grew from infancy and childhood to maturity, and became strong and useful men and women. One by one they married, and left the family fireside. The sons went West; and one of them, Amaziah E., drifted southward to Texas. There he amassed a large fortune, and died in 1892, at the ripe age of ninety years. Stephen, the eldest, made his home in Illinois. Peter Baker, the father of Augustus, lived in New York; but the rest all went different ways, and, if any are united now, it must be that they have reached

At the age of sixty-five their mother passed away; and their father, uncompanioned, always holding her memory sacred in his heart, after many lonely years died, aged ninety.

Augustus Baker was the fourth child and second son of four sons and three daughters born to his parents, of whom but three are now living. The famous blind singer, William Baker, is one of these. When two years old, scarlet fever deprived him of his sight; but, if anything could be a recompense for this loss, of which his memory retains nothing, perhaps it is his splendid gift of song, for he is a most beautiful singer, whose stirring strains so thrill the souls of his vast audiences that they are carried away in entrancing raptures or moved to sympathetic tears. He was educated at the School for the Blind in Philadelphia, one of the best institutions of the kind in the United States, and has been in the employ of John Wanamaker, at a lucrative salary, for the benefit of city missions. His wife was Katie Smith, of Philadelphia, blind from five months old. She also is a highly gifted and cultured musician. They were educated together, and are united by their common misfortune and by their great gift, so that their habits and tastes flow naturally in one channel, while their sympathy, love, and mutual dependence show the completeness of their lives. He is a fine tenor, and she is an alto singer. Together they have given concerts for years, and are an inestimable power for good. The wife plays the piano accompaniments, and both are prominent in church and musical circles of the Quaker City. This blind brother is the youngest of the Baker family. The other brother, George, is a carpenter, residing in Newark, N.J.

Augustus Baker was born in the town of Lisle, Broome County, May 26, 1828. At three years of age he was taken to Luzerne County, Pennsylvania. His father was a native of Westchester County, New Jersey; and his mother, whose maiden name was Sally Wright, was born in Middletown, Delaware County. They were married about the year 1820. Augustus was reared on a farm, and, like other farmers' sons, did not have very good advantages of education; yet so well did he improve the limited opportunities afforded him that he taught school three winters, while other boys of his age were still wrestling with the mysteries of fractions and the double rule of three. He came of an exceptional and sturdy race, and was bound to make his way in the world, whatever the obstacles that lay in his path.

At the home of Valentine Lockwood, on the 27th of April, 1834, a daughter was born, who was destined to become the wife of Augustus Baker. Her father was then a prominent farmer of Delaware County; but he has resided in Broome County since 1836, coming here when land was but two dollars and fifty cents an acre. This daughter, Martha, was married to Augustus Baker February 24, 1852. It is now nearly twenty-two years since Mrs. Baker's parents came from Colesville to settle on this beautiful tract of seventy acres, which they bought for eleven thousand dollars, going in debt four thousand dollars. Mrs. Baker was an only child. Her father died here July 15, 1886, aged seventysix; and her mother died January 7, 1892, at

eighty-four. Both were worthy members of the Methodist Episcopal church, and they died happy in the faith in which they had lived. The strong character of Augustus Baker has been spoken of as the great element in the success which he has achieved, but his wife has been as devoted as he to the accomplishment of his life-work. Mrs. Baker deserves half the praise, for she has never shirked any duty, however arduous; and the peace and prosperity of their home are greatly due to her actual labor and economy as well as to her words of encouragement and cheer. She is endowed with excellent abilities, and blessed with good health. She is the mother of six children, four of whom are now dead. Elma E. died aged two, and Selma E. died aged thirteen. Herbert L., who was an invalid for years, died at twenty-seven; and Tracy S., at sixteen. Lamont and O. J., the former for years in feeble health, alone are left to comfort their parents' declining years. Both are single young men, and are the pride and cheer of the home. The latter is talented in music, and has literary gifts that promise well for his future. He is noble-hearted, and has worked faithfully on the farm while cherishing hopes of a different career; for his duty seemed to lie straight and plain before

Mr. Baker carries on his large farm according to the latest improved methods in this age of scientific study and invention, and also conducts a dairy in connection with it, which, like the other farm work, goes on regularly and in order. He is engaged in stock-rais-

ing, too; and in all of his enterprises his attention to details has been constant and unflagging. "Whatever is worth doing is worth doing well" has been his motto, and the result now before him attests its successful application. He was stricken with paralysis in the month of December, 1888, from the effects of which he-has never fully recovered, though he continued the active supervision and management of the farm for several years after. Mr. Baker is a Republican. He is an influential member of the Methodist Episcopal church, and has often officiated as steward and class leader. His whole life has been a clear and fitting example of one who lives

"In deeds, not years; in thoughts, not breaths;
In feelings, not in figures on a dial.
... He most lives
Who thinks most, feels the noblest, acts the best."

ILLIAM E. TAYLOR, one of the wealthy retired merchants of Binghamton, N.Y., was born in Hampden County, Massachusetts, April 22, 1818, son of William and Nancy (Culver) Taylor. The father was one of the old farmers of that county, owning and occupying a farm which had been in the family for a great many years. He was a military man under the old State law, having several official positions, and was Colonel at the time the militia service was abandoned. He died in November, 1832. The mother of our subject died aged about seventy-eight years.

Young Taylor was educated in the common

5. Andrew Hill², son of Anthony¹ and Mary (Ward) Hill, removed from Fox Meadows after 1765 to Dutchess County, N. Y., where he resided until 1790, when he removed to Marbletown, Ulster County, N. Y., and from there to Shokan, Ulster County, N. Y., where both he and his wife died and are buried in Reformed Dutch church yard.

August 15, 1775, he signed the Revolutionary Association pledge in Dutchess County. October 17, 1775, he was commissioned as captain in the Second Regiment, Dutchess County Militia, Rombout Precinct. In 1777 he was appointed as Major of the Levies, Dutchess County, N. Y. In 1778 he was commissioned as Major in the Dutchess County Militia, Second Regiment. In 1784 he was appointed as Major No. 1, Dutchess County Militia. It appears by New York in Revolution, Supplement, 177, that he furnished one or more soldiers at his own expense, for which honorable mention is given him. He was a freeholder in both Dutchess and Ulster Counties. May 5, 1786, he purchased of Daniel Graham, Commissioner of Forfeitures, 385 acres in Philipse Precinct, Lot 3, Philipse Patent, Dutchess County. September 2, 1799, describing himself as of Marbletown, Ulster County, he conveyed the 385 acres to his son Andrew Hill, Jr., of Marbletown. His name appears upon the list of members of the Reformed Dutch Church at Shokan. According to a tradition in the family, his wife was Catherine Horton, of Westchester County. After his appointment as Major, he was generally known as Major Hill.

The last four were born in Ulster County. James Schutt was a private in the Dutchess County Militia, Second Regiment, in War of Revolution; his wife was a member of the Reformed Dutch Church at Shokan.

Among their children were Thomas, Samuel, born December 10, 1787; Andrew, born February 23, 1790; Cornelius, born October 27, 1801, died at Shokan, N. Y., 1876; Polly, born December 20. 1797; Sally, born July 15, 1807.

34. Anna³, died 1809; married Daniel Ladue of Fishkill, N. Y.; he was a private in Dutchess County Militia, Second Regiment, in War of Revolution; removed to Shokan, N. Y.; issue: Abraham D., Judith, Rebecca, Bilbeck, Hannah, Anne, born May 28, 1809, married Matthew Cure, of Ulster County, N. Y.
