


Figure 1. Gravestone of Mary Riggs, died 1816, wife of Isaac




Figure 2. Intermarriage of the families of brothers Silas<sup>1</sup>, James<sup>1</sup>, and John<sup>1</sup> Riggs. Red lines join spouses, blue lines join siblings; arrows show descent.




Figure 4. The division of the lands of James<sup>1</sup> Riggs among his heirs




Figure 17. Gravestones of Cynthia Jane 2 (Riggs) and James M. Wilson  $\,$




Figure 28. Frank, Byron Riggs<sup>4</sup>, Ina<sup>3</sup> (Riggs), and James Clifford<sup>4</sup> Lewis




Figure 30. Rev. Milford<sup>3</sup> and Mary Riggs and their four sons




Figure 31. Menu from the Riggs' Restaurant, Manhattan




Figure 33. Publicity brochure probably for Harry Spillman<sup>3</sup> Riggs




Figure 37. Autographs of John Perry<sup>4</sup> Riggs Jr. and his brother-in-law, John Klein




Figure 38. Gravestone of John Perry<sup>3</sup> and Rachel Riggs




Figure 40. Col. Kerr Tunis<sup>4</sup> Riggs




Figure 43. James Robert<sup>4</sup> Riggs




Figure 59. Theodore  $Harold^6$  Selin




Figure 60. Robert Parker<sup>6</sup> and Parker Stewart<sup>7</sup> Selin




Figure 67. Robert Meldrum<sup>6</sup> Riggs




Figure 68. George Thomas<sup>6</sup> Riggs




Figure 70. Book by Joy<sup>6</sup> (McCollum) and Zdenek Salzmann




Figure 72. Jennifer<sup>7</sup>, Greg, and Alyssa Marie<sup>8</sup> Dinsmoor




Figure 73. Prof. David<sup>6</sup> Riggs, Stanford University, English Department




Figure 75. Dorothea  $\mathsf{Darrah}^7$  Riggs at her wedding, 1987, with her uncle George  $\mathsf{Thomas}^6$  Riggs
