The Descendants of William Lawson Smith (1852-1906?) and Emily Spartis Guthrie (1855-1939) of Texas

This is the continuing saga of the descendants of Jesse R. Smith and Elizabeth Harrison Smith and an examination of the life of their 3rd child and his children and an introduction of his grandchildren. As usual, I'll leave a brief introduction of Ernest and Isabella before delving into the children.

William was the 3rd child of Jesse and Elizabeth arriving in 1852 probably in Washington County before the move to Atascosa in late 1850's. He first appears in the 1860 Census in Atascosa County with 6 siblings, his parents, and an uncle. He shows up next in 1870 after the family moved to Atascosa and everyone is still at home. Records show that in Jul 1873, he has made his way to Bell County and married Emily Spartis Guthrie. He would have been 20 and Emily almost 18. Emily had been born near Hallettsville, TX in Lavaca County in 1855 and she was one of the youngest children of William Guthrie and his last of several wives.

Lola was William and Emily's 10th and final child. While she claims Gainesville as her birthplace, my earlier explanation would suggest that it was more likely Bartlett. She appears as Delores in 1900 and Lola in 1910, and then does not reappear in the Census until 1930 at which point she and Charlie Bennett are living in Cottle County in the Texas Panhandle working on a farm with their 3 sons, Lonnie Clifford Bennett 1912, William Losson Bennett 1914, and Ova Vestal Bennett 1922. The census shows that Charlie was 24 when they married in 1911 and Lola had

been 16. The boys were 17, 15, and 7 causing one to wonder if she perhaps lost a child between 1915 and 1923. Charlie registered for the WW1 Draft in 1917 at which time they lived at Northfield TX which is an area in Cottle County. He had been born in Williamson County and was married with 2 children which would have been Lonnie and Bill. From what I have pieced together, Charlie's father was George Walter Bennet and his mother was Lucy Ward Bennet. Looking deeper, it appears that his father was the brother of Summie Fee Bennet who was of course the husband of Lola's oldest surviving sister, Cora. Let's see – Lola's husband is the nephew of his brother-in-law. To my family, my sister Kathryn would have had to marry Bruce's nephew. Bruce's nephews are Nathan or one of his sister's sons.

Lonnie was the first of three children born to Charles and Lola Smith Bennet arriving in Hall County on 9 Aug 1912 which is a county up in the Panhandle southeast of Amarillo. Since I am missing the 1920 Census for his family, he does not show up until 1930 when he is 17 and still at home on the family farm in Cottle, TX with his parents and his younger brother and sister. Cottle County is a little further south of Hall County and its county seat is Paducah. He seems to have gone by Bud, and as we will see, he named his son Buddy.

Per his wife's obituary (who apparently went by Ted) they were married Mar 1936 and two daughters arrived in short order with Starlene Bennett in 1936, and Willdene Bennett in 1939. These 4 appear in the 1940 Census in Cottle County where Lonnie is farming and they are living in a rental that costs \$4/month. You can see their education and note that Lonnie was 4 years older than Ted. I wish that all census enumerators were as neat and diligent as theirs were that year. Many of them are nearly unreadable, but this gentleman did a wonderful job.

Lonnie registered for the WW2 Draft in Oct 1940 when he was 28. He was living on the Childress Cee Vee Route in Cottle County, TX and working for W. W. Goundie. His father, Charles Bennett was his point of contact and he

lived near Childress. He was 5'-11"-150lbs-brown eyes-brown hair-light complexion. I have not found any evidence that Lonnie enlisted or was drafted. I guess he needed a new farmhand, because in 1947, they had

a son, Buddy Joe Bennett. The 1950 Census found that they had moved a bit north to Donley County

probably in the vicinity of Clarendon which is about 60 miles southeast of Amarillo. He was now 37 and still farming with two pre-teen daughters and a baby son. Margie was 32.

Farmers in small towns in west Texas don't seem to have generated many headlines. When searching the news for him the only this that I came up with was a Lonnie Bennet who was replacing Jim Bertleson as the University of Texas running back. Not our Lonnie. I'll do a quick check of the children to see what might come up.

In 1958, Starlene married William Pike III, the son of a geologist from Louisiana. He was in the Air Force when they married and had been training at Shepherd AFB. They had a daughter Debra Ann Pike in 1959.

They seem to have lived closer Wellington, TX than Clarendon or on a farm nearby, because I found an article from 1947 showing Starlene and Willdene both in the 2nd grade in Wellington and getting good grades. I have not found any records, but she married someone named Rouch. The only thing that I have so far found about her is a Willdene Rouch taking nurses training in Fort Worth in 1968. It's a unique name so I suspect that this is our Willdene. She died in 2022 in Lubbock. Buddy Joe seems to have married Vickie Powell in 1968 in Castro, TX. That is about the extent of my findings.

Lonnie died in Amarillo in 1986, but I have not found an obituary. Margie died in Lubbock at the age of 99 in 2016. Her obituary reads:

Mrs. Bennett was born October 1, 1917 in Kirkland, Texas to John D. and Willie May Cross. She married Lonnie Clifford Bennett on March 23, 1936 in Childress. She enjoyed working at the nursing home in Clarendon for 20 years prior to her retirement. She had been a resident of Clarendon and Colorado Springs before moving to Lubbock 15 years ago. She was a member of the Church of Christ.

PRECEDED IN DEATH BY – her parents; her husband on September 12, 1986; a grandchild; and several brothers and sisters.

SURVIVORS – a son, Joe Bennett of Lubbock; 2 daughters, Starlene Lindsay and Willdene Rouch both of Lubbock; 3 grandchildren; 8 great grandchildren; and 6 great grandchildren.

MEMORIALS- The family request memorials be sent to Hospice of Lubbock.

Lonnie and Margie's first child was Starlene who arrived in May 1936 in the middle of the depression in Cottle County where her father was working on a farm

probably near Paducah. She was joined by a little sister in 1939 and they appear in the 1940 Census. By 1950, they had moved a little north to a farm near Clarendon and they now had a little brother, Buddy Joe.

She attended high school in Claude, TX where I found her as a freshman in 1954 which means that she probably graduated in 1956 or 1957. I found her younger sister graduating in 1957 and the yearbooks for 1955 and 1956 are missing. In the late 1950's she met a young man who from Louisiana named Will Pike III who was in the Air Force and probably stationed at Dyess AFB in Abilene as they had a daughter, Deborah Ann Pike in Abilene on 26 July 1959. (That's exactly a year before my youngest sister), The next thing we hear about them is an article from Metairie, LA in Apr 1960:

Airman First Class William S. Pike III, son of Mr. and Mrs. William S. Pike Jr., 269 Hollywood Drive, Metairie, was graduated recently from the aircraft maintenance technician course at Sheppard Air Force Base, Texas.

Airman Pike is a graduate of St. Martin's school in Metairie. He is married to the former Miss Starlene Bennett of Amarillo, Texas and they have one child, Deborah Ann.

Airman Pike came to Sheppard AFB from Dyess AFB, Texas. Sheppard AFB is one of the 26 bases comprising Air Training Command. Third largest of the major air commands, ATC trains personnel in America's expanding aerospace force in which manned aircraft, missiles and spacecraft provide the world with its best guarantee of peace through deterrence.

Will's parents were both from Maryland and his father was a geologist working in the Louisiana oilfields in 1950. He appears to have been an only child. In August 1954 he completed his registration for the Selective Service while attending the University of the South in Sewanee, TN. He was 5'-9 ½"-140lbs-blue eyes-blonde hair-ruddy. His home address was 269 Hollywood Dr., New Orleans. Shortly after registering in 1954, he enlisted in the Air Force. He had been born Hamlin, TX in Aug 1936 which is just north of Abilene and where my aunt Kathryn was raised. I'm a little confused here as this would suggest that he graduated from high school in 1953 when he was 17 and headed off to college for a brief time before enlisting. Meanwhile, Starlene was only a freshman in 1954 yet they were the same age.

In the 1959 New Orleans City Directory, they were living in New Orleans at the 269 Hollywood address with Will's parents and his father was working for Shell Oil. His parents came from a Quaker family and his father was a prominent geologist who had earned a PHD and gone to work for Shell in 1934 and contributed significantly to Shell's success in offshore oil production. When he died in 1985, a portion of his obituary noted: Bill is survived by his wife Betty of Signal Mountain: his son Bill. daughter-in-law Mary. and grandson Barry. all of Kalamazoo. Michigan: and his granddaughter Deborah Goette. of Ypsilanti, Michigan. A great grandson. Dennis Goette. Jr. was born in late 1985.

This suggests that by 1985, Will and Starlene were no longer married and that daughter Deborah had married Dennis Goette in the 1980's and had a daughter that she named after herself. I get the impression that Will may have had a career in the Air Force. He also has a son, Barry and I do not know if this is a child that he and Starlene had or a child that Will and new wife Mary had. Starlene's mother's obituary does not name her grandchildren.

While I cannot find marriage or divorce records for Deborah and Dennis, I did fine that I 1988, a Deborah Pike married a Cale Dansbee in Wichita Falls, TX. Cale seems to have been in the Air Force and in 1996 was reportedly injured in a deadly blast in Saudi Arabia while on a 90-day assignment with his unit from Nellis AFB in Nevada. The terrorist bombing killed 19 US Servicemen.

In 1990, Starlene married a 2nd time to Mark Anthony Lindsay. Mark was born in 1949 in Indiana, but by 1950 was living in Odessa, TX with his parents, Carter and Margaret Lindsay and 4 older sisters ranging in age from 6 to 15 born in Kentucky and Illinois before his birth in Indiana. Surprisingly, he was 13 years younger than Starlene and had married Irene William of Arizona in the late 1960's and they had a son, Anthony in Apr 1970 and Monte Lindsay in Feb 1974 in Riverside, CA.

Son Monte died in 2008 and Mark died in 2010. His obituary reads: *BRIDGEPORT, Ill. - Mark A. Lindsay*, 61, died November 7, 2010, at Lubbock, Texas.

Survivors include his wife, Starlene of Clarendon: son, Anthony Lindsay of Indiana; brothers, Monty McMinn and Mike McMinn: sisters, Louise Young and Margie Cordell: nine grandchildren: and two great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents; a son, Monty Lindsay; two sisters, Beth Girton and Carroll Lindsay. Services will be private. Cunningham Funeral Home is in charge of arrangements.

Unfortunately, this does not shed much light on Starlene's daughter Deborah, but suggests that in 2010, Starlene may have been living in Lubbock.

Again, I have been unable to find marriage records of much about her husband, but they appear to have married in the early 1960's and had a son, Henry Roach, Jr in Abilene on 13 May 1963 which may suggest that like William Pike, Harry may have been in the Air Force. (Speculation based on her sister's path). From there. The only information that I found is from her obituary at the time of her death in 2022. It reads:

Willdene Rouch, 83, of Lubbock died Sunday, October 30, 2022 in Lubbock. Graveside services will be 2:00 PM Friday, November 4, 2022 in Claude Cemetery in Claude with Dr. David Belk, officiating. Arrangements are by Robertson Funeral Directors of Clarendon. Willdene was born January 10, 1939 in Childress to Lonnie Clifford and Margie Alma Cross Bennett. She married Harry John Rouch on June 8, 1957 in Washburn. She had been a resident of Colorado Springs, Colorado before moving to Lubbock 20 years ago. She was an LVN prior to her retirement where she worked mostly in nursing homes. Willdene loved decorating different things. She was preceded in death by her parents; and her son, Harry Rouch, Jr. Survivors include her husband Harry Rouch of Lubbock; her brother, Joe Bennett of Lubbock; her sister, Star Lindsay of Lubbock; and her grandchildren, Harry Rouch, III and Lonnie Clifford Rouch. The family request memorials be sent to the Salvation Army.

What we can deduce from this is that they lived in Lubbock from 2002 to 2022 after having lived in Colorado Springs which again suggests that Harry may have been in the Air Force as there is a big Air Force presence in that area. We note that as of 2022, Harry was still alive but that their son had died before her, but not before getting married and having a son Harry Roach III. With his birth in 1963, he probably married around 1983-1990, probably in Colorado and then records show that he died on 21 Jul 2001 and is buried in Logan National Cemetery in Denver. My initial thought was that maybe he died in the Afghanistan invasion following 9/11, but his death was 3 months before that action. His grave marker notes that he did serve in the Persian Gulf War. He may have been one of the unfortunate soldiers who suffered from PTSD but I have found no details of his demise. He does not appear on the official casualty list.

Buddy came along 11 years after his next older sister so he was probably abused by his two big sisters who probably fought over who had to babysit him. He arrived in the summer of 1947 as the war was over and the baby boom was underway. He was too young for Korea, but may well have faced the reality of being drafted to serve in Vietnam, though I have not record of either of these folks after high school and marriage. Buddy was a junior at Claude HS in 1964, but I could not find him in any Senior yearbook, but I supposed

that he graduated in 1965. Vickie lived in nearby Dimmitt and graduated in 1968 and she and Buddy married right after graduation. She had one younger sister, Cindy Powell who was born in 1954 and died in 2018 from early onset Alzheimer's. In her obituary she mentions her sister Vickie Bennett lived in Lubbock. I found one daughter Amy Dawn Bennett who was born on 22 Nov 1972 (my dad's birthday). When last seen, she was attending Texas Tech in Lubbock in 1992.

William who I believe mainly went by Bill was Charles and Lola's 2nd child arriving right about Thanksgiving in 1914 when his parents must have made a detour to Fort Worth. Bill introduces some challenges for me. First, his middle name is given as Losson and this has

been taken from his WW2 Draft Registration. I'm of the impression, that his middle name was really Lawson after his grandfather. This is supported by the 1940 Census which clearly lists his son's name as Larry Lawson Bennett. The other thing that confuses me is that there is a note on her Findagrave that they married in 1943, but their first child was born in 1939 in Oklahoma. This suggests that either the Findagrave note is incorrect, or Mary had another husband, or they just lived together for a few years before tying the knot. Since they appear together in the 1940 Census with a young son Larry, I'm inclined to believe that the 1943 date is an error.

Looking at the 1940 Census, we see that Bill had only gone to school through the 7th grade whereas Mary had a year of high school. They lived in Donely County where much of the family lived and Bill was 25 and Mary was 18. Both Mary and her son had been born in Oklahoma. Mary was the youngest of 10 children born to Sherrod Parker and Lucinda Martin. She had 4 older sisters and 5 older brothers and their birth pattern is curious. The oldest was born in Texas in 1900 and then the next 4 were born in Oklahoma before the 6th was born in Johnson County, TX in 1910 and then 7 through 9 were born in Quanah, TX between 1912 and 1917. Finally, Mary was born in 1922 in Oklahoma. There are a lot of Oklahoma school records for his children through 1926, and then in 1930 he was in Cottle County in the Texas Panhandle. That explains Mary's birth in Oklahoma, but I cannot figure out why her son was born there.

In 1940, Bill registered for the WW2 Draft and here is where we see him use the middle name Losson. Not to be disrespectful, but my impression is that Bill just had a little problem with his spelling. His wife Mary was the informant on the 1940 Census and she spelled her son's

name correctly, however on his death certificate, the son is back to Losson. There must have been a family argument. Anyway, Bill was 25 and they lived on the Naylor Route outside of Clarendon. His wife was his point of contact. He was 5'-8"-140lbs-brown eye-brown hair-ruddy complexion.

Between 1940 and 1950, they moved to Hale County probably near Planview which is a little north of Lubbock. Bill was still farming and claimed to be putting in 70 hours/week. They lived on North County Line Road. Bill was 31, Mary 29, and Larry was 9. A son Jimmy eventually. I have not been able to find his birth or death information, but he is mentioned in obituaries of his parents so I will keep looking. We know that he was born after 1950 because he does not appear in the 1950 Census of Bill of his future wife.

After 1950, The Bennet's seemed to have had a rough spell. In 1956, their son Larry was killed in a car accident in Plainview. An account of the accident is here:

Wreck Near Plainview Hurts Four. March 17 — An Olton high school student died here tonight of injuries suffered 30 minutes earlier in a 7 p.m. automobile accident which injured four youthful companions, none apparently seriously. Plainview Hospital-Clinic attendants said Larry Bennett, 16, son of Mr. and Mrs. Bill Bennett of Olton, died of internal injuries a few' minutes after reaching the hospital.

His death marked the 26th traffic fatality on the South Plains this year, as compared to 24 killed at this time in 1955. It was Hale County's first 1956 traffic fatality. Other Youths Hospitalized The injured youths, all from Olton, were identified as Terry Allen, 16, son of Mr. and Mrs. Sidney Allen; Thurman Adams, 15, son of Mrs. Corine Clayton; Alvin Wallace, 16, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Wallace; and Charles Ray Moore, 17, son of Mr. and Mrs. Pete Moore. Attending physicians said none of the youths appeared seriously injured, but that all would be held in the hospital, at least over-night, for observation. Highway patrolmen said the one- car accident happened four miles west of here on U.S. Highway 70.

The car, driven by Bennett, reportedly ran off the right side of the road, overturned several times, and came to rest beyond the bar ditch in a field. Lloyd Graham, Plainview, said he arrived at the scene seconds after the accident happened, and found the youths strewn for several hundred feet along the right-of-way. Graham sped to a nearby farm house and called an ambulance.

From these we can learn that in 2006, son James or Jimmy Bennett was alive and married to Oleta. We then see in 2011, that Jimmy had died before his father. I think that I have found records of a James Clifford Bennett marrying an Uleta Lavelle Gooding in 1998 and then Oleta Bennett and James Bennett divorced in 2000. This sort of contradicts Florine's obituary showing that they were still together in 2006. The only conclusion I can draw is that the divorce did not proceed or that they got back together, and then sometime between 2006 and 2011, Jimmy died, but I have not found any record to confirm this.

William and Mary's first child was Larry Bennett who was born in Hollis, OK in time to make the 1940 Census. I suspect that his mother had gone back to be with her mother for his birth which would explain the reason for his birth in Oklahoma. His father was farming in the Olton area. In 19555, he was a freshman at Olton high school and in the spring of his freshman year he and some of his high school buddies drove over to nearby Plainview and with Larry at the wheel, he accidentally drove off the road and the car flipped multiple times resulting in his death and the injury of his friends.

James has been a little hard to figure out. As I dug deeper, I discovered that he was actually born in May 1980 at which time his "father" would have been 66 and his "mother" would have been 63, so he is clearly not their child. My only thought is that he was adopted by William and his 2nd wife Florine Butler. We know that James could not have been her son from another marriage as she only had one child with her first husband who died in 1969 and she than married William.

In Jun 1998, he married Uleta Gooding in Franklin, TX which is south of Waco. They divorced 2 years later with no children.

Uleta was born to Billy Don Gooding and Carolyn Daughtry who married in 1971 after her divorce from her 1st husband, Frank Kuhl which resulted in no children. Carolyn and Billy divorced in 1981 after having 2 children, but then married and divorced again between 1984 and 1986. Carolyn died in 1993 before Uleta's marriage.

Meanwhile, it looks like Billy married Madeleen Compton in 1989 who was coming off of her first11 year marriage to David Sanders with one child. After Billy and Carolyn divorced a 2nd time, Billy and Madeleen remarried in 1989. While they had been divorced, she married Bobby McVay between 1986 and 1988.

Billy died in 1999, before Uleta's marriage, and Madeleen married Edwin Blair in 2000 before dying in 2001. I don't know where Uleta was during all of this turmoil, but somehow, she made it through to marry James. It looks like after she and James divorced in 2000, she married Timothy Butler in May 2001 and they divorced in 2010 after having two children. After that, she married Andrew Anthony in 2010 and divorced in 2012 in Franklin, TX.

The final child born to Charlie and Lola Bennett was their son Ova Vestal who arrived in Childress, TX in April 1922. He appears in the 1930, 1940 and 1950 Censuses in his parent's home. In 1950, the census doesn't give us much information. He's 28 and still at home presumably helping his aging parents on their farm. We know that in 1942 when he turned 20, he registered for the WW2 Draft at which time he was living in Clarendon. I guess he didn't like his given name of Ova as he said his name was Vestal (NMN) Bennett. His father, Charles was his point of contact and he was working for Russell Barnett in Claud, TX. Clarendon and Claud are just 27 miles apart. He was 5'-10 ½"-150lbs-blue eyes-brown hair-light complexion. He also noted that he had a crippled left foot and a slight limp. This must have kept him out of the war as I see no evidence of his having served.

The 1950 Census was held in April, and per Virginia's obituary they got married in August of 1950 in Clovis, NM. Marriage records in New Mexico are hard to come by, so I will have to take her word for it. They got busy building a family with the arrival of the following children over the course of the next few years - Janice Bennett 1951, Danny Bennett 1953, Dickey Don Bennett 1956, Larry Don Bennett 1960, Laura Donna Bennett 1960, and Tonja Bennett 1963. You will note that we have another set of twins in the family with Larry and Laura in 1960.

Virginia was the daughter of Aaron and Alice Clinch Parsons and she the 7th of 10 children in her family with 6 sisters and 3 brothers with birthdays beginning in 1919 through 1936. Her mother had died in 1940 when she was only 9 leaving her father a widower with 10 children ranging in age from 21 to 4 so I suspect she received a lot of upbringing from her older siblings.

In 1970, Virginia sadly followed in her mother's footsteps by dying young from cancer. She was only 38 and left Vestal with a houseful of 6 children who would have been 7 to 19. They were living in

Washburn, TX when she was stricken with skin cancer and within 4 weeks after being taken to Northwest Hospital in Amarillo, she succumbed to the cancer. Washburn is a small community just east of Amarillo.

In Oct 1970, five months after Virginia's death, Vestal married Jerrie Pounds Pate. Jerrie was initially married to Otis Pate, a Georgia boy. They ironically married in Clovis, NM in 1948, shortly before Vestal had married Virginia there in 1950. It appears that Jerry and Otis had a son F. L. Pate, probably in New Mexico in 1949-1951. I have not found birth records for him, but he is mentioned in an obituary. I do not have any details about Otis other than the fact that he was born in Texas in 1923 and when he and Jerry applied for their marriage license in 1948, they both lived in Bovina, TX which is another small town southwest of Amarillo. I don't know what happened to Otis, but Jerrie was available to jump in and marry Vestal when he needed a hand with all of his children. I looked at her death records and it suggests that I may have some mistakes in my research. It shows the following:

I cannot reconcile these dates with obituaries and the 1950 Census.

Vestal died in 1992 and I do not find an obituary, only his Findagrave site. Virginia's Findagrave site also is devoid of any biography. Jerrie's obituary however appears in 2002 and it reads:

CLARENDON - Jerrie Lou Bennett, 72, died Saturday, Sept. 28, 2002.

Services will be at 2 p.m. Tuesday in Clarendon Church of Christ with Billy Jones, of Jericho, and Eddie Stegall, minister, officiating. Burial will be in Claude Cemetery by Robertson Funeral Directors.

Mrs. Bennett was born Jan. 25, 1930, in Hereford and was a resident of Washburn before moving to Clarendon 15 years ago. She had worked as a home health nurse for 20 years before her retirement. She married Ova Vestal Bennett on Oct. 13, 1970, in Amarillo, Potter County. She was a member of the Clarendon Church of Christ.

Casket bearers include Craig Cobb, Greg Bennett, Chris Cox, Brayden Bennett, Teal Bennett and Tate Bennett. She was preceded in death by her husband on Feb. 13, 1997; a brother; and a granddaughter.

Survivors include four sons, F.L. Pate of Houston, Danny Bennett, Dickie Bennett and Larry Bennett, all of Clarendon; four daughters, Deborah Cox and Tonja Ruthardt, both of Clarendon, Janice Perales of Houston and Donna Bennett of Amarillo; two brothers, Danny Pounds of Capitan, N.M., and Sammy Pounds of White Water, Mo.; three sisters, Martha Wilson and Dee Jameson, both of Fort Stockton, and Betty Pounds of Bernalillo, N.M.; 14 grandchildren; and 14 great-grandchildren.

This obituary gives a few more clues about Jerrie. In addition to her son, F. L. Pate, she may have had a daughter Janice Perales. It seems unlikely that Vestal and Jerrie would have had a daughter together since she was 40 when they married, but I have so far run into a dreaded brick wall. I have found birth records for the other 6 children mentioned. (See updates below where I have unraveled the children)

Janice was the first of 6 children born to Vestal and Virginia. She arrived on the 1st of June 1951 in Wheeler, TX. The photo is from her 5th grade year in Claude, TX in 1962 which would suggest that she would have graduated about 1968 at which time she married James Beavers who was from South Dakota. They stayed married until 1996 during which time they seem to have had a daughter, Kimberley Janelle Beavers on 6 Aug 1970 in Amarillo. While James

was from South Dakota, he may have been orphaned as he had ended up at Carl Farly's Boys Ranch near Amarillo in 1966 when he was 15 and stayed there until 1969. He later returned as a staff member from 1973 to 1974 so Janice and Kimberly must have spent their early years of the marriage there.

Three years after her divorce, she married Carlos Perales in 1999. I have not found much about him but saw some indication that he had married and divorced and had 3 children, and since his name was Carlos Sr. I suspect that he had a son, Carlos Jr. They may still be living in Galveston.

Dickey was the 3rd child born to Ova and Virginia and arrived on the 1st of Mar 1956 in Hale. I found him as a Junior at Claude HS in 1974, but he was not there as a Senior. If he graduated, it was probably in 1975 and right after that, he married Betty Joslin who was from Hale, TX and seems to have graduated from Plainview HS in 1974. Her credits show:

The 4th and 5th children born to Ova and Virginia were Larry and Laura who arrived in Amarillo on 18 July 1960 only 8 days before my youngest sister. I found a photo of them together in the 7th grade, but in the 1974 Claude Yearbook, but I could not find them together later in high school. I found this shot of Larry in 1976 at Plainview HS as a freshman, but I'm

not certain that these are the same people. Meanwhile, look at Laura's photos below. Her 2nd one is from 1977 at Amarillo Caprock HS as a sophomore. They look very similar. I did not see anything in Ova's biography that would explain the kids living in separate places except for the fact that Virginia died in 1970 and married Jerrie Pounds that same year so who knows what happened with all of the kids during these tumultuous years.

In 1984, Larry married Cheryl Burch in Amarillo and they had Brittney Senae Bennett in 1986 and Bradley Bennett in 1989. They divorced in 1993 and she later married Neal Patrick Koetting. I have not found another marriage for Larry.

He is survived by wife, Helen Ruthardt of Childress; his son, Seth Ruthardt wife Sierra of Amarillo; daughters, Haley Bennett of Amarillo, and Rachel Wade and husband Roger of Clarendon; the mother of his children, Tonja Ruthardt of Hedley; his brothers, Ken Ruthardt and wife Missy of Edmond, Oklahoma and Brice Ruthardt and wife Jeanie of Amarillo; his sister, Judith Ingle and husband Jerome of Groom; his mother, Judy Ruthardt of Groom; numerous nieces and nephews; step son, Colton Fowler and wife Dyan of Childress; step daughter, Jacklyn Sims and husband Dallas of Wellington; and 16 grandchildren. The family suggest memorials be made to Groom Methodist Church, Groom Fire Department, or St. Jude's in Travis' name.

From this obituary we learn that Travis and Tonja did not stay married. He mentions that Travis Seth is married to Sierra and that he and Tonja may have had two more children, Haley (married to a Bennett) and Rachel married to Roger Wade. His new wife Helen had been married to someone named Fowler and she had A son Colton (married to Dyan) and Jacklyn (married to Dallas Sims). All of these children have 16 kids between them.

I have been unable to sort out these people. I found Colton Fowler's mother was Kimberly Wilkins who was married to Christopher Curtis Fowler and had 4 children - Colton Howard Fowler 1988, Shandi Dawn Fowler 1989, Christian Hope Fowler 1990, and Stephen Curtis Fowler 1991. Tis a puzzlement.

One final story about Ova's 2nd wife, Jerrie Pounds and her children. I was able trace that she married Odis (or Otis) Pate in Las Cruces, NM in 1948 while both were living in Bovina, TX. They had two children,

Deborah Pate 1951 and Faris Lyn Pate 1953, but in 1953 she filed for divorce and petitioned for custody of the children which she brought to the marriage with Ova in 1970. I do not know what she did between 1953 and 1970. In 1921, her grandfather, Zachariah Benjamin Pounds (Z B Pounds) was accused of trying to kill his wife and was convicted and sentenced to 10 years in prison. He claimed that a cow kicked her. He ended up in Huntsville and appealed his conviction, but the courts denied his appeal. Then in 1936, a curious thing happened in Texas. The Governor, "Pa" Ferguson had his wife "Ma" Ferguson run to succeed him after he was impeached and she won. They began selling pardons and Z B was the fortunate recipient of one of the pardons! Unfortunately, he died a year later just about the time that Jerrie's father got married.

This completes the story of William Lawson Smith and Emily Guthrie's children, grandchildren, great grandchildren, and great grand children. By my count, there are 10 children, 42 grandchildren (plus 14 step), 50 great great grandchildren (plus 3 step), and 78 great great grandchildren (plus at least 5 step) descended from William Lawson and Emily Guthrie Smith.
