## LINEAGE LIST NOTATION

This document is written in “*Register* format,” a format popular with scholarly genealogists named for the New England Historic Genealogical Society (NEHGS) and its learned journal the *NEGHS Register*. To facilitate stepping “backward” through the genealogy, I utilize one small addition to standard (actually “modified”) *Register* format. A leading subscript to a person in a lineage list is the person number for that individual in this work. For example, Caleb Smith<sup>6</sup> Riggs (<sub>70</sub>Joseph<sup>5</sup>, Joseph<sup>4</sup>, Edward<sup>3</sup>, Edward<sup>2</sup>, Edward<sup>1</sup>) was son of person 70, Joseph<sup>5</sup> Riggs (<sub>37</sub>Joseph<sup>4</sup>, Edward<sup>3</sup>, Edward<sup>2</sup>, Edward<sup>1</sup>), who in turn was son of person 37, Joseph<sup>4</sup> Riggs, and so forth. This technique may be applied to any person in a lineage list. However, to reduce visual clutter, I will use it here for at most one person per lineage list, usually the first.

A superscript asterisk (\*) indicates the first person in a lineage list who is not genetically related to the next older person in the list. For example, Skylor Nathan<sup>13\*</sup> Knoll (Martha Jane<sup>12</sup>, Edward Clark<sup>11</sup>, Theodore Dalzel A.<sup>10</sup>, Edward<sup>9</sup>, Elias<sup>8</sup>, Elias<sup>7</sup>, Preserve<sup>6</sup>, Zebulon<sup>5</sup>, ?Joseph<sup>4</sup>, Edward<sup>3</sup>, Edward<sup>2</sup>, Edward<sup>1</sup>) was an adopted son of Martha Jane<sup>12</sup> Riggs. Note also the question mark (?) in this lineage list, indicating that the father-son relationship of Joseph<sup>4</sup> and Zebulon<sup>5</sup> has not been proved.

It is traditional in American genealogy to label the immigrant’s generation as no. 1. The generation preceding his is A, preceding A is B, and so forth.

## METHODOLOGY AND STYLE NOTES

**Un sourced material.** Some claims without accompanying sources are important to preserve, as hints to future researchers or simply to indicate that I am aware of commonly claimed dates, names, or places, but am not certain of them. I enter these in footnotes and not in the main text or in red. I do not always explicitly flag these claims as unsourced, but they should be understood as such by their presence in the footnotes only or the red. This type of information often comes from compiled, but unfortunately unsourced, genealogies that have the appearance, to me at least, of being well researched and based on solid evidence. The footnote hint might inspire a future researcher to find the elusive evidence, whereas I had not done so by the time this book went to press.

**Census litany.** Rather than trying to be creative on each of dozens of census readings, I have chosen to state them with a common “litany.” To make census litanies easy to spot, I usually introduce each one with the year. For example, a reading from the U.S. census for 1900 will begin “In 1900 . . . .”

**Online sources.** I have made much use of online sources, usually secondary, such as the listing of gravestones in a particular cemetery. The problem with this practice is the supposed ephemeral nature of the web. Many online sources may simply disappear from the web over time, or change addresses at least. Very notable exceptions are the many databases available from major servers, such as <Ancestry.com>, which I assume, with some trepidation, will be permanently available by some means. The URL for a website is identified by enclosing < > brackets. When a URL needs to wrap at the end of a line for good visual appearance, I have inserted a hyphen in an appropriate location. This line-breaking hyphen should be omitted, of course, when the URL is used as an internet address.

**Abbreviations.** I use abbreviations. With one exception, I always abbreviate state names and month names. The exception: I do not abbrevi-

ate state names in the main text that stand alone. However, state names in footnotes are always abbreviated, except in the titles of books.

I do not abbreviate anything in a quotation. An abbreviation in a quotation is present in the original.

I use succinct forms for the sources in footnotes. The bibliography should be consulted for full expansion of a source reference. See the abbreviations section of the front matter for the full list of abbreviations used in the census references. In all cases, the census was read from <Ancestry.com>, and the roll numbers correspond to the microfilm series used by that organization.

**Verb tenses.** Past tense is normally used, but a record is described in the present—e.g., Joe Gopnik was born in 1836, but a death certificate for Joe Gopnik states that he was born in 1836.

## PREFACE

On 6 Jan. 2025, I submitted a 69-page paper titled “Abraham<sup>1</sup> Rutan in America, Revisited,” to the New York Genealogical & Biographical Society RECORD (the NYG&B RECORD). It appears as of this date (21 Feb. 2025), that article will be published in that fine old journal. In order not to cannibalize it, I urge the reader to consult it for the latest descriptions of the first three generations. The third generation in the article is essentially just a listing, so the fleshing out in this book begins with the sketches of the persons of that generation. I do maintain some notes and figures for the early family sections that do not (or will not) appear in the RECORD paper.

Portions in red are not yet fully vetted. In fact, there are several glaring holes in the following presentation. The text in red seeks to explain what explanations are missing. I do not allow printing of this document since it is so incomplete. I offer it, in its unfinished state, so that others can track my progress while research time passes measured in years.

## First Generation

6. PETER [PIERRE]<sup>2</sup> RUTAN (<sub>1</sub>Abraham<sup>1</sup>) was born in Esopus, baptized in New Paltz, 24 Oct. 1691. He married (1) 7 Nov. 1713, Dutch Reformed Church, Hackensack, Bergen Co., N.Y., GERTRUDE VAN DER HOEF [HOEVE] [HOEVEN]. *This is my line and also Burt and Dick Rutan's line.* Peter married second, probably after 19 Dec. 1744 and certainly before 1 June 1749, ELIZABETH (—) VAN SICKLE.

Known children of the first marriage, to Gertrude (with births after Rachel's estimated at 2-year intervals):

- + 13 i RACHEL<sup>3</sup> RUTAN, born in New Barbadoes Neck, Bergen Co., N.J., baptized 15 Apr. 1719, Dutch Reformed Church, New York City, married ABRAHAM VOLK, and had at least two children.

13. **RACHEL**<sup>3</sup> **RUTAN** (<sub>6</sub>Peter<sup>2</sup>, Abraham<sup>1</sup>) was born in New Barbados Neck, Bergen Co., N.J., and baptized 15 Apr. 1719, Dutch Reformed Church, New York City, with Johannes Van der Hoef, probably her grandfather or uncle, as witness.<sup>[1]</sup> She married 25 June 1741, Dutch Reformed Church, Hackensack, Bergen Co., N.J.,<sup>[2]</sup> **ABRAHAM VOLK**, who was born in Acquackanonk, Essex Co., N.J.

Known children:

- 17 i **HARMPJE**<sup>4</sup> **VOLK**, baptized 19 Sept. 1745, Dutch Reformed Church, Pompton Plains, Bergen Co., N.J.<sup>[3]</sup> The witnesses were Coenraet and Tynntje Leyn—that is, Conrad Lein and his wife Catharine (–) Rutan.
- 18 ii **ABRAHAM**<sup>4</sup> **VOLK**, baptized 24 May 1750, Dutch Reformed Church, Paramus, Bergen Co., N.J.<sup>[4]</sup> The witnesses were Abraham and “Caartie” Rutan. Since Caartie is not a familiar Dutch name, it might be a corruption of Saartie or Saartje. This is not unlikely because we know that Abraham<sup>3</sup> and Sarah Rutan witnessed, on 18

14. PETER<sup>3</sup> RUTAN (<sub>6</sub>Peter<sup>2</sup>, Abraham<sup>1</sup>) was born say 1721, an estimate based on his older sister Rachel's known baptism on 15 Apr. 1719. He died after 3 July 1753, when he applied for a tavern license in Morris Co., N.J.,<sup>[6]</sup> and presumably before 16 Mar. 1754, when his estate was inventoried in Morris Co. (q.v.)—certainly before 28 Mar. 1754, when his widow was bonded as administratrix (q.v.). So his youngest child would have to have been born—at the latest—in late 1754.

His eldest child, Daniel<sup>4</sup>, was probably born in about 1747, as he was age 15 on 29 Nov. 1762 when a guardian was appointed.<sup>[7]</sup> Peter<sup>3</sup> was 21 in say 1742, based on his birth year estimate, and thus marriageable. He married by 1746 or early 1747, per his eldest child's birth, SARAH THOMPSON, daughter of John Thompson. That Peter's wife was named Sarah follows from the following estate records:

Sarah's full name comes from Littell's *First Settlers*, which has this to say about Sarah Thompson, daughter of John Thompson:

5. Sarah married 1st, Mr. Van Sickle, of Long Hill, and had a daughter, Elizabeth, who married Jacob Britton, son of William. [See Britton.] Sarah married 2d, Mr. Rutan, who had a son, Peter, who lived in Albany, N.Y. She married 3d, James Enos, or Innes, of Long Hill.<sup>[9]</sup>

Littell's *First Settlers* (often "Littell" here for short) is a gold mine of information. It was published in 1852 by a member of the Littell family who lived among the families covered in the book. But it must be handled with care for there are known, even obvious, errors. For example, at one place, Littell refers to Sarah as a daughter of Thomas Thompson, but this is inconsistent with his own genealogy of the John Thompson family elsewhere in the same book, which has Thomas as a sister of Sarah, and both as children of John Thompson.<sup>[10]</sup>

Littell, in the quotation above for daughter Sarah Thompson, states (A) that she married Mr. Van Sickle before she married Mr. Rutan. It further seems to say (B) that Mr. Rutan came with a son Peter<sup>4</sup>—that is, from a previous marriage. But it does not have to be read that way. I will show that even if Peter<sup>3</sup> had married another woman first, his son Peter<sup>4</sup> would not have been old enough to have been from anywhere else (like

Albany) when Sarah later married Peter<sup>3</sup>. I will take the Littell wording to mean instead that Mr. Rutan and Sarah had a son, Peter<sup>4</sup>—that is, statement (B) is false. Otherwise, we would have to find a first wife for Peter<sup>3</sup> Rutan, and I have found no evidence for one nor even a mention of one. However, we will revisit this possibility.

Notice that Littell does not specify that Mr. Rutan was Peter Rutan. In fact, although he sketches Peter<sup>2</sup> Rutan, he gives him only one son, Abraham<sup>3</sup>, and omits Peter<sup>3</sup> altogether.<sup>[11]</sup> Similarly, Littell does not specify Mr. Van Sickle's first name, although he hints, as will be demonstrated, that it might be Samuel.

I now show that statement (A), like (B), is false, that Littell interchanged the first two husbands of Sarah Thompson—that she married, first, Mr. Rutan, then second, Mr. Van Sickle. Furthermore, we will find that Mr. Van Sickle was Abraham Van Sickle, not Samuel. Here are the estate abstracts for Abraham Van Sickle:

1759, Aug. 7. Sickle (van Sickle), Abraham, of Morris Co., yeoman; will of. Wife, Sarah. Only child, Elisabeth. Real and personal estate. Executors—the wife and “Ensyn” Thomas Baker, of the Congregation of New Providence in the “Borough” of Elizabeth. Witnesses—Jonathan Elmer, **Piter Rutan, Abraham Rutan**. Proved Dec. 10, 1759. | Lib. G, p. 139.<sup>[12]</sup>

1759, Aug. 25. Van Sickle, Abraham, of Morris Co. Int. Inventory, £333.2.10., incl. 62 bush. of corn in the ear; 17 do. of buckwheat; bonds, cash and notes, £150.4.7; made by William Broadwell, **Abraham Rutan**, Thomas Baker and Sarah van Sichel.<sup>[13]</sup>

So Abraham Van Sickle's wife was named Sarah, and that was her name on 25 Aug. 1759, and they had an only child, Elizabeth Van Sickle. This matches Littell's description of Sarah Thompson. And the wit-

nesses included “Piter” and Abraham Rutan, which is consistent with Sarah’s being Peter<sup>3</sup>’s wife and Abraham<sup>3</sup>’s sister-in-law. This Peter Rutan had to have been Peter<sup>2</sup>, who was alive, as we have seen, until his death 29 June 1774 in New Providence.<sup>[14]</sup> It couldn’t have been Peter<sup>3</sup>, who died about 1754. It couldn’t have been Peter<sup>4</sup>, who was indeed a son of Peter<sup>3</sup> as implied by Littell, because he was too young at this time, as we will see.

Notice the name Thomas Baker in these records. He married Hannah Thompson, a sister of Sarah Thompson, and hence another daughter of John Thompson.<sup>[15]</sup> He appears in several important guardianship records here.

The following records, for example, tell us about the child, Elizabeth Van Sickle, and her first guardian, Thomas Baker:

1762, Nov. 29. Van Sickle, Elizabeth, of Morris Co. Ward. Aged 6 years and one of the children of Abraham Van Sickle, of said Co., deceased. Guardian—Thomas Baker, of Essex Co. Fellowbondsmen—William Callwall, of Morris Co. | Lib. H, p. 203; File No. 177 N.

1770, April 12. Van Sickle, Elizabeth, of Morris Co. Ward. Daughter of Abraham Van Sickle, of said Co., deceased; who makes choice of Cornelius Ludlow as her Guardian.

1770, April 12. Guardian—Cornelius Ludlow. Fellowbondsmen—**Abraham Rutan**; both of Morris Township. Witness—Abraham Burgean. | Lib. K, p. 191.<sup>[16]</sup>

So Elizabeth Van Sickle, daughter of Abraham and Sarah Van Sickle, was age 6 on 29 Nov. 1762, implying that she was born about 1756, well after the death of Peter<sup>3</sup> Rutan which occurred presumably before the

inventory of his estate on 16 Mar. 1754. Assuming Abraham's wife, Sarah, was Sarah Thompson, then her marriage to Mr. Van Sickle had to occur after her marriage to Mr. Rutan, say about 1755. She might have married Mr. Van Sickle earlier if Peter Rutan died nearer 3 July 1753, when he applied for a tavern license, the last known recorded date of his existence. But Peter's widow, Sarah, was made administratrix 28 Mar. 1754, suggesting that she had not yet remarried at that date, and assuming again that she was Sarah Thompson. Therefore, let's use about 1755 as a likely date for her second marriage, to Abraham Van Sickle.

Littell's *First Settlers* implies, but never quite states, that the Mr. Van Sickle who married Sarah Thompson was Samuel, not Abraham, Van Sickle. Under his sketch of Samuel Van Sickle, Littell has this:

Note.—Sarah Thompson, daughter of Thomas [sic] Thompson, married, 1st, Mr. Van Sickle, of Long Hill, and had a daughter, Elizabeth, who married Jacob Britton, son of W l[i?]am [sic, a printing error] [See Britton] She married, 2d, Mr. Rutan, who had a son, Peter, who lived in Albany, N.Y.; 3d, James Enos, or Innes, of Long Hill.<sup>17</sup>

The note is almost identical to the paragraph about the fifth child Sarah of John (not Thomas) Thompson, quoted previously. Notice that Littell does not explicitly state that Samuel Van Sickle was the Mr. Van Sickle whom Sarah married. The placement of the note was meant, presumably, to imply it, but cautiously. And under Samuel Van Sickle's children, Littell asks, "4. Elizabeth. (Is not this Elizabeth the wife of Jacob Britton.)" We shall present a more likely Elizabeth Van Sickle as Jacob's wife, a daughter of Abraham Van Sickle.

So Littell ambiguously made Samuel Van Sickle the husband of Sarah Thompson. To complete the evidence he offers, here is his treatment of Jacob "Brittin," son of William (which gets the relationship to Thomas Thompson correctly this time):

As a positive check on Littell, a church record shows that Jacob “Britian” married 3 Mar. 1774, New Providence Presbyterian Church, Essex Co., N.J., Elizabeth “Sickel.”<sup>[19]</sup>

Furthermore, here is the abstract of Jacob Britton’s will, which verifies that his wife’s name was Elizabeth, assuming the administratrix was his wife:

1787, March 5. Brittin, Jacob, of Morristown, Morris Co. Int. Adm’x—Elizabeth Brittin. Fellowbondsman—Kennedy Vance; both of said place. Witnesses—Sarah Campfield and Jabez Campfield, Surrogate.

1784, Oct. 11. Inventory, made by Cornelius Ludlow and Peter Layton. | Lib. 29, p. 472.<sup>[20]</sup>

Notice that this corroborates everything we have deduced about Elizabeth Van Sickle without ever invoking a man named Samuel Van Sickle. I will therefore assert that Samuel Van Sickle was not Sarah Thompson’s husband. He was instead Abraham Van Sickle, and he was her second husband. **We shall return to her putative third husband, James Enos [Innes] later.**

Other received wisdom about Peter<sup>3</sup> Rutan further confuses the issues. This is from Keegan’s *Third Rutan Family Index*, which is not a source but rather a 2010 compendium of Rutan names, with brief descriptions, and pointers to supporting materials:

Peter Rutan, Jr - (c1720-1754) p/Abraham Rutan-Geertruy Vanderhoef m Sarah Thompson of Long Hill; Sarah moved from Morris

Co. to Frankford Twp, Sussex Co. by 1774; Peter was Sarah's second husband; she m (1) James Enos (3) Samuel Van Sickle<sup>[21]</sup>

Keegan identifies Mr. Rutan with Peter Rutan, with dates that agree closely with ours, and Mr. Van Sickle with the erroneous Samuel Van Sickle. And makes James Enos, husband no. 1, not no. 3, for Sarah Thompson. *I have failed so far to place Sarah in Sussex Co. in 1774. There was a Sarah Rutan, 80-90, in the 1830 census of Frankford Twp., Sussex Co., N.J., but she would have been born 1740-1750 and only a child in 1746 or 1747 for marriage to Peter<sup>3</sup> Rutan.*<sup>[22]</sup>

### The Children

From the New Jersey will abstracts we learn about three sons of this family, one of whom chose Thomas Baker as his guardian, with Thomas Baker probably serving as guardian for the other two. Notice that the first record bears the same date as the guardianship record presented previously for Elizabeth Van Sickle, also with Thomas Baker as guardian. And it appears on the same original Morris Co. record page:

1762, Nov. 29. **Rutan, Daniel**, of Morris Co. Ward, aged 15 years, and one of the children of **Peter Ratan**, of said Co., deceased. Guardian—Thomas Baker, of Essex Co. Fellowbondsman—William Calwall, of Morris Co. | Lib. H, p. 203; File No. 177 N.

[Followed here by the 1761 will abstract for **John Rutan** of Morristown, Morris Co.—see sketch of Peter<sup>3</sup>'s brother, John<sup>3</sup>.]

1762, Sept. 4. **Rutan, John and Peter**, of Morris Co. Petition of Kennedy Vance, Mica Howell, John Maxfell, Jr., William Baker, James Calwall,

Notice that the 15 Nov. 1762 wording has Daniel, Peter, and John as brothers, hence all sons of Peter<sup>3</sup>.

Daughter Elizabeth Van Sickle, from Sarah Thompson's second marriage, would have been in the care of Thomas Baker at the same time as the three sons of Peter<sup>3</sup> Rutan, from her first marriage.

#### **Ouke Johnson Sr.**

On 2 Sept. 1752, Ouke Johnson Sr., signed his will in Morris Twp., Morris Co., N.J., and it was proved 18 Dec. 1752, with Peter<sup>3</sup> Rutan as an executor. Except for the 3 July 1753 application for a tavern license, this is the last factual data we have for Peter. Sarah Rutan is mentioned in this record, but not her relationship to Peter. We shall see that Abraham<sup>3</sup>, Peter<sup>3</sup>'s brother, lost by inaction a plantation in Hampshire Co., Va. (yet another brother, John<sup>3</sup>, had such a plantation) to "Okey" Johnson, who might have been the same person as Ouke, or related to him:

1752, June 16. Johnson, Catharine, of Somerset Co. Int. A Citation to William Johnson, Ouke Johnson, Barbara Billieu and Amiantie Bodine, children of Ouke Johnson and Catherine his wife, both deceased, to show cause why letters should not be granted to Thomas Aten, a creditor.

1752, July 20. Adm'r—Ouke Johnson, of Morris Co. [cf. similar item of same date following the 2 Sept. 1752 item below].

1752, Aug. 1. Inventory, £31.13.6, by James Calwall and John Bedeel [Bedell], Jr. [cf. similar inventory item following the 2 Sept. 1752 below].

1753, May 7. Account filed by Administrator. | Lib. F, pp. 58, 59.<sup>[24]</sup>

The items above are jumbled but paint the following picture:

–16 June 1752: Ouke Johnson and Catherine his wife, of Somerset Co., had both died, intestate, leaving children William Johnson, Ouke Johnson (Jr.), Barbara Billieu, and Auriantie Bodine.<sup>[27]</sup>

This is an excellent source.

So it appears that Abraham<sup>3</sup> and John<sup>3</sup> made moves to acquire land in Hampshire Co., Va., but Abraham<sup>3</sup> backed out and Ouke Johnson took it instead. Then somehow Ouke’s brother Abraham Johnson also got involved there.

### Counterfactual Version

A brief summary of this sketch is this: Sarah Thompson married Peter<sup>3</sup> Rutan say 1746 and had all three Rutan sons with him during about 1747–1751, assuming 2-year birth intervals. Then Peter<sup>3</sup> died sometime in the period 3 July 1753–16 Mar. 1754, and Sarah was there for the inventory and administration of his estate. Then she married, probably sometime during 1755, Abraham Van Sickle, and had daughter Elizabeth in about 1756.

I promised to revisit the alternative version, suggested by Littell, that Sarah married Mr. Van Sickle *before* she married Mr. Rutan, who came with a son Peter<sup>4</sup> who lived in Albany. This would require Peter’s marriage to another woman who would mother the three sons. Then that

woman would have to die, and Peter to remarry to Sarah Thompson, and then Peter to die sometime during the period roughly 1751 to 1755. Then Sarah would remarry to Abraham Van Sickle. This is barely possibly, but seems unnecessarily complicated given that we have no knowledge of another wife. The seeming force of Littell's implication that Mr. Rutan came with a son Peter "living in Albany" loses all its strength when we realize that Peter<sup>4</sup> would have been a mere child, in guardianship, at Sarah's supposed marriage to Mr. Rutan, and so probably would not yet have been living anywhere else.

Known children:

- + 19 i DANIEL<sup>4</sup> RUTAN, born about 1747 (aged 15 on 29 Nov. 1762 when a guardian, Thomas Baker, was appointed), married SARAH —, and had 12 children.
- + 20 ii PETER<sup>4</sup> RUTAN, born say 1749. He was underage on 4 Sept. 1762, when it was proposed that he and his brother John<sup>4</sup> Rutan be assigned Thomas Baker as a guardian. **I believe (rather shakily at this point) him to be an overlooked Revolutionary War Patriot.** See appendix. Littell says he was "living in Albany."
- + 21 iii JOHN<sup>4</sup> RUTAN, [\[Allegany John\]](#) born 16 May 1751, New Jersey, married CATHERINE JONES, and had nine children. John was underage on 4 Sept. 1762 when it was proposed that he and his brother Peter<sup>4</sup> Rutan be assigned Thomas Baker as a guardian. The last possible date that his father Peter<sup>3</sup> could have fathered him must have been after 3 July 1753, the tavern license application, and before 16 Mar. 1754, Peter<sup>3</sup>'s own estate inventory. Adding nine months gives the upper bound range on John<sup>4</sup>'s birth to be after 3 Apr. 1754 and before 16 Dec. 1754. **[We must be careful not to confuse this John<sup>4</sup> (Peter<sup>3</sup>, Peter<sup>2</sup>) [Allegany John] with his cousin John<sup>4</sup> (John<sup>3</sup>, Peter<sup>2</sup>) [Hampshire John].]**

From Littell's *First Settlers*:

Abraham Rutan was an Elder in the Presbyterian Church of New Providence.<sup>[41]</sup> He married, —; she died 15th Dec. 1788; they had 5 sons and 8 daughters:

1. John, who married, 20th March, 1774, Catherine Jones, and went to the west. [According to Keegan, this is an error. John was son of brother Peter<sup>3</sup>, but brought up by Abraham<sup>3</sup>. Supported by a Bible record at GSNJ. Which I have not seen.]
2. Samuel married Eleanor Bedell, daughter of Jacob, and went west. [See Bedell.]
3. Peter, born 1757, and died 12th April, 1802, aged 45 years, unmarried.

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m Anna – Ens NJ.” This seems to be the source for the 1734 date, but I suspect it is an estimate based on the first child's birth in 1754. It seems late compared to sibling Rachel born about 1719—the mother, Gertrude (bap. 29 Mar. 1688), would have been about 33–37 for these latter three births if they occurred as estimated. She would have been about 46 for a 1734 birth.

We shall see that the Littell treatment is correct in all aspects, save the one exception, identified above, for putative son John.

Daughters, Sarah (wife of Simeon Simpson), Hannah (wife of John Calwall), Mary (wife of Mathias Roll), Rosannah (wife of Thomas Parrot), Martha (wife of Moses Camp), Anne (wife of Moses Squire), and Elizabeth (wife of Abraham Calwall), each £15; and daughter, Elizabeth, is also to have a cow. Grandchildren, children of John Miller, i.e., Abraham, Anne and James, each £4, when of age. Executors—son, Peter, and son-in-law, John Calwall. Witnesses—John Carle, Hugh Calwall, Rachel Squire. Proved Oct. 27, 1792. | Lib. 34, p. 148. | 1792, Dec. 1. Inventory, £301,15., made by Hugh Calwall and Nathaniel Littell. | File 802N.<sup>[44]</sup>

This is the treatment in Littell's *First Settlers*, of the William Cauldwell family that intermarried with Abraham Rutan's family:

### Revolutionary War service

Abraham Rutan served as an Ensign in Capt. Layton's Company, "Eastern Battalion," Morris Co., N.J., in the Revolutionary War.<sup>[46]</sup>

On 28 June 1778, Ensign Rutan was paid £9.5.10 for service in Elizabeth Town in Seeleys Morris Battalion under Brig. Winds. On 2 July 1778, similarly, Ens. "Retan" was paid £2.11 for service in Elizabeth Town in Seeleys Morris under Brig. Winds.<sup>[47]</sup> Seeley was Sylvanus Seeley.<sup>[48]</sup>

On 25 Oct. 1748, Thomas Lord Fairfax, Proprietor of the Northern Neck of Virginia, deeded 354 acres of land on Pattersons Creek to “John Ratan of the county.” We will demonstrate in brother John<sup>3</sup> Rutan’s sketch that he was this “John Ratan.” On 5 June 1767, Thomas, Lord Fairfax, in Frederick Co., Va., granted 200 acres in the Northern Neck of Virginia, for a certain annual rent, to **Okey Johnson** of Hampshire Co. “on a Branch of Meadow Run a Drain of Pattersons Creek in the s<sup>d</sup> County which s<sup>d</sup> land was survey’d for **Abraham Rutton** and a Plot thereof return’d from under the Hand of David Vance Dated October 30th: 1752 The said Abraham Rutton not Complying with an Advertisement Issued from my Office dated March 26th: 1765 requiring all Persons who had surveys in this Office Dated before the Year 1761 To pay for the same before a certain Time therein Mention’d or they should Forfeit all right & Claim to the s<sup>d</sup> Survey.”<sup>[49]</sup>

This implies that Abraham<sup>3</sup> Rutan also sought a plantation in Hampshire Co., Va., and it was surveyed for him, 30 Oct. 1752, but he failed to follow through on it, so the 200 acres went instead to Okey Johnson. I suggest that Okey Johnson is the same person as Ouke Johnson, for whose estate Peter<sup>3</sup> was an executor.

There was a Sarah Manning, daughter of Trustrum Manning, mentioned in his (Trustrum's) will signed in Piscataway, Middlesex Co., Province of New Jersey, 16 Jan. 1771 and proved 15 Feb. 1779. It mentions "my beloved Wife Johannah Manning," "my Son Trustrum Manning," "my Son Joseph Manning," "my Son David Manning," "my Grandson Enoc Manning Son of my Son Joseph Manning" not yet 21, "my Grandson John Drake Son of Joseph Drake" not yet 21, "my Grand Daughter Sarah Drake daughter of Joseph Drake" not yet 18, "my Daughter Sarah Manning," "my Grandaughter Lydia Manning daughter of Joseph Manning" not yet 19, "my Son Andrew Manning," "I also give to my Daugh-

ter **Sarah Manning** one feather bed and furniture Suitable for it, and also one Cow and one two Year Old Heifer and a Chest of drawers now Standing in my House Six pewter Plates two Pewter platters and one pewter bason and one Black walnut Table,” “I do now Stand bound for Benjamin Manning,” no relation stated, for an obligation of a “Considerable Sum of Money.” Executors: “friend Isaac Stolle and my Son David Manning.” Witnesses: Jonathan F. Randolph Jr., John Holton Jr., James Fitzrandolph Jr.<sup>[50]</sup> **No spouse or kin is mentioned for Sarah Manning, so she appears to be unmarried in 1771, hence not the wife of John<sup>3</sup> Rutan.**

1761, Feb. 23. Rutan, John, of Morristown, Morris Co.; will of. Wife, Sarah, use of my plantation for 13 years, and then she is to have 1/3 of the same. Daughter, Sarah, £10, at her marriage. Son, John, £30, when 21 **[so not 21 in 1761, implying he was born after 1740]. Son, John, to have my plantation in Hampshire Co., in Virginia.** Executors—wife, Sarah, and my friend, Elias Soullud. Witnesses—James Calwall, William Broadwell, Zacheriah Vansickel. Proved April 3, 1761.

The Abraham Rutan in the inventory record was probably John<sup>3</sup>’s brother, Abraham<sup>3</sup> Rutan.

Here is John<sup>3</sup>’s actual last will and testament:

Imprimis I give devise and bequeath unto **my beloved wife Sarah** the use and improvement of my dwelling house and plantation whereon I

Item my will is that at the decease of my wife such part as shall then remain of her dowry given in this my last will and testament be equally divided between my son John and my four daughters Sarah Rachael Elisabeth and Mary

Item I do appoint my beloved and trusty wife Sarah Rutan Executrix and Elias Soullud my trusty friend in Essex county to execute this my last will and testament

Signed Sealed pronounced and declared the last will and of the said John Rutan this twenty third day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand hundred [sic] and sixty one — in presence of

James Calwall William Broadwell Zachariah [his mark] Vansickel }  
John [his mark] Rutan [LS]

[Followed by the proof on 3 April 1761 by James Calwall and William Broadwell, and by the swearing in of Sarah Rutan as executrix. One notable line in the proof: the witnesses signed the will “in the same room where the said John Rutan lay and at the same time he signed it, but he could not see them do it, being blinded with the smallpox.”]<sup>52</sup>

**Placeholder.** There is an estate settlement for Zachariah Van “Sickel” in Allegany Co., Md., on 10 Mar. 1835.<sup>[53]</sup> **[But this is Allegany not Hampshire]**

N.B. John’s 1761 will mentions “my plantation in Hampshire Co., in Virginia.” **Hampshire Co., Va.**, became effective in 1754. The southern half, more-or-less, became Hardy Co., Va., in 1786 (and Pendleton Co. later was taken from the southern half of Hardy Co.). At the time, its northern boundary was the southern boundary of the westernmost part of the Maryland neck. Hampshire Co. (and Hardy and Pendleton) became part of West Virginia when that state was formed in 1863. In 1866 Mineral Co., W.Va., was taken from the western half of the remaining Hampshire Co.

N.B. Modern Mineral Co., W.Va., formerly Hampshire Co., protrudes north into the neck of Maryland at Cumberland, Md. The neck is only about 4 miles thick at this point—that is, West Virginia is only 4 miles from Pennsylvania to the north here. The northernmost point of Mineral Co. is defined by a hook in the North Branch of the Potomac River—which also defines the boundary between West Virginia and Maryland.

## PETER<sup>2</sup> RUTAN FAMILY

N.B. Patterson Creek lies in modern Mineral Co., W.Va., and runs northeast into the (North Branch of the) Potomac, east of Cumberland, Md., the county seat of Allegany Co., Md. *Wikipedia* states that *the Patterson Creek watershed contains two-thirds of Mineral Co.* (emphasis added). In a sense, Allegany Co., Md., surrounds the “peak” of Mineral Co., W.Va. (part of old Hampshire Co., W.Va.) formed by the hook in the Potomac at Cumberland, Md.

Later we will find Rutans in Rostraver Twp., Westmoreland Co., Pa., south of Pittsburgh. Rostraver Twp., Pa., lies about 65 miles northwest of Cumberland, Md., as the crow flies. **Were these the same Rutans?**

From a deed in son John<sup>4</sup>'s sketch we learn that this plantation of 60 acres was “known and distinguished by No 4 in the Plat of Survey upon Pattersons Creek of Potowmack River,” being a grant made 21 Oct. 1740 [sic] “from the Lord Proprietor to John Rutan (Father to the said John Rutan) now deceased” (q.v.).

N.B., modern Patterson Creek, on the Potomac River, is in Mineral Co., W.Va., *immediately south and west across the Potomac from Allegany Co., Md.* (my emphasis). **The point is that Hampshire Co., W.Va., and Allegany Co., Md., are not the same place—although quite close.**

N.B. Frederick Co., Va., was organized in 1743. Hampshire Co. was formed from Frederick Co. in 1754 (so it is not clear what exactly was granted in 1740—in fact, we will find 1740 incorrect, and the correct date, 1748, makes sense).

I found the actual deed in the Virginia State Land Office Northern Neck Grants, Vol. G, 1747–1751 (Figure 17): On 25 Oct. 1748, Thomas Lord Fairfax, Proprietor of the Northern Neck of Virginia, deeded 354 acres of land on Pattersons Creek to “John Ratan of the county.” The only county mentioned in the deed is Fairfax Co., where the deed was signed, and which abutted Frederick Co. at the time. The tract was known as No. 4 on the Plat of Survey made by Mr. James Penn. The annual rent was one shilling sterling per 50 acres. The deed does not mention the Potomac River, but Pattersons Creek flows north into the Potomac in this area. Tracts No. 1 and No. 2 are described as on “Patter-

sons Creek of Potomack River.” And of future importance, “Abram” Johnson of Frederick Co. was granted 26 Oct. 1748 the adjoining tract, No. 5, of 309 acres.<sup>[54]</sup>

**Placeholder.** On 5 June 1767, Thomas, Lord Fairfax, in Frederick Co., Va., granted 200 acres in the Northern Neck of Virginia, for a certain annual rent, to **Okey Johnson** of **Hampshire Co.** “on a Branch of Meadow Run a Drain of Pattersons Creek in the s<sup>d</sup> County which s<sup>d</sup> land was survey’d for **Abraham Rutton** and a Plot thereof return’d from under the Hand of David Vance Dated October 30th: 1752 The said Abraham Rutton not Complying with an Advertisement Issued from my Office dated March 26th: 1765 requiring all Persons who had surveys in this Office Dated before the Year 1761 To pay for the same before a certain Time therein Mention’d or they should Forfeit all right & Claim to the s<sup>d</sup> Survey.”<sup>[55]</sup>

Children (in will order, will signed in Morristown, Morris Co., N.J., suggesting the probable birthplace for these children):

### The Peter<sup>3</sup> Peter<sup>2</sup> Branch

19. DANIEL<sup>4</sup> RUTAN (<sub>14</sub>Peter<sup>3</sup>, Peter<sup>2</sup>, Abraham<sup>1</sup>) was born about 1747. He was aged 15 on 29 Nov. 1762 when a guardian, Thomas Baker, was appointed.<sup>[57]</sup> His father Peter<sup>3</sup> had died before 16 Mar. 1754, when Daniel<sup>4</sup> would have been about 7. He died before a 1793 deed to his widow (q.v.). He married SARAH —.

On 11 [empty] 1793, Nathaniel Hazen, late of Newtown, Sussex Co., N.J., sold to “Sary” (var., Sarah) Rutan, widow of Daniel Rutan deceased, for an undisclosed amount, a tract of land in Newtown Twp. “under the foot Pahaqualing Mountain,” of 30.97 acres. It was acknowledged 6 Feb. 1794.<sup>[58]</sup>

On 12 Aug. 1797, Martin Ryerson, Deputy Surveyor of the Eastern Division of the State of New Jersey, surveyed for Joseph Sharp, Elias Ogden, Martin Ryerson, and Richard Edsall Jr., a tract of unappropriated land at the foot of Minisink Mountain, Frankford Twp., Sussex Co., N.J., “Beginning at a small Hickory tree marked on four sides with a blaze and three notches, standing on the North East side of the **Widow Rattan’s meadow**, . . . to the place of Beginning,” containing 63.46 acres. The four principals were granted the right, on 18 June 1797 by Elisha Boudinot, to 2,446 acres in “any part unappropriated in the Eastern Division of New Jersey except Romopock and the Sussex Allotments.” This survey is for part of that.<sup>[59]</sup>

## PETER<sup>2</sup> RUTAN FAMILY

Also on 12 Aug. 1797, apparently this same tract of land, of 63.46 acres, was surveyed for Peter Rattan, including Pater Rattan's improvements. **Peter Rattan and Ab<sup>m</sup> Rattan** served as chain bearers. Peter was probably Peter<sup>5</sup> Rutan (*Daniel*<sup>4</sup>) and Abraham his brother.<sup>[60]</sup>

On 8 Aug. 1797, a survey was returned to the same parties as above, Joseph Sharp, Elias Ogden, Martin Ryerson, and Richard Edsall Jr., a tract of 80.25 acres in Frankford Twp., Sussex Co., N.J. **Peter Rattan** served as a chainbearer.<sup>[61]</sup>

On 15 June 1801, Martin Ryerson, Deputy Surveyor of the Eastern Division of the State of New Jersey, surveyed for himself, a tract of unappropriated land "between John Beamer's and **Peter Rattan's**," in Frankford Twp., Sussex Co., N.J., "Beginning at a hickory tree marked on four sides with a blaze and three notches, standing at and on the North bank of a branch of Pauling's kill called Nightingale's brook and about eight rods below a small Swamp and at the foot of a Falls in said brook and at the lower end of a small rocky Island, . . . to the place of beginning," containing 17.34 acres. Also a tract containing 10.93 acres [etc.].<sup>[62]</sup>

On 1 Nov. 1809, Levi Ayers Jr. and Peter Rattan requested a survey of a tract of unappropriated land of 52.85 acres at the foot of Minisink Mountain in the townships of Frankford and Wantage, Sussex Co, N.J. The land description mentions land of John William and Nathan Shepherd. The survey was returned 14 Oct. 1811.<sup>[63]</sup>

In the Nov. Term 1838 of the Sussex Co., N.J., Orphans Court, a partition for land having belonged to Daniel Rutan, "late of the County of Sussex," lists the children and heirs at law of the said Daniel as "Peter

Rutan Daniel Rutan Sarah Rutan Samuel Rutan James Rutan Anne Rutan Lydia Rutan Rebecca Rutan Elizabeth Rutan Mary Rutan Abraham Rutan and David Rutan. Daniel Rutan (Jr.) had purchased the shares of said Peter, Samuel, James, and Rebecca “now the wife of James Mattison.” The said Sarah had intermarried with Jacob Strubb [Struble?] and since died. The said Elizabeth had intermarried with Henry Rodney and since died. Both daughters had left several minor children as heirs. The said Mary intermarried with Michael Mattocks (var., Mattox), and the said Anna (var., Anny) with Moses [Barpoe?]. The said Lydia had sold her share to Martin Rutan (of unstated relation). The dower of the widow, Sarah Rutan, was also mentioned. A committee of three disinterested persons devised a set of 13 lots and distributed them to the heirs (and widow) by 28 May 1839. This document contains a map of the lots.<sup>[64]</sup>

20. PETER<sup>4</sup> RUTAN (<sub>14</sub>Peter<sup>3</sup>, Peter<sup>2</sup>, Abraham<sup>1</sup>) was born say 1749. He was underage on 4 Sept. 1762, when it was proposed that he and his brother John<sup>4</sup> Rutan be assigned Thomas Baker as a guardian.<sup>[74]</sup> I have placed Peter<sup>4</sup> in birth order before John<sup>4</sup>, assuming births separated by about two years. However, the *N. J. Calendar of Wills* guardianship record lists them in opposite order (q.v.).

According to Littell, “Sarah married 2d, Mr. Rutan, who had a son, Peter, who lived in Albany, N.Y.”<sup>[75]</sup> Sarah here was Sarah Thompson, wife of Peter<sup>3</sup> Rutan. **But note that Littell has Peter<sup>4</sup> son of a former Mrs. Rutan, not Sarah, whereas I have Sarah as his mother.**

I believe Peter<sup>4</sup> Rutan (Peter<sup>3</sup>, Peter<sup>2</sup>, Abraham<sup>1</sup>) to be Lieut. Peter Rutan, Revolutionary War veteran (see appendix), [well, maybe not] not to be confused with third cousin Peter<sup>4</sup> Ruttan (William<sup>3</sup>, Paul<sup>2</sup>, Abraham<sup>1</sup>), a Loyalist and a founder of the Canadian branch of the family.

**Could this Peter<sup>4</sup> Rutan be Lieut. Peter Rutan, who served under Col. James Livingston in New York during the Rev. War, 1777–1779 (and for which there are many records)? This places him near Albany, and born about 1749 works. Oddly, there seem to be no genealogical records for him. Nor even much of a Revolutionary War remembrance.**

## PETER<sup>2</sup> RUTAN FAMILY

First we ensure that they are not the same person. Peter<sup>4</sup> Ruttan joined the British in 1776 in New York City. Peter<sup>4</sup> Rutan joined the Americans in Sept. 1777 near Loudon's Ferry, on command to Fort Schuyler. Both of these locations are, as we shall see, on the Mohawk River just north of or west of (respectively) Albany, N.Y., where in fact he was "on command" in Dec. 1777.

21. JOHN<sup>4</sup> RUTAN (<sub>14</sub>Peter<sup>3</sup>, Peter<sup>2</sup>, Abraham<sup>1</sup>) [Allegany John] was born 16 May 1751,<sup>[76]</sup> New Jersey, and died 7 Feb. 1838 (Hoye),<sup>[77]</sup> after he signed his will 2 Sept. 1837 in Allegany Co., Md., and before it was proved 13 Mar. 1839.<sup>[78]</sup> He married 20 Mar. 1774, New Providence, Essex Co., N.J.,<sup>[79]</sup> CATHERINE JONES, who was born 2 June 1757.<sup>[80]</sup> Littell has them removed to "the West." They actually went to Maryland. Catherine, 80–90, was still alive (by deduction) in the 1840 census, residing with her son, Daniel<sup>5</sup> (q.v.), in Allegany Co., Md., and was still alive on 19 Oct. 1840 according to an estate record (q.v.).

**MAJOR PROBLEM:** *The Hoyes of Maryland* claims John<sup>4</sup> (Abraham<sup>3</sup>, Peter<sup>2</sup>, Abraham<sup>1</sup>) as their Allegany Co., Md., progenitor,<sup>[81]</sup> and Littell's

*First Settlers* was probably the source of that lineage.<sup>[82]</sup> But Kagan's *Second Rutan Index* states that although John<sup>4</sup> was raised by Abraham<sup>3</sup>, he was actually John<sup>4</sup> (*Peter<sup>3</sup>, Peter<sup>2</sup>, Abraham<sup>1</sup>*)—that is, he was raised by his uncle after his father Peter<sup>3</sup>'s early death.<sup>[83]</sup> This is supported by the Bible birth record for John<sup>4</sup>. All three of these references agree that John's wife, Catherine, was Catherine Jones. **But here's the real problem:** There is another John<sup>4</sup> (*John<sup>3</sup>, Peter<sup>2</sup>, Abraham<sup>1</sup>*) who also was born about the same time in the same part of New Jersey and also married a Catharine, and went to Hampshire Co., Va., which we find (after a couple of name changes) abuts Allegany Co., Md. These are almost certainly different families, since this latter John<sup>4</sup> inherited John<sup>3</sup>'s Hampshire Co., Va., estate. The John<sup>4</sup> Rutan who went to Allegany Co., Md., was the John who married Catherine Jones. His descendants have installed a monument that says so.<sup>[84]</sup> More convincing is that one of his descendants, Daniel Jones Hoye, born 1819, was probably named for her, and she was still alive at the time.<sup>[85]</sup>

John Rutan is listed in Stryker's official registry of *New Jersey Men in the Revolutionary War*.<sup>[86]</sup> (The other John [[Hampshire John](#)] was already

in Hampshire Co., Va., by 1770 (q.v.). He was supposedly also in the Revolutionary War, but in Pennsylvania.)

N.B. Allegany Co., Md., was formed in 1789 from Washington Co., Md., which itself had been formed from Frederick Co. in 1776. Allegany became then the westernmost county of Maryland. Then in 1872 Garrett Co. was formed from Allegany Co., and Garrett then became the westernmost county.

In his will of 2 Sept. 1837, John Rutan of Allegany Co., Md., mentions “my dear wife Catherine,” “my son David,” “my daughter Sarah More,” “my son Peter Rutan,” “my son Daniel Rutan,” “my two grand children Sarah and Isac Rutan children of my son Isac Rutan,” “my daughter Mary hoye,” “my daughter Catherine,” “my grandson Jesse Rutan son of my daughter Ordery [sic] Rutan.” He appointed David Rutan and Joseph Frantz executors. Witnesses were John Frantz, Stephen P. Rutan, Joseph J. Frantz, and Daniel J. Hoye. It was proved 13 Mar. 1839.<sup>[87]</sup>

An additional abstract of John Rutan’s estate, Allegany Co., Md., proves that his widow Catherine was still alive on 19 Oct. 1840:

Page 9 | 10/19/1840. John Nutan [sic] estate. David Nutan, executor. First and final account. Paid to:- Mrs. Catherine Nutan, per will.<sup>[88]</sup>

In 1800 John “Rattan,” over 45, resided in Sandy Creek Twp., Allegany Co., Md., with a woman over 45, two girls under 10, one male 10-16, and two males 16-26.<sup>[89]</sup>

David Hoffman, Sr., of Allegany County, Maryland sold to John Rutan of the same place for the sum [sic] of \$43.50, that tract of land in Allegany County known as "Friends Fortune."<sup>[90]</sup> [See Figure 29.]

In 1810 John "Rattan," over 45, resided in Allegany Co., Md., with two women over 45, one male and one female 10–16, and two females 16–26. He is listed next to David "Rattan," Joseph Moore, and Isaac "Rattan."<sup>[91]</sup>

In 1820 John "Rattan," over 45, resided in Allegany Co., Md., with two women over 45, and one girl under 10, one female 16–26, and one male 18–26. He is listed next to David "Rattan."<sup>[92]</sup>

In 1830 John Rutan, 70–80, resided in Allegany Co., Md., with a woman 70–80 [probably his wife Catharine], and a female 15–20. Next door was David Rutan, 40–50 (q.v.).<sup>[93]</sup>

In 1840 David Rutan, 50–60, resided in Selbysport Twp., Allegany Co., Md., with one woman 80–90 [probably his mother, Catharine], and several family members. On the same census page are listed Squire Rutan, 20–30, and Stephen Rutan, 20–30.<sup>[94]</sup>

I quote extensively from *The Hoyes of Maryland*:

John Rutan, son of Abraham II [sic], married Catherine Jones of New Jersey in 1774 and "went west". In 1787 he was listed as a settler on Military Lots 3284, 3285, 3286 on the Blooming Rose, two miles south of Selbysport, Maryland [see Figure 29 and Figure 30]. These lots he purchased from the State for six shillings, six pence for each lot of fifty acres. This land made an excellent stock farm, known in recent years as the Runbaugh place. The Rutan log house was by the spring on the east side of the

Blooming Rose road opposite the present farm house. Most of the neighbors—Coddingtons, Frazees, VanSickle, Savage—were also from New Jersey.

John Rutan was a typical pioneer settler; he had a large family, plenty of land and other very moderate resources. In 1798 he was assessed in Sandy Creek Hundred with 150 acres of land, one horse and seventeen cattle. His children may have attended either the Blooming Rose or Selbysport school. The Rutans were among the first members of the Methodist Congregation at Friend's, nearby. Rutan girls were noted singers in the neighborhood. W. Scott Friend told us that they often sat in the evening on the bluff overlooking the Youghiogeny River and sang hymns heard for miles over the quiet valley.

The Rutans planted a fine apple orchard on the slope above their home; some of the trees still [1942] bear fruit; the "Rutan Pippin" is the last of the Rutans on the Blooming Rose. The family graveyard is at the upper side of the orchard. Here stands a modest sandstone monument with a bronze tablet inscribed to the Pioneer settlers, John Rutan and Catherine Jones, 1787, erected by the descendants of Mary Rutan and William W. Hoye, in 1935.

Isaac Rutan died in Maryland, leaving two children.

Daniel Rutan bought 101 acres of "Shepherds Tent" near the Sanging Ground but abandoned it and went West about 1835.

John Rutan died at his home February 7, 1838. His will was probated, March 13, 1839. Witnesses were John Frantz, Stephen P. Rutan, Joseph J.

Frantz, and Daniel J. Hoye. David Rutan inherited the home farm upon the death of his mother.

The pioneer, his wife Catherine, and probably Isaac and Anne are buried in the farm graveyard.

David Rutan was Justice of the Peace of his District in 1814. In 1845 he sold the remainder of the Rutan farm, 64 acres, to John Slicer. All the Rutans left Maryland except Mary, who married W. W. Hoye.<sup>[95]</sup>

[Land records for Allegany Co., Md., require temple access.]

Inspection of the actual land and tax documents indicates differences from the account above: the military lot grants were patented to John “Rattan” in 1799, not 1787 (Figure 30), but this might reflect just a different stage in the claiming process (implied by the price paid per acre by John, of 6 shillings 6 pence). The hundred might have been the Grant Hundred, not the Sandy Creek Hundred, since the tax documents state both in the location column heading (but subsequent records state Sandy Creek). Notice from the same Figure that John and James Friend owned nearby lots.

For years 1798–1803, John “Rattan” paid tax in 1st District, Sandy Creek or Glade Hundred, Allegany Co., Md., on lots 3284, 3285, and 3286, totaling 150 acres, at 8 shillings 2 pence per acre, for a total annual tax of £62.10.0. He was also taxed, in 1798 anyway, for 1 horse, 17 black cattle, and “other property” (but no slaves) for an additional £87.10.0.<sup>[96]</sup>

Church at Turkey (New Providence), Essex Co., N.J.,<sup>[109]</sup> **ELEANOR BEDELL**, who was born 7 Feb. 1759,<sup>[110]</sup> daughter of Jacob and Eleanor [Aula] (Powers) Bedell.<sup>[111]</sup> “Ellen” Rutan, 80–90, in the 1840 might have been Eleanor (q.v.). Eleanor was sister-in-law of Martha Bebout (*Sarah<sup>2\*</sup> Darling, Samuel<sup>1</sup> Parrot’s 2d wife*).<sup>[112]</sup> That is, Martha Bebout married Eleanor Bedell’s brother, John Bedell. Samuel<sup>4\*</sup>’s children (unnamed) were mentioned in the will of his brother Abraham<sup>4</sup> (q.v.). Jacob Bedell was also in the Revolutionary War, and he was an Elder in the church at Turkey.

N.B., Westmoreland Co., Pa., was organized in 1773 (derived from Bedford Co.). Washington Co. was derived from Westmoreland Co. in 1781.

In an affidavit signed by Samuel Rutan, 1 Oct. 1832, Washington Co., Pa., he states, “that he served as a private in the Army of the Revolution in the Company of Captain Potter, in the Regiment commanded by Colonel Elias Dayton; that he now resides in Morris township, Washington County, Penna., and did reside there [ca 1819] when he first applied for the pension above named; and that previous to his residence in this County he resided in Morris County, New Jersey.”<sup>[113]</sup>

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Samuel, Pvt., commenced payments 4 Jan. 1840, through Sept. 1843, followed by “See new Roll.”

Indeed, a muster roll dated 23 Nov. 1776, Ticonderoga, of a company with Capt. Samuel Potter and commanded by “[torn] Dayton [torn]attalion of Forces Raised in the State of New Jersey and now [torn] States of amereca [sic] Dated in Camp at Ticonderoga November 23, 1776,” lists Pvt. Samuel Rutan, enlisted 22 Feb. [1776, assumed], “Sick in Barracks.”<sup>[114]</sup> N.B. Ft. Ticonderoga, at the foot of Lake Champlain, N.Y., fell to the Americans in May 1755 and was held by them until June 1777 [*Wikipedia*, accessed 5 Jan. 2019].

**Placeholder.** There is a similar muster roll dated 3 Oct. 1775 (begun on 28 June 1775), Ticonderoga, of a company with Capt. Robert Johnston, of the 3rd Regiment of New York Troops under Col. James Clinton “in the Service of the United Colonies. It lists three sergeants, including **Peter Rutan** “20 July on Command at St Johns.” Remarkably, the muster lists 24 privates who had deserted.<sup>[115]</sup>

The Revolutionary War pension application file for Eleanor Rutan, widow of Samuel Rutan, of New Jersey, contains (remarkably) a family Bible page (Figure 18) which I transcribe as follows:<sup>[116]</sup>

Also in the Revolutionary War pension application file for widow Eleanor Rutan is an affidavit signed by Sarah Simpson on 12 Nov. 1840, Washington Co., Pa., who claims she was present at the marriage of Samuel and Eleanor. She was surely Samuel's sister, Sarah, who married Samuel Simpson (q.v.). <sup>[120]</sup>

Also in the file is an affidavit signed by Lydia Sayer on 4 Nov. 1840, Washington Co., Pa., who claims her parents were present at the mar-

riage of Samuel and Eleanor. She was surely the daughter Lydia of Samuel's sister, Sarah (q.v.).<sup>[121]</sup>

Also in the file is an affidavit signed by Moses DeCamp on 22 Apr. 1834, Washington Co., Pa., "formerly of Essex County New Jersey, now of Washington County Pennsylvania," states "That he is, and has been for sixty years and upwards intimately acquainted with Samuel Rutan . . . This deponent prior to and during the Revolutionary War, lived near to the residence of the said Samuel Rutan, the River Passac [sic] merely dividing them, that he was present on the 16<sup>th</sup> february 1775, when the said Samuel Rutan enlisted in the Army of the United States, in Captain Potters Company of Col Dayton's Regiment of the New Jersey line . . ."<sup>[122]</sup> Moses DeCamp was surely the husband of Samuel's sister, Martha (q.v.).

On 14 May 1796, Price Dille and Sarah his wife, of "Washington & Commonwealth of Pennsylvania," sold to Samuel Rutan, of the same place, for £27.10, a part of a tract of land called "Welcome" in Washington Co. "on the Waters of Ten Mile Creek," granted to Dille on 25 June 1796 [sic, after this deed's date], containing 250 acres and 110 perches. Witnesses: Constant "Rowlee," Jacob Rutan. Acknowledged the same date.<sup>[123]</sup> Note that Samuel's son, Jacob, would have been only about 17 at the time.

On 14 May 1796, Samuel Rutan and Ellandar (var. Ellandra, signed Elenor his wife, of Washington Co., Pa., sold to Constant Rowley, of the same place, for £7.10, a part of a tract of land called "Welcome" in Washington Co. "on the Waters of Ten Mile Creek," granted to Price Dille on 25 June 1796 [sic, after this deed's date], containing 49 acres and 152 perches. Witnesses: Price Dille, Jacob Rutan. Acknowledged the

same date. “Recorded and compared with original April 10<sup>th</sup> A.D. 1805.”<sup>[124]</sup>

In 1800 Samuel Rutan, over 45, resided in Morris Twp., Washington Co., Pa., with a woman over 45, two boys and three girls under 10, one female 10-16, and one male 16-26. Simeon Simpson was listed on the same page.<sup>[125]</sup>

In 1810 Samuel “Rattan,” over 45, resided in Morris Twp., Washington Co., Pa., with a woman over 45, one male and one female 10-16, one male and one female 16-26. Jacob Rattan was listed nearby.<sup>[126]</sup>

On 10 Apr. 1815, Charles D. Hass, yeoman, of Columbia, Washington Co., Pa., sold to Samuel “Ratan,” farmer, of Westmoreland Co., Pa., for \$55, lot no. 16 on Front St. in Columbia. Witnesses: Isaac Teeple, Joseph Budd. Acknowledged the same date.<sup>[127]</sup>

In 1820 “Sam<sup>l</sup>” Rutan, over 45, resided in Morris Twp., Washington Co., Pa., with a woman over 45, one boy and one girl under 10. Jacob and John Rutan are listed nearby. Also nearby is “W<sup>m</sup>” Clutter, and on the next page is Moses “De Camp.”<sup>[128]</sup>

In 1830 Samuel “Retan,” 70-80, resided in Morris Twp., Washington Co., Pa., with a woman 80-90 [sic], one boy 10-15, and one female 20-30. Jacob “Retan” is listed nearby.<sup>[129]</sup>

In 1840 “Ellen” Rutan, male [sic], 80-90, resided in Morris Twp., Washington Co., Pa., with a male 15-20, and no females. Jacob and

John Rutan are listed nearby, and Daniel Rutan on the same page.<sup>[130]</sup> Since Samuel died by 14 Jan. 1840 (proof of his will), this was probably his wife Eleanor, misgendered. But, also in the 1840, Samuel Rutan, 20-30, is listed in Morris Twp., with a woman 40-50, four male children, three female children. On that same page appears Samuel Hayden.<sup>[131]</sup>

On 6 Feb. 1830, Samuel Rutan signed his will in Morris Twp., Washington Co., Pa., and it was proved 14 Jan. 1840. It mentions “my beloved wife Elinor,” “my son Jacob Rutan,” “my son Abraham Rutan,” “my son John,” and “my daughters or their heirs viz Sarah Catharine Fanny Elizabeth and Anna share and share alike Sarah and Elizabeth being dead their share to be divided among their children.” Executors: William Lindly and John Rutan. Witnesses: Anna Lindly and I. W. Lindly.<sup>[132]</sup>

The probate file for Samuel Rutan’s estate contains this list of legatees, including the widow Eleanor:<sup>[133]</sup>

So \$6.44 is a full child's legacy. Eight children implies \$51.52 total legacy for them. If a child has three (grand)children, then each would get \$2.14  $\frac{2}{3}$ . If a child has seven (grand)children, then each would get \$0.92. If the widow got  $\frac{1}{3}$  of the estate, then the estate was \$48.33. The list above accounts for six children or their (Samuel's grand)children. Abraham Rutan, Daniel Sanders (and Catherine Rutan), Reuben Sanders (and Fanny Rutan), and William Loren (and Anne Rutan) are four children (and their spouses). We know that Elizabeth (Rutan) Dille and Sarah (Rutan) Clutter died before their father's will, so are represented by the Clutters and Dilles in the list. **I do not yet know whose child Samuel Hayden (or his spouse) was.**

1774.<sup>[137]</sup> Simeon had served in the Revolutionary War, and Sarah was awarded a widow's pension.

Sarah contributed an affidavit to the Revolutionary War pension file application for Samuel<sup>4</sup> Rutan, her brother, and vice versa, he for her widow's pension application.

Record of a deed:

Simeon Simpson purchased Sept. 10, 1794, for "one pounds," from Stephen Sanders and "Catee" his wife of Wash. Co., a parcel of land on Ten Mile Creek for which Stephen Saunders obtained patent, June 2, 1794.

"One of the Justices of aforesaid Co." testifies: "Catee being by me examined seprate from hir's Husband acnallidged that she vallanturly of hier one free will and acord without compulsion of hier's Husband . . . the aforegoing Dide | Signed, Ebenezer Bogle | One of the Justices of aforesaid Co."<sup>[138]</sup>

In 1800 Simeon Simpson, over 45, resided in Morris Twp., Washington Co., Pa., with a woman 26-45, and one male 10-16. Samuel Rutan was listed on the same page.<sup>[139]</sup>

A summary, with excerpts, of Simeon's will:

Simeon Simpson wrote his will as "of Morris Tp., Washington Co., [Pa.], 14 Aug. 1823, being weak and sickly," but letters of Administration are not dated till Apr. 13, 1830.

His property except for a small bequest "to my daughter Lydia Sayres" is left to his wife Sarah, but at her decease "to my grandson Montgomery Sayers" expressing the wish that he should occupy the farm and care of his grandmother, Sarah, during her life, but making provision that if this arrangement is not satisfactory, "she shall be at liberty to dismiss him from the premises during her life."

A summary, with excerpts, of Sarah's will:

The will of his wife, Sarah Simpson is made "in reasonable health, " Oct. 25, 1842; Letters of Administration issued Nov. 26, 1845.

She bequeaths specified personal belongings to Montgomery Sayer, to Clymena & Lucina Sayer, daugh. of Montgomery Sayer; to Catherine Sanderz, wife of Daniel Sanders; to Catherine Sanderz, wife of Stephen Sanders; to Eunice Sanderz, daugh. of Daniel Sanders; to Sarah Lindley, wife of Wm. Lindley.

A bequest of \$25 is made to the support of pious students at Washington College who have no funds of their own, to be disbursed at the discretion of the faculty.

The balance of her property goes to Daniel Sanderz and to his son Stephen, equally divided. | Executors: Wm. Lindley & John Hanna.<sup>[141]</sup>

Catherine Sanders in this will was surely Sarah<sup>4</sup>'s niece Catherine<sup>5</sup> Rutan (*Samuel*<sup>4</sup>), also of Washington Co., Pa.

Information about Simeon Simpson's first marriage and about daughter Lydia Simpson from that marriage comes from this biography:

Lydia Simpson who was born 30 November 1765, daughter of Simeon and Mary (Mulford) Simpson. (Simeon Simpson was born 14 August 1743, a son of Alexander and Elizabeth Simpson. Simeon married 10 February 1763 Mary Mulford who was born 6 January 1745 to Ezekiel and Bathiah Mulford.) Lydia (Simpson) Sayre died 4 March 1841. Burial was at Prosperity (south of Washington), Pennsylvania in a cemetery adjacent to Ten Mile Run Presbyterian Church. Lydia married Samuel Sayre was born 15 April 1761, a son of Samuel of Somerset County, New Jersey. During the Revolution, Samuel was a soldier in Captain Benjamin Corey's Company, First Battalion, Somerset County, New Jersey Militia. Samuel

Sayre was with General Washington when they recrossed the Delaware River Christmas Night 1776. Among the many troop maneuvers, he also spent the historic cold winter at Valley Forge with Washington's Troops. Two old family bibles owned by descendants have recorded the birth of the triplets as 26 February 1794. General George Washington was a close personal friend of the family, and since the triplets were born in the same month as George, Samuel invited him to give them names. General Washington chose to name the triplets after his three favorite generals, Montgomery, Warren, and Mercer and sent a gift of fifty dollars for each.

Samuel Sayre and family moved to western Pennsylvania where he was a farmer. He died 14 March 1813 in Washington County, Pennsylvania, where his will was recorded. His brother, Ezekiel Sayre, witnessed his will.

It mentions his brothers, Abraham<sup>4</sup> and Joseph<sup>4</sup>, and the husbands of two of his sisters, Martha<sup>4</sup> DeCamp, and Rosannah<sup>4</sup> Parrot. Noticeably absent from Peter's will is mention of his other remaining brother, Samuel<sup>4</sup>. This is probably because Samuel had moved by the 1800 census, at the latest, to Washington Co., Pa., and had probably done so long before that.

On 17 Jan. 1793 Peter Rutan was listed as a freeholder of Morris Twp., Morris Co., N.J., along with (in alphabetical order) John Roll,

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received from his first wives Father Zeakel Madford.” [This latter probably refers to a single leaf containing only the following: “Israel eldrige Sun of Simeon and mary Simson was born october 15 day which was Saterday in the year 1763 | and he departed this life June the 5<sup>th</sup> 1766 | lidia Simson daughter of Simeon and mary Simson was born November the 30<sup>th</sup> 17[ink blot, but possibly 65].”

The actual will follows:

In the name of God amen, the twentyfourth day of March, in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and two Peter Rutan of the county of Morris and State of New Jersey being weak in body . . .

Imprimus, I give and bequeath unto my beloved brother Abraham Rutan all my equal half part in quantity and quality of a certain Lot of land lying and being in Essex county undivided between my brother Joseph and me, which lot we purchased jointly of Moses Decamp and Thomas Parrot, north by W<sup>m</sup> Parrot, east by Samuel Patter and others and southerly by the road, which lot of land is commonly called the camp Lot, to him my said brother Abraham his heirs and assigns forever:

Item Lastly, I do hereby constitute, ordain and appoint my beloved brother Joseph Rutan and Aaron Ball, Esq<sup>r</sup> to be my Executors to this my last will and testament; ratifying and allowing this and no other to be my last will and testament:

Peter Rutan [seal]

Signed, sealed, published and declared by the said Peter Rutan to be his last will and testament in the presence of us Joseph Ludlow, David Allen, Miles Putnom.

The foregoing will being proved in the usual form before Jabez Campfield, Esq<sup>r</sup>, Surrogate for the County of Morris, on the 28<sup>th</sup> day of April 1802 by Joseph Ludlow and Miles Putnom, two of the subscribing witnesses to the said will . . .<sup>148</sup>

**25. CHARITY<sup>4</sup> RUTAN** (<sub>15</sub>Abraham<sup>3</sup>, Peter<sup>2</sup>, Abraham<sup>1</sup>) was born **about 1759**, died before 20 Sept. 1792, the date of her father's will in which she was not mentioned. She married (Littell) **JOHN MILLER**, son of Jennet (Cauldwell) Miller (according to Littell), aunt of brothers John and Abraham Cauldwell, who married Charity's sisters, Hannah<sup>4</sup> and Elizabeth<sup>4</sup> Rutan.<sup>[149]</sup>

Matthias Ogden's regiment of the New Jersey line for term of four years, having enlisted in 1778 or 1779 at Elizabethtown, N.J.<sup>[161]</sup>

On 6 Aug. 1810, Matthias Roll of Hamilton Co. was granted 108.59 acres "on the North end of a Tract of 225 acres which lies in the East side of Section number Thirty four of Township number four in the fourth Range [roughly, E½ S34 T4 R4, in Warren Co.] of the Land lying between the Great Miami river and the Virginia reservation, sold under the direction of the Register of the Land-office at Cincinnati, by virtue of the right of pre-emption granted by law to certain persons who have contracted with John Cleves Symmes or his associates."<sup>[162]</sup>

On 30 July 1812, Matthias Roll of Warren Co. was also granted land in Butler Co., Ohio, by James Madison being the tract NE¼ S13 T4N

R1E, “West of the Greater Miami,” sold at the Cincinnati office. Also tracts NE $\frac{1}{4}$  S18 T4N R2E and SE $\frac{1}{4}$  S17 T4N R2E.<sup>[163]</sup>

On 30 July 1812, the United States (by President James Madison) granted to Matthias Roll “of Warren county,” the land described as NE $\frac{1}{4}$  S18 and SE $\frac{1}{4}$  S17 of T4 R2E, sold at Cincinnati by the act of Congress entitled “An act providing for the sale of the lands of the United States in the Territory North West of the Ohio and above the mouth of Kentucky river.”<sup>[164]</sup> On the same date, the United States further granted to Matthias Roll of the same place the land described as NE $\frac{1}{4}$  S13 T4 R1E.<sup>[165]</sup>

N.B. Warren and Butler Counties in Ohio abut one another, Warren to the east of Butler. Both were formed in 1803.

On 2 Jan. 1813, in the deed recorded directly after the second grant above, Matthias Roll of Butler Co., Ohio, sold to Ruben Blackford of the same place, for \$90, a plot of 80 acres described as E $\frac{1}{2}$ NE S18 T4 R2E, which was half of one of the grants of the United States to Matthias. It was acknowledged the same day.<sup>[166]</sup> Ruben was his son-in-law.

On 11 Feb. 1813, Matthias Roll and Mary his wife of Butler Co., Ohio, sold to Joseph Roll of the same place, for \$90, a plot of land in Butler Co. described as the “undivided as yet” W $\frac{1}{2}$ NE S13 T4 R1E, which was half of another one of the grants of the United States to Matthias. It was acknowledged 15 Dec. 1813.<sup>[167]</sup> Joseph was their eldest son.

On 20 Apr. 1814, Matthias Roll and Mary his wife, of Butler Co., Ohio, sold to William S. Stewart, of the same place, for \$160, the 80 acres of land described as W $\frac{1}{2}$ NE S18 T4 RE (presumably R2E), which

was another half of one of the grants of the United States to Matthias. It was acknowledged the same day.<sup>[168]</sup> William S. Stewart was another son-in-law.

On 19 Mar. 1814, Matthias Roll and Mary his wife, of Butler Co., Ohio, sold to Reuben Blackford of the same place, for \$90, the 80 acres of land described as E½NE S18 T4 R2E, which was another half of one of the grants of the United States to Matthias. It was acknowledged the same day.<sup>[169]</sup> This is a puzzling repeat of the 2 Jan. 1813 deed. Perhaps it had to be repeated to have Mary's approval, which was not part of the 1813 version.

Matthias Roll paid taxes in Butler Co., Ohio, in 1814, 1817, 1819, 1821, 1822, 1823, and 1824.<sup>[170]</sup>

In 1820 Matthias Roll, over 45, resided in Hanover Twp., Butler Co., Ohio, with a woman 26-45, one boy and two girls under 10, two males and one female 10-16, one male 16-18, two males 18-26, and one female 16-26.<sup>[171]</sup>

In 1830 Matthias Roll "senr," 60-70, resided in Hanover Twp., Butler Co., Ohio, with a woman 60-70, one female 15-20, and one male 20-30. Nearby were listed John Roll, 20-30 [born 1800-1810], Isaac Roll, 30-40 [born 1790-1800], and Matthias Roll, 20-30 [born 1800-1810].<sup>[172]</sup> N.B. Littell, *First Settlers*, 352, lists John, Isaac, and Matthias among the sons of Matthias who removed to Ohio.

Mathias Rall, or Roll, 59, was listed in the Pension Roll of 1835, in Butler Co., Ohio, for Revolutionary War service as a Private in the “N.J. continental.”<sup>[173]</sup>

Matthias Rall, or Mathew Roll, received Revolutionary War soldier’s pension S.40309, and bounty land warrant 1717-100, for four years of service as a private in the New Jersey line under Col. Matthias Ogden. He enlisted 1779 in Elizabethtown, N.J., served until 5 June 1783. He applied for the pension on 30 Nov. 1819 at age 58 from Butler Co., Ohio.<sup>[174]</sup>

The 1831 will of Mathias Roll, mentions his wife, Mary, sons, Israel, Joseph, Mathias, John, Samuel, Silas, and Isaac, and daughters, Abigail, Rachel, “Charityann” [presumably Charity and Ann], and Polly.<sup>[175]</sup>

We have two purported sources for this family, which unfortunately do not quite agree, and neither is sourced. Here they are for comparison:

Fellowbondsmen—Benjamin Pettit, of Essex Co. | Lib. 29, p. 419.<sup>[199]</sup>

Kennedy Vance, Thomas Parrot's guardian, married Phebe (Potter) Pettit, widow of Benjamin Pettit and mother of Benjamin Pettit (III), presumably Vance's fellowbondsmen in the guardianship above. Kennedy and Phebe Vance had several children, including Jane Vance, who married 8 July 1790 Joel Jones. Joel was brother of Luther Jones, second husband of Martha Bebout, Thomas's half-cousin.

In June 1793 Thomas Parrot appeared on a tax list for Essex Co., N.J.<sup>[200]</sup>

In Sept. 1811 Thomas "Parot" appeared on a tax list for Chatham Twp., Morris Co., N.J.<sup>[201]</sup>

On 19 Nov. 1811, Thomas Parrot was made a Justice of the Peace in Morris Co., N.J.<sup>[202]</sup>

The message is clear: Littell is a good source of family structure and where to look to find family members. For this sketch, its errors (in red) are minor, as we show. The dates and ages are off by small amounts only. The largest errors are mis-

Repeated for convenience: In 1800 Peter "Rattan," 26-45, resided in Sandy Creek Twp., Allegany Co., Md., with a woman 26-45 [born 1755-1774], and 2 boys under 10. Nearby (2 pages away) was listed his father, John "Rattan."<sup>[280]</sup> Several Frazees were listed on this same page, including Mary Frazee, over 45 (born before 1755), with two females 10-16. Also listed were Jonathan Frazee, 11010,31010, "Jer" Frazee, 00010,00100, next to Mary and Thurman Frazee, 21010,01010, one listing removed from Mary.

In 1830 Elisha Frazee, 30-40, resided in Allegany Co., Md., 101001, 000001, listed on same page with Thurman Frazee, Ephraim Frazee, John Frazee, Jeremiah Frazee, John Rutan, 70-80, and David Rutan, 40-50.<sup>[281]</sup>

In 1840 Elisha Frazee, 40-50, resided in Selbysport Twp., Allegany Co., Md., with one male and two females 5-10, one female 15-20, and one female 20-30. Several Frazees were listed on the next census page, including Jeremiah Frazee, 70-80, and Thurman Frazee, 80-90.<sup>[282]</sup>

But another report published on <Ancestry.com> has Jeremiah, son of Ephraim, born 1749, New Jersey, settled at an early date on half of the “Buffellow Run” tract, and is buried in an unmarked grave on his farm in the Frazee graveyard on Buffalo Run. It is not particularly surprising to me that Elisha Frazee and his wife Mary Rutan, brother of John Rutan with an estate in Hampshire Co., Va. (which became Mineral Co., W.Va., next door to Allegany Co., Md.) all went to that area at about the same time. Maybe? But the John Rutan living amongst the Frazees in Allegany Co., Md., seems to be different from the John Rutan in Hampshire Co. (then Mineral Co.), W.Va.

Plat of Survey upon Pattersons Creek of Potowmack River,” being a grant made 21 Oct. 1740 [sic] “from the Lord Proprietor to John Rutan (Father to the said John Rutan) now deceased.” Then, on 11 Dec. 1770, they released the same tract to Abraham Johnson for £20. The deed of lease and the deed of release were each acknowledged on 14 May 1771.<sup>[287]</sup> Note that “Abram” Johnson was granted tract No. 5 in [West] Virginia, abutting the Rutan tract No. 4.

N.B. Modern Patterson Creek, on the Potomac River, is in Mineral Co., W.Va., immediately across the Potomac from Allegany Co., Md.

... [somehow John gets from Hampshire Co., Va., in 1771, to Westmoreland Co., Pa. in 1786. Rostraver Twp. (as *Wikipedia* spells it), which lies about 70 miles northwest of Mineral Co., W.Va., as the crow flies).]

N.B., *Wikipedia* states that **Rostraver** Twp., Pa., is the southwestern corner of Westmoreland Co., Pa. It is said to be named for Rostrevor, a seaside community in Co. Down, Northern Ireland. The township in Pennsylvania is bounded on the west by the Monogahela River and on the east by the Youghiogheny River.

Keegan’s *Second Rutan Index* suggests this for the current John:

In 1786 John “Rattan” and “Mathias Shipler” were listed in the Pennsylvania “Septennial” census for Restrover Twp., Westmoreland Co., Pa.<sup>[290]</sup>

In 1790 John “Rattan,” over 16, resided in Restrover Twp., Westmoreland Co., Pa., with one other male 16 or over, three males under 16 [born 1774-1790], and two females. Listed nearby were several “Shipler”s, including “Mathias Shipler.”<sup>[291]</sup>

In 1810 John “Rattan,” over 45 [born before 1765], resided in Restrover Twp., Westmoreland Co., Pa., with a woman over 45, one girl under 10, three males and one female 16-26. Listed nearby were several “Shipler”s, including Matthias “Shipler,” over 45, with a woman over 45, one female 10-16, and two males 16-26.<sup>[292]</sup>

On 20 Jan. 1820, John Rutan, “of Trumbull County Ohio,” was granted 160 acres (NE¼ S19 T20 R18) in Richland Co., Ohio, and again on 3 Nov. 1820 John Rutan, “Assignee of Daniel Johnston,” was granted another 160 acres (SE¼ S17 T20 R18), both from the U.S. Government Land Office (in the name of President James Monroe).<sup>[293]</sup> For local convenience only, I shall call NE¼ S19 T20 R18 by the name “John<sup>4</sup> S19 Grant.” And I shall call the second grant SE¼ S17 T20 R18 by the name “John<sup>4</sup> S17 Grant #2.” Both of these tracts appear to be in Knox Co., not Richland Co., according to Figure 19, but online Gov-

ernment Land Office records state Richland Co. in both cases. At the time of the grants, they were in “the territory north-west of the Ohio, and above the mouth of Kentucky River.”

On 9 Jan. 1817, an important grant was issued to Samuel “Ruten” of Westmoreland Co., Pa., from the U.S. Government Land Office (in the name of President James Madison), of a tract in what is now Ashland Co., Ohio, located just outside Richland Co., Ohio. See Figure 19 and Figure 21. This is the tract we shall call “Samuel<sup>5</sup> S33 Tract,” being SE $\frac{1}{4}$  S33 T25 R17 in subsequent arguments.

In 1820 John “Retan,” 26-45 [sic], resided in Restrover Twp., Westmoreland Co., Pa., with a woman over 45, one boy and one girl under 10, one female 10-16, and one female 16-26. Listed nearby and on adjoining pages were several “Shipler”s, including Philip Shepler or “Shipler” on the same page and “Mathias Shipler” two pages removed. Listed directly next to John was Asa Lane, 26-45, with a woman 26-45, one boy and two girls under 10, two females 10-16.<sup>[294]</sup>

16 Sept. 1823 John Rutan and his wife Catherine, of “Raterver,” Westmoreland Co., Pa., sold to Isaac Teeple, for \$250, a tract of 80 acres 3 roods 32 perches, lying in Washington Twp., Richland Co., Ohio, being N $\frac{1}{2}$ SE S17 T20 R18. Acknowledged in Washington [sic] Co., Pa., the same date.<sup>[295]</sup> N.B. the tract is the north half of the tract that I call John<sup>4</sup> S17 Grant #2 in the sketch for John<sup>5</sup>, being SE $\frac{1}{4}$  S17 T20 R18. Westmoreland Co., Pa., the same date, by Joseph Finley.<sup>[296]</sup> N.B. This tract is half of the tract (the other half) that I call John<sup>4</sup> S17 Grant #2, being SE¼ S17 T20 R18.

On 20 Nov. 1832, John Rutan signed his will (with his mark) in Westmoreland Co., Pa., and it was proved 6 Jan. 1836. It mentions “my Son William Rutan,” “my son Nicholas Rutan,” “my Daughter Catherine Lane,” “all my Grand Children.” Executors: Michael Finley and Morgan Gadkill. Witnesses: Hugh McMeckan, John S. Carnes, Joseph Finley.<sup>[297]</sup> Son John<sup>5</sup> had died in 1821, daughter Elizabeth<sup>5</sup> in 1819, and putative son Samuel<sup>5</sup> in 1818, explaining why they do not appear (except presumably their children, his grandchildren).

Catherine was alive and married to John in 1830 (see preceding deed). Both that deed and this will were executed in Westmoreland Co., Pa. There is no evidence thus far for a wife Hannah Frazee, nor for John’s move to Trumbull Co., Ohio. But he still had time to move, remarry, and die between Nov. 1832 and his supposed death probably in 1835. The marriage seems unlikely, at age say 89–90, but is possible.

N.B., Harrison Co., Ohio, was formed in 1813 from Jefferson and Tuscarawas Cos., on the eastern side of Ohio. Carroll Co., Ohio, was formed in 1833 from the top part of Harrison Co. and from others.

In 1850 Peter Rutan, 73, born in Maryland, resided in Perry Twp., Carroll Co., Ohio, with Mary, 60, born in Maryland, and Martin Workman, 23, a teacher born in New Brunswick. In the next dwelling was Alexander Rutan, 44, and his family (q.v.).<sup>[314]</sup> This matches Hoye, assuming he meant Carrollton, Carroll Co., Ohio, where he says “Descendants at Arrolton, Ohio.” Martin “Workman” was probably a relative, perhaps a brother, of son Alexander’s wife, Sarah Wortman.

Estate distribution occurred by William Lindley on 25 Aug. 1843 to the following heirs in equal amounts, listed in this order: Anna Drake, Jane Drake, Cephas Clutter, John Clutter, William Clutter, Experience “Bickley,” Samuel R. Clutter, Isaac N. Clutter, Abraham Clutter, “No-adiah” Clutter, and Milton Clutter, allotted \$128.60 each, and \$368.88 to Stephen Sanders, guardian of the three minor children of the deceased: Sarah, Ruth, and Caroline, and \$16.92 to Silas McCrispin for an expense of the child Sarah. Note that  $\$368.88 + \$16.92 = 3 * \$128.60 = \$385.80$ , so the three minors each received an amount equal to the other children.<sup>[392]</sup>

(from Joseph Adison's death certificate, q.v.), died 25 Sept. 1884, and was buried near John.<sup>[441]</sup>

In 1820 John Rutan, 16-26 [born 1794-1804], resided in Morris Twp., Washington Co., Pa., with a woman 16-26, and one boy under 10 [Samuel]. "Sam<sup>l</sup>" and Jacob Rutan are listed nearby.<sup>[442]</sup>

In 1830 John "Retan," 30-40 [born 1790-1800], resided in Morris Twp., Washington Co., Pa., with a woman 30-40, two boys and two girls under 5 [born 1825-1830], one boy 5-10 [born 1820-1825], and one male 10-15 [born 1815-1820].<sup>[443]</sup> It appears that the woman was the first wife, and that she had had as many as six children by 1830. Note that the eldest son, by my reckoning, Daniel D.<sup>6</sup>, was born about 1818. And the second eldest, Samuel<sup>6</sup>, was born about 1824. I have only two boys, both born about 1830, James Davis<sup>6</sup> and John<sup>6</sup>, who might fill the four slots occupied by the youngest children. There are two girls here unaccounted for.

On 29 Sept. 1874, John Rutan, of Morris Twp., Washington Co., Pa., sold to “his son Adam Weir Rutan,” for the following sums at the following times, a part of his [John’s] farm in Morris Twp., the upper end on which John then resided, containing 90 acres, with “the line between Addison Rutans part and the above being at present agreed on,” on this schedule: \$150 each year of John’s life on 1 July of each year. The conditions of this agreement include that John should have part of the house while he remained alive (and other things, such as “every fall one good fat hog”) and, furthermore, that upon John’s death, Adam was to pay \$1,585 as follows, on a specified timeline: \$300 to Adam’s sister, Melissa J. Rutan, \$25 to his brother Daniel Rutan, \$100 to his brother Samuel Rutan, \$200 to brother John Rutan, \$150 to sister Nancy Jane, \$160 to sister Margrett G. Black, \$250 to brother James Davis Rutan, \$200 to sister Mary Ellen Dille, \$200 to sister Lavina Ann Armstrong. Also Adam’s duty, if “his Mother survives his Father to keep board clothe and support his said Mother one half of said time during her lifetime also furnish any medical attension [sic] or medicins [sic] which she may think nessary [sic].”<sup>[453]</sup> The next deed follows this one immediately:

On 14 Sept. 1874, John Rutan, of Morris Twp., Washington Co., Pa., sold to “his son Addison Rutan,” for the following sums at the following times, a part of his [John’s] farm in Morris Twp., the lower end on which Addison then resided, containing 90 acres, on this schedule: \$150 each year of John’s life on 1 July of each year. The conditions of this agreement include that John should have several things while he remained alive (such as, again, “every fall one good fat hog”) and, furthermore, that upon John’s death, Addison was to pay \$1,585 as follows, on a specified timeline: [same list and amounts as in Adam’s agreement]. Also Addison’s duty, if “his Mother survives his Father to keep board clothe and support his said Mother one half of her said time, and also

furnish any medical attention which she thinks nessary [sic].” Both this agreement and the one above with Adam were recorded 28 Nov. 1885.<sup>[454]</sup>

On 18 Feb. 1886, Melissa J. Rutan, of Morris Twp., Washington Co., “one of the children of John Rutan, dec’d. late of [the same place],” stated that J. A. Rutan had, in accordance with the agreement he had made with his father John, paid Melissa \$300, and thus she released him officially from his obligation to her.<sup>[455]</sup>

Although I have not seen the documents (not available at the FHL), the grantee index for Washington Co., Pa., lists the similar releases of “J. Add” Rutan by John, Daniel, and Samuel Rutan, on 11 Dec. 1886, and by Margaret Black and “Nancie Clutter,” on 15 May 1888, and the releases of “J. Addison” Rutan by Lavina Armstrong, J. D. Rutan, and Mary E. Dille, on 20 Dec. 1889.<sup>[456]</sup>

On 23 Apr. 1884, John Rutan, of Morris Twp., Washington Co., Pa., signed his will, and it was proved 6 Mar. 1885. It mentions “my beloved wife” (not yet deceased), “all my children,” the farms sold to his sons A. Weir Rutan and Addison Rutan (see the agreements above), where they now reside, become fully their lands, and they are to pay the other heirs as specified in those earlier agreements of 14 Sept. 1874 and 29 Sept. 1874. Sons J. David Rutan and Addison Rutan to be executors.<sup>[457]</sup>

On 28 Oct. 1834, Hugh C. Rutan, of Newark Twp., Essex Co., N.J., sold to Jane Rutan, of the same place, for \$1 [so surely Jane was his mother], two parcels of land in Morris Twp., Morris Co., N.J., of respectively 31.04 and 6 acres. The parcels were “those two undivided half parts of the two tracts or parcels of law and premises hereinafter particularly described.” The description of the first parcel mentions “the Long Hill road, in front of the House of Daniel Rutan deceased,” “the line of Jane Rutans land,” and “to the Passaic river.” The description of the second parcel mentions “the said Long Hill road east of the above described lot,” “to Passaic river,” and “to the line of lands set off to Abigail wife of Peter D. Valentine.” Acknowledged 9 Aug. 1837 in Essex Co., N.J.<sup>[545]</sup>

On 9 Aug. 1837, Hannah B. Rutan, of Newark Twp., Essex Co., N.J., sold to Jane Rutan, of the same place, for \$500, two parcels of land in Morris Twp., Morris Co., N.J., of respectively 31.04 and 6 acres. The parcels were the same two described in the 28 Oct. 1834 deed above for Hugh C. Rutan, so surely Hannah B.’s brother. Acknowledged 9 Aug. 1837 in Essex Co., N.J.<sup>[546]</sup>

Then also on 9 Aug. 1837, Jane Rutan, of Newark Twp., Essex Co., N.J., sold one of the two parcels (perhaps both, the acreage is not specified) to Nicholas Van Winkle, of New York City, for \$200. It was acknowledged 10 Aug. 1837.<sup>[547]</sup>

On the same date, 9 Aug. 1837, Jane Rutan sold to Nicholas Van Winkle another parcel in Morris Twp., for \$3,300, of 74 acres. It was acknowledged 10 Aug. 1837.<sup>[548]</sup>

On 10 Jan. 1845, Jane Rutan, of Newark Twp., Essex Co., N.J., sold to Caroline Runyan, of Morris Twp., Morris Co., N.J., for \$15, a parcel of land in Morris Twp., of 5 acres, “being the same lot of land sold by Cornelius Ludlow Executor of Benjamin Ludlow deceased and conveyed by him to the said Jane Rutan by deed bearing date” 1 Feb. 1828. It was acknowledged 17 Feb. 1845.<sup>[549]</sup>

On 29 Jan. 1848, Jane Rutan of Newark, Essex Co., N.J., signed her will. On 12 Dec. 1848 she signed a codicil. Both were proved 5 Mar. 1849. On 20 Nov. 1828, Joseph Rutan and Sally Anne [signed Sally Ann] his wife, of Rahway Twp., Essex Co., N.J., sold to John Littell, of New Providence Twp., Essex Co., N.J., for \$300, a parcel of land in Morris Twp., Morris Co., N.J., of 18.4 acres, “being part of the lot of land of land and premises devised to the said Joseph Rutan by his father as set off to him as part of his said fathers farm. The description mentions a corner of Jane Rutan’s land, a corner of John Littell’s land, and the corner of the Colwell farm and Peter D. Valentine’s land. Acknowledged 28 Nov. 1828.<sup>[558]</sup>

In 1820 John Rutan, 26-45 [born 1775-1794], resided in Washington Twp., Richland Co., Ohio, with a woman 26-45, one boy and two girls under 10 [born 1810-1820], two boys 10-16 [born 1804-1810], and one other male 26-45.<sup>[581]</sup>

On 28 Mar. 1821, John Rutan, of Richland Co., Ohio, signed his will, and it was proved 8 Oct. 1821. It mentions “my beloved wife Nancy the whole of my estate to be for the use of her and my children till they become of age.” Executors: wife Nancy and Jacob Mitchell. Witnesses: William Goss, Jacob Mitchell.<sup>[582]</sup> This suggests that none of his children was of age on 28 Mar. 1821.

In 1830 Samuel “M<sup>c</sup>Lure,” 60-70 [born 1760-1770], resided in Troy Twp., Richland Co., Ohio, with a woman 40-50 [born 1780-1790, Nancy], one boy under 5 [born 1825-1830, possibly of marriage to McClure], one girl 5-10 [born 1820-1825, possibly of marriage to McClure], one male 10-15 [born 1815-1820, possibly John<sup>6</sup>], two females 15-20 [born 1810-1815, possibly Anna<sup>6</sup> and Katherine<sup>6</sup>], and one male 20-30 [born 1800-1810, possibly Samuel<sup>6</sup> or William<sup>6</sup>].<sup>[583]</sup>

On 13 Dec. 1831, Samuel Rutan of Richland Co., Ohio, sold to William Rutan, of the same place, 1/5 undivided part of (NE¼ S19 T20 R18—that is, John<sup>4</sup> S19 Grant) in Richland Co., for \$150, held by Samuel as “heir at Law of John Rutan Late of said County & State now Deceased, in Common with Anna Rutan Katherine Rutan John Rutan Jun<sup>r</sup> and the aforesaid William Rutan all heirs at Law of said John Rutan Deceased [sic].” It was acknowledged the same day.<sup>[585]</sup> (See also the 31 Dec. 1833 deed under Anna<sup>6</sup> and the 31 Oct. 1835 deed under Catherine<sup>6</sup>.)

### Establishing the Children of John<sup>5</sup>

The 1831 deed abstracted just above names the five children of John<sup>5</sup>. The following transactions show that some of the land in Richland Co., Ohio, was originally held as undivided 1/25 parts by John’s heirs. That is, John<sup>5</sup> and his four siblings held the tract in undivided fifths, so John<sup>5</sup>’s heirs got rights to only 1/25 each. One such tract to which we shall pay particular attention is SE¼ S33 T25 R17, abbreviated here as the “Samuel<sup>5</sup> S33 Tract.” See Figure 19 and Figure 21.

Here, for example, is a transaction by Samuel<sup>6</sup> concerning Samuel<sup>5</sup> S33 Tract:

On 16 Oct. 1841, Samuel Rutan and Sarah his wife, of Sandusky Twp., Richland Co., Ohio, sold (quitclaimed) to John Rutan [“2<sup>nd</sup>” in the title box of the deed], of the same place, for \$30, the tract in Richland Co., Ohio, denoted by SE¼ S33 T25 R17 (that is, Samuel<sup>5</sup> S33 Tract),

referance [sic] being had to a Patent signed by James Madison President of the United States to Samuel Rutan dated January the 9<sup>th</sup> 1817. The right or part of said Tract hereby intended to be conveyed is one Twenty fifth of the said Tract derived to us as one of the heirs of John Rutan deceased at law of Samuel Rutan late of Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania deceased.<sup>[586]</sup>

This appears to say that John<sup>5</sup> was one of five heirs of a Samuel<sup>4</sup>. Of course, Samuel<sup>6</sup> is one of five heirs of John<sup>5</sup>, hence the partition into 1/25 pieces of Samuel<sup>5</sup> S33 Tract. With this deed, Samuel<sup>6</sup> sold his 1/25 to his brother John<sup>6</sup>.

But our evidence supports their being heirs of a John<sup>4</sup>, not a Samuel. We shall have to solve this puzzle. My proposed solution is that the generous Samuel was Samuel<sup>5</sup>, brother of John<sup>5</sup>, who died childless, so his estate was divided equally among his five siblings. On the face of it, John<sup>5</sup> had five children as stated in the 13 Dec. 1831 deed (using the order and the spelling of that deed): Samuel<sup>6</sup>, William<sup>6</sup>, Anna<sup>6</sup>, Katherine<sup>6</sup>, and John<sup>6</sup> Jun<sup>r</sup> "all heirs at Law of said John<sup>[5]</sup> Rutan Decesed." This same deed seems to say that John<sup>5</sup> was one of five children of Samuel<sup>4</sup>. So John<sup>5</sup>'s children would each receive 1/5 of 1/5 of Samuel<sup>4</sup>'s estate—that is, 1/25.

But we have John<sup>5</sup> as son of John<sup>4</sup>, not a Samuel<sup>4</sup>. In fact, we have shown that John<sup>4</sup> had these children: John<sup>5</sup>, William<sup>5</sup>, Nicholas<sup>5</sup>, Catherine<sup>5</sup>, and Elizabeth<sup>5</sup>—William<sup>5</sup>, Nicholas<sup>5</sup>, and Catherine<sup>5</sup> explicitly, in his will. And we will now show, with the deeds concerning Samuel<sup>5</sup> S33 Tract, that Samuel<sup>4</sup> seems to have had children: John<sup>5</sup>, William<sup>5</sup>, Nicholas<sup>5</sup>, Catherine<sup>5</sup>, and Elizabeth<sup>5</sup>. This "coincidence" doesn't make sense, so we have to be careful. I establish, in this sketch, John<sup>5</sup>'s siblings and his children with arguments based on the Samuel<sup>5</sup> S33 Tract. I establish John<sup>4</sup> as their direct ancestor based on the William<sup>5</sup>-Nicholas<sup>5</sup>-Catherine<sup>5</sup> coincidence.

The solution I suggest is that Samuel<sup>5</sup> was another sibling of John<sup>5</sup>, that he (Samuel<sup>5</sup>) was childless, died young, and his estate was left to John<sup>4</sup>'s other heirs. I develop this argument in the sketch for putative son Samuel<sup>5</sup> Rutan (q.v.). A key part of the argument is that Samuel<sup>5</sup> married Mary Teeple, daughter of Isaac Teeple (Sr.) and brother of Isaac Teeple (Jr.).

Recall from John<sup>4</sup>'s sketch that he and his wife Catherine, of Westmoreland Co., Pa., sold to Isaac Teeple, in two transactions (actually, to Isaac Teeple Sr. and then to Isaac Teeple Jr.) in 1823 and 1830, all of the tract of land in Washington Twp., Richland Co., Ohio, that I call John<sup>4</sup> S17 Grant #2, being SE $\frac{1}{4}$  S17 T20 R18. This tight nexus of John Rutan, Samuel Rutan, and Isaac Teeple suggested first that Samuel<sup>4</sup> was perhaps a brother of John<sup>4</sup>, otherwise unaccounted for. But estimated dates for this missing Samuel suggest instead that he was a brother of John<sup>5</sup>, not of John<sup>4</sup>, so he would be Samuel<sup>5</sup>, and that is the theory I proceed with. A problem with this theory is that it appears that Samuel<sup>5</sup> died intestate, so there would be no will leaving anything to anybody. The division would have to have been performed by Samuel<sup>5</sup>'s executors, namely his brother-in-law Isaac Teeple (see appendix C) and his brother John<sup>5</sup>.

On 15 Dec. 1841, Anna Cracraft, of Troy Twp., Richland Co., Ohio, sold (quitclaimed) to William Rutan 2nd, of Washington Twp., Richland Co., for \$20, a portion of SE $\frac{1}{4}$  S33 T25 R17 [Samuel<sup>5</sup> S33 Tract] in Clearwick Twp. and being, "One fifth the fifth part [1/25] of the said Tract derived to me as one of the heirs at law of Samuel Rutan late of Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania deceased."<sup>[587]</sup>

So this deed tells us that Anna<sup>6</sup> was sister of William<sup>6</sup>. Again, Samuel<sup>5</sup> is the implied mutual ancestor (assuming Samuel<sup>5</sup> is the putative sibling I have hypothesized, and which I henceforth do assume). Anna<sup>6</sup> sold her 1/25 to brother William<sup>6</sup>.

On 16 Oct. 1841, Robert Dixon and Catherine his wife, sold (quit-claimed) to John Rutan ["2<sup>nd</sup>" in the title box of the deed], for \$20, a tract in Clear Creek Twp., Richland Co., Ohio, denoted by SE $\frac{1}{4}$  S33 T25 R17 [Samuel<sup>5</sup> S33 Tract],

reference [sic] being had To a Patent sign d [sic] by James Madison President [sic] of the United States to Samuel Rutan dated January 9<sup>th</sup> 1817.<sup>[588]</sup>

So Catherine<sup>6</sup> was sister of John<sup>6</sup>. Again, Samuel<sup>5</sup> is the implied mutual ancestor. Catherine<sup>6</sup> sold her 1/25 to brother John<sup>6</sup>.

Taking stock so far: We have established as the five heirs of John<sup>5</sup> the following children: Samuel<sup>6</sup>, John<sup>6</sup>, Anna<sup>6</sup>, William<sup>6</sup>, and Catherine<sup>6</sup>, and some of their spouses. At this point, John<sup>6</sup> has rights to 3/25 of Samuel<sup>5</sup> S33 Tract, and William<sup>6</sup> has 2/25 of it. So together they own 1/5.

N.B. All the deeds just discussed in this section are contiguous in the Richland Co., Ohio, deed book. They all have similar wording, as if written by one person.

### Establishing the Siblings of John<sup>5</sup>

Also contiguous with the deeds just used to establish John<sup>5</sup>'s children, in the Richmond Co., Ohio, deed book, are the following deeds concerning Samuel<sup>5</sup> S33 Tract. These establish John<sup>5</sup>'s siblings, who own undivided 1/5s of Samuel<sup>5</sup> S33 Tract.

On 11 Sept. 1841, William Rutan and Rebecca his wife [see William<sup>5</sup> sketch], of Champion, Trumbull Co., Ohio, sold (quitclaimed) to William Rutan 2nd, of Washington Twp., Richland Co., Ohio, for \$100, their right to

So William<sup>5</sup> was brother of John<sup>5</sup>. Again, Samuel<sup>5</sup> is the named relative. William<sup>5</sup> sold his 1/5 of Samuel<sup>5</sup> S33 Tract to nephew William<sup>6</sup>.

On 14 Sept. 1841, Nicholas Rutan and his wife Mary, of Milton Twp., Richland Co., Ohio, sold (quitclaimed) to William Rutan 2nd, of Washington Twp., Richland Co., for \$75, a portion of Samuel<sup>5</sup> S33 Tract being,

One fifth of the said Tract derived to us as one of the heirs at law of Samuel Rutan late of Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania deceased.<sup>[590]</sup>

So Nicholas<sup>5</sup> was brother of John<sup>5</sup>. Samuel<sup>5</sup> is the named relative. Nicholas<sup>5</sup> sold his 1/5 of Samuel<sup>5</sup> S33 Tract to nephew William<sup>6</sup>.

On 13 Sept. 1841, John R. Sheplar and his wife Elizabeth, of Stark Co., Ohio, sold (quitclaimed) to William Rutan 2nd, of Washington Twp., Richland Co., for \$75, a portion of Samuel<sup>5</sup> S33 Tract being,

One fifth of the said Tract derived to us as one of the heirs at law of Samuel Rutan late of Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania deceased.<sup>[591]</sup>

John R.<sup>6</sup> Shepler was the only heir (as we shall show) of Elizabeth<sup>5</sup> and sold her (then his) 1/5 of Samuel<sup>5</sup> S33 Tract to cousin William<sup>6</sup>.

Taking stock at this point: William<sup>6</sup> now has rights to 3/5 of Samuel<sup>5</sup> S33 Tract (the 1/5s previously owned by William<sup>5</sup>, Nicholas<sup>5</sup>, and Elizabeth<sup>5</sup>) and also 2/5 of the 1/5 owned by his father John<sup>5</sup>). Brother John<sup>6</sup> now has rights to the other 3/5 of the 1/5 owned by his father John<sup>5</sup>. Note that 1/5 of Samuel<sup>5</sup> S33 Tract is unaccounted for, the part belonging to Catherine<sup>5</sup>.

N.B. All the deeds discussed in this section are contiguous in the Richland Co., Ohio, deed book, and contiguous also with all the deeds discussed in the preceding section about John<sup>5</sup>'s children.

### Back to the John<sup>5</sup> Sketch

On 29 June 1849, Nancy Moffit, of Richland Co., Ohio, the widow of John<sup>5</sup> Rutan deceased, sold (quitclaimed) to William<sup>6</sup> Rutan, of Crawford Co., Ohio, for a yearly payment of \$30 during her natural life, the tract of land which was her dower, namely NE¼ S19 T20 R18—that is, John<sup>5</sup> S19 Tract.<sup>[592]</sup> As a reminder, this was the grant of United States lands made to John<sup>5</sup> in 1820. The very next deed in the record is the following transaction regarding the same tract:

On 2 July 1849, William Rutan and his wife Hannah, of Crawford Co., Ohio, sold to John B. Vanderbelt, of Richland Co., Ohio, for \$2,450, a tract called NE¼ S19 T20 R18 “to be sold at Wooster and lying and being in Richland County Ohio saving and excepting thirty eight acres off the east side of said quarter section.”<sup>[593]</sup> Presumably, the 38 acres not sold was reserved for Nancy Moffit, who would live until 1853.

In 1850 Nancy “Maffet,” 73, born in Virginia, resided in Troy Twp., Richland Co., Ohio, in the household of “Ann” Cracraft, 36, born in Ohio, with \$2,500 real estate.<sup>[594]</sup>

WILLIAM<sup>5</sup> RUTAN (<sub>38</sub>John<sup>4</sup>, John<sup>3</sup>, Peter<sup>2</sup>, Abraham<sup>1</sup>) was born about 1773 (calculated), died 24 Oct. 1845, age 72, and was buried in Old Mahoning Pioneer Cem., Warren, Trumbull Co., Ohio.<sup>[595]</sup> He married (1) HANNAH —,<sup>[596]</sup> who was born about 1766 (calculated), daughter of Henry Lane [proof? she is not listed as child of Henry Lane Sr. in *History of Western Reserve*], and who died 23 May 1825, age 59, and was buried near her husband.<sup>[597]</sup> William married (2) 8 Nov. 1826 Boardman, Trumbull (now in Mahoning) Co., Ohio, REBECCA (SHIELDS) GUY, who was born 29 Aug. 1781, died 30 Apr. 1853, and was buried in Old Champion Cem., Champion, Trumbull Co., Ohio.<sup>[598]</sup> Rebecca had married, firstly, 22 May 1806, Trumbull Co., Ohio, Matthew Guy, and had at least one child: Mary Guy.

A snippet from a biography of their son, Abraham<sup>6</sup>, from 1880:

Rutan, Abraham, farmer; P.O. West Windsor; his parents [Nicholas<sup>5</sup> and Mary] came from Westmoreland Co., Penn., in 1822, and settled in what is now Ashland Co., then a part of this county [Richland Co., Ohio]. . . .<sup>[603]</sup>

Nicholas Rutan served as a Corporal in Hill's Regiment of the Pennsylvania Militia in the War of 1812.<sup>[604]</sup> The Pennsylvania Archives has a roll of Capt. Daniel McKown's Company in a regiment of the Pennsylvania militia commanded by Col. Rees Hill, for the period 25 May 1813 to 2 Nov. 1813, and listing Nicholas Rutan as Corporal.<sup>[605]</sup>

On 9 Jan. 1817, "Nicholas Ruten of Westmoreland county Pennsylvania" was granted a tract of land by the U.S. Government Land Office (via President James Madison) in Ohio, designated as SE $\frac{1}{4}$  S9 T24 R17.<sup>[606]</sup>

N.B. On 9 Jan. 1817 Samuel "Ruten" of Westmoreland Co., Pa., was granted a tract in what is now Ashland Co., Ohio, located just outside Richland Co., Ohio. See Figure 19 and Figure 21. This is the tract we shall call "Samuel<sup>5</sup> S33 Tract," being SE $\frac{1}{4}$  S33 T25 R17. It is important to our argument, of course, that these putative brothers were issued grants in Ohio on the same date.

In 1830 "Nicholes" Rutan, 40-50 [born 1780-1790], resided in Milton Twp., Richland Co., Ohio., with a woman 40-50, one boy under 5 [John], one girl 5-10 [probably Athalia], and one male 10-15 [probably Abraham].<sup>[607]</sup>

In 1840 Nicholas Rutan, 50-60 [born 1780-1790], resided in Milton Twp., Richland Co., Ohio., with a woman 40-50 [born 1790-1800], one male 10-15 [John], one female 10-15 [probably Athalia], and one male 20-30 [probably Abraham].<sup>[608]</sup> In both this census and the 1830,

the dates for the older two children are off a few years, but the gender and order are as expected.

In 1850 “Nicholus” Rutan, 64, a farmer born in Pennsylvania, with \$3,000 real estate, resided in Milton Twp., Ashland Co., Ohio., with Mary, 58, born in Pennsylvania, and with Abraham, 32, born in Pennsylvania, John, 22, born in Ohio, both farmers, and with “Wm.” Egner, 9, born in Ohio.<sup>[609]</sup> William Egner appears in the 1860 with son Abraham.

In 1860 Mary Rutan, 67, born in Pennsylvania, with \$3,000 real and \$300 personal estates, resided in Milton Twp., Ashland Co., Ohio., with Amanda Spruce, 14, born in Ohio. Sharing the dwelling was Hugh Burns, 50, a farmer born in Pennsylvania (see details in Athalia<sup>6</sup>'s sketch). Next door was John Rutan, 32.<sup>[610]</sup>

On 2 Mar. 1860, Nicholas Rutan, of Ashland Co., Ohio, signed his will, and a codicil to it on the same day, and they were proved 10 Mar. 1860. It mentions “my two sons Abraham Rutan and John Rutan,” “my Daughter Athalia Burns,” “my wife Mary Rutan,” “the heirs of Hugh Burns and Athalia his wife.” Executors: George Springer and Henry Sainer. Witnesses: George Springer and James Wharton.<sup>[611]</sup>

CATHERINE<sup>5</sup> RUTAN (<sub>38</sub>John<sup>4</sup>, John<sup>3</sup>, Peter<sup>2</sup>, Abraham<sup>1</sup>) was born 1775-1794 (say, 1790), married ASA LANE, who was born 1775-1794, son of Henry Lane, and died just prior to 26 Sept. 1825, Westmoreland Co., Pa., when letters of administration on Asa's intestate estate were issued.

According to the 1910 *History of the Western Reserve*, what is now Warren, Trumbull Co., Ohio, was settled by Ephraim Quimby, from Washington Co., Pa., in 1799. The second party of settlers in Warren also came from Washington Co., Pa. In this group was Henry Lane Sr., his wife, and their children, John, Benjamin, Asa, Catherine, Annie, and Henry Jr. They came in 1800. "Asa returned to Pennsylvania in 1820 and died there."<sup>[612]</sup>

In 1820 Asa Lane, 26-45 [born 1775-1794], resided in Rostraver Twp., Westmoreland Co., Pa., with a woman 26-45, one boy and two girls under 10 [born 1810-1820], and two girls 10-16 [born 1804-1810]. Listed next to Asa is John "Retan" (100010,11101).<sup>[613]</sup>

On 26 Sept. 1825, Catherine Lane was issued letters of administration for the estate of Asa Lane, deceased, in Westmoreland Co., Pa.<sup>[614]</sup> She was known as Catherine Lane in her father's will of 20 Nov. 1832.

ington Co., Pa.<sup>[615]</sup> They had no children. Mary married, secondly, 7 Feb. 1820 (Bible record), SAMUEL DAVIS.

On 9 Jan. 1817 “Samuel Ruten of Westmoreland county Pennsylvania” was granted a tract from the U.S. General Land Office (via President James Madison) in what is now Ashland Co., Ohio, located just outside (east of) modern Richland Co., Ohio.<sup>[616]</sup> See Figure 19 and Figure 21. This is the tract we call “Samuel<sup>5</sup> S33 Tract,” being SE¼ S33 T25 R17, which was involved in so many land transactions among the siblings and children of John<sup>5</sup> (q.v.).

N.B. On 9 Jan. 1817, “Nicholas Ruten of Westmoreland county Pennsylvania” was granted a tract of land by the U.S. Government Land Office (via President James Madison) in what is now Ashland Co., Ohio, designated as SE¼ S9 T24 R17.<sup>[617]</sup> See Figure 20 and Figure 21. It is important to our argument, of course, that these putative brothers, located in the same place, were granted tracts in the same part of Ohio on the same date, with consecutive accession numbers. Nicholas’s tract lies exactly 2 miles south of Samuel’s.

A major assist in the creation of my theory about Samuel<sup>5</sup> came from James J. Keegan’s *A Third Rutan Family Index*, which lists the following two items together in the Pennsylvania section:

This alerted me to the importance of the surname Teeple. Mary Teeple of Washington Co., Pa., was suggestive of a family connection to Isaac Teeple, who made deals with John<sup>4</sup> Rutan. And it told me that one researcher, at least, had assigned a Samuel Rutan, died 1818, to John<sup>4</sup> Rutan and his wife Catherine, as his parents. This would make him Samuel<sup>5</sup>, not Samuel<sup>4</sup> as my initial theory had proposed.

In fact, the Teeple family Bible record presented in appendix C spells out the connection to the Teeple family. And, by changing my theory from Samuel<sup>4</sup> to Samuel<sup>5</sup>, the two items above quickly resolved into one Samuel.

There is an 1818 estate record of a Samuel “Ratan” in Westmoreland Co., Pa., with administrators Isaac Teeple and John “Ratan.” Letters of administration were issued in 1818, and the account for the estate was recorded in 1819 and 1821, presumably an initial inventory and a final accounting.<sup>[619]</sup> I have not been able to access these files, but we have the following:

On 5 May 1818, Isaac “Teepler” and John “Ratan” were bonded in Westmoreland Co., Pa., for \$500, to administer the estate of Samuel “Ratan,” deceased, with cobondsmen Peter Rugh and Joseph Budd.<sup>[620]</sup>

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“(George A. Rutan)” is a mention of the source of the information. Whether that is so or not, see the sketch for George Albert<sup>9</sup> Rutan Jr. (*George Albert<sup>8</sup>, Samuel<sup>7</sup>, Samuel<sup>6</sup>, John<sup>5</sup>, Samuel<sup>4</sup>, John<sup>3</sup>, Peter<sup>2</sup>, Abraham<sup>1</sup>*) herein, in the sketch for Samuel<sup>6</sup> Rutan (*John<sup>5</sup>*). George Jr. was the father of Burt and Dick Rutan featured in this book. See J. 121. **ELIZABETH<sup>5</sup> RUTAN** (<sub>3</sub>John<sup>4</sup>, John<sup>3</sup>, Peter<sup>2</sup>, Abraham<sup>1</sup>) was born 3 [Aug.?] 1795 (calculated), Pennsylvania, died 23 [Oct.?] 1819, aged 24 years 2 months 9 days, and was buried in Shepler Church Cem., Navarre, Stark Co., Ohio.<sup>[621]</sup> She married 1816 (see Shepler bio), Pennsylvania, **MATTHIAS SHEPLER**, who was born 11 Nov. 1790, Westmoreland Co., Pa. (Congressional bio), died 7 Apr. 1863, and was buried near Elizabeth.<sup>[622]</sup> Matthias married two more times: secondly to **Elizabeth Beghtel** on 2 Mar. 1826, Stark Co., Ohio,<sup>[623]</sup> and had six children, and thirdly to **Sarah Linerode** on 3 May 1842, Stark Co.,<sup>[624]</sup> and had no further children.

**Matthias Shepler** (November 11, 1790 – April 7, 1863) was a U.S. Representative from Ohio for one term from 1837 to 1839.

Born in Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania, Shepler received a limited schooling. He served in the War of 1812. He moved to Ohio in April 1818 and settled in Bethlehem Township, Stark County, Ohio. Shepler was elected as a Democrat to the Twenty-fifth Congress (March 4, 1837 - March 3, 1839). He served as chairman of the Committee on Revisal and Unfinished Business (Twenty-fifth Congress).

He declined to be a candidate for renomination in 1838. He moved to Navarre, Ohio, in 1860, where he died April 7, 1863. He was interred in Shepler Church Cemetery, near Navarre.

Shepler was married three times, first in 1816. He had seven children. He was a member of the Church of the United Brethren in Christ.<sup>[625]</sup>

The following quotation is from the reference behind the biography above:

Mathias Shepler was born in Westmoreland county, Pennsylvania, November 11, 1790. His advantages of early education were limited. He served in the war of 1812, married in 1816, and in April, 1818, removed to Ohio, settling upon a quarter section of land entered by his father in Bethlehem township, Stark county. His wife accompanied him on horseback, carrying a child the whole distance . . .

Mr. Shepler left his farm in 1860 and removed to Navarre, where he died April 7, 1863, from a disease of the respiratory organs, supposed to be consumption. His body was interred upon the homestead farm. Mr. Shepler was married three times. He had one child by his first wife, John R. Shepler, still living, a retired minister; six by his second marriage, only two living; and no children by his last wife.<sup>[626]</sup>

So both Elizabeth and her child were probably born in Westmoreland Co., Pa., where she was probably married too. Since she died in 1819, the child she brought to Ohio must have been her only one. Elizabeth<sup>5</sup>'s 1/5 of the Samuel<sup>5</sup> S33 Tract in Richland Co., Ohio, was passed whole to her single heir John R.<sup>6</sup> Shepler.

In 1900 Harold Conover, 46, a pictures agent born Sept. 1853, resided in Plainfield, Union Co., N.J., with his wife of 11 years, Minnie, 35, born Dec. 1864, both born in New Jersey of New Jersey natives. Minnie had had no children.<sup>[713]</sup>

Obituary for George DeWitt Garretson:

George DeWitt Garretson, native of South Bound Brook, died yesterday in his home in High street. He was born on July 12, 1849. He is survived by his widow who was Minnie Smith Conover.

On 26 Aug. 1845, Thomas Brown and Eleanor his wife, of Richland Co., Ohio, sold to William Rutan, of the same place, for \$35, a tract of land, “viz In Lot No three in Harveys Addition to the Town of Lexington in said County of Richland.”<sup>[725]</sup>

Repeated from the John<sup>5</sup> sketch: On 2 July 1849, William Rutan and his wife Hannah, of Crawford Co., Ohio, sold to John B. Vanderbilt, of Richland Co., Ohio, for \$2,450, a tract called NE¼ S19 T20 R18 “to be sold at Wooster and lying and being in Richland County Ohio saving and excepting thirty eight acres off the east side of said quarter section.”<sup>[726]</sup> This tract had been in mother Nancy Moffit’s dower (cf. deed of 29 June 1849).

On 10 Mar. 1848, Ezekiel Clark and Susan his wife, John Clark, William Rutan and Hannah his wife, Milton Lewis and Sarah his wife, John Murphy and Mary his wife, Samuel J. Kirkwood and Jane his wife, Isabella Clark, Lois Clark, Phebe Ann Clark, and Priscilla Clark leased, for \$50, to Isabella Clark widow and relict of Icahbod Clark, deceased, 270 acres in Richland Co., Ohio, for the rest of her natural life. The heirs residing in Richland Co., Ohio, acknowledged the lease on 14 Mar. 1848 there. William Rutan and Hannah his wife acknowledged it in Crawford Co., Ohio, on 17 Oct. 1848.<sup>[727]</sup>

N.B. Crawford Co. and Richland Co., Ohio, abut one another in the northcentral part of the state.

In 1850 William Rutan, 42, a merchant born in Ohio, resided in Troy Twp., Richland Co., Ohio, with Hannah, 35, born in Ohio, and

with Isabell, 16, Sarah J., 14, John, 10, William H., 8, and Hannah, 2, all born in Ohio. [Hannah's mother,] "Isabell" Clark, 58, born in Pennsylvania, and her family resided in the next dwelling.<sup>[728]</sup>

On 22 Apr. 1854 the Clark heirs listed in the preceding deed of 10 Mar. 1848 (as modified by new spouses and new residences) sold to Hannah Rutan, of Richland Co., Ohio, for \$500, a tract of 25 acres in Richland Co. being part ("of the east end") of S½SE S2 T20 R19. In detail, the heirs were Isabella Clark, John "Murphey" and Mary his wife, Milton Lewis and Sarah his wife, Samuel J. Kirkwood and Jane his wife, Lois Clark, and Priscilla Clark, of Richland Co., and Ezekiel Clark and Sylvia P. his wife, Wesley Redhead and "Isabel" his wife, Edward W. Lucas and Phebe Ann his wife, and John Clark, of Iowa. It was acknowledged in Richland Co., Ohio, on 1 May 1854, and in Johnson Co., Iowa, on 23 May 1854.<sup>[729]</sup> Although William Rutan was not mentioned in this deed, he must have still been alive as witnessed by this next deed:

On 22 Apr. 1854 the Clark heirs listed in the preceding deed also of 22 Apr. 1854, with the addition of William Rutan and Hannah his wife, sold to John "Murphey" and Mary his wife (both excluded of course from the list of selling heirs), of Richland Co., Ohio, for \$1,500, a tract in Richland Co. being S½SE S2 T20 R19, less the 25 acres of the preceding deed. It was acknowledged the same dates and places as the preceding deed.<sup>[730]</sup>

There is another such "Clark heirs" deed in the Richland Co., Ohio, deed books, but since the dates and names are almost identical to the above deeds, and since both William Rutan and Hannah his wife continue to be parties to it, I shall not go into its details here.<sup>[731]</sup>

On 4 Feb. 1856, William Rutan and Hannah his wife, of Richland Co., Ohio, sold to William Logan Jr., of the same place, for \$2,000, a tract of land of 70 acres in Richland Co., being part of S½NW S12 T20 R19, plus another 10 acres from the SW¼.<sup>[732]</sup>

Again on 4 Feb. 1856, William Rutan and Hannah his wife, of Richland Co., Ohio, sold to Thomas Logan, of the same place, for \$700, a tract of land of 25 acres in Richland Co., being part of S½SE S2 T20 R19.<sup>[733]</sup>

In 1860 William “Reutan,” 50, a farmer born in Pennsylvania, with \$4,780 real and \$2,140 personal estates, resided in Prairie City, Mount. Prairie Twp., Jasper Co., Iowa, with Hannah, 45, born in Ohio, and with Isabell A., 27, John C., 20, William H., 17, and J. H., 11, all born in Ohio, and Wesley E., 3, born in Iowa.<sup>[734]</sup>

In 1870 William Rutan, 64, a farm hand born in Ohio, resided in Iowa City, Johnson Co., Iowa, with Hannah, 56, born in Ohio, and with Janetha, 21, a schoolteacher born in Ohio, and “Westly,” 13, born in Iowa.<sup>[735]</sup>

An obituary for William:

At his residence in West Lucas, near Iowa City, Lordsday, February 22, 1880, Wm. Rutan, aged 72 years and two months. He had been in feeble health for many years, but passed away suddenly at the last, after suffering through two days from heart disease.

Bro. Rutan was born in Trumbull county, Ohio, December 28, 1807; in his boyhood moved to Richland county, in the same state, and there, in after years, married Miss Hannah Clark, sister of Hon. Ezekiel Clark, of this city<sup>[736]</sup> and also sister to the wife of Senator Kirkwood.<sup>[737]</sup> Of this un-

ion six children remain,—three boys and three girls. In 1835 Brother Rutan united with the Christian Church in Mansfield [county seat of Richland Co.], Ohio, came to Iowa in 1857, and settled near Des Moines. Moved to Montana in 1864; returned to Iowa City in 1869, and remained here until death gave his spirit release from a body weary with years and service. Deafness shut him out from the pleasure of life, but shut him in with God and his word. The Bible was his constant companion and solace, and toward the last his voice, long lost to him, returned again, and the sunset of his life was made glorious by faith and praise—the promise of eternal day.<sup>[738]</sup>

Sarah was sister of Rev. Abner C. Cracraft who married Samuel<sup>6</sup>'s sister Anna<sup>6</sup> Rutan. *This is Burt and Dick Rutan's line.*

N.B., "Pop" Rutan's genealogy chart ([unsourced](#)) states that Samuel Rutan was born **5 Dec. 1809, Westmoreland Co., Pa.**, died **24 Jan. 1885, San Louis Obispo, Calif.**, married **6 Dec. 1832 (? [sic])**, Ohio, to Sarah Cracraft, born **8 June 1809, Pa.**, daughter of Joseph Cracraft and Ruth Chase, and died **25 July 1875, San Joaquin Co., Calif.**<sup>[743]</sup> I used the hints in this chart, particularly the hint that Sarah's surname was Cracraft, to determine the following case for her (but the items in red above remain unresolved or incorrect):

**Placeholder:** An **unvetted** note on <Ancestry.com> linked to Joseph W. Craycraft:

Joseph married Ruth Chase, **daughter of Abner Chase and Abigail Scranton** on 5 Apr 1804 in Washington (Co), Pennsylvania. **Ruth was born 23 Feb 1783 in Dartmouth, Bristol, Massachusetts.** She died on 13 **[my evidence has this date 18]** Aug 1870 in Springfield Twp, Richland Co, Ohio.<sup>[744]</sup>

"Bristol ss Dartmouth February 5<sup>th</sup> day 1781. Then Joyned Together in Marriage Abner Chace and Abigail Scranton both of Dartmouth Witness Benj<sup>n</sup> Akin Jus<sup>t</sup> peace." [*Massachusetts, Town Vital Collections, 1620-1988, Dartmouth Births, Marriages and Deaths, image 902 of 2331 at <Ancestry.com>.*] **But I have found no evidence that they were connected to the Ruth who married Joseph Cracraft, or indeed that Ruth's surname was Chase.**

In 1810 Joseph "Craycraft," 26-45, resided in Morris Twp., Washington Co., Pa., with a woman 26-45, and two males and two females under 10.<sup>[745]</sup> Note that Sarah Cracraft would have been 1 year old.

In 1820 Joseph Cracraft, 26–45, resided in Troy Twp., Richland Co., Ohio, with a woman 26–45, one male under 10, and two males and two females 10–16.<sup>[746]</sup> Note that Sarah Cracraft would have been 11, and Abner 9.

In 1830 Joseph Cracraft, 40–50, resided in Troy Twp., Richland Co., Ohio, with a woman, 40–50, and with one male under 6, one female 10–15, one male 15–20, one male and one female 20–30.<sup>[747]</sup> Sarah would have been 21, and Abner 19.

In 1840 Joseph Cracraft, 50–60, resided in Troy Twp., Richland Co., with a woman, 50–60, one male 15–20 and one female 20–30.<sup>[748]</sup> Sarah would have moved out by this census, when she married in say 1833.

Considering the intermarriages with the Rutan family, it is curious that Samuel Rutan does not appear in the 1820 to 1840 censuses for Richland Co., although he was clearly there, as the deeds show.

In 1850 Joseph Cracraft, 67, a farmer born in Pennsylvania, resided in Troy, Richland Co., Ohio, with Ruth, 67, born in Massachusetts, and with Joseph, 23, born in Ohio. Charles Cracraft, 44, resided in the next dwelling.<sup>[749]</sup>

In 1870 Ruth Cracraft, 87, born in Pennsylvania [*sic*], resided in Troy Twp., Richland Co., Ohio, in the home of Thomas (age 70) and Clara (age 69) Wiley, both born in Pennsylvania. Enumeration occurred on 7 July 1870, about a month before Ruth died (see next).<sup>[750]</sup>

Ruth Cracraft, born about 1783, died 18 Aug. 1870, and was buried in Fairview Day Cem., Troy Twp., Richland Co., Ohio.<sup>[751]</sup>

Joseph Cracraft [Jr.], born 20 Oct. 1826 (calculated), died 13 Apr. 1879, aged 52 years 5 months 24 days, and was buried in Hiawatha Cem., Hiawatha, Brown Co., Kans.<sup>[752]</sup> On 22 Nov. 1855, Richland Co., Ohio, Joseph Cracraft married Miss Lucretia Penn.<sup>[753]</sup>

In 1870 Joseph Cracraft, 42, a farmer born in Ohio, resided in Capioma, Nemaha Co., Kans., with Lucretia, 35, born in New York, and with Louie, 10, and Andrew W., 32, both born in Ohio, and with **W. Cha<sup>s</sup> Rutan**, 28, a farm laborer born in Ohio, and two other laborers.<sup>[754]</sup> **W. Charles<sup>7</sup> Rutan** was a son of the current Samuel<sup>6</sup> (q.v.).

On 21 Apr. 1879, Lucretia P. Cracraft, **W. C. Rutan**, A. W. Cracraft, J. P. Davis, Mary A. Cracraft, and A. Schilling put up a \$20,000 bond to the State of Kansas to ensure that Lucretia P. Cracraft would fully honor her responsibility as administrator of the estate of Joseph Cracraft, deceased. Then, on 22 Apr. 1879, in Brown Co., Kans., she was made the administrator of his estate.<sup>[755]</sup>

So the circumstantial case that Sarah was a Cracraft is fairly strong. Now we return to Samuel himself.

On 13 Aug. 1831, Samuel Rutan of Richland Co., Ohio, bought from John Mitchell and Ann his wife, of Sandusky Twp, Richland Co., 80 acres (E½SE S11 T20 R20), for \$200.<sup>[756]</sup>

On 6 Nov. 1833, Samuel Rutan, of Richland Co., Ohio, bought from James Bryant, of Knox Co., Ohio, 120 acres (W “part” of SE¼ S10 T20 R20), for \$500.<sup>[758]</sup> N.B. W½SE has only 80 acres; SE¼ alone has 160 acres.

On 7 May 1834, Samuel Rutan and Sarah his wife, of Richland Co., Ohio, sold to Benjamin Ogden, of the same place, for \$80, a tract of 20 acres in Richland Co., being part of SE¼ S10 T20 R20, acknowledged the same date, recorded 1 Mar. 1843.<sup>[759]</sup> Compare the deed of 6 Nov. 1833 above.

N.B. I descend from this Benjamin Ogden. His daughter Henrietta Ogden married Sylvester Parrot who descended from the Thomas Parrot who married Rosannah<sup>4</sup> Rutan (q.v.). This brings together the old New Jersey families of Ogden, Rutan, and Parrot. This is also perhaps the closest approach of my Rutan ancestry to that of the Dick and Burt Rutan brothers. Of passing interest, however, is that their mother was born in San Jon, New Mexico, a tiny town just 57 miles straight north from my hometown of Clovis, N.M.

So Samuel<sup>6</sup> sold his tract portion to brother John<sup>6</sup>.

In 1850 Samuel Rutan, 40, a farmer born in Ohio, with \$1,500 real estate, resided in Wilmington Twp., Will Co., Ill., with Sarah, 41, born in Pennsylvania, Joseph, 16, Catarine, 14, John, 12, Adam 10, Charles, 8, George, 6, all born in Ohio, and Mary, 4/12, born in Illinois.<sup>[762]</sup>

In 1860 Samuel Rutan, 50, a farmer born in Ohio, resided in Elkhorn, San Joaquin Co., Calif., with Sarah, 51, born in Pennsylvania, Adam P., 20, Charles, 18, George W., 16, all born in Ohio, and Samuel, 9, born in Illinois.<sup>[763]</sup>

On 11 June 1867, Samuel Rutan, 58, a farmer born in Ohio, registered to vote in San Joaquin Co., Calif., residence Elk Horn.<sup>[764]</sup> So did his brother John the previous day.

In 1870 “Sam” Rutan, 60, a farmer born in Ohio, with \$3,000 real and \$1,000 personal estates, resided in Stockton, Elkhorn Twp., San Joaquin Co., Calif., with Sarah, 61, born in Pennsylvania, Sarah, 30, a farmer born in Ohio, with \$2,000 real and \$300 personal estates, Samuel, 18, born in Illinois, and Sarah, 10, born in California.<sup>[765]</sup>

In 1880 Samuel Rutan, 70, a farmer born in Ohio of Pennsylvania natives, resided in St. Helena, Napa Co., Calif., in the household of his son, Adam P. Rutan, 39, a farm laborer born in Ohio of Ohio natives,

On 31 Dec. 1833, Abner Cracraft and Anna, his wife, of Richland Co., Ohio, sold to William Rutan, of the same place, for \$125, a piece of land in Richland Co. being “an equal undivided fifth part” of NE¼ S19 T20 R18 [that is, John<sup>4</sup> S19 Grant] “of which said Anna Cracraft is seized and possessed as heir at law of John Rutan late of said county deceased in common with said William Rutan Samuel Rutan Catherine Rutan & John Rutan Jn<sup>r</sup> all heirs at law of said John Rutan Dec<sup>d</sup>.”<sup>[769]</sup>

On 9 Aug. 1841, Abner C. Cracraft signed his will, and it was proved (and letters issued) 12 Nov. 1841, Richland Co., Ohio. It mentions “my beloved wife Anna Cracraft,” “Abner W. Cracraft, Son of James Cracraft,” and “Joseph Cracraft my Father.” It also mentions an 80-acre tract, lying in Richland Co., Ohio, namely E½NE S16 T20 R19.<sup>[770]</sup>

On 7 Apr. 1853, Anna Cracraft, of Richland Co., Ohio, sold to George M. Miller of the same place, for \$6, a tract in Richland Co., part of NW¼ S24 T20 R19 containing 14.25 square rods, apparently adjoining land Miller already owned.<sup>[771]</sup>

In 1850 John Rutan, 30, a landlord born in Ohio, resided in Richland Co., Wisc., with Susan, 28, born in Pennsylvania, and William C. “Vansickle,” 30, born in New Jersey, and one laborer.<sup>[780]</sup>

In 1860 John “Rutann,” 40, a farmer born in Ohio, with \$600 real and \$400 personal estates, resided in Franklin, Sacramento Co., Calif., with Eliza, 23, born in Ohio, and C. F., 2, male, born in Calif.<sup>[781]</sup>

On 13 Nov. 1855, Abraham Rutan of Richland Co., Ohio, sold to (his brother-in-law) Hugh Burns, of Ashland Co., Ohio, for \$2,000, a tract of land in Weller Twp., Richland Co., of 80 acres (minus 4+ acres), namely S½NW S30 T24 R17 and also the tract being a part of SE¼ S25 T22 R18, containing 2+ acres.<sup>[789]</sup>

On 18 May 1867, Abraham [transcribed as Adam but signed as Abraham] Rutan of Richland Co., Ohio, sold to Hugh Burns, for \$2,600, a tract of land in Ashland Co., of 80+ acre, namely W½SE S9 T24 R17.<sup>[790]</sup>

In 1860 Abraham Rutan, 40 [sic], a farmer born in Ohio with \$300 real and \$800 personal estates, resided in Olivesburg, Weller Twp., Richland Co., Ohio, with Susan, 25, born in Pennsylvania, and with Amanda, 5, born in Pennsylvania, and William “Egnor,” 19, born in Ohio.<sup>[791]</sup>

was serious. The body has not arrived in Carrollton and no arrangements have been made here, as yet, for the funeral. However, funeral services and burial will be in Carrollton. Mr. Rutan and his wife and daughter Sara had been spending their winters in Florida for the past 10 or 15 years, Mr. Rutan owning property in St. Petersburg.

Mr. Rutan was born in Perry Twp., this county, August 16, 1843, being the fifth of eight children. His paternal grandparents settled in this county in 1818. He attended school at Harlem and Scio colleges. He was a Civil War veteran and served 100 days in Co. I. 157th O.V.I., and in 1865 re-enlisted in Co. A, 186th O.V.I. His death leaves but four Civil War veterans living in Carrollton. He lived on extensive farms in Perry and Center Townships all his life. Mr. Rutan was an extensive wool buyer and has bought over 15,000,000 pounds of wool. In 1889 he was elected county treasurer and was reelected in 1891. In 1897 he was elected representative of the Carroll-Harrison district in the legislature.

On September 6, 1870 he was married to Anna H. Ebersole who survives, together with two daughters, Mrs. James McKalip of Pittsburgh, and Miss Sara Rutan of the home. He is also survived by a sister, Miss Hattie Rutan of Carrollton. Mr. Rutan was a powerful force in republican politics and as a politician could size up a situation and control a convention. As a power behind the throne he elected many men and defeated others in nominations and elections.

Mr. Rutan was a member of the famous legislature which elected Mark Hanna to the United States senate. He was one of the House who refused to vote for Hanna; those seven and the democratic members voting for Robert E. McKisson, republican of Cleveland. It was one of the bitterest political fights in Ohio's history and they came within one vote of defeating Hanna. Mr. Rutan was a subscriber to *The Chronicle* from its first issue in 1871, and his name was a continuous one on our subscription list.<sup>[858]</sup>

Legendary pilot Dick Rutan, whose round-the-world flight made history in 1986, slipped the surly bonds of earth on May 3, 2024 in Coeur d'Alene, Idaho. His beloved wife Kris was at his side as he passed.

Raised in Dinuba, CA, Dick fostered dreams of joining the Air Force and flying fighter jets from an early age. He earned his pilot wings and driver's license on the same day—his 16th birthday. Three years later he enlisted in the U.S. Air Force. Rutan flew 325 combat missions in Vietnam, 105 of those as a member of the “Misty” squadron, a high-risk, classified Air Force unit.

Dick retired from the Air Force in 1978 having served two decades, earning sixteen Air Medals, five Distinguished Flying Crosses, the Silver Star and the Purple Heart.

After retirement he worked as a test pilot for the Mojave aerospace company founded by his brother Burt. There, Dick flew research and development flights of both military and civilian experimental aircraft. He set world speed and distance records in the airplane he built with his own hands—the Long-EZ.

Dick founded Voyager Aircraft, Inc. in 1981 to meet a challenge presented by his brother—be the first to fly around the world non-stop, non-refueled. The grassroots effort drew hundreds of volunteers world-wide to support the endeavor.

On December 14, 1986, the Voyager took off on its historic flight. Nine days later, Dick set the storm-battered Voyager down at Edwards Air Force Base to achieve “Aviation's Last, First Milestone.”

Dick Rutan, co-pilot Jeana Yeager, Burt Rutan and their team of volunteers were awarded the Collier Trophy—the highest honor in American aviation, and the Presidential Citizen's Medal presented by President Ronald Reagan. The Voyager now hangs in the Smithsonian Air & Space Museum in Washington D.C.

Dick continued to live by his motto “Adventure is the essence of Life.” He tested rocket-powered aircraft; attempted to become the first person to fly nonstop around the world in a balloon; ran for Congress; and built an igloo in the North Pole after his airplane broke through the polar ice.



Dick was inducted into the National Aviation Hall of Fame in 2002 and became an Eagle at the Gathering of Eagles in 2003. He published “The Next Five Minutes” a memoir, in 2019.

Dick’s greatest pride was his family whom he loved, his fellowship with other Veterans; the youngsters he inspired; and the legions of people who supported his endeavors as he lived his exceptional life of adventure.

Lt. Col. Richard “Dick” Glenn Rutan will be buried with full honors at Arlington National Cemetery.

Survivors include his wife of 25 years Kris Rutan; two daughters, Holly Hogan, Jill Rutan–Hoffman; two step-daughters Shannon Ford and Kelly Roth; sister Nell, brother Burt; eight grandchildren and one great-granddaughter.<sup>[1005]</sup>
