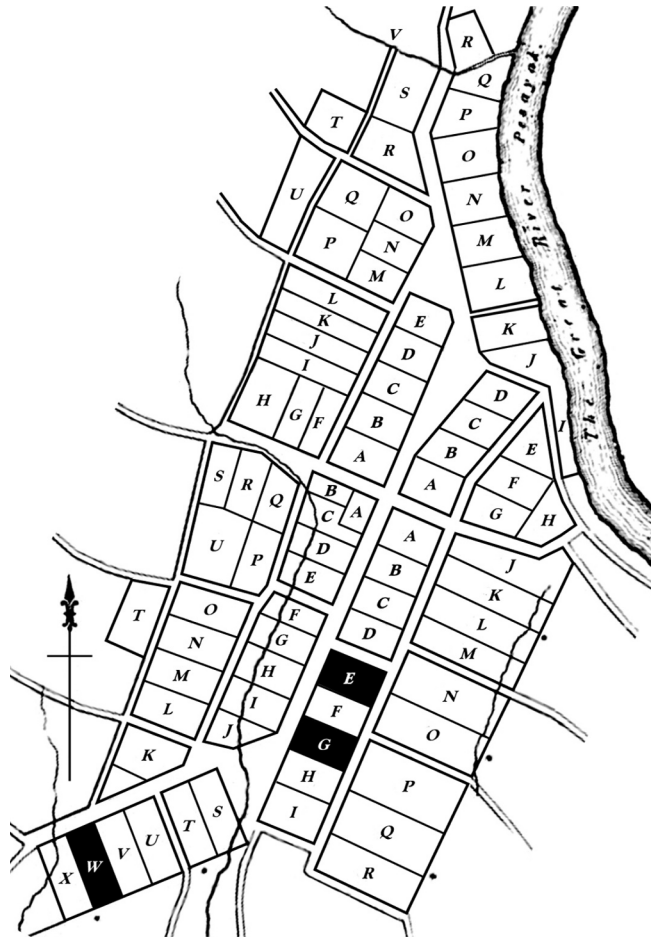


Figure 3. Original Newark lots, 1666-1668. Lot G: Edward² Riggs then Joseph³ Riggs, E: George and Mary³ (Riggs) Day, W: Edward³ Riggs.

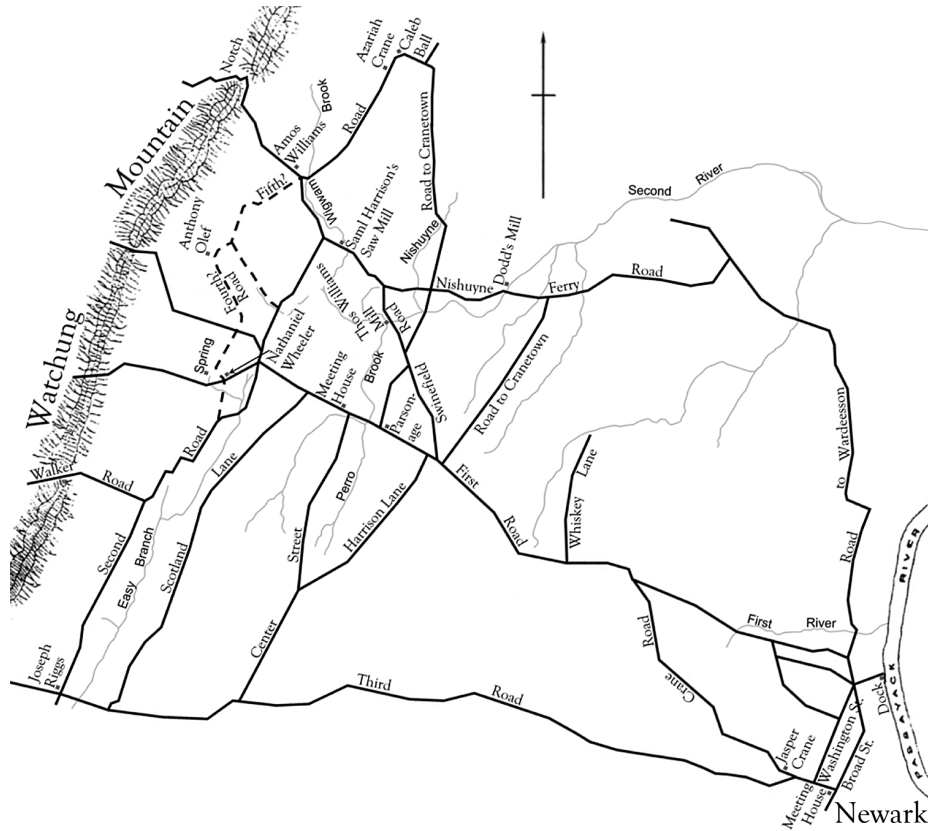


Figure 4. Early map of the Oranges with Joseph³ Riggs's house at far left and Anthony Olef's house at upper left

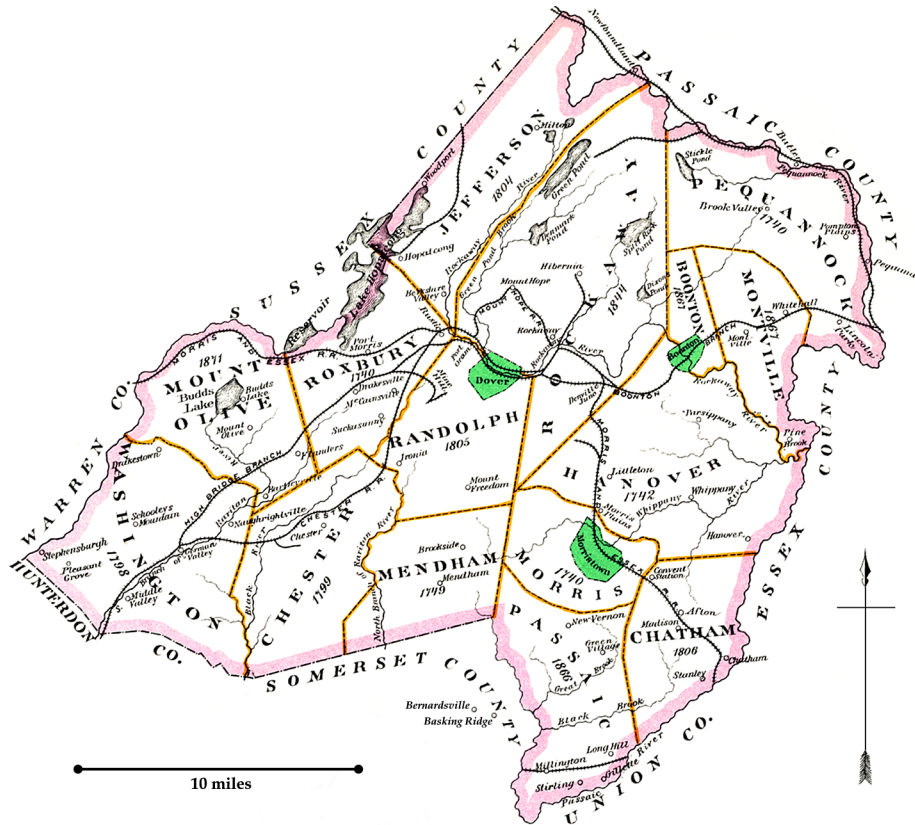


Figure 11. Morris Co., N.J., townships, with creation dates under the names

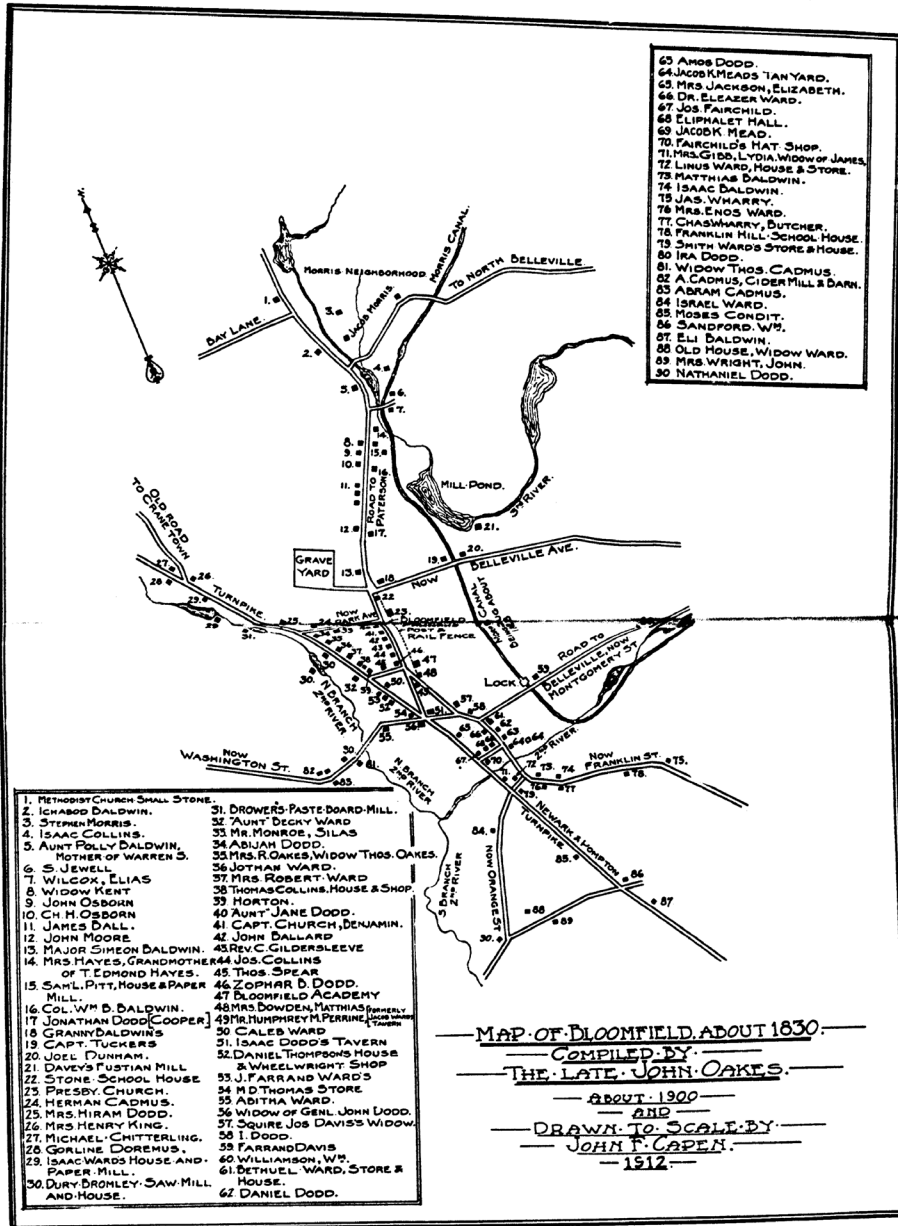


Figure 13. Map of Bloomfield, Essex Co., N.J., about 1830

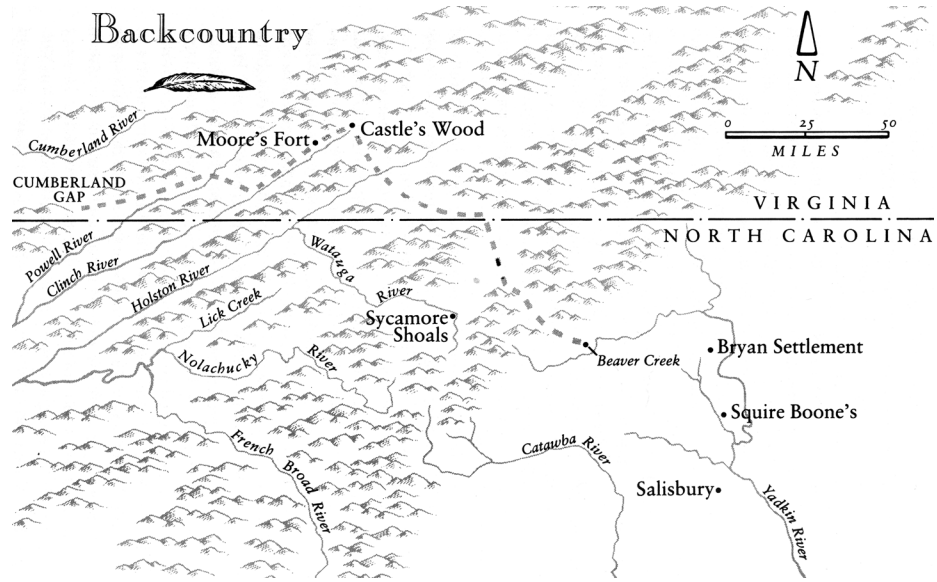


Figure 14. Daniel Boone country, 1755-1769

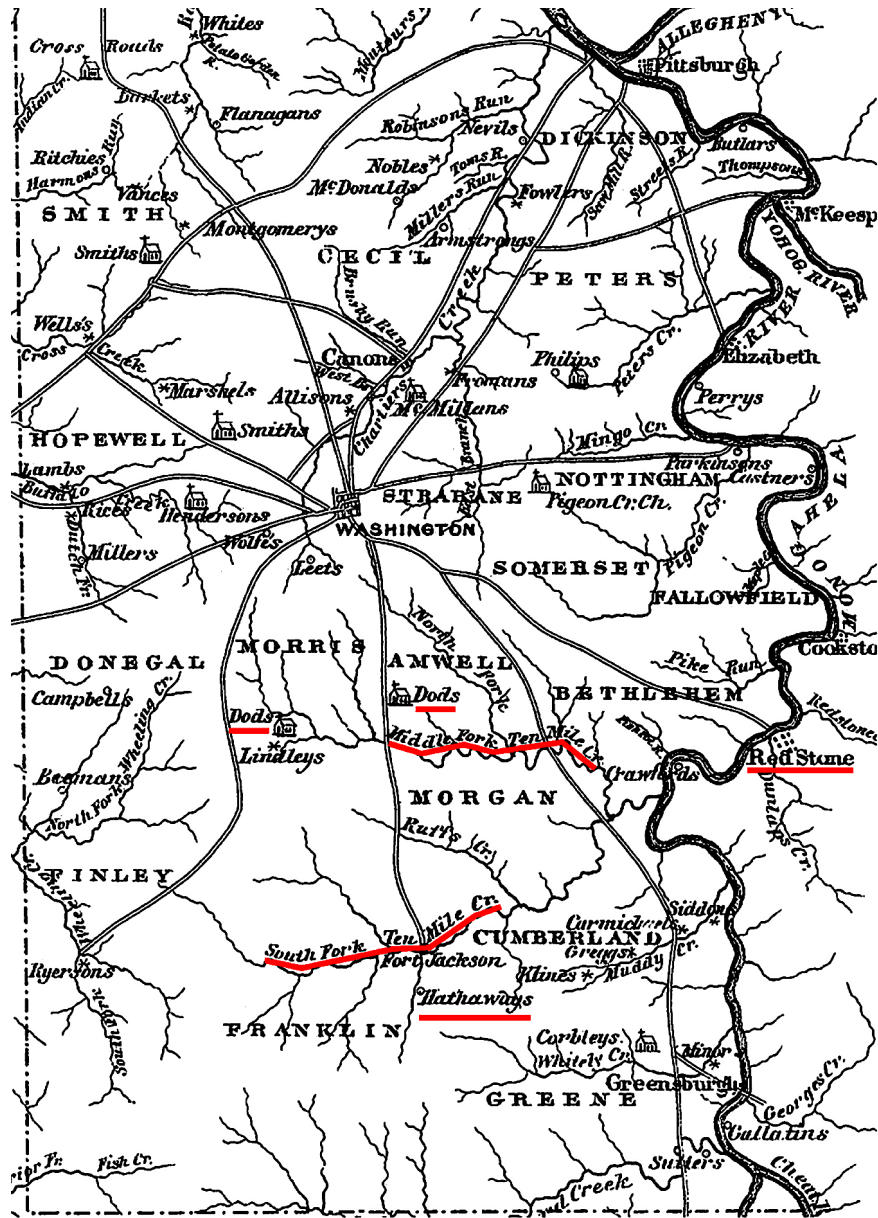


Figure 15. Washington Co., Pa., 1781-1788, with Dods and Hathaways

This Letter was written to my Great Grandfather
Daniel Brown

1780 My Dear friends I hope you are now met
with hearts sincerely Engaged to cry and plead
with God for: the out powering of his Blessed
Spirit with out which: Religion will never
flourish in your own souls: nor in the souls of others:
there fore my Dear friends: pray fervently pray much
seek the Lord while he may be found call upon his
name he may be heard: there is Great Concern
in the presence of his Majesty: that he may please to
be Dispensing his Blessings here and there around us
and my wish and prayer for you all is that God may
grant you his Grace that in this happy Day ye may
be clothed with the Garment of Salvation that those
who are a sleep may be awakened the weak among you
strengthened and the built up that faith and love and
zeal and Charity may come down well a bundently in
all our hearts that be fore this happy Day be over we
may all be made new creatures: finally my friends
fare well: when you get need the Grace of Grace pray
for me who am at present in some nest Depressed from
sickness with you this from your friend
if nothing this worth your while
you may read it at your next meeting
