Robert was the 8th child of Phineas and Cordie arriving just before the turn of the century and right before the twin. As with Henry, there is not a lot of information about his early life and as shared above, he and Henry were farming together in 1920, but unlike Henry, he had not registered for the WW1 Draft, but instead, he enlisted in the US Navy. Records are scarce but from his headstone application, he served from 4 Jan 1918 to 2 Feb 1919. He was apparently wounded and I'm of the impression that it was probably serious because on the birth certificate of his 2nd child in 1927 he wrote that

he was ex-service – hospitalized. He married Willie O'Bannon about 1925 and they had their first child, Joyce Amazona in May 1926 in Mineral Wells, and then in Sep 1927 Robert Jr was born in Kerrville. I believe that Kerrville had the reputation of being a place for healing and that was probably accounted for them being there in 1927. In 1930 they were back in the Mineral Wells area. The Census shows that they had been married 4 years so that pins the marriage date as around 1926. Willie was the 2nd child of Jessie and Effie O'Bannon and also farmed in Palo Pinto County. Jessie was from Georgia and came to Texas and married a Texas girl.

Joyce was the first child born to Robert and Willie Hudman. She arrived in Lipan, TX in 1926 and she appeared in the 1930 Census in Texas before moving with her family to California where her father died in 1938 when she was 12 and then her mother died in Phoenix in 1940 leaving Joyce and her little brother, Robert as orphans. We should be able to find her in 1940 in Phoenix, but perhaps her mother was in the hospital at the time of the census as she died a couple of months after the 1940 Census. In her mother's obituary, it indicates that she had been in Glendale, AZ for about 6 years which suggests that she and Robert may have separated since he died in California in 1938. Anyway, I have not been able to find Joyce and Robert in 1940. The only news article I found about her was from 1942 in Glendale where she was participating in an oratorical contest at school and finished 2nd. It gives no clues as to who she was living with.

In Mar 1946, I found marriage records from Prescott, AZ where she is getting married to Harry Webster Hall, a young man from Oklahoma who was living at 211 N. Willow, Prescott while Joyce lived

at 129 S. 2nd, Glendale, AZ. He was 25 and she was 20. The wedding was performed by Frank Matthews in the presence of Opal Ione and Herbert Eugene Scott. Opal was Harry's sister and Herbert was her husband. Harry and Joyce then appear in the 1950 Census in Prescott where Harry is working for the Highway Department and they have a 3-year-old daughter, Kathleen who was born in Arkansas.

After 1950 it starts getting a little chaotic and I believe that this chain of events is correct, but it is not rock solid. It appears that a Joyce A Hall, who is the appropriate age to be our Joyce Hudman, gets married in 1959 to Wilson Harris Frayer in Las Vegas. (Update 2025) Wilson had begun his marrying in 1941 when he married Ollie Mae Pillman and they divorced in 1944 after he served in the Navy from 1942 to 1943. Wilson then married Iona Haslem who was a young lady from Utah before the 1950 Census. Iona had first married Darrell Stevens in 1937 and they had a son Van Stevens in 1939 before divorcing. Darrell then married Irene Ludtke in 1947 and had another son, Roger Stevens in 1949. Meanwhile, Iona left her son with his father and married the above-mentioned Wilson Frayer and appears as his wife in the 1950 Census in Oakland, CA where he is a cab driver and she works at a department store. In 1959, Iona is then found to be marrying Anthony Sarnuto, while Wilson Frayer is marrying our Joyce in Las Vegas. (Actually, records show that Wilson and Joyce married first in 1957 and then again in 1959. Maybe Wison discovered that he had not been divorced from Iona. Joyce would have been 30 at the time of the first marriage to Wilson)

A little side trip on Wilson Frayer. He seems to have had a bit of a rough life. His father was Joseph Frayer who married his mother, Minnie Muniz in 1908. Minnie was the daughter of immigrants from Portugal. They had three sons with Wilson being the youngest born in 1919 in California. Shortly before his birth, his father was reported to have beaten Minnie because he objected to her going out alone while he was working as a night watchman. They must have briefly reconciled, because 8 months later, Wilson was born. Perhaps Joseph wasn't really his father? In the 1920 Census, Wilson and his mother and two brothers are not living with Joseph because he is in the Alameda County Jail, probably for beating his wife. In 1920, his oldest brother fell off of a coal truck he was riding on and was crushed beneath the wheels. In 1930, Wilson is in an orphanage in LA called the McKinley Home for Boys. I don't know where Minnie and brother Rudolph were in 1930, but in 1940, Minnie reappears in Oakland as Minnie Schroeder living in a boarding house with Rudolph and Wilson and perhaps a new boyfriend Silvadore Pepitone, though their relationship is not clear. To finish off, with that rough upbringing, it does not appear that Wilson was a pillar of virtue. In 1968, he was reported to be running a restaurant in Las Vegas named Bill's Red Hots and this happened:

Change Girl Is Held As Vegas Killer LAS VEGAS, Nev. (AP)

Las Vegas police said Saturday they arrested a casino money change girl on a murder charge in the shooting of a drive-in restaurant owner whom she tried to revive with oxygen. Lt. John McCarthy said Louise Kuehl. 34, was booked and was being held in a hospital room guarded by a deputy sheriff.

Officers said she suffers a heart condition. They said Wilson H. Frayer, 49, owner of Bill's Redhots, died Friday after he was shot in the chest at Miss Kuehl's apartment. Officers said he had forced his way into the apartment and insisted she accompany him on a vacation. McCarthy said a coroner's inquest will be held to decide if Miss Kuehl will be arraigned on the murder charge. He said the incident is still being investigated. Officers said Miss Kuehl tried revive Frayer with an oxygen tank she keeps at her home. They said she called a doctor.

It is unclear of Joyce and Wilson were still married at the time and I never saw an obituary. That being said, Joyce was now without a husband again at age 42, so in Aug 1971 she married Maynard Lee Smith in Las Vegas, but they divorced 2 years later in Sep 1973. Information about Maynard has been hard to come by. He appears to have been from Nebraska originally and I have found some stories in Nebraska about a Maynard Smith, I haven't been able to put all of the pieces together.

Joyce was only 47 when she and Maynard divorced so it is likely that she married again, but I have not been able to determine if she did and consequently have not been able to find any death records for her. I have searched for Joyce Hudman, Joyce Hall, Joyce Frayer, and Joyce Smith without success. I did notice

that in 2001 when her brother died, she was still referred to as Joyce Frayer when she was 75, so I suspect that was her final name.

Looking briefly at her daughter, Kathleen who showed up in the 1950 Census when Joyce was married to Harry Hall and indicating that she had been born in Arkansas in 1947 or 1948. There are those on FamilySearch who have suggested that Kathleen is Kathleen Iris Hall born 1 Dec 1947 in Arkansas who married Paul Woodrow Fluno in Las Vegas in 1979. I do not have enough evidence to completely rely on this information as Arkansas birth records are not available to confirm her birth and parentage.

Finally, Harry Hall seems to have remarried and ended up in New Jersey where he died in Newark in 1984. He had married an Eleanor Sandmaier after he and Joyce divorced.

2025 Update – I have gone back and explored Kathleen in a bit more detail. My findings are below. Sadly, or gladly, it seems to indicate that Kathleen has two sisters in her obituary. I have not found a full copy of her obituary, but a synopsis. I say bad news because that means I need to insert new people at 437 and 438 and renumber everyone after that! Hopefully I can find out who these people are, but my initial search has not been fruitful and with no Arizona birth records, it may be a challenge.

I thought that Kathleen was the only child born to Joyce and Harry Hall but I found in Kathleen's obituary that her mother had two sisters, Pamela and Barbara. I finally found some more information about her father, Harry and his obituary reads:

Services for Harry W. Hall, 63, of Clark will be held at 10 a.m. Saturday in the Walter J. Johnson Funeral Home, 803 Raritan Rd., Clark, New Jersey.

Mr. Hall died Tuesday in the St. Barnabas Medical Center, Livingston. He was a mechanic for the Newark Caster and Truck Corp. of Newark for 15 years before retiring last year. Mr. Hall served in the Navy during World War II.

Born in Heavener, Okla., he lived in Prescott, Ariz., and Irvington before moving to Clark 15 years ago. Surviving is his wife, Eleanor; a son, William Hardy; two daughters, Mrs. Karin Vella and Mrs. Eleanor Romeo, and six grandchildren.

This doesn't shed much light. Harry ended up in New Jersey married to Eleanor Sandmaier who was born in Munich in 1921 and may have been married earlier to someone named Hardy. If this is our Harry, then technically, Joyce's daughters Kathleen, Barbara, and Pamela had two stepsisters, Karen and Eleanor.

Getting back to Kathleen, she next shows up after the 1950 Census where she appeared with her parents Harry and Joyce Hall, when she was getting married in Las Vegas to Timothy McDaniel in 1975 when she was 27. I have not found her before that time so I'm not sure where she ended up during her childhood. I spent more time on Timothy than I should have for a two-week marriage, but he was born as Timothy Sanner, but his mother remarried a McDaniel and that was the name he lived his life with.

Kathleen then appears again in 1979 where as Kathleen Bennett, she marries Paul Woodrow Fluno. This would suggest that somewhere between 1975 and 1979, she was married to someone named Bennet.

She would have been 27 to 31 during this period. I say this because her obituary mentions that she had 2 children, Cheryl and Mike and that Cheryl was married to Angel. Unfortunately, no surnames are given.

Paul was the son of Woody and Julia Delores Dotson and he had a younger sister Cheryl. (This is a clue that the daughter that Helen had was probably with Paul Flumo in honor of his younger sister who had been killed in 1960 at age 15.) Paul's father was a colorful character. He was born in Michigan and married an Oregon girl who claimed Italian heritage. In 1960, his 15-year-old daughter. Cheryl was driving the family car with her parents in it when she crashed and was killed. At the time of the accident, Paul at age 18 was away in the Navy. Upon returning from the Navy in 1967 he briefly married Virginia L Maliszewski, before he and Kathleen got married.

I'm going to segue a bit here to highlight Paul's father. In 1949, he was involved in a scandal with the Portland police chief in a scheme to produce a "yearbook" which was actually a way to shakedown businesses to advertise in a bogus publication. After surviving that scandal, he then became a bootlegger in Portland and in 1954 was arrested. In 1961, his mother, who had run a hotel in Portland with her husband, was also killed in a car wreck a year after Woody lost his daughter. In 1965, he had moved to Oakland where this story appeared:

Meet Oakland's Woody Fluno, the inventor, whose latest idea is vacuum-type ashtrays for bars, where the patron flicks his ashes, pushes a button and the ashtray is cleaned by suction from underneath. So, Woody built a model bar at his home and invited bar owners out to look at it. None was particularly impressed by the ash trays - but several asked him to build their bars!

Let me skip to the obituary information that I discovered on FamilySearch.

Kathleen Iris Fluno's Parents and Siblings

Joyce Frayer Mother – so in 1980 and again in 2001 she is going by this name
Barbara Sister – She was either Harry Hall or William Frayer's daughter
Pamela Sister – She was either Harry Hall or William Frayer's daughter

If these girls were born to Harry Hall and Joyce, it would have to have been between 1950 and 1957 which I think is the most likely scenario.

Kathleen Iris Fluno's Spouses and Children

Cheryl Daughter – probably the daughter of Paul Fluno which means she was born about

1980-1981

Mike Son – likewise, I suspect that he was born to Paul Fluno

Angel Son-in-law – I will search for marriage records for Cheryl Fluno.

The challenges that this presents are to find out who was the father of Barbara and Pamela. I then need to determine if Cheryl and Mike are her children with Paul Fluno, or if they are Paul's children from his first marriage to Virginia in 1967.

We know that Kathleen's father was Harry Hall and that he and Joyce divorced before 1971. With this new information and the assumptions above, let me see what I can find. In searching Paul Fluno, I found an article in 2004 where he was having to sell some property in a bankruptcy sale in Bountiful, UT. In 2008, when Kathleen died in Kingman, AZ, I assume that he is there. In 2012, I found his transferring property to a Cheryl Fluno in Missouri, a year after Cheryl had had a car wreck there. This suggests that Cheryl and Angel were no longer married after her mother's death when a son-in-law Angel was mentioned. Finally, in 2013, I read about Cheryl still in Missouri getting arrested on drug charges. My search for a Mike Fluno has only resulted in a guitar playing car salesman in Tampa. Florida in 2009.

Searching first for Barbara Hall who would have been born after 1950 in Arizona since she was not in the 1950 Census. Since she was mentioned first, I suspect that she was born 2nd after Kathleen. In 1958, I found an 18-year-old Barbara Ann Hall marrying a 20-year-old Robert Hugh Curtis in Tucson and they were divorced in 1971. If this is out Barbara, that is all that I have found.

Moving on the Pamela Hall, I found an interesting reference to a Pamela Hall born in 1953 who in 1966 when she was 13 got involved in drugs and was able to get dried out and wrote a book about her experiences. An excerpt is here from 1971. We who live outside the youth culture and the drug culture are insulated from the most agonizing problem of our age.

A little book, "Heads, You Lose," by an 18-year-old named Pamela Hall, has seared some rather terrible vignettes in my mind. I am shocked, for example, by the early, casual way youngsters take to drugs. It's the way one expects them to take to swimming or dancing or driving cars, but never to such potential killers as LSD, speed and heroin.

Miss Hall, who is now 18 and cured, began her drug experiments at 13. Here is a sample entry from her diary: "Our class took a field trip to a museum today and Keith, Doug and I were riding about two feet higher than all the others due to some hash we brought, along with my little water pipe. We had ourselves a good stone right on the bus."

Fortunately, Pamela had a wise, loving mother – though it took her some time to discover her daughter's addiction. She sent her sad, freaked-out daughter to a sanitarium, then put her in the care of a Swiss family. She also wrote to her regularly, loving letters that make you cry.

"I view drugs now as something senseless and a waste," writes Pamela. She also suggests a way to combat the growing use of drugs by the very young. "Parents need to give their kids more of a close-knit family life. If parents could somehow make their homes more open to discussions and if they could encourage an aura of trust, perhaps it would help." Funny, isn't that what we old-fashioned, buttoned-down bourgeois types have been saying all along?

This pretty much completes all that I have been able to find. There is a lot of speculation that could be completely wrong. I have not found any death records for Joyce, Barbara, Pamela, or Paul or any resolution of the children, Barbara and Mike. I did find a listing of Pamela's book, but it does not appear to be in print. A link is here.

Robert was then 2nd child of Robert and Willie arriving in Kerrville in 1927. I'm not sure why he was born there, but perhaps his parents were enroute to California. As has been mention, he was orphaned at the age of 13 when his mother died in Glendale. As with his sister, I haven't found him in 1940 and don't know who took him in. (Update 2025 – I found him 1940 living with his aunt and uncle, Bessie Hudman and her husband AC York. I have not found him in the 1950

Census either, but finally found his obituary which allowed me to work backwards and find out about his family.

I will publish his obituary and make some comments.

Robert "Buddy" Hudman September 6, 1927-June 27, 2001

Buddy was full of life and laughter, and quick to infect all he met with his special humor and fun. Born in Kerrville, Texas, raised in the rugged mountain wilderness of northern Arizona, his youth was an almost pioneer way of life, today which seems like myth or legend. Orphaned at age eleven, Buddy worked as a farmer, cowboy, and a prospector. As a teen, rheumatic fever damaged his heart, and he was only given a year to live. But he had his heart set on seeing the world, so he set out riding the rails, filling his life with adventure.

Unable to enlist because of his heart problems, Buddy worked on the building of Davis Dam, was the steward of Mingus Mountain for many years for the Arizona Dept. of Transportation, and the US Forest Service, and finally as a tractor mechanic and foreman for Tucson Tractor.

Retiring in 1992, Buddy again traveled the west, in his RV, with his best friend, a German Shepard named "Duke". He gave his family and friends more than words could ever say. He had a generous heart and kind soul.

He is survived by three children, Robert and Gary of Tucson, Michelle of Scottsdale; three grandchildren, Cody, Josh and Levi, sons of Robert and Debbie; former spouse and friend, Theodosia Hudman; sister, Joyce Frayer of Kingman; and close companion, Ruth Thompson of Congress. His spirit has changed us all, and will be greatly missed. Private services will be held at the Rich Hill mining claims, on Saturday, July 2.

My observations include that he was married to Theodosia and they had three children, Gary, Robert, and Michelle. He was divorced from Theo. His son Robert and wife Debbie have 3 sons. Here is some information on the Davis Dam. https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Davis_Dam and here is some information about the Mingus Mountains. https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Mingus_Mountain. I also note that at the time of his death, his sister Joyce was still alive and had retained the last name of Frayer after her aborted marriage to Maynard Smith mentioned above. I was able to find his marriage records from 1952 in Prescott and his sister, still Joyce Hall at the time was one of the witnesses. They were married at the Free Methodist Church. I then found that he and Theo divorced in 1973.

Moving on to Theo, her obituary reads:

Theodosia "Josie" Hudman Heaven received another angel on November 28, 2015. Theodosia passed away with her family around her. Born April 2, 1929 in Miami, Arizona she was the oldest of nine brothers and sisters. Theo grew up in Jerome, AZ, where she married and had three children, Robert, Gary and Michelle. She then lived in Tucson for the next 43 years.

Theo had recently moved to Gilbert, AZ. She worked as a nurse for years at St. Joseph's Hospital and then retired after working for a mental health provider. Theo was compassionate and cared about everyone. She was called "Mom" by most and would never let anyone leave her home hungry.

She loved to sew, make jewelry, watch the news and never missed NCIS. She would send money to any charity that asked for it, however she had a special place in her heart for the soldiers and Wounded Warriors. Her smile would light up a room and her hug would take away the tears. She would listen and always be able to give just the right advice. Theo is survived by brother, Robert Gonzalez; sons, Robert (Debi) Hudman and Gary (Joyce) Hudman; daughter, Michelle Hudman; grandsons, Cody, Joshua, Levi and many nieces and nephews.

She will be missed more than anyone can imagine and hearts are broken in her absence. All are welcome to join at a Memorial Mass on Friday, December 11, 2015 at 11:00 a.m. at St. Mary Magdalene Catholic Church, 2654 E. Williams Field Rd., Gilbert, AZ 85295 with a reception to follow

I have not quite tracked down all of her siblings but her father was Franciso Gonzales and Maria Jimenez both from Mexico. Her father died in 1934 after fathering 4 children with Theo being the first. Her mother then married Benabe Cruz and must have had 5 additional children of which I have only discovered 3. The only items that I can draw from this are that Robert and Debi were still married, Gary had a wife named Joyce, and Michelle has not married.

In trying to track down the kids, I found that Robert married a Dorothy Alford when he was 19, but then married again to Deborah Barnes in 1977 who must be the Debi mentioned in the obituaries.

I have not found Gary's wife Joyce, but I did find a Gary Hudman involved on a project called Biosphere-2 in the- 1990's and I wonder if this was our Gary. It was quite an interesting project that made a lot of headlines at the time when the initial group of volunteers were sealed in to spend a couple of years in a "self-sufficient" community and things did not necessarily go as planned. I have not found anything about Michelle.

Robert and Willie's first child was Robert (perhaps Jr) who arrived in Arizona in 1953. He was followed by brother Gary and sister Michelle in 1956 and 1958. While I have not found any information about his youth, we know that his parents divorced in 1973 when he was 20 and his siblings were 16 and 11. It looks like he may have gotten married just before their

divorce when he was 19 and he married Dorothy Alford who was only 16.

Dorothy seems to have had a brother George Alford III who may have been a twin, but I have not confirmed his exact date of birth. On 2 Mar 1974, they gave birth to son Robert Cody Hudman in Tucson. Dorothy was the daughter of George and Patricia Lingfelter Hudman (1933-2022) and George Alford (1930-?). from Pennsylvania and New Jersey. I know that George died before his wife, but I have not found his obituary, but her mother's 2022 obituary is interesting. It reads:

Patricia Lingenfelter Obituary

Patricia "Patty" Lou Lingenfelter, 89 years old, passed away peacefully on Jan. 31, 2022, in Cambridge, Wisconsin. Patty was born on Dec. 1, 1933, the sixth of 11 children, to Avis Zelina (Callaghan) Lingenfelter and Mayes Andrew Lingenfelter, in Eldred, McKean County.

Patty loved books, history, family genealogy and the backwoods of Pennsylvania. She earned a certificate in family history research and genealogy from Brigham Young University and was for many years an enthusiastic member of the Pennsylvania German Society. She traced her Lingenfelter ancestors back to 17th-century Switzerland and published her research in three volumes: "Descendants of Rudolph Hoch and His Wife Veronica and Related Families," "The Lingenfelters: Volume I, The Early Generations" and "The Lingenfelters: Volume II, The Later Generations." She also had the great pleasure of traveling to Ireland to research more of her family history and meet members of the O'Callaghan family.

Patty was predeceased by her mother and father; two brothers, Jack Lingenfelter and Thomas Lingenfelter; and four sisters, Margaret "June" Atcheson, Phyllis Dudley, Dorothy Truman and Carol Young.

She's survived by her brother, David Lingenfelter and wife Margaret, and sisters Betty Means, Nancy Brash and Daneen Bowers and husband Thomas Bowers. And she's survived by her children, Dorothy (Alford) Mickleburgh, and George W. Alford III, whom she raised in Tucson, Arizona with her former spouse, the late George W. Alford.

She is also survived by two grandsons, Elliott Charles Mickleburgh and Robert Cody Hudman; her great-grandchildren, Skyler Epple-Hudman and Robbie Epple-Hudman; and by many nieces and nephews, all of whom she had great affection for. Family and friends are welcome to a brief committal on Saturday April 2, 11 a.m., at Valier Cemetery, Co. Rd 3013, Valier, Jefferson County, PA 15780.

From this we learn that Dorothy married Alford Mickeburgh after divorcing Robert and had a son Elliot with him. We also learn that our Robert Cody has married and has a child Skyler Epple-Hudman. I have not been able to locate a copy of her genealogy work.

Getting back to Robert and his life after Dorothy. I found that on 19 Nov 1977, Robert married Deborah (Debra) Barnes in Tucson. He was 24 and she was 23. She was the daughter of Dale Philip Barnes (1922–1987) and Elizabeth Mae Bailey Barnes (1923–1997) from Zanesville, OH. Deborah was born there and had a younger brother David Barnes. Her father was an auto mechanic in Ohio in 1950 and had served in WW2 in the Army. Newspaper records show that Robert and Debra had a son on 3 Apr 1970 in Tucson and another son on 7 Aug 1991. Residential records suggest that these boys were Josh M and Levi I Hudman. In later life, her mother married Graham Dallas Reese who was her husband when she died in 1997. He obituary reads:

Elizabeth "Liz" M. Reese, 74, of Scottsdale, a retired medical secretary, died Dec. 19, 1997. She was born in Zanesville, Ohio. Survivors include her husband, Graham; daughter, **Debra Hudman**; son, David A. Barnes; and five grandchildren. Services: 11 a.m. Tuesday, Green Acres Chapel of Light, 401 N. Hayden Road, Scottsdale, with visitation an hour before services.


